

Let's Elope starting point for lightly raced Savabeel mare Butter Chicken

Begg also unveils well-bred three-year-old fillies at Cranbourne barrier trial session

A pedigree page doesn't guarantee success, nor necessarily does barrier trial form, but Grahame Begg appears to have plenty to look forward to if yesterday's Cranbourne barrier trial session is any guide.

Begg's lightly raced mare Butter Chicken (Savabeel), a stylish winner of heat two (1190m), will begin her four-year-old season in the Let's Elope Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Flemington on September 11 while well-bred fillies No Whining (Redoute's Choice) and

Passive Aggressive (Fastnet Rock) will make more modest starts to their careers.

No Whining, a three-year-old filly from the Chiara (Last Tycoon) family which is responsible for Star Witness (Starcraft), Ferocity (Lion Hunter) and Chinchilla Rose (Lion Hunter), was runner-up to the race fit Tycoon Humma (Capitalist) in heat ten (800m) and stablemate Passive Aggressive won heat 12.

Unbeaten filly Dosh (Rich Enuff) was also set to barrier trial yesterday but Begg scratched her in preference to jumping her out at Caulfield this morning.

Written Tycoon's stakes-winning son Banquo to stand at Waikato Stud this year

Stakes-winning entire Banquo (Written Tycoon), the younger brother to Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) winning sprinter Booker, has been retired to stand at Waikato Stud in New Zealand on the eve of the breeding season.

<< *Continued from page 1* The hit-out of Butter Chicken, a Jonathan Munz-bred and raced mare who was runner-up in the MRC Autumn Classic (Gr 2, 1800m) in February, was enough to convince Begg that the four-year-old was ready to resume after "trailing beautifully".

"We are starting to fine-tune her up a bit, so at this stage she looks like she'll go to the races in the Let's Elope on the 11th of September - that will be a kick off point for her," Begg told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"We will see how she measures up and work out a plan with her."

One of an enviable band of race fillies and broodmares owned by Munz's GSA Bloodstock, Butter Chicken is a daughter of Scintillula (Galileo), a mare who was a Group 3 winner and Group 1 placed Ireland, making her a sister to Royal Ascot winner Cuis Ghaire.

"She has been placed up to 1800 metres, but not all Savabeel mares are distance mares. She's out of a Galileo mare, so you'd like to think she'd run a distance, but she seems quite sharp as well," Begg said.

"She performed well at 1400 and 1600 metres and then up to the 1800 metres last preparation and she's certainly an untapped horse. We've looked after her, she had a good spell after her first preparation.

"We are really working towards next year, more than anything, but we just have to see how she measures up in the spring.

"Hopefully we can get her ratings points up and get some (more) black type with her."

The unraced **No Whining**, a half-sister to Award Winner (Exceed

And Excel) who won twice for Anthony and Sam Freedman in May, is another homebred for Munz but Begg has no grand plans for the valuable filly at this stage of her career despite showing ability on the training track.

"She's a big filly and we've given her plenty of time to mature," the trainer revealed.

"She was having her first barrier trial and she had a jump-out previously at Caulfield. She is a filly that I quite like and I feel that she'd be more of an autumn filly, but it's time now to start testing the waters a bit with her.

"I'll start her off at a very low base and then they will tell us where they are at."

Victorian businessman Munz, through his agent Dean Hawthorne, is not afraid to add to the depth of his quality homebreds by acquiring well-bred fillies at the Australian and New Zealand yearling sales each year and trial winner **Passive Aggressive** is a result of that strategy.

A sister to Group 3 winner and Group 1 placed sprinter Missrock, who also ran fifth in a VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m), Passive Aggressive was bought by Hawthorne for \$500,000 at last year's Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale from the Cressfield draft.

"She's a really, really nice filly. We've given her plenty of time to come into her own, so she will also start off at a very low base, in a maiden somewhere, and we will gradually build her up," Begg said. *Continued on page 4>>*

"She's shown us nice things up to now. She's starting off late, so we might be working towards next year with her as well but we'll let her tell us where she is at"

Dosh, who impressed in a jump-out at Caulfield a fortnight ago, meanwhile, remains on track for the Cap D'Antibes (Listed, 1100m) at Flemington on Saturday week despite missing yesterday's trial.

A winner of the Ottawa Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) and the Blue Diamond Preview (F) (Gr 3, 1000m) last season, Dosh was withdrawn from the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) due to a bruised heel and was not seen

again publicly in her juvenile year.

"I gave myself two options, whether to come away (or stay at home), and the track was heavy at Cranbourne so I thought I'd just keep her at Caulfield," he said.

"She has her next jump-out tomorrow and all going well she will run on Saturday week (in the Cap d'Antibes). This time of year there's no hiding."

All options are on the table this spring for Dosh who showed superior speed to her rivals in her two victories over 1000 metres so far and Begg is hopeful the filly can maintain that brilliance over 1200 metres.

If she does, it opens up the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) door against the colts and geldings.

"She is a high-speed filly, so I guess a lot will be told this time around. She's a lot more mature, she's a big strong girl. She's got to let us know where she is in the order, so to speak," he said.

"Obviously there's no easy races, but to our eye she hasn't lost anything."

Begg believes the daughter of Rich Enuff (Written Tycoon) is in the mould of her sire and is much heavier than Written By (Written Tycoon), the Blue Diamond Stakes winner he trained until his retirement to Widden Stud in 2019.

"We will be nominating her in everything but, as I said, we'll get her to that race on Saturday week and then we will just take it each race as it comes," he said.

"There's plenty of options, lots of three-year-old options. Whether that is just against the fillies or you can take on the colts at some stage as well.

"She is a very strong girl. She weighs a lot more than Written By did. She's a much bulkier horse, very strong and she's got great strength. She is very much in his (Rich Enuff) mould."

Airbnb jockeys accused of providing false and misleading evidence

Racing Victoria stewards yesterday issued one charge each against jockeys Ethan Brown, Jamie Kah and Ben Melham and apprentice Celine Gaudray for allegedly providing false and/or misleading evidence to them. The quartet were charged with breaching AR232(i) which states a person must not give any evidence at an interview, investigation, inquiry, hearing and/or appeal which is false or misleading. On August 25, Brown, Kah, Melham and Gaudray were present at an Airbnb in Mornington after 9pm and in breach of state government regulations and RV's Covid protocols. The following day all four were interviewed by RV stewards with respect to their attendance and the attendance of others at the Mornington gathering. The evidence tendered by them during their interview is alleged to be false and/or misleading given each, when asked to communicate the list of attendees at the Mornington gathering, failed to state that another jockey, Mark Zahra, was also in attendance. They are now set to face a Victorian Racing Tribunal at a date to be confirmed. RV stewards also issued one charge against Zahra for allegedly providing false and/or misleading evidence to them, having initially denied being present at the Airbnb when interviewed on August 28. All five riders had their licence suspended for three months.

VJA writes to riders after breach

Meanwhile, it has emerged that the Victorian Jockeys Association has written to its members urging them to "accept your responsibility" following last week's controversy. "You would

all be aware of the serious breaches of the government's Covid-19 regulations by four riders," VJA boss Matt Hyland wrote in a memo sent on Friday. "Every one of us needs to understand that we have no special entitlement to be able to continue racing. It's amazing that we have been permitted to continue over 18 months while so many other people in the community cannot work. So, I implore each and every one of you to accept your responsibility and follow the government and racing industry guidelines and regulations in relation to Covid-19."

Buckley's racing ban lifted

Ultra Thoroughbreds owner Sean Buckley has been permitted to race horses again in Victoria after settlement with Racing Victoria to lift an embargo placed on him while stewards investigated claims of embryo transplantation. Buckley was banned by RV from nominating horses to race in Victoria because he had "not fully complied with a direction of the stewards" while they investigated allegations that Buckley had bred two foals through artificial insemination. Ultra Thoroughbreds had applied for an urgent Supreme Court hearing, listed to go ahead yesterday in attempts to lift the embargo, but both parties reached a settlement before the hearing. RV yesterday issued a statement which said: "RV stewards reached agreement with Ultra Thoroughbred Racing Pty Ltd (UTR) and Sean Buckley prior to a listed court hearing today to lift the order imposed under AR 55 that has seen the Victorian race nominations for horses in which UTR or its proprietor Mr Buckley are the majority owner be refused since 31 March 2021. The stewards note that the investigation into alleged breaches of the rules of racing and Australian Stud Book Rules by UTR and/

or Mr Buckley remains ongoing. Accordingly, during the investigation, if the circumstances permit, the stewards retain the right to reject nominations of particular individual horses owned by UTR or Mr Buckley pursuant to AR 55."

Sky Command ready to race tomorrow

Gary Portelli's promising three-year-old filly Sky Command (Deep Field) will drop back from stakes grade to run in tomorrow's TAB Handicap (1000m) at Kensington. The filly won her first two starts before finishing down the track in the Rosebud (Listed, 1100m) at Randwick where she had excuses in defeat. "She got galloped on last start but we were lucky she suffered no major injury, she just lost her legs from under her," Portelli said. "I backed right off her and made sure there was no underlying issue there as she did stop quickly in the straight. But Brenton (Avdulla) said she would have run second or third if that didn't happen." Still only in her first racing preparation, Sky Command will compete against older horses for the first time tomorrow and is awkwardly drawn in barrier 11 with James McDonald in the saddle. "We're just regrouping with her and then we'll see what happens on Wednesday. It is still only her first preparation," Portelli added.

Blue's long road leads to The Kosciuszko

The Michelle Ritchie-trained Blue Missile (Smart Missile) will attempt to prove his Kosciuszko credentials when he lines up against Sky Command tomorrow. The winner of five races, Blue Missile almost never made it to the track after sustaining an injury while being transported to the breaker. "He was on a truck on his way up to the breaker/pre-trainer and the truck broke down and he was up Cambewarra Mountain," Ritchie said. "There was no way of actually getting the truck back off the mountain, so it had to be rolled back down with him on it. By the time we got the truck off the mountain and got him off after a few hours, he'd cut all his hock open. My target is The Kosciuszko. If that doesn't pan out, he'll just have the two runs this prep and he's still eligible for the Country Championships. He'll have two runs and if we don't get a Kosciuszko slot, I'll give him four weeks off then just get him ready for the Country Championships. I think he likes the give out of the ground better than a dry track, but he proved himself on both." Blue Missile has drawn barrier eight for the Benchmark 72 event, with Rachel King in the saddle.

Godolphin filly makes winning debut

Anthony and Sam Freedman sent out their latest winner for Godolphin when Suricate (Exceed And Excel) came from off the pace to make a winning start to her career in a 1106-metre maidan at Benalla yesterday. "She had been trialling up really nicely, albeit mostly on the bridle but we weren't quite sure what she was going to find off the bridle," co-trainer Sam Freedman told Racing.com after the three-quarter length win under Zac Spain. "She's always been a nice filly and we just told Zac to

give her a nice experience, let her find the line and it was nice to get the win on debut. She will probably get a bit further than that." Suricate is the first foal to race out of dual stakes winner Antelucan (Domesday) who herself is a half-sister to the former Freedman stakes winners Hazard (Flying Spur), Java (Medaglia D'Oro) and Crucial (Nadeem). "She's bred to get a shorter trip with a lot of speed in her family," Freedman continued. "With these Godolphin fillies we'll be looking to get a metropolitan win with her. If she can progress to further (in class) than that then this is the time of year because there's no hiding when you start to step out in better races."

Elephant likely to contest Feehan

The unbeaten Elephant (Shocking) is likely to contest Saturday's Feehan Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) at Moonee Valley in preference to an open handicap over the same distance at the same meeting. The Emma-Lee and David Browne-trained five-year-old won impressively over 1400 metres at Caulfield earlier this month in a Benchmark 84 to keep his five from five record intact. But with significant spring targets looming, connections are leaning towards the \$500,000 mile contest as a means of bolstering the gelding's rating in a race that will feature a number of stayers resuming. "It is probably where we are going to head, mainly just to see where he sits now," Browne said. "He needs quite a few points to get in a lot of those better races. Sooner or later we are going to have to go against better opposition and it is probably a nice race. It is at a good distance for him and it is not necessarily the very top but enough to give you a good line of where you're at." With Damian Lane, who was on board last time, committed to fellow Kiwi The Chosen One (Savabeel), Luke Currie will ride Elephant on Saturday.

Valley a better fit for Nonconformist

Grahame Begg is confident he's made the right decision bypassing a race at Caulfield for a tilt at the Feehan Stakes with Nonconformist (Rebel Raider). Begg initially considered the Heatherlie (Listed, 1700m) at Caulfield last Saturday for Nonconformist but instead opted

for the Moonee Valley race this weekend. "It (the Heatherlie) was ridiculously run, a non-event, so hopefully we've ended up pulling the right rein," Begg said. Nonconformist is being targeted at the Caulfield Cup (Gr 2400m) and goes into the Feehan second-up after finishing sixth behind Sierra Sue (Darci Brahma) in the P. B. Lawrence Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Caulfield on August 14. Begg said in that contest Nonconformist was not fully tested but was happy with how he's trained on since the run. "He had a bowl down the back straight with Dr Drill. It was nice striding work, they weren't out to break any records. It was a good opportunity to give him some time away from Caulfield, a change of environment, some stimulation and it was just what he needed. The three weeks between suits better than the two weeks, not that he had a hard run and when he was winning as a three-year-old, he enjoyed a bit of space between his runs. He's not a horse that you need to race every two weeks, just so long as he's happy." A total of 19 possibles have been nominated for the Feehan and the winner is exempt from the ballot of the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) at Moonee Valley on October 23.

Taunting to head to Moonee Valley

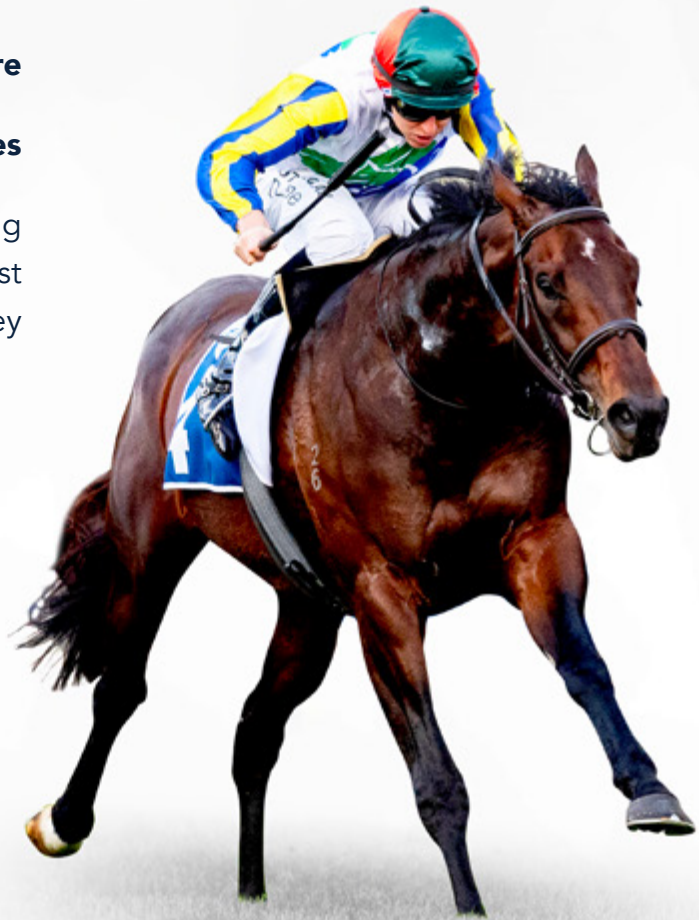
Reigning premier Adelaide trainer Michael Hickmott will test progressive colt Taunting (Brazen Beau) over 1200 metres at Moonee Valley on Saturday in what he hopes is an audition for the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). Part-owned by Hickmott and Seymour Bloodstock, Taunting raced three times as a late two-year-old, winning his last two starts by a combined five lengths. "I'm looking forward to kicking him off next Saturday and getting a better idea about where he fits in this spring," Hickmott told Racing.com. "At this stage, there are a few different options for him so his performance on Saturday, as well as Brett Prebble's feedback, will be telling as to what path we look to take. Aside from his ability, the horse's greatest asset is his mind and his ability to relax. We've gone forward on the horse at his last two starts due to track conditions but I think he'll be a much better horse ridden with cover. Both Jess (Eaton) and I were extremely pleased with his trial (at Murray Bridge) on Friday."

Prebble gains Incentivise experience

In-form jockey Brett Prebble had his first ride on highly fancied Cups contender Incentivise (Shamus Award) in a trial at Cranbourne yesterday. Yet to race for new trainer Peter Moody, Incentivise was given an easy time in the 1190-metre opening heat of the session. A winner of six of his nine starts in Queensland for part-owner Steve Tregaea, Incentivise is set to run first-up in the Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Flemington on September 11. Prebble, who burst back into Group 1 winning form aboard Behemoth (All Too Hard) in the Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield last Saturday, described Incentivise as a "Group 1 horse" in the making. "He's a proper horse," Prebble told RSN. "He's got a great action, a great temperament and a great set of lungs. It's going to be interesting, but I think he will run a respectable race over a mile for sure." The trial was conducted on a Heavy 9 surface and Prebble said the son of Shamus Award (Snitzel) would have no trouble handling rain-affected ground during the spring. "He didn't miss a beat out there," Prebble said. "Onwards and upwards. He feels like a quality stayer."

Williams to ride Behemoth in Rupert Clarke

Craig Williams has been booked to ride last Saturday's Memsie Stakes winner Behemoth at his next start in the Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield on September 18. Williams has a strong record on the David Jolly-trained gelding having won two Group 1 races on him so far including last year's edition of the Rupert Clarke Stakes. "Great to officially welcome Craig Williams back into the saddle of Behemoth for the Group 1 Rupert Clarke. The champ will be looking for back to back wins in the race and he looks to have pulled up enormous after his impressive third Group 1 win," Grand Syndicates racing manager Sam Lyons said. Behemoth was named South Australian Horse of the Year at the weekend. And in a further boost for the champion jockey, Williams is also in the frame to ride Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux) over the spring. James McDonald is set to

once again partner the Group 1 winner when he makes his return in Saturday's Tramway Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) but Zaaki's trainer Annabel Neasham yesterday said she would look to use the services of Williams if Covid regulations prevented McDonald from travelling to Melbourne. "If James can't get down, I've been in talks with Craig Williams, who is keen to ride him," Neasham told Racing.com. "I haven't committed for the whole prep yet but I think if he does come down for the Underwood, he'll ride him there. But I suppose I am holding out a small glimmer of hope that by the Cox Plate they could get Sydney jockeys down there. If not, I am sure Craig will be keen to ride him. It's nothing I am too worried about as he's a straightforward horse. If not James, then Craig looks a good option."

Artorius heavily backed for Guineas

Star colt Artorius (Flying Artie) has been heavily backed in futures markets to win the Caulfield Guineas after his impressive return to finish second in last Saturday's McNeil Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield. The Anthony and Sam Freedman trained three-year-old has been backed into \$4.60 (from \$8) after he hit the line hard behind Bruckner (Snitzel). He will now be aiming to emulate the feat of Super Seth (Dundeel), who won the classic two years ago for Anthony Freedman. Masked Crusader (Toronado), another impressive performer at Caulfield last weekend coming from last to win The Heath (Gr 3, 1100m), has also been a firmer in the betting for major races coming up and is now the equal favourite at \$5 with Nature Strip (Nicconi) for October's \$15 million The Everest.

Amarelinha arrives in Sydney

Te Akau Racing's Australian raiding party received more firepower over the weekend with the addition of last season's New Zealand Filly of the Year Amarelinha (Savabeel) to their Sydney barn. The Group 1 winner arrived in Australia on Sunday in preparation for her likely first target of the spring, the Bill Ritchie Handicap (Gr 3, 1400m) at Randwick

next month. "She is in good shape. She arrived there yesterday morning. She had a good trip over and settled in well," the filly's trainer Jamie Richards said. "She had a canter this morning and everything seems to be going to plan at this stage." Amarelinha had two trials in New Zealand, including a runner-up result behind stablemate Entriviere (Tavistock) over 900 metres at Ellerslie earlier this month. Richards has taken it quietly with the daughter of Savabeel (Zabeel) since then but has been pleased with her progression prior to leaving his Matamata base. "We just backed off a bit after that trial at Ellerslie," he said. "She seems to be going well and she is a mare that is going to appreciate it being a bit warmer in Sydney."

Entriviere back on track

Meanwhile, Richards has received positive reports from his father, Te Akau travelling foreman Paul, about the progress of Entriviere after suffering a minor foot issue earlier this month which ruled her out of the Toy Show Quality (Gr 3, 1100m). "She seems to be in pretty good shape. Dad is happy with how she is doing over there and the plan is for her to trial on Thursday as well," Richards said. "She will kick-off on Saturday-week in the Sheraco, it should be a nice race for her first-up - a Group 2 1200 metres fillies and mares."

Melbourne campaign off for Glycon

Group 2 winner Glycon (Le Havre) will stay in Europe this year as opposed to heading to the Melbourne Spring Carnival. The five-year-old was a cosy winner of Sunday's Grand Prix de Deauville (Gr 2, 2500m) after which owner and breeder Andreas Putsch revealed the Jean-Claude Rouget-trained gelding would remain at home. "We will think about the rest of the year with him but he will not go to Australia, we had entered him just in case," Putsch said. "Maybe we could give it a try next year but, with Covid and the restrictions in place, it's too complicated this year. Glycon had problems early in his career and we gave him time. He has become a good horse and, although he is five years old, he has not run much and is still young."

Boss reflective about Covid restrictions

Glen Boss has described how stories he heard while quarantining in the Northern Territory made him "disappointed to be an Australian". Boss spent several days in the NT as he prepared to return to Victoria to ride during the Spring Carnival but just hours after arriving he was told he would have to return to Sydney on the next available flight after rules at the Howard Springs quarantine facility changed. Boss and his wife Sloane departed days later, ruling him out of the coveted ride on Incentivise and Cox Plate contender Alligator Blood (All Too Hard). "To be very honest, my story pales into insignificance with what's really going on," Boss told RSN927. "I'm fortunate that I got back to Sydney and I'm going to start my job again. The real stories you hear, from the couple of days we were there ... I am actually really disappointed to be an Australian at the moment. It's horrendous the way things have been handled," Boss said he believed the publicity surrounding his decision to ride in Victoria influenced the about face that saw him told to return home and said the decision has taken a heavy toll on his family. "It's been a hell of a ride, the last couple of weeks. But that's the landscape that we live in. It's the cards we have been dealt with and we have to deal with the umpire's rules. It's been really tough, we are living out of a suitcase because we only took enough stuff to go to Howard Springs and then to Melbourne. Everything was packed up and sent to Melbourne."

McDougall moves to Victoria

Blaike McDougall is set to spend some time riding in Victoria after the 27-year-old rode at Benalla yesterday, his first meeting since crossing the New South Wales border earlier this month. McDougall's manager Hayden Kelly told Racing.com that McDougall would remain in Victoria in the quest for Spring Carnival success. "He quarantined in Albury for a couple of weeks in the bubble and now he has to remain in Victoria, in the border bubble areas for two weeks," Kelly said. "He can still ride in those border bubble areas, so he can still go to Bendigo, Mildura, Swan Hill and those places along the border. But the plan is once the two weeks is complete to then head to Melbourne and have a crack."

Racing Queensland announce all-weather track plan

Racing Queensland will seek to reduce the number of abandoned meetings in South East Queensland by implementing an all-weather track procedure from October. Over the past three years, 26 SEQ meetings have been abandoned due to the weather or track conditions, costing the industry \$5.8 million in prize-money. Having recently installed the new Polytrack at the Sunshine Coast Turf Club, RQ will seek to introduce a procedure which will allow race meetings at turf tracks to be transferred to the SCTC all-weather track after considering the track rating and the prevailing and forecast weather conditions. This includes meetings scheduled for the SCTC course proper, along with other turf tracks across SEQ.

NEW ZEALAND

Syndicates paying dividends for Pike supporters

Like most New Zealand trainers, Tony Pike is champing at the bit to see racing recommence once the Covid lockdown restrictions are eased around the majority of the country. Pike has a large spring team ready to roll, with the stable likely to have 31 horses at the Cambridge trials scheduled for Friday. A number of those runners will come from the younger members of his racing team, a situation that Pike relishes after generating plenty of success at the two- and three-year-old level in recent seasons. A significant component of that success has come from horses sourced by Pike for a syndicate of high-profile individuals and stud farms that he first put together for the 2019 National Yearling Sale at Karaka. Pike struck gold that year with Not An Option (Not A Single Doubt), who won his first two races, including the Wakefield Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m), before a controlling interest was purchased by Cambridge Stud. The trainer is getting ready to unleash the syndicate's class of 2021 in the next few months and is excited by the firepower he has at his disposal. "When we first put that syndicate together in 2018, it was a little bit of a trip into the unknown," he said. "The great thing was the people who came on board

were committed to the concept and got off to a fantastic start with Not An Option performing the way he did and attracting the interest of Cambridge Stud. From our 2020 purchases we have Tutukaka, who we are aiming at the Derby in Melbourne. I'm thrilled with the success we have had and I can't wait to see our 2021 group step out later this year. One of the standouts is the Charm Spirit ex Lady Kipling colt we paid \$280,000 for from the Windsor Park Stud draft. He is just a beautiful horse and one of the nicest two-year-olds I have had for quite a while. He has handled everything we have sent his way so far and is coping with the pressure well, so I'm really keen to see what he can do on raceday."

From the photograph he sent me I can see he's a good leggy foal, so all in all it's a great result." Opulence will return to Zed (Zabeel), who Corcoran anticipates will cover a book of 70-80 mares this spring off the back of a season that besides Verry Elleegant also included Wellington Cup (Gr 3, 3200m) and NZ St Leger (Listed, 2600m) winner Waisake, Ballarat Cup (Listed, 2000m) winner Irish Flame and Avondale Cup (Gr 2, 2400m) winner Robusto.

Auckland neighbours celebrate Sydney success

Covid-19 lockdown makes for testing times at present, but the weekend news from Sydney for Goodwin and his Auckland near-neighbour David Paykel has given them something to celebrate. In the past three years Goodwin has been having the time of his life as the breeder and co-owner of Verry Elleegant, while over a much longer period Paykel has enjoyed numerous successes with horses carrying his canary and pink colours. On Saturday Verry Elleegant was the headline act when various awards for the 2020-21 season were announced by the New South Wales Racehorse Owners' Association while Paykel's current leading light So Wicked (Street Cry), a stablemate of Verry Elleegant in Chris Waller's star-studded line-up, took the award as the most prolific performer on Australian Turf Club tracks. "I was absolutely gobsmacked to be told," her owner-breeder admitted. "I didn't even know they had an award of that nature, but we're thrilled that our mare has won it."

Starspangledbanner's (Choisir) Flotus (2 f ex Floriade by Invincible Spirit) romped to victory in Ripon's Champion Two-Year-Old Trophy (Listed, 6f) yesterday, becoming the 21st individual stakes winner for the Rosemont Stud stallion. Owned by Jean-Etienne Dubois, the trainer of Todman Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Aylmerton (Siyouni), as well as Ben Kwok, Flotus won by four and a half lengths over Hellomydarlin (Galileo Gold), with Atomic Lady (Kodiac) six lengths behind the winner in third. A €65,000 foal, the Simon and Ed Crisford-trained Flotus was purchased for 125,000gns at the Tattersalls October Book 1 Yearling Sale and is the seventh individual stakes winner

this calendar year for Starspangledbanner, which includes Saratoga Derby (Gr 1, 9.5f) State Of Rest, and the Rosemont-owned Brooklyn Hustle, winner of the Dane Ripper Stakes (Gr 2, 1300m) at Eagle Farm in June. Starspangledbanner will stand for a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST) this season.

11 for Ribchester

Beautiful Surprise (2 f ex Lovely Surprise by Shamardal) made a winning debut in a restricted maiden stakes over seven furlongs at Epsom yesterday, becoming the 11th individual winner for Haunui Farm shuttler Ribchester (Iffraaj). Sent off the 9-4 favourite, the filly defeated Shabano (Amaron) by a head, with Psychic Change (Due Diligence) a further two and a half lengths back in third. The Hugo Palmer-trained juvenile, who races in the colours of Dr Ali Ridha, owner of smart sprinter Gifted Master (Kodiac), is the second foal out of the winner Lovely Surprise (Shamardal), herself a daughter of Italian Group 1 winner Dubai Surprise (King's Best). Ribchester stands the 2021 season at Haunui Farm for a fee of NZ\$15,000 (Plus GST).


UK: Lone Eagle's career in doubt after injury setback

Irish Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) runner-up Lone Eagle (Galileo), owned by Aquis Farm in partnership with Ballylinch Stud, has his racing career in

the balance after suffering a fetlock fracture during his disappointing run in last month's King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 4f) at Ascot. The colt's trainer Martyn Meade said: "He's definitely out for the season. We'll have to see how he progresses from there as to whether he'll be able to run next season. It could be that his career is in doubt." The three-year-old colt was a 500,000gns buy for Aquis Farm from the Ballylinch draft at the Tattersalls October Book 1 Yearling Sale and had been slated to contest the St Leger Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 6.5f) before his injury.

US: \$8.2 million filly dies in track accident

Three-year-old filly America's Joy (American Pharoah), who sold for a record-breaking \$8.2 million to Mandy's Pope's Whisper Hill Farm at the 2019 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, suffered a fatal injury during training at Saratoga on Sunday. The filly, out of 2016 Broodmare of the Year Leslie's Lady (Tricky Creek) and half-sister to Spendthrift stallion Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday), was working in preparation for her debut at the track next month for trainer Todd Pletcher. She suffered a sesamoid fracture and fell after completing her breeze, and broke her neck, according to the New York Gaming Commission's equine incident database. Pletcher, quoted by Daily Racing Form, said: "It's very unfortunate, she was a very talented filly, a very sweet filly to be around. We hadn't had her that long, but she trained impressively and we were looking forward to her debut on closing day (September 6). That was a tough one." Leslie's Lady is also dam of Mendelssohn (Scat Daddy), winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (Gr 1, 8f) for Aidan O'Brien, as well as the UAE Derby (Gr 2, 1900m) by an extraordinary 18 and a half lengths, and now standing for Coolmore at Ashford Stud in Kentucky.

Written Tycoon's stakes-winning son Banquo to stand at Waikato Stud this year

Stakes-winning entire Banquo (Written Tycoon), the younger brother to Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) winning sprinter Booker, has been retired to stand at Waikato Stud in New Zealand on the eve of the breeding season.

Raced by Waikato Stud's Mark and Garry Chittick and partners including agent Bruce Perry, Lib Petagna and Jomara Bloodstock, Banquo won the Hilton Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at three for trainer Danny O'Brien who prepared the well-bred son of reigning champion sire Written Tycoon (Iglesia) for all but two of his 16 starts.

Banquo was also placed behind Group 1 winners Alabama Express (Redoute's Choice) and Microphone (Exceed And Excel), both of whom retired to stud in Australia last year, as an autumn three-year-old while he also finished fifth in the 2020 running of the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m).

By the same sire as sire sons Capitalist, Ole

Kirk, Dirty Work, Winning Rupert, Written By and Rich Enuff, he also split Group 1 winners Zoutori (Zoustar) and Tofane (Ocean Park) when finishing second in last year's Bobbie Lewis (Gr 2, 1200m), also down the Flemington straight course.

Banquo will stand for an introductory fee of \$4,000 (plus GST) after connections made the late call to retire him from racing after finishing fourth in the Aurie's Star Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) at Flemington on August 7.

"Banquo is an incredibly good-looking horse and he was very talented," O'Brien said.

"He won a stakes race at his third run as a three-year-old and raced very well for us the following spring, just beaten in a Group 2 race at Flemington as a four-year-old.

"He's a genuine Group-class sprinter that unfortunately we didn't get to see at his best."

Perry selected Banquo on behalf of the syndicate from the draft of Mill Park Stud at the 2018 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

Purchased for \$600,000, he is one of three

winners out of Noondie (Flying Spur), a half-sister to Listed winner Tranquility (Redoute's Choice) and the stakes-placed Impassioned (Redoute's Choice).

"Banquo made a statement as soon as he walked out as a yearling. He had presence and quality," Perry said.

"He was a very athletic and good moving yearling. Waikato Stud has an incredible history of success and for Mark to take him on shows the belief he has in Banquo.

"It's pretty special for Banquo and his owners, as we know he will get every opportunity. Waikato Stud don't get it wrong very often with their stallion selections."

Banquo is the fifth first season sire to be launched in New Zealand this year, joining Cambridge Stud shuttler Hello Youmzain (Kodiac), Windsor Park Stud's Circus Maximus (Galileo), Novara Park's King Of Comedy (Kingman) and Ancient Spirit (Invincible Spirit) who is standing at White Robe Lodge in the South Island.

Smith stars in Macau Gold Cup

It was billed as the race of the season, the clash of the titans, the much-awaited rematch between Macau's king and highest rated horse, Sacred Capital (O'Reilly), and the pretender to the throne, Star Of Yiu Cheung (Casino Prince); but in the end it turned out a one horse affair, with Star Of Yiu Cheung simply demolishing his opposition with a runaway win in the 30th running of the Macau Gold Cup (Listed, 1800m) on Sunday.

To use trainer Wayne Smith's own words, "that was simply awesome, it was freakish," and it was; a soft six-length win and a result that was never in doubt after the first few hundred metres.

Star of Yiu Cheung began like a rocket and went straight to the front to lead the Cup field out of the straight the first time; once in the back jockey Shogo Nakano got the son of Casino Prince (Flying Spur) to relax and come back under him, and then rode him to perfection. Still under a hold at the top of the straight, Nakano let the bay gelding stride and a shake up at the two hundred saw him sprint away to establish a seven-length break on the remainder of the field.

At the line it was Star of Yiu Cheung eased down by six from Top Mountain legend (Manhattan Rain) in second, with Qian Gua (Cape Blanco) running in third.

Smith was very confident going into the race, and declared on Thursday morning that he was going to avenge his nose defeat by Sacred Capital in last year's Cup, but admitted after the race he was blown away by the ease of the win.

"I truly expected him to win but he just trotted in, he just destroyed them," he said.

"Shogo (Nakano) and this horse are a match made in heaven; he gets the horse to relax so well he just gets on so well with him."

"It was always in the back of my mind that he might want to go a bit hard in front having

only had two 1200 metres races as a lead in, but Shogo just rated him to perfection."

Last season Star Of Yiu Cheung was the proverbial bridesmaid, being the runner up in the Derby Trial (Listed, 1500m) to Winnie Star, second in the Macau Guineas (Listed, 1500m) to Hostwin Saturn, beaten a short head in the Macau Derby (Listed, 1800m) by Sacred Magnate, and beaten a nose in the last stride by Sacred Capital in the Macau Gold Cup.

However, it's been a different ball game this season, and Smith described the six-year-old bay gelding as now a really serious racehorse.

"He has come back this season as the real finished article, the perfect racehorse. Two runs back he bolts in and breaks a 13-year-old track record doing 1200 metres in 1.07.2, and now he trots in over 1800 metres on a heavy track."

Smith finished the season on 26 winners, a superb effort given he has only 15 horses in his yard. As well he managed 31 placed efforts from his 174 runners giving him a 15 per cent win rate and a 33 per cent place rate.

"It's been a good steady season. There were no highs or lows, the horses just ran consistently all season so I couldn't ask for more than that."

Sacred Capital, who jumped as second favorite, was never really in contention on a

track that was riding on the heavy side and after being caught three and four deep in the run turned in a career worst performance, finishing a distant tenth, 23 lengths away. Stablemate Sacred Magnate (Foxwedge) fared not much better finishing sixth, just over 13 lengths away.

A very down to earth Joe Lau had this to say of his runners after the race.

"It was obvious to me after the first three hundred metres or so that Sacred Capital was not going to be there. They were really getting into the ground and he was not the same horse and ended up very wide," he said.

"Sacred Magnate was the same, he was never happy on the ground. I've checked them out and they have pulled up well, there were no problems. It just wasn't our day; they were different horses on the day."

Shogo Nakano stole riding honors on the day, winning three races on the eight-race card, including the very next race after the Gold Cup on Smith's Pursuing Eagle (Holy Roman Emperor), who took out the Class 2 Handicap over 1200 metres. Pursuing Eagle won by a whopping eight and a half lengths over race favorite Fifer (Spirit of Boom), with Fortune Paradise (Animal Kingdom) in third.

It was win number six in Macau for the

son of Holy Roman Emperor (Danehill) and whilst Smith expected a bold showing he was astounded at the win.

"I truly expected him to run well as he was only beaten a half-length by Fifer last start, but he is for me a better horse on top of the ground; but he just blew them away on the heavy ground and won eased down."

Nakano's earlier winner was the Sio Cheong-prepared River Pentium (Better Than Ready) who led throughout to win the Class 3 & 4 over 1200 metres.

Luis Corrales picked up his sixth Macau champion jockey title to end the season on 73 wins, which has been another great achievement given that there were only 66 race days conducted.

Corrales now joins Manoel Nunes as the only two riders to win six titles. Eric Cheung was runner up on 57 victories, a fine effort in his first year as a senior rider, with Masa Tanaka in third spot on 43 winners.

Stanley Chin took out his second Macau

trainers' title with 49 winners, six ahead of Sio Cheong on 43, with Tony Fung in third spot on 30 wins.

Chin led in a double for the day with Star Of City Gold (Swiss Ace) in the Class 2 & 3 over 1800 metres and also provided the quinella in the race

with Treasurelakebuddy (Snitzel) a head way in second spot, and then picked up his second win for the day with the Hong Kong cast-off Marqula (Coast Guard) in the Class 3 & 4 Division 1 over 1200 metres, with Masa Tanaka on top.

Nick Moore finished the season on a winning note with Hostwin Jupiter (Testa Rossa) rocketing home late to score a last stride win in the Class 4 over 1500 metres.

Ridden by Cheung, Hostwin Jupiter

sprouted wings late to beat Big Alloy (Fozwedge), with the tearaway leader Dawson (Smart Missile) in third.

Moore finished with 19 winners for the season, a fine effort given he only has a small team of 14 horses in his barn. With a total of 133 runners for the year Moore's stats read 19 wins with 21 seconds and 13 third placed efforts giving him a 14 per cent win strike and a 40 per cent place hit.

NEW BOYS ARE READY

With the new breeding season almost upon us, Kiwi Chronicles takes a look at the four new boys added to the stallion ranks for this year.

Two of the four, Windsor Park Stud's Circus Maximus (Galileo) and Cambridge Stud's Hello Youmzain (Kodiac), are about to embark on their initial southern hemisphere duties, having already begun their new careers in Ireland and France respectively.

White Robe Lodge's Ancient Spirit (Invincible Spirit) and Novara Park's King Of Comedy (Kingman) are freshmen, this their maiden season, so to speak.

All are connected, either by pedigree, or, in the case of Circus Maximus and King Of Comedy, by their race record.

Hands up those who got up in the middle of the night to watch Hello Youmzain at Royal Ascot during the last lockdown, in June of 2020.

The writer did and I went back to bed with a smile on my face. Seeing local colours to the fore in one of the best sprints all year was worth the sleep interruption but better yet was the knowledge that Cambridge Stud and the Lindsays were able to enjoy some good news for a change, and we all know why.

Cambridge Stud CEO Henry Plumptre reports that Hello Youmzain has not disappointed upon first viewing him in the flesh.

"He is an imposing individual, very strong with great scope and rein. He travelled well and is easy to manage. He looks like he has been at Cambridge all his life!"

"And as for Almanzor, well he is his normal self, composed, laid back and knows exactly where he is," said Plumptre.

Hello Youmzain's book was full some months ago and that should come as no surprise, even sight unseen. His race record is superb. A Group 2 winner in France at two, a Group 1 sprint winner in the Haydock Sprint

Cup (6f) at three then a triumphant victory in the Diamond Jubilee Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) at Royal Ascot at four.

You had to admire his great fight from the furlong marker where he was giving up a half length but pulled out all the stops to get up. It was courage and tenaciousness at its best.

What more could breeders want, race wise?

His sire, Kodiac (Danehill) is a sensation. From small beginnings he has emerged from nowhere. The half-brother to Invincible Spirit (Green Desert) has become one of Europe's best sires.

The sires across the bottom line, Shamardal (Giant's Causeway), Sadler's Wells (Northern Dancer) and Mill Reef (Never Bend) are formidable and all were champion racehorses that went on to become top class sires.

His dam has foaled three stakes winners and is six for six re winners. Third dam, Sandy Island (Mill Reef), was a Group 3 winner and ranks as a direct three-quarter sister to Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) victor Slip Anchor who is by Shirley Heights, the son of Mill Reef, both also Epsom Derby winners.

Ancient Spirit and King Of Comedy share the same sire line, the latter being a grandson of Ancient Spirit's sire Invincible Spirit.

The sire line has been particularly strong in Australia over the last few years thanks largely

to I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) whose son Brazen Beau is off to a flying start with 14 stakes winners in his first three seasons at stud.

A dual Group 2 winner at three in Germany and rated the champion three-year-old of his year, Ancient Spirit remained sound to win twice at five at Listed level in Ireland.

His half-brother, Alson (Areion) is a French Group 1 winner, his dam is by Galileo (Sadler's Wells) and his Group 1 winning grandam Amarette (Monsun) is a three-quarter sister to Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) hero Almandin (Monsun).

White Robe Lodge's Wayne Stewart reports that Ancient Spirit is ready for his new life.

"He's an experienced traveller and arrived here in good order. When he stepped off the float he is exactly like his photo. He has settled in well and is a good doer, taking everything in his stride. Our agent in Ireland did a great job for us, forwarding pics and video, so we are very pleased.

"We have a number of stakes winning mares here and he will get his opportunity. He fits the mold of some of our previous stallions and reminds me of Noble Bijou (Vaguely Noble) in particular," said Stewart. "The response has been good with a recent booking from Australia and also from throughout New Zealand."

It would not be a stretch to suggest that Kingman, sire of King Of Comedy, is the heir apparent to Invincible Spirit, at least in the northern hemisphere.

The St James's Palace Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) at Royal Ascot in 2019 saw King Of Comedy take it to Circus Maximus. He was the only runner taking ground off the winner and behind him that day was the very talented Too Darn Hot (Dubawi).

Another fine effort that same season at three was in the Joel Stakes (Gr 2, 1m), finishing second to Benbatl (Dubawi) who, the previous year took out the Caulfield Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) and ran a gallant second behind the great Winx (Street Cry) in the 2018 Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m).

In third place in the Joel at Newmarket was current Cox Plate favourite Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux), who has made such a big impression since being imported to Australia.

King Of Comedy's best win took place in the Listed Heron Stakes (1m) at Sandown where he



King Of Comedy

was eased down over the last few strides yet still won easily.

He is a half-brother to Prix de Diane (Gr 1, 2100m) victress Star Of Seville (Duke Of Marmalade), they being two of three stakes winners from his dam Stage Presence (Selkirk), the latter a half-sister to the dam of four-time Grade 1 winner Winchester (Theatrical).

Novara Park's Luigi Muollo is still pinching himself that he managed to secure King Of Comedy for his Cambridge located stud.

"I am really excited about the prospects of King Of Comedy. Kingman continues to excel and King Of Comedy's value is increasing by the day," said Muollo.

"He was the only runner that made a race of the St James's Palace Stakes. The race is an outstanding stallion-maker. Just look at the winners since the turn of the century which include his own sire Kingman as well as Frankel, Shamardal and Shamardal's sire Giant's Causeway.

"Kingman has two of the best in the world right now namely Palace Pier in Europe and Domestic Spending in the USA. Palace Pier won the St James's Palace last year," added Muollo.

"There were are few hiccups with travel and his trip took longer than desired but he is thriving at his new home," said Muollo. "My mare, Broodmare of the Year nominee Extra Explosive, dam of Explosive Jack, was one of the first mares added to his book."

The victor in the stallion-making St James's Palace Stakes was Windsor Park Stud's Circus

Maximus, one of his three Group 1 successes. A second Group 1 at three, in the Prix du Moulin (1600m), saw Circus Maximus declared Champion French Miler.

His three-year-old season also included a second to Too Darn Hot in the Sussex Stakes (1m) at Goodwood, then fourth in the Breeders' Cup Mile (8f), but he was not finished.

He returned to Royal Ascot at four, bagged the Queen Anne Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) and added four Group 1 placings including another tilt at Breeders' Cup honours, this time finishing second in the Breeders' Cup Mile.

Circus Maximus is the only foal of his dam, Duntle (Daneshill Dancer), a Group 2 Royal Ascot winner of the Duke of Cambridge Stakes (1m), one of her five wins including four stakes. She also recorded three Group 1 placings.

His grandam, Lady Angola, is a three-quarter sister to USA Grade 1 winner Honor In War (Lord At War) who ultimately took his talents to Sydney and scored in the Villiers Handicap (Gr 2, 1400m) at Randwick as a nine-year-old, one of his eleven wins, beating no less than international sprint star Takeover Target (Celtic Swing).

Windsor Park Stud proprietor Rodney Schick reports that Circus Maximus travelled like a soldier and arrived in Cambridge in great order.

"He stepped off the float as if he owned the place, was relaxed and went straight into his feed," said Schick.

"He is a cracking type, robust and easily

lived up to our expectations, so we are rapt. Coolmore have looked after him very well. There is no better operation than Coolmore. He has a serious book of mares and was full weeks ago and will cover 150 mares," added Schick.

Three-time Group 1 winners are rare. The industry is fortunate to have access to such quality.

It wasn't always like this.

The stallion industry has seen a significant change in commercial requirements since the middle of the last century.

When Sir Patrick Hogan imported Sir Tristram (Sir Ivor) in the mid 1970s, he was following a somewhat necessary pattern that had evolved over previous decades. That pattern was standing stallions with Classic bloodlines but without the desired performance. In Sir Tristram' case, his best black-type efforts resulted in three fourth placings. Such stallions were, largely, all that the New Zealand industry could afford.

However, the stallions we did import succeeded despite their race records. Throughout the 1950s and 1960s champion sires Count Rendered (Precipitation) and Summertime (Precipitation) were up to winning handicaps. Classic and Group winners were too expensive.

The following decade saw sire sensation Pakistan II (Palestine) impact the scene. He was also Classically connected but his race form was not too exciting even though his trainer, Alec Head, rated the horse, claiming that had he found a way to get the horse's back right, his record would have been much better.

During the same decade a similar profile was followed in the form of Copenhagen II (Royal Charger) and the unraced Mellay (Never Say Die).

Two rare exceptions to the above rule are Okawa Stud's Faux Tirage (Big Game), winner of the St James's Palace Stakes and Te Parae Stud's Oncidium (Alcide). Both were high class performers who became champion sires and both would ultimately add strongly to the New Zealand Stud Book's gene pool.

And so to this season, and, by a new (commercial) necessity, all four of the new boys on the block are well-performed as well as being nicely-bred. Let the season begin.

Kiwis Can't Be Denied

The winning margin in Saturday's Cockram Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) doesn't tell the race's story. Probabeel (Savabeel) was thoroughly professional. Her acceleration once she straightened was the real story. She made up five lengths to almost form a line of three at the 100 metres, which was the winning of a race that should have been a little short for the now five-year-old.

The first three were out on their own but the mare knows where the post is and despite the short neck advantage she appeared in control.

Her winning time compared very favourably with that in the Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) run an hour and fifteen minutes later. Extrapolating her 1:10.58 for the 1200 metres translates to 1:22.34 for 1400 metres. The Memsie was won by Behemoth (All Too Hard) in 1:23.59. An extra 200 metres? There would be no way that Probabeel would have taken more than 13 seconds.

Aegon is back

Aegon (Sacred Falls) is back. His preferred racing style was never going to be helpful at Caulfield, a tricky layout at the best of times, especially in his first attempt there and against Group 1 company.

From well back then switching ground several times in the run home, he really pinned his ears back once he saw daylight and will be competitive wherever he lines up next,

provided he has a straight long enough to truly wind up.

Co-trainer and part-owner Andrew Forsman is, rightly so, delighted with the run.

Ayrton too

Boom sprinter-miler Ayrton (Iffraaj) continued on his winning way with a decisive victory in the last on the Caulfield card. He had to be kept up to his work but lengthened his stride when asked, to control the race, his fifth win in six starts.

Co-trainer Mick Price's dirt-bike riding career might be in tatters but his ability to train and oversee the emerging career of such a boom galloper, is very much intact.

Kiwis prominent elsewhere

Morphettville, Kembla Grange and Doomben were each impacted by two Kiwi winners, the stakes victory by the former Kevin Gray-trained Second Slip (Alamosa) being another stand out.

In the central districts of the North Island, Second Slip raced 12 times for two wins and six minor placings, leaving New Zealand on a winning note in March of last year.

Since his arrival in South Australia Second Slip has been on a roll, scoring a treble during January and February, which included a successful Melbourne raid.

Back home (Morphettville), in March he was tried in Listed stakes class for the first time and was a solid three-quarters of a length

second behind Night Raid (Vancouver) in the Matrice Stakes (1200m).

His current preparation saw him head back to Melbourne fresh up and a strong win over 1100 metres at Caulfield two weeks ago.

Saturday's all-the-way stakes success was one of his easiest, slipping clear past the 200 metres and he was under no pressure at the post.

The other Kiwi at Morphetville was Moscow Red (Road to Rock) who may be an eight-year-old mare but in scoring her eighth win appears not quite ready to head to the breeding barn.

She, too, did her early racing in New Zealand, winning her only start under the name of Moscow Mistress at Hastings as a late three-year-old when trained by John Bary.

Her seven further wins from the Ballarat stable of Henry Dwyer have seen the mare bag victories at Sandown (twice) and now at Morphetville.

When Moscow Red is retired there are some worthwhile bloodlines to breed from. Her dam,

Miss Faberge (Ustinov) is a winning half-sister to Innovation (Keeper), winner of seven races, including three Listed stakes.

At Kembla Grange, Signora Nera (Sweynesse), also formerly trained in New Zealand by Allan Sharrock, showed that she has strengthened from her three-year-old season.

A storming run from well back then bolting clear by three lengths over the 1500 metres suggests there is lots more in store for the Sweynesse (Lonhro) mare.

Prior to her transfer to Chris Waller's stable, Signora Nera recorded two wins and three placings, including a strong third in the Eulogy Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Awapuni in December last year.

Her five-start autumn campaign in Sydney and Brisbane were all stakes races, wrapping up with a fighting third behind Duais (Shamus Award) in the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m).

Signora Nera is out of a mare by Red Clubs (Red Ransom), a top class sprinter and winner of the Haydock Sprint Cup, whose promising stud career was cut short after just two seasons (one here in New Zealand).

His two northern hemisphere crops included the English 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) winner Sky Lantern. Considering there are so few (21 New Zealand foals) by Red Clubs in existence it is interesting that Bonita Aurelia, the Group 3 winner now with Jamie Richards, is also by Sweynesse from the Red Clubs mare Cassie May. Signora Nera's dam, Madonna Mia, who won nine including the Listed Wanganui Cup (2040m), is the best of them.

Chris Waller also took out the following race with ex-Kiwi Our Intrigue (Showcasing),

adding her fourth win in a career of 22 starts by powering home to get up in the last stride.

Formerly with Tony Pike, Our Intrigue won twice in New Zealand as well as in Queensland not long after finishing second in the Championship Stakes (Gr 2, 2100m) at Ellerslie in April of 2019.

At Doomben, yet another formerly Kiwi-trained performer, London Banker (Tavistock), bagged his third successive Brisbane win, his sixth start since transferring from the stable of Roger James and Robert Wellwood, from where he won his first four races.

Smart and good

How good is Weona Smartone (Shamexpress)? A picket fence of six on end says he is, indeed, pretty smart.

Stepped out once as three-year-old, Weona Smartone did not see race action again until September last year and in the interim remains undefeated, including three super wins at Doomben.

In late March over 1110 metres he drew three lengths clear and toyed with them, while in early June over 1200 metres he bolted in by six lengths, leading all the way.

On Saturday he was taken on in front (and was not happy about it either, tossing his head about when headed early) but in the straight ran on very well in a smart 1:08.66 for the 1200 metres.

A true Windsor Park Stud creation, Weona Smartone was a stunning yearling and fetched \$160,000 from Book 1 of the 2018 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale, purchased by David Vandyke, the gelding's trainer.

New first season sire winners

Caravaggio - Coolmore's Caravaggio (Scat Daddy) sired a 16th individual winner on Thursday when his son Don Julio (2 c ex Remember Alexander by Teofilo) landed a seven and a half furlong maiden claimer at Tipperary. The Donnacha O'Brien-trained colt defeated Hul Ah Bah Loo (Raven's Pass) by one and three-quarter lengths, with 9-4 favourite Ardluasa (Dandy Man) a further length and a half in arrears. Don Julio, a 110,000gns buy for his trainer from the Tattersalls October Book 1 yearling sale, is out of Group 3 winner Remember Alexander (Teofilo), herself a half-sister to Memory (Daneshill Dancer), a winner of the Cherry Hinton Stakes (Gr 2, 6f), and the Albany Stakes (Gr 3, 6f) at Royal Ascot. Caravaggio's 17th individual first-crop winner came when Madonnadelrosario (2 f ex Muravka by High Chaparral) landed a seven-furlong nursery at the Curragh on Friday. The Aidan O'Brien-trained filly was sent off a 16-1 chance after running sixth at Leopardstown earlier this month but defied those odds with a half-length defeat of Malayan (The Gurkha). Nectarine (Parish Hall) was the same distance further behind in third. The sixth foal out of unraced mare Muravka (High Chaparral), Madonnadelrosario is a half-sister to former shuttler The Wow Signal

(Starspangledbanner), winner of the 2014 Prix Morny (Gr 1, 1200m), and this year's Takarazuka Kinen (Gr 1, 2200m) runner-up Unicorn Lion (No Nay Never). Caravaggio, who shuttled to Australia for one season in 2018, stood at Ashford Stud in Kentucky for \$25,000 (approx. AU\$34,200) last year.

Highland Reel - Reel Rosie (2 f ex Lady Canford by Canford Cliffs) scored on debut over seven furlongs at Redcar on Saturday for Ed Bethell to become the third individual winner from the first crop of globetrotter Highland Reel (Galileo). One of only two debutants in the field of 15, she was held up and showed signs of greenness in the early stages, but

when asked the question she extended well in the closing stages to win by a neck from the favourite Bellstreet Bridie (Sir Percy), with Wee Poppy (Aclaim) half a length further back in third. Bred by Richard Nolan's Oldcourt Stud in Ireland, she was offered at Tattersalls as a yearling but unsold for 11,000gns and subsequently syndicated. She is the second runner and winner out of Lady Canford (Canford Cliffs), who was also trained by Bethell and is a half-sister to the stakes-placed French Quebec (Excellent Art) and Perfect Madge (Acclamation). Coolmore shuttler Highland Reel is available at Swettenham Stud this year for an unchanged fee of \$16,500.

Ribchester - Ribchester (Iffraaj) sired his tenth individual winner on Wednesday when Tollard Royal (2 c ex Dew Line by Vale Of York) comfortably took out a mile novice stakes at Kempton on his debut for trainer George Boughey. Ridden by jockey James Doyle and sent off the second favourite, Tollard Royal took early control of the race from the front and kicked clear inside the final furlong to win by three and a half lengths from Berkshire Breeze (Mastercraftsman) with race favourite Peak Perfect (Anodin) a further length back in third. Bought for £28,000 (approx. AU\$52,000) by John and Jake Warren at the Goffs Orby Sales in September 2020, Tollard Royal is the first foal of Listed-placed dam Dew Line, herself a half-sister to useful winners Sir Roderic (Roderic O'Connor) and Comfort Line (Alhebayeb). Bred by Thomastown Farm and now owned by Isa Salman Al Khalifa, the colt has an entry in the Royal Lodge Stakes (Gr 2, 1m) on September 25. Ribchester will shuttle to Haunui Farm in New Zealand this breeding season where he stands for a fee of \$15,000 (Plus GST).

Time Test - Turn Back Time (2 f ex Diamond Run by Hurricane Lane) landed a seven-furlong fillies' maiden at Lingfield on Wednesday to provide Little Avondale shuttler Time Test (Dubawi) with his fifth individual first-crop winner. The Mark Johnston-trained filly had placed in all three of her previous starts, including a second-placed effort at Brighton earlier this month, and her consistency was rewarded with a half-length defeat of Trans Montana (Mondialiste). El Felicia (El Kabeir) was a further length back in third. Turn Back Time is the second scorer from four to race out of winning mare Diamond Run, who is a half-sister to stakes performers Ivory Gala (Galileo) and Alo Pura (Anabaa). Time Test, who will stand at Little Avondale for NZ\$8,500 (plus GST) this year, has already sired a stakes winner in Tardis, while his daughter Sunset Shiraz outran her odds to finish runner-up in the Debutante Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) at the Curragh on August 21.

New Group/Grade 1 winners

Uncle Mo - Yaupon (4 c ex Modification by Vindication) won an extraordinary renewal of the Forego Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) at Saratoga on Saturday, in which runner-up Firenze Fire (Poseidon's Warrior) appeared to bite the Steve Asmussen-trained entire as the pair went head-to-head in the straight. Race favourite Yaupon prevailed by a head after leading throughout in the seven-furlong contest, with a two-and-a-half-length gap back to Chance It (Currency Swap) in third. The progressive four-year-old takes his record to six wins from eight starts after winning on his first step up to seven furlongs. Yaupon returned a beaten favourite in the Golden Shaheen (Gr 1, 1200m) in Dubai earlier this year, but landed a first elite-level success at the Saratoga meet, becoming the ninth individual Group/Grade 1 winner for his sire Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie). The former Australian shuttler stood the 2021 season for a fee of \$175,000 (approx. AU\$240,000) at Coolmore's Ashford Stud in Kentucky.

New stakes winners

Adlerflug - Adlerflug (In The Wings) sired his 20th individual stakes winner when his

son Loft (3 c ex Labrice by Dubawi) got off the mark at the seventh attempt with a victory in Sunday's Baden Galopp Stehercup (Listed, 2800m). Ankunft (New Approach) finished second with Diamantis (Golden Horn) third. Loft is the second foal out of the Dubawi (Dubai Millennium) mare Labrice, who herself is out of a winning sister to Japan Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Lando (Acetenango). Adlerflug stands at Gestut Schlenderhan for a 2021 fee of €16,000 (approx. AU\$25,800).

Alamosa - Four-time Group 1 winner Alamosa (O'Reilly) landed a 19th individual stakes winner as the Will Clarken-trained Second Slip (5 g ex Scarlet O'Hara by Fast N Famous) justified odds-on favouritism to claim the Leon Macdonald Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Morphettville on Saturday, winning by two and a half lengths over Ritratto (Fiorente) and Extreme Thrill (Bullet Train), who was a long neck further back in third. Five-year-old Second Slip won two of his 12 races in New Zealand, and now takes his record to seven wins from 19 starts, since moving to South Australia, with this his maiden stakes success. Alamosa stands at Wellfield Lodge in Palmerston North for a private fee in 2021.

Daiwa Major - Daiwa Major (Sunday Silence) sired his 38th individual stakes winner when Serifos (2 c ex Sea Front by Le Havre) followed up his debut win by landing Sunday's Niigata Nisai Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m). The Mitsumasa Nakauchida-trained colt, who was stepping up in grade following his success in a newcomers race in June, beat favourite Arrival (Harbinger) by a length and a quarter. Otaru Ever (Leontes) was another three-quarters of a length away in third. Daiwa Major stands at Shadai Stallion Station for a private fee.

Dansili - Acanella (3 f ex Across The Floor by Oasis Dream) caused an upset in Friday's Snow Fairy Fillies Stakes (Gr 3, 1m 1f) at the Curragh to provide Dansili (Danehill) with his 149th individual stakes winner. The Ger Lyons-trained filly was rated a 16-1 shot after running unplaced in her previous two starts, both in Listed company, but showed improved form to defeat Group 1 winner Champers Elysees (Elzaam) by three-quarters of a length. Oodnadatta (Australia) was the same distance further behind in third. Acanella, now the winner of two of her six starts, is the second foal out of Across The Floor (Oasis Dream), who is a half-sister to multiple elite-level winner Flintshire (Dansili). Former Juddmonte stallion Dansili was retired from stud duties in 2018.

Dubawi - Dilawar (4 g ex Dolniya by Azamour) proved to be a cut above his rivals as he cruised to a comfortable victory in the Prix Quincey (Gr 3, 1600m) at Deauville on Sunday, providing Darley's Dubawi (Dubai Millennium) with his 211th individual stakes winner in the process. Anchored at the rear of the field by Christophe Soumillon, the Alain De Royer-Dupre-trained four-year-old made light work of passing his ten rivals to win by a cosy two and a half lengths. Now We Know (Kendargent) finished in second with National Service (Elusive City) filling third place, another half a length away. Now the winner of four of his five starts, Dilawar is the first foal out of the UAE

Group 1 winner Dolniya (Azamour). Dubawi stands at Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket for a 2021 fee of £250,000 (approx AU\$470,500).

Fastnet Rock - The evergreen Fastnet Rock (Danehill) has another high-class three-year-old on his hands, who also becomes his latest new stakes winner, after Coastwatch (3 g ex Bullion Mansion by Encosta De Lago) eased to victory in the Ming Dynasty (Gr 3, 1400m) at Kembla Grange on Sunday. Coastwatch, a \$750,000 yearling purchase for Mulcaster Bloodstock from the Coolmore draft at the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale, defeated \$1.1 million yearling buy Military Expert (Redoute's Choice) by three-quarters of a length, with Rebel Dane's (California Dane) Subterranean third, three lengths behind the winner. The A half-brother to Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Mighty Boss (Not A Single Doubt), Coastwatch's granddam is Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) winner La Volta (Laranto). He is the eighth foal out of Bullion Mansion (Encosta De Lago), whose colt by Pierro (Lonhro) sold for \$300,000 to Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott/Kestral Thoroughbreds at this year's Inglis Easter Yearling Sale, while she has a Justify (Scat Daddy) yearling filly and is due to foal to Pierro

this spring. Fastnet Rock stands at Coolmore for a fee of \$165,000 (inc GST).

Free Eagle - Dancing King (3 g ex Agnetha by Big Shuffle) provided former shuttler Free Eagle (High Chaparral) with his third individual stakes winner when landing the March Stakes (Gr 3, 1m 6f) at Goodwood on Saturday. The three-year-old gelding had placed in stakes company on his previous two starts and went one better with a head defeat of odds-on favourite Nagano (Fastnet Rock) after the pair were engaged in a thrilling duel up the Goodwood straight. Third-placed Classic Lord (Lord Of England) finished ten lengths further behind. One of 11 winners from 13 to race out of Group 3 winner Agnetha (Big Shuffle), Dancing King is a half-brother to US Grade 3 winner Starstruck (Galileo). Free Eagle shuttled to Australia for three seasons between 2016 and 2018 and now stands at the Irish National Stud for €8,000 (approx. AU\$12,900).

Galileo - The Yulong-owned Magical Lagoon (2 f ex Night Lagoon by Lagunas) stepped up to stakes level on just her second career start and impressed when winning the Flame Of Tara Stakes (Gr 3, 1m) at the Curragh on Friday, rolling odds-on favourite Albula

(Galileo) to win by three-quarters of a length. She's Trouble (Fracas) finished third. The Jessie Harrington-trained filly finished fourth on debut at Naas earlier this month, in a race won by Albula, however she turned the tables on that rival to deliver Yulong further juvenile stakes success in Ireland and Galileo (Sadler's Wells) a 342nd individual stakes winner. The filly, a 305,000gns (approx. AU\$575,000) buy for Yulong out of the Tattersalls October Book 1 Yearling Sale, is the 12th foal out of Group 3 winner Night Lagoon (Lagunas), and a half-sister to multiple Group 1 winner Novellist (Monsun), who stands at Shadai Stallion Station in Japan. The late Galileo delivered a reminder to the southern hemisphere of what the global industry has lost after his son Harpo Marx (5 g ex Nechita by Fastnet Rock) saluted in the Premier's Cup (Gr 3, 2000m) at Kembla Grange on Saturday to become the 343rd individual stakes winner for the Coolmore great and 63rd stakes winner in Australia. The Irish-bred five-year-old is the second stakes winner out of Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Nechita (Fastnet Rock) and was a 60,000gns buy

for De Burgh Equine and Darby Racing out of the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale in 2019.

High Chaparral - Desert Lord (7 g ex Nova Star by Iglesia) became the late High Chaparral's (Sadler's Wells) 134th individual stakes winner when landing the Goldmarket (Listed, 1200m) under Michael Cahill at the Gold Coast on Friday. The David Vandyke-trained seven-year-old was half a length superior to the runner-up Tramonto (Wandjina), with a length back to third-placed Totally Charmed (I Am Invincible). Desert Lord, now the winner of eight of his 26 career starts, is out of the Group 1-winning mare Nova Star (Iglesia), who has also produced Acrostar (Danhill Dancer), a two-time Listed winner and Group 2-placed.

Lord Kanaloa - Having finished in the frame in Grade 2 company on each of his previous two starts, Kaiser Minoru (5 h ex Strike Root by Smart Strike) got off the mark in stakes company when landing the Toki Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Niigata on Sunday. In beating

Ruggero (Kinshasa No Kiseki) and Daddy's Vivid (Kizuna) by a length and the same he became the 30th individual stakes winner for Shadai's Lord Kanaloa (King Kamehameha) who stands for a 2021 fee of ¥15,000,000 (approx. AU\$18,675).

Munnings stands at Ashford Stud, Kentucky, for a 2021 fee of \$40,000 (approx. AU\$54,700).

Noble Mission - Frankel's (Galileo) brother Noble Mission sired his sixth individual stakes winner when the Larry Rivelli-trained juvenile Nobals (2 c ex Pearly Blue by Empire Maker) made it two wins from as many starts with victory in the Arlington-Washington Futurity Stakes (Listed, 7f) on Saturday. Among Noble Mission's other stakes winners is Code Of Honor, winner of the 2019 running of the Travers Stakes and the Melbourne Spring Carnival-bound Spanish Mission. Noble Mission stands at Shizunai Stallion Station in Japan.

Reward For Effort - No Effort (7 m ex Hold The Lion by Lion Cavern) scored for the first time at stakes level at start 44, as she delivered trainer Gavin Bedggood a first stakes success when capturing the Heatherlie Stakes (Listed, 1700m) at Caulfield on Saturday. The daughter of Reward For Effort (Exceed And Excel) defeated Ziegfeld (New Approach) by a long neck, with Tralee Rose (Tavistock) third, a further length in arrears. She becomes the eighth individual stakes winner for her sire, who stands at Chatswood Stud for a fee of \$11,000 (inc GST) in 2021.

The James Ferguson-trained juvenile followed up her debut victory at Haydock last month with a neck defeat of favourite Daneh (Dubawi), providing Ferguson with a first Group win as a trainer. Prosperous Voyage (Zoffany) was a length and a half further back in third. Mise En Scene is the third foal out of Gadfly (Galileo), an unraced half-sister to English 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) winner Speciosa (Danehill Dancer) and stakes scorers Major Rhythm (Rhythm) and Special Meaning (Mount Nelson). Siyouni stands at Haras de Bonneval for a €140,000 (approx. AU\$225,840) fee.

Slade Power - Master Matt (5 g ex Ahaaly by Exceed And Excel) gave sire Slade Power (Dutch Art) his second individual stakes winner when he produced a career-best effort to win the Abergwaun Stakes (Listed, 5f) at Tipperary on Thursday. Turned out by dual-purpose trainer Matthew Smith and ridden by

jockey Sam Ewing, Master Matt made relentless headway in the second half of the race and took the lead well inside the final furlong, holding on gamely from the fast-finishing White Lavender (Heeraat) to win by a neck, with race favourite Urban Beat (Red Jazz) a further length and a quarter back in third. Bred by Shadwell Estate Company Limited, the five-year-old was a shrewd €700 (approx. AU\$1,100) purchase by David Brazil at the Goresbridge October Sale for horses-in-training. Now owned by F W Lynch, Master Matt is the third foal of winning Exceed And Excel (Danehill) mare Ahaaly, herself a daughter of Group 2 winner Alshakr (Bahri), and is a half-brother to US winner Himmah (Intikhab). Sire Slade Power stood at Haras de Tierce in France for the 2021 season for a fee of €3,000 (approx. AU\$4,800).

Snitzel - A three-year-old interstate stakes double for Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) on Saturday saw his tally of individual black-type winners rise to 112, as Bruckner (3 c ex Jestajingle by Lonhro) denied Artorius (Flying Artie) by a neck to win the H. D. F. McNeil

Toronado - Swettenham Stud shuttler Toronado (High Chaparral) sired his 15th individual stakes winner when his son Toro Strike (4 c ex Scarlet Strike by Smart Strike) went one better than last year with success in Sunday's Supreme Stakes (Gr 3, 7f) at Goodwood. Ridden by Ryan Moore for Richard Fahey, Toro Strike was tasting victory for the fourth time in 13 starts as he defeated favourite Double Or Bubble (Exceed And Excel) by a going-away two lengths. Rhoscolyn (Territories) was another length and three-quarters behind in third. Toro Strike is the second foal out of US Grade 3 winner Scarlet Strike (Smart Strike) who, herself, is a half-sister to the Grade 1 winner Visionaire (Grand Slam). Toronado will stand for a 2021 service fee of \$49,500 (inc GST).

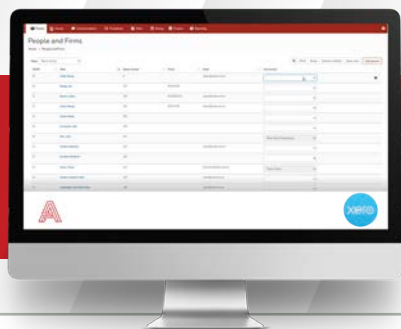

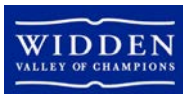
