## Spieth on the board with two-year-old trial winner

*Owner Man holds long term Hong Kong aspirations for juvenile he bred by Aquis' first-season sire*

New season stallion Spieth (Thorn Park) drew first blood at yesterday's barrier trials at Aquis Park on the Gold Coast with his two-year-old colt Victory Moments winning the opening heat of the morning impressively.

With three of the five runners in the 900-metre trial sired by the Aquis stallion, there was always a high chance of a winning outcome, but that didn't detract from the genuine excitement his trainer Kacy Fogden and other good judges felt after the performance.

"He's a colt that's constantly improving. I

didn't think any of our Spieths would be that early. They are really robust types of horses and they just keep on improving.

"I always had a bit of an opinion of him, so I thought he could do it but it was nice to see him go away from the farm and step up publicly and do it," Fogden said.

Having tracked the early pace, Victory Moments was pushed into the clear by Mark Du Plessis to finish a length clear of Spieth filly Wild Botanica, who is also prepared by Fogden and races in the Aquis colours, in 53.98 seconds.

"I think the filly that ran second jumped out of the ground, she surprised me the most," Fogden continued. *Continued on page 2>>*

#### New first season sire winners

**Churchill** - Snaffles (2 c ex Annabelle Ja by Singspiel) gave his sire Churchill (Galileo) his 15th individual winner when he easily took the Irish EBF Auction Series Maiden (7f) at Down Royal on Friday for trainer Joseph O'Brien. Despite ducking left out of the stalls, Snaffles was settled in a prominent early position by jockey Shane Crosse and was travelling best of all approaching the final half of the race quickening to lead inside the final furlong and coast clear of his rivals to win by five lengths. *Continued on page 18 >>*

"They have all come off the farm and it was good to see them so professional.

"It's testament to the Spieths, they have always been easy to train. They are quite versatile and for them to do what they are doing now makes it exciting because they are only going to mature.

"They have scope and I think that's what makes them exciting. They are only going to get better."

Fogden also trained the fourth placegetter in the trial, a colt named Acotango, who is also by Spieth.

She said she will wait and see how the winning colt recovers from the outing before deciding when he will make his race debut for Hong Kong-

based owner Sebastian Man, a close friend of Aquis' Tony Fung.

Man bred the colt from his Group 3-winning Street Boss (Street Cry) mare Tris on the advice of Avesta Bloodstock's Jimmy Unwala, who was working with Aquis at the time.

Tris, a winner of four of her 22 starts, was retired from racing in 2018 and was subsequently sold at the 2019 Magic Millions

National Broodmare Sale for \$200,000.

"When Sebastian and I sat down in Hong Kong and spoke about a plan to breed a few mares with a goal of getting a nice colt to eventually race in Hong Kong, I remember telling him that breeding needs patience," said Unwala.

"Luckily he has plenty of patience and we picked three mares for him to get the project underway. Tris was a fast Group-winning two-year-old and physically I felt Spieth was a lovely match up for her.

"It would be her maiden foal, so I wanted to make sure the stallion was well put together and had enough size but not too big, he fit the bill perfectly. The cross also gave us double Machiavellian, which I really like in a pedigree."

Man has raced horses with success in Hong Kong with his best being Victory Magic (Savabeel), who ran second in the 2016 edition of the Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m)

"I have been good friends with Tony Fung for a long time. I met Jimmy when he came to Hong Kong for a research project. We chatted and I expressed my wish to get a nice horse to race in Hong Kong," Man told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"I wanted to breed my own horse to go to Hong Kong and not just buy it. I have started to enjoy the breeding side of things and I hope someday Victory Moments can make it to Hong Kong but at the same time, if he measures up, I am happy to race him in Australia if he has the talent to win

Spieth covered a book of 149 in his first year at stud, where he stood for \$16,500, and 35 of his first crop have already been named, while 23 are nominated for the 2022 Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m). His yearlings sold up to \$180,000 this year and he stands at Aquis in Queensland for a fee of \$8,800 (inc GST).

Twice runner-up in Group 1 company, Spieth won five of his 18 starts, including the City Tattersalls Lightning

(Listed, 1100m) in 2016. He was retired after finishing eighth in the 2018 Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1350m) and finished his career with earnings of more than \$626,000.

The official two-year-old trials will take place at Kensington on September 20, with the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) and Breeders' Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) on October 2 at Randwick.

## Maher expecting improvement from returning duo

The Ciaran Maher and David Eustace-trained pair Sir Dragonet (Camelot) and Explosive Jack (Jakalberry) will resume in the Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Flemington on Saturday, with Maher expecting the pair to come on for their first outing on route to bigger spring targets. Three-time Derby winner Explosive Jack is being aimed towards the Caulfield (Gr 1, 2400m) and Melbourne Cups (Gr 1, 3200m), while Sir Dragonet will be set to defend his crown in the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m). Both horses had a break on the NSW coast at Newcastle after their respective campaigns before making their way to Maher's Fingal property based in Victoria. Both then ran in a trial over 1190 metres at Cranbourne on August 30 and while the co-trainer said the trials had been important for their conditioning, he added that they will be nowhere near their best on Saturday. "They won't be winning it, I wouldn't think, but they've really come on since their trials," Maher said. "They'll want the run, probably a second one, and then they'll hit their straps." The duo are among 19 nominations for the Makybe Diva Stakes that includes Aegon (Sacred Falls), Incentivise (Shamus Award), Inspirational Girl (Reliable Man), Keiai Nautique (Deep Impact), Mo'Unga (Savabeel) and Tofane (Ocean Park).

## Big spring ahead for Kheir

Ozzie Kheir has a busy weekend ahead as he prepares to watch his stars, Incentivise and Sir Dragonet, make their return to action at

Flemington. The prominent owner won't have much time for reflection as he also has newly-purchased Sir Lucan (Camelot) running in the final UK Classic of the season, the English St Leger (Gr 1, 1m 6½f) at Doncaster. After this, the horse will then go into quarantine and be prepared for his trip over to Australia where training partnership Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott will ready him for a crack at this season's Melbourne Cup. "It's been an anxious wait," Kheir told Racing.com about Incentivise's return. "You want to see him come back and start off where he left off and show he is going to be a serious contender." On the return of Sir Dragonet Kheir said "Everything is on the table with him. He loves a real fast tempo and the Japan Cup is always run at a fast pace."

## Uzziah set for Run To The Rose

Part-time trainer Scott Aspery will send his Golden Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) hopeful Uzziah (Outreach) to the Run To The Rose (Gr 2, 1200m) at Kembla Grange on Saturday. The three-year-old has not had the most usual of Golden Rose campaigns, winning a Taree maiden two starts ago before an unlucky second at Gosford on his latest start. That maiden win was Aspery's first since 2018 after he decided to give up training three years ago before making his comeback last year. Based in Newcastle, Aspery only has a small team of horses, and is also a mortgage consultant, but he feels he could have a smart one on his hands in Uzziah. "He's shown every indication that he's a pretty smart colt, but he's just taken a little while to learn his craft," he said. "I think he's going to measure up to the better grade in time, whether this being his first preparation,

it's a bit soon we'll find out on Saturday, but he's progressive and on the upward curve." Throughout his training career to date, Aspery has had 330 starters with four of those coming in Grade 1 company, while also saddling up Group 3 winner Estonian Princess (Snitzel).

## First mainland winners for Alpine Eagle

Alpine Eagle (High Chaparral) had his second mainland winner in as many days as yearling sale topper Throntari won on debut at Wangaratta yesterday for trainers Robbie Griffiths and Mathew de Kock. The Tasmanian sire's only progeny to race are all aged three, with four of them now winners so far including unbeaten juveniles Alpine Wolf and Verbano. Now added to that duo are the David Jolly-trained Speak No Eagle who came from last to first to win his 900-metre maiden at Murray Bridge on debut as the odds-on favourite on Sunday, and the three-year-old filly Throntari who also made a sweeping run to victory under apprentice jockey Lewis German. "It worked out perfectly, Lewis (German) put her in a good spot and we loved the way she rounded them up and went to the line in good, strong fashion," Griffiths told Racing.com. "She's been so sharp in her education which gave us great encouragement because of her pedigree." Griffiths, together with bloodstock agent Peter Ford, purchased Throntari for \$95,000 at the Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale last year, the top lot of the 146 yearlings catalogued. The filly is the first foal of Melbourne-winning dam Must Be Mink, a Musket (Redoute's Choice) daughter of Tasmanian Guineas (Listed, 1600m) winner Di's Angel (Racer's Edge).

## Zaaki firms in betting for majors

After his hugely impressive winning return in the Tramway Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) last weekend, Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux) is now a heavy favourite for the Cox Plate after firming from a \$4.50 chance to \$2.70 with Sportsbet. The gelding has his name in the hat for a few of the feature races this spring and his price for those races are all heading the same way, with his price for the upcoming Underwood Stakes (Gr 1, 1800m) going from \$3.50 to \$2.10. Bookmakers are also wary of Zaaki's dominance continuing on into Flemington as he is also in from \$4.40 to \$2.25 in the Mackinnon Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m). Away from Zaaki, it appears there are expectations that Anamoe (Street Boss) has now fully recovered from a temperature spike he suffered a few weeks ago with the three-year-old also coming in for support in key races despite not having raced this season. One punter has had a \$2000 bet on the Godolphin-bred horse at \$4 to win the Golden Rose while

there was another bet of \$1500 at \$6 for him to win the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m).

## Williams looking forward to Zaaki ride

Craig Williams' time in Queensland this winter may have earned a potential spot on Cox Plate favourite Zaaki after he was revealed as the seven-year-old's jockey when he heads to the Underwood Stakes at Sandown on September 26. James McDonald has been on Zaaki's back for all four of his Australian wins, but due to the current Covid-19 enforced border restrictions, Williams has picked up a first ever ride on Annabel Neasham's British import when he travels to Melbourne. McDonald will ride Zaaki in the Cox Plate if he is able to travel to Victoria, however Williams is sure to be a front runner for the ride if the Covid situation has not improved by that point. "I rode for Annabel through the winter carnival in Brisbane," Williams told Racing.com. "I wasn't riding Zaaki, (but) he was so impressive up there, the conversation after talking about our

race that we were riding in together was always about how impressive was he." Neasham is yet to confirm when exactly Zaaki will head south for the spring, with the restrictions around travel and sending staff across the border still very much relevant. "If we can get the green light to get the staff down, I think we'll get a decision this week, that will make up my mind," she said. "I would love to run him in the Underwood which would be three weeks between runs, then two weeks to the Caulfield Stakes and two weeks to the Cox Plate would be the path I would like to do."

## Top Rank to join Neasham stable

Australian Bloodstock have acquired the UK-based Top Rank (Dark Angel) and will transfer the five-year-old to Neasham's yard from Newmarket-based trainer James Tate. Top Rank, a winner of six of his 12 starts, is due to arrive in Sydney on October 12. "I think he's a very good horse," Australian Bloodstock co-director Jamie Lovett told Racing.com. "He was third in the Group 1 Lockinge Stakes in May behind Palace Pier and Lady Bowthorpe which was a very strong form race. We all know what Palace Pier has done and Lady Bowthorpe then came out and won the (Group 1) Nassau Stakes." A winner of the Superior Mile (Gr 3, 1m) at Haydock, Top Rank has a similar profile to that of his soon to be stablemate Zaaki who had also only won at Group 3 level in the UK before being transferred to the Neasham yard. "I think he could get into the Doncaster with a winnable weight being only a Group 3 winner. Even in the back of my mind, he could be a lovely horse for the All-Star Mile," Lovett added.

## International spring picture to become clearer

The impact that the more stringent pre-travel veterinary checks for international horses will have on the feature races in Australia this year will be clearer today with the first declarations being taken for many of the top spring races, including the Melbourne Cup. Racing Victoria is preparing for a decline in the number of international runners this year due to these extra checks, with the declarations providing a far better insight into how many could potentially line up in Melbourne. The veterinary testing for horses intending to travel to Australia include a full-body scintigraphy and CT/MRI of distal limbs. There were 174 nominations made for the Melbourne Cup by the deadline date of August 3, with 15 of those coming from international stables. Cup stalwart Prince Of Arran (Shirocco) will not be seen in action at the feature race this year as he was retired on Saturday after it was revealed he had

failed the pre-export veterinary checks. First declarations will also be taken for many other spring features including the Caulfield Guineas, Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m), and Cox Plate.

## Cup contender to join Waller

Melbourne Cup contender Ocean Billy (Ocean Park) is set to join Chris Waller's Flemington stable ahead of the upcoming spring carnival. Winner of the Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m), Ocean Billy is currently trained by Bill Pomare in New Zealand but with the current Covid-19 situation in both countries, it means that it would be hard for Pomare to return home for the New Year if he was to come to Australia for the spring. "It's really disappointing because I'm quite social with my horses and I like to enjoy the racing and for everyone around me to have a good day too," Pomare told Racing.com. "Chris offered to help and he's also come up with a couple of good deals to help out with cost as well." More immediately, Ocean Billy will go

for the Tarzino Trophy (Gr 1, 1400m) after he flashed home to be fifth in the Foxbridge Plate (Gr 2, 1200m) at Te Rapa on his most recent outing. "The way he finished over 1200 metres, he's still fresh enough to go a pretty mean 1400 metres, and he's going to be racing against similar horses to what he raced against on Saturday," Pomare said.

## Group 1 winner Dreamforce retired

Dreamforce (Fastnet Rock), a dual winner of the Tramway Stakes has been retired from racing. The John Thompson-trained nine-year-old finished seventh in Saturday's running of a race that he had made his own in recent years, winning the 2019 and 2020 renewals. The gelding was a multiple black-type winner, with his greatest triumph coming in the 2020 George Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m) at Rosehill. Dreamforce won 13 of his 41 starts, placing in a further 12 of them, to amass career earnings of \$2,516,235.

## Payne's QLD team off and running

Michelle Payne's satellite stable in Queensland is set to be bolstered with last start winner Templar (Fiorente) to join the team this week. Her first runner was at the Sunshine Coast on Sunday when Smokin' Pierro (Pierro) finished fourth. "It gets so strong every year (in Victoria) and I think Smokin Pierro he's a nice horse, but I think we will be able to have a lot of fun with him up there," Payne told Racing.com. "He's really thrived in the warmer climate and has been up a fair while and he's been racing really well here but I thought a change would do him the world of good and it seems to have worked." Templar has made his return from more than two years on the side-lines with a win and two placings from his three starts so far this campaign, and he will now head up to the Sunshine Coast after his comfortable win at Echuca last month. With the current Covid-19 situation restricting Payne from being with her Queensland team, she has left the stable in the

hands of former jockey Nikita Beriman. "She's doing a really great job, she's 100 per cent in the whole idea and the team," Payne added.

## Hickmott set for Ballarat move

Robert Hickmott is ready to relocate the majority of his team to Ballarat within the next month ahead of the upcoming closure of his Caulfield base. "We are looking forward to it, there are some great developments up there at Ballarat and I think it's a great move for the horses more than anything," Hickmott told Racing.com. "Obviously I live up over that side of town, but I think the horses will appreciate it more than anyone else." Hickmott, who expects to be relocated by early October, will take up 25 boxes and share a newly renovated on-course complex with fellow trainer Melody Cunningham.

## Yorke banned for four months

Gordon Yorke has been suspended for four and a half months following an argument with fellow trainer Norm Loy. The Albury-based trainer was given his suspension last week after an inquiry into the incident was held. Yorke subsequently pleaded guilty of confronting Loy while he was in a horse walker which contained a number of horses that he was trying to remove on July 31. During the confrontation, Loy's Funky Bella (Adelaide) became fractious after Yorke deliberately held the gate shut to prevent Loy from exiting and kicked out on a number of occasions. The mare suffered a fracture to the lateral splint bone in her near hind leg and the walker gate was also dislodged. Yorke was initially suspended for six months, however the stewards reduced the ban due to the trainer's cooperation with the investigation and because of his guilty plea.

## Daniel Gaul disqualified

Former Canberra Racing Club (CRC) committee member Daniel Gaul pleaded guilty yesterday to the charge of conduct prejudicial to the interests of racing under AR 228(a). Racing New South Wales stewards held an inquiry into the alleged behaviour of Gaul when attending a private social gathering at a residence in Covid-19 affected Harrison on August 28. Gaul was first interviewed by stewards on August 30 and he tendered his resignation as a committee member of the CRC later that day. On September 2, the stewards issued a charge against Gaul which he subsequently pleaded guilty to at the hearing yesterday. CRC chief executive officer Andrew Clark said: "I am extremely disappointed that this private social gathering took place and the decisions made by the individuals who attended. Stewards have finalised their enquiries and handed down substantial punishments to all attendees including Mr Gaul today."

## Eaton to appeal suspension

Jessica Eaton sent off an appeal yesterday to the six-week suspension she was handed on Friday for failing to take "all reasonable and permissible measures" aboard Old Time Rock (Pride Of Dubai) at Morphettville on August 14.

Eaton's appeal will now be heard by the state's independent racing appeals board at a time yet to be set. After a torrid passage behind runners, Old Time Rock finished on the bridle in a close last of eight runners as an \$11 chance. The stewards argued that Eaton had the opportunity to take a gap that had presented itself but chose not to for reasons unknown. Eaton, who last week got her prestigious John Letts Medal for her stunning 2020/21 season, is hoping to clear her name when the meeting with the racing officials takes place.

## Queanbeyan to inspect

Today's meeting at Queanbeyan will be subject to a check by NSW stewards after surface water was still found following an inspection yesterday. A final inspection of the track will take place this morning and a decision will be made from there over whether the surface is raceable.

## Wellington card moved

NSW stewards have made the decision that yesterday's postponed meeting at Wellington will now be held tomorrow. Fields remain unchanged, but the updated race times are as follows; Race 1: 1:04pm, Race 2: 1:39pm, Race 3: 2:14pm, Race 4: 2:49pm, Race 5: 3:24pm, Race 6: 3:59pm, Race 7: 4:34pm, Race 8: 5:12pm.

## Soft win for Miss Tycoon Rose

The Michael and Matthew Pitman-trained Miss Tycoon Rose (Written Tycoon) made an easy reappearance in a 1200-metre handicap at Ashburton yesterday and the Group 1-performing four-year-old now looks set for a strong spring campaign. "We don't trial our good horses as we don't believe in going to the trials. We were pretty happy with how she has been going and that is basically what we expected of her," Michael Pitman said. "She is a Group 1 horse." Runner-up in last season's New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), Miss Tycoon Rose has numerous options available to her during the spring carnival with the Coupland's Bakeries Mile

(Gr 2, 1600m), the Valachi Downs Canterbury Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) and the Lindauer Stewards Stakes Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) all possibilities. "I think she would be competitive in any one of them, depending what we aim her for," Pitman added. "My first thought is we will probably concentrate on the fillies and mares 1400 metres." Earlier in the day, Mackenzie Lad (Vespa) also made a pleasing return when fourth to Art De Triomphe (Vadamos) over the 1200-metre trip. "We're very happy with that run. His coat hasn't turned yet... He is probably a month off being there and the 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) is his target," Pitman said.

## Carston eyes Guineas with promising filly

Andrew Carston was delighted with the performance of Art De Triomphe in the Mount Somers Honey (1200m) yesterday. The three-year-old, running out of barrier nine, settled towards the rear of the field and picked up well when asked by jockey Kylie Williams to win by one and three-quarter lengths from Buoyant (Dalghar) with a further nose back to Emanon (Burgundy) in third. Carston is now aiming the filly for a crack at the New Zealand 1,000 Guineas. "I am really happy with her performance, she will take a lot of benefit from today as well. It is always pleasing to see them come back at three," he said. "The instructions were to go back to last and have her relax, she showed a good turn of foot and won quite convincingly in the end. She is on a 1,000 Guineas path at this stage and will go to the Canterbury Belle in 12 days time and we will pick a path from there."

## Six for Muhaarar

Ataared (2 f ex Alnajmah by Dansili) landed the Prix Haras de Bouquetot (Listed, 1650m) at Craon yesterday to become the sixth individual stakes winner for Muhaarar (Oasis Dream). The Shadwell-owned Jean-Claude Rouget-trained filly held off the late challenge from Hot Queen (Recorder) to score by a head. Joli Coup (Pedro The Great) was half a length further behind in third. Ataared is one of two winners from as many to race out of Alnajmah (Dansili), who herself is out of Prix Maurice de Gheest (Gr 1, 1300m) runner-up Joanna (High Chapparral), making her a half-sister to Listed winner Rafaadah (Oasis Dream). Further back this is the family of Livamol Classic (Gr 1, 2040m) winner Cazals (Aussie Rules). Muhaarar stands at Shadwell's Nunnery Stud for a £10,000 (approx. AU\$18,600) fee.

## 36 for Authorized

Soft Light (5 h ex Light Saber by Kendor) became the 36th individual stakes winner for former shuttler Authorized (Montjeu) when he landed the Defi du Galop (Listed, 2400m) at Craon. Making his 18th start in a career that has seen him finish runner-up three times at Group 2 level, Soft Light got his first stakes win with a two and a half-length defeat of Port Etienne (Olympic Glory). Hopeful (Motivator) was another three-quarters of a length behind in third. A €40,000 buy as a yearling, Soft Light is a half-brother to stakes winners Busybeingfabulous (Soldier Of Fortune) and City Light (Siyouni), with the latter twice runner-up at the highest level including when second behind Merchant Navy (Fastnet Rock) in the Diamond Jubilee Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) at Royal Ascot in 2018. Authorized, the sire of Australian Group 1 winners Hartnell, Complacent and Pounamu, stands at the Jockey Club of Turkey for €12,500 (approx. AU\$20,000).

## 15 for Curlin

Grace Adler (2 f ex Our Khrysty by Newfoundland) demolished her rivals in the Debutante Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) at Del Mar on Sunday to become the 15th individual elite-level winner for her sire Curlin (Smart

Strike). The Bob Baffert-trained filly won on debut at Del Mar over five furlongs in July and remained unbeaten with a devastating 11 and a quarter-length defeat of Dance To The Music (Maclean's Music). Bicameral (Constitution) was another two and three-quarter lengths back in third. Bought for \$700,000 from the Blue Heaven Farm draft at the 2020 Fasig-Tipton Selected Yearlings Showcase, Grace Adler is one of four winners out of Grade 3 scorer Our Khrysty (Newfoundland), who is also the dam of the Grade 2-placed Virginia Key (Distorted Humor). Curlin stands at Hill 'N Dale Farms in Kentucky for \$175,000 (approx. AU\$235,550).

## First for Gun Runner

Echo Zulu (2 f ex Letgomyecho by Menifee) became the first elite-level winner for Three Chimneys Farm first-crop stallion Gun Runner (Candy Ride) when taking the Spinaway Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) at Saratoga on Sunday. The Steve Asmussen-trained filly won on debut at the same track in July and followed that up with a four-length defeat of Tarabi (First Samurai). Saucy Lady T (Tonalist) was another three and three-quarter lengths back in third. Asmussen, who trained Gun Runner, the 2017 Horse of the Year, through six Grade 1 wins, said: "I can't measure how much I wanted to have Gun Runner's first Grade 1 winner. Obviously, he's a tremendous sire but somebody had to be first and I'm glad it was us." Out of Grade 3 winner Letgomyecho (Menifee), Echo Zulu is a half-sister to fellow elite-level scorer Echo Town (Speightstown). Gun Runner, the sire of ten first-crop winners, stands in Kentucky for \$50,000 (approx. AU\$67,260).

## 11 for Liam's Map

Liam's Dove (2 f ex The Dove by Hawk Wing) became the 11th individual stakes winner for her sire Liam's Map (Unbridled's Song) when taking out the Del Mar Juvenile Fillies Turf Stakes (Listed, 8f) on Sunday. The Peter Miller-trained filly improved from a third-placed effort on her second start last month to score by a head over Helens Well (Kodi Bear), with Dolly May (Outstrip) two lengths behind the winner in third. Liam's Map stands at Lane's End Farm in Kentucky for \$30,000 (approx. AU\$40,350).

## 36 for Blame

Officiating (3 c ex Come A Callin by Dixie Union) got off the mark in stakes company with victory in the Bear's Den Stakes (Listed, 7f) at Gulfstream Park on Sunday. The Saffie Joseph-trained colt, a winner of one of his 11 previous starts, finished runner-up in Listed company earlier this year and went one better with a comfortable three and a half-length defeat of Papetu (Dialed In). Dark Timber (Mineshaft) was four lengths further back in third. The win provided Blame (Arch), who stands at Claiborne Farm in Kentucky for \$30,000 (approx. AU\$40,350), with his 36th individual stakes winner. Out of Come A Callin (Dixie Union), Officiating is a half-brother to Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (Gr 1, 8½f) winner Caledonia Road (Quality Road).

## 58 for Flatter

Accredit (3 c ex Berncredit by Bernstein) provided Flatter (A P Indy) with his 58th individual stakes winner when landing the Dueling Grounds Derby (Listed, 10½f) at Kentucky Downs on Sunday. The Pavel Matejka-trained colt saw off Yes This Time (Not This Time) by a length. Cellist (Big Blue Kitten) was another two and a half lengths back in third. Accredit is one of six winners from as many to race out of Berncredit (Bernstein) and is a half-brother to Grade 1-placed Sistas Stroll (Stroll). Flatter, the sire of five elite-level winners, stands at Claiborne Farm for a fee of \$35,000 (approx. AU\$47,100).

## UK: 13 remain in St Leger

Short-priced favourite Hurricane Lane (Frankel) remains in contention to contest the St Leger Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 6½f) at Doncaster on Saturday. The Charlie Appleby-trained colt looks set to bid for a third consecutive elite-level win after landing the Irish Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) and Grand Prix de Paris (Gr 1, 2400m) on his previous starts. Thirteen horses remain in the field for the final Classic of the season at the five-day entry stage, including the OTI Racing-owned Ottoman Emperor (Excelebration) and Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) runner-up Mojo Star (Sea The Stars).

## FOUR STUDS, FOUR STORIES

**F**our leading New Zealand studs each had varying stories to tell this week. They experienced the highs, as well as the exasperations associated with racing and breeding.

Grabbing headlines is not new for Waikato Stud's Savabeel (Zabeel). Even when he sires the winner of the first two-year-old race for the season it is old hat. He did it two years ago with Cool Aza Beel who became Champion Two-Year-Old and is now at Newhaven Park in New South Wales about to start his own stud career.

Savabeel's Cincoro, off two trial wins, stepped out at Wanganui in the first two-year-old race of the current season to win handily. Winning trainer Stephen Autridge rates the filly.

Meanwhile, in Melbourne there are whispers that Savabeel might have a Derby contender in Forgot You, from the Trent Busuttin & Natalie Young stable. He was quite impressive over 1500 metres at Moonee Valley, backing up the promise shown in three starts last season.

Forgot You is pure Waikato Stud. His dam is by O'Reilly (Last Tycoon) and his third dam is by Centaine (Century). He descends from Georgina Belle (Pakistan II), a mare that Garry Chittick went to great lengths to acquire, finding her in California. Georgina Belle is central to the successes that the stud has enjoyed.

Bellacontte (Burgundy), the O'Learys Fillies Stakes (Listed, 1200m) winner at Wanganui on Saturday, also traces to Georgina Belle. Her grandam is by Centaine and her third dam by O'Reilly.

O'Reilly and Centaine: Ever present in Waikato Stud's great history.

Tivaci (High Chaparral) too, continues

to make noise, his Newcastle winner Never Been Kissed going back-to-back to remain undefeated in two starts. The filly, with Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott, is owned by the Chitticks.

Never Been Kissed is the product of four Waikato Stud sires, namely Tivaci, Savabeel, Pins (Snippets) and O'Reilly and is yet another descendant of Georgina Belle. Her grandam Tootsie (Pins) and Bellacontte's grandam, Goodgolly Itsdolly (Centaine), are half-sisters.

Tivaci, with five recent winners, three of which are from Savabeel mares, is clearly on his way. His first black-type winner may be just around the corner.

Ocean Park (Thorn Park) got into the act at Eagle Farm, his Ocean Treaty taking her record to five wins in her last six starts. The five-year-old mare began her career in Victoria but since transferring to Queensland has been in great form despite a couple of longish breaks. This time last year she won four on the trot including at Doomben.

Ocean Treaty is a half-sister to a Western Australian Oaks (Gr 3, 2400m) winner, First Impressions (Rip Van Winkle). Her dam, Listed winner and Group 1 placed Striker (Van Nistelrooy) is a half-sister to four stakes winners, including champion sprinter-miler Calveen (Canny Lad).

Waikato Stud and Mark Chittick kicked off the week with their announcement that Listed winner and Group placed Banquo (Written Tycoon) will join their 2021 stallion roster.

Banquo's immediate attraction is his being the first son of last season's champion Australian sire, Written Tycoon (Iglesia). The latter's first title put a stop to the four successive premierships racked up by Snitzel (Redoute's Choice).

Blood-wise, Waikato Stud has revisited some of their former success. Their O'Reilly is a son of Last Tycoon (Try My Best) who is also the sire of Iglesia, Written Tycoon's dad.

Century (Better Boy) features as the sire of Banquo's third dam as well as being the sire of the stud's former champion Centaine.



Banquo, a brother to Group 1-winning sprinter Booker, will join the lineup of Savabeel, Ocean Park and Tivaci, each of whom had an impact on part one of this week's stud stories.

The second stud to celebrate is Cambridge Stud. Their Burgundy (Redoute's Choice) is, sadly, no longer with us but the stallion is not going to let us forget either. The aforementioned Bellacontte became his fifth stakes winner and the filly made the O'Learys Fillies Stakes her maiden stakes win and second career win at start five.

The first southern hemisphere representative of the stud's exciting Almanzor (Wootton Bassett), Gibraltar Rising, was the talk of the first two-year-old race for the season.

The youngster clearly has talent but had trouble negotiating the last corner, heading towards the outside rail before maintaining a strong run to the line for third. He must have covered at least an extra three lengths yet stuck to his task really well. Right-handed next time?

Brendan Lindsay's wife Jo has a very smart filly in Zouzarella (Zoustar), a decisive winner of the Atlantic Jewel Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Moonee Valley.

She was never on the track yet once in the straight kicked away impressively to win by two lengths and remains unbeaten in two starts. Her maiden win, featuring a similar strong finish, was also at Moonee Valley just two weeks back.

Purchased by Cambridge Stud CEO Henry Plumptre at the 2020 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, the filly has firmed as favourite

for the Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Caulfield next month.

Her dam won six, including three in Melbourne, and her bloodlines reveal an interesting double up to Fairy King (Northern Dancer), the brother to Sadler's Wells and three-quarter brother to Nureyev (Northern Dancer).

Fairy King is the sire of the filly's grandam and also grandsire of her paternal grandsire Northern Meteor.

Her third dam Zaborowska (Top Ville) ranks as half-sister to Italian Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) winner Zabarella (Clouet). Her fourth dam, Zannira (Sovereign Path) is from a half-sister to Runaway Bride (Wild Risk), dam of champion Blushing Groom (Red God).

Story three is somewhat mixed, a combination of triumph and exasperation. Rich Hill Stud is sure to have experienced both last Saturday afternoon.

Here in New Zealand their Proisir (Choisir) sired his sixth stakes winner, Soldier Boy, who showed promise for his connections last season at two. After three placings he was given his opportunity in the Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) then put aside.

In Saturday's Wanganui Guineas (Listed, 1340m) he took over at the 100 metres then held out the favourite, Yeaboi (Belardo), for his maiden win.

Soldier Boy's sister, Vancooga, was a solid second in last season's New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) which might indicate that Soldier

Boy could extend his races to 1600 metres and beyond.

Rich Hill's afternoon was not over but ended in frustration. Riadini (Proisir) made a bold attempt to nail his biggest win since joining the Waterhouse-Bott establishment.

He led the Chelmsford Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) field into the straight and had what looked like a winning break at the 300 metres. Even with a 100 metres left he seemed to be in control but a desperate late lunge by Think It Over (So You Think) saw him relegated to second, officially by a half-head, although the margin looked less than that.

A Group 3 winner at Ellerslie prior to his Sydney sojourn, Riadini was third in last year's Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) and having found his form again might give the same race another shake this year.

An hour after the Chelmsford, Rich Hill Stud turned their attention to Moonee Valley and the prospect of a victory by Elephant (Shocking) in the Feehan Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m).

Unbeaten in five starts (four in New Zealand) heading to the Feehan, Elephant is a very exciting and talented galloper, but taking on Group 2 quality at his first attempt at stakes class was quite ambitious, yet he almost pulled it off.

Rolling away from the fence half way down the short Moonee Valley straight was the difference that saw Superstorm (Sebring) grind along the rail and snag the nose win. Elephant had it won everywhere but the very last stride and lost no admirers. This time the official margin was a nose but Elephant could have used a trunk as his nose was just not quite long enough!

Victory would have resulted in automatic entry into next month's Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) so plans may need to be tweaked, the Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) being a possible target.

Story four takes us to the northern hemisphere, at least racing-wise.

Sam and Catriona Williams of Little Avondale Stud have at least three reasons to celebrate. That's the individual stakes winners score by their Time Test (Dubawi), whose initial crop is making quite a statement all around Europe.

Time Test is about to start his fourth season

at LA Stud. His book is already full and his supporters can be excused for having growing smiles on their faces.

Last January at the NZB Karaka Yearling Sale, the Time Tests sold up to \$220,000. That particular lot was a colt out of the Mapperley Stud draft and he was a cracking type.

Before his stakes and Group winning form at three and four, Time Test himself had three starts at two for a win at Sandown and was twice second.

Over in Europe success is building, beginning with Time Test's first winner named The King's Horses, the victory occurring at Milan, Italy in mid May. He also won his second start then became Time Test's first stakes performer when finishing third in the Premio Premi Passi (Gr 3, 1200m) at Milan.

Time Test's first stakes winner is the cleverly named Tardis who won at her third start then went back-to-back when claiming the St Hugh's Stakes (Listed, 5f) at Newbury in mid August.

Stakes winner number two is Rocchigiani who is unbeaten in two starts in Germany, winning at Group 3 level at Baden Baden on September 1.

The very next day, at Salisbury, Romantic Time also scored at Group 3 level in the Dick Poole Fillies' Stakes (6f), her third win in six starts, having secured a win at Sandown at her fourth start.

Sunset Shiraz has yet to win but must be close. In three attempts she has placed three times including a last start second in the Debutante Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) at the Curragh.

Other winners are Turn Back Time, a last start winner at Lingfield who preceded that with three placings, plus Justice Protocol who won at his second start at Chelmsford on September 2.

Catriona Williams' response to the good news: "Thursday night was a big night for Time Test and we are stoked for everyone who has backed him. Watch this space."

## In other news....

The route from weanling purchase in Queensland, then over to New Zealand for the NZB Karaka Yearling Sale, off to Singapore to win eight of nine races then back to Australia for a Group 2 win in Melbourne, would be a rare path for any thoroughbred, but that is exactly

the path taken by The Inferno (Holy Roman Emperor), who raced as Inferno in Singapore.

Taking Singapore form to Australian success is quite rare as well. The late Laurie Laxon was keen to try Singapore star Stepitup (Hussonet) in Melbourne, thinking he was a big chance in the Cox Plate but it never eventuated.

The Inferno, now a five-year-old, was two for two at two at Kranji, bagging the Listed Golden Horseshoe (1200m). At three, he raced three times, won twice, including the Saas Fee Stakes (Listed, 1200m) and suffered his first and only defeat there at start five.

At four he went undefeated in four starts, taking out three of Singapore's richest and most prestigious races; the Lion City Cup (1200m), the Singapore Guineas (1600m) and the Singapore 3YO Classic (1400m), leaving the country as Singapore Horse of the Year and with more than \$S900,000 in the bank.

Trainer Cliff Brown admitted to not working The Inferno sufficiently for his Australian debut but on Saturday corrected the formula for the McEwen Stakes (Gr 2, 1000m).

The gelding was widest into the straight but between the 100-metre pole and the 50 metres he was too quick to put them away and score comfortably by a length in 59.48 seconds on the Soft 6 surface.

After such an impressive performance and with a record of nine wins in only 11 starts, the speedster will surely be discussed as a prospect for The Everest.

The Inferno's dam, Spina Rosa (Redoute's Choice) is a three-quarter sister to AJC Flight Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Lotteria (Redoute's

Choice) and the gelding himself is bred 2x3 to Danehill (Danzig).

## The local scene

From the same sale as Zouzarella is Te Akau's Imperatriz (I Am Invincible), a David Ellis purchase who was very convincing in winning the Northland Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Te Rapa on Saturday.

Not seen since her Eclipse Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) success back on January 1, Imperatriz looks like a star in the making and remains undefeated in three starts.

A length off the lead at the 200 metres, her acceleration to the 100 metres was decisive and she looked to have something in reserve at the line. The tangerine and blue look to be a force, yet again, in the upcoming fillies' Classics.

The main attraction on the card was the Foxbridge Plate (Gr 2, 1200m) and was expected to be a match between Advantage (Fastnet Rock) and Tavi Mac (Tavistock) but neither were to figure in the finish.

Instead, Team Rogerson spoiled the party with Mascarpone (Shooting To Win) who ran some mighty good placings in the best of company last season with only a Listed win to show for it.

Forming a line of four across the track at the 200 metres, he burst into the lead and had the rest in real trouble at the 100, and although the lead shrunk very late to a neck, he never looked like being beaten.

Graeme Rogerson purchased Mascarpone from the same 2018 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale as The Inferno.

Despite ducking left out of the stalls, Snaffles was settled in a prominent early position by jockey Shane Crosse and was travelling best of all approaching the final half of the race, quickening to lead inside the final furlong and coast clear of his rivals to win by five lengths from Nawraq (Buratino) in second with Gaire Os Ard (Teofilo) a further three-quarters of a length back in third. The tenth foal from two-year-old-winning dam Annabelle Ja (Singspiel), Snaffles is a half-brother to four winners including the Group 2-winning Libranno (Librettist), useful winner Al Muthana (Pastoral Pursuits) and Group-placed Unforgettable (Muhaarar). Bred by Lynch Bages, Camas Park and Arkle Bloodstock, the colt was an €11,000 purchase at the Goffs Autumn Online Yearling Sale in 2020. Churchill is standing at Coolmore Stud in Australia for the 2021 season for a fee of AU\$22,000 (inc GST).

**Ribchester** - Beautiful Surprise (2 f ex Lovely Surprise by Shamardal) made a winning debut in a restricted maiden stakes over seven furlongs at Epsom on Monday, before Garachico

(2 c ex Frine by High Chaparral) got off the mark at Evreux on Wednesday, becoming the 11th and 12th individual winners for Haunui Farm shuttler Ribchester (Iffraaj). Sent off the 9-4 favourite, Beautiful Sunrise defeated Shabano (Amaron) by a head, with Psychic Change (Due Diligence) a further two and a half lengths back in third. The Hugo Palmer-trained juvenile, who races in the colours of Dr Ali Ridha, owner of smart sprinter Gifted Master (Kodiac), is the second foal out of the winner Lovely Surprise (Shamardal), herself a daughter of Italian

Group 1 winner Dubai Surprise (King's Best). Meanwhile, Garachico (2 c ex Frine by High Chaparral) claimed a colts and geldings maiden over 1800 metres. Well beaten on last month's debut at Deauville, Garachico improved to win by one and a half lengths over Heart Dream (Dabirsim). A €40,000 buy out of the Arqana Deauville October Yearling Sale, Garachico is the third winner out of French Group 2 winner Frine (High Chaparral). Ribchester will stand at Haunui Farm in New Zealand this year for a fee of \$15,000 (Plus GST).

Despite pulling hard under Julien Leparoux in the early stages, the four-year-old filly managed to switch off the rail two furlongs out, taking the lead and kicking clear inside the final furlong to register a two and a quarter lengths success over Great Island (Scat Daddy) with My Sister Nat (Acclamation) a further nose back in third. "She's a classy filly. You can do whatever you want and she'll still give you that punch in the end," said Leparoux. "It's nice. It's a sign of the good ones, for sure." With her last five wins now all coming at graded level, War Like Goddess has racked up an impressive US\$713,684 in her career to date, a huge return on her mere US\$30,000 price tag as a two-year-old. War Like Goddess was bred in Kentucky by Calumet Farm. English Channel stands at Calumet Farm in Kentucky for a 2021 fee \$27,500 (approx. AU\$36,800).

**Sea The Stars** - Baaed (3 c Sea The Stars - Aghareed by Kingmambo) gave his sire Sea

**American Pharoah** - Coolmore shuttler American Pharoah (Pioneer of The Nile) sired his 20th individual stakes winner when his son Trust Our Journey (2 c ex Tribal Music by A P Warrior) struck in the Rosie's Stakes (Listed, 5.5f) at Colonial Downs on Tuesday. Already twice-placed in stakes company, Trust Our Journey was winning for the second time in five starts when beating Tejano Twist (Practical Joke) and Wish Me Home (Midshipman). **Ardad** - Eve Lodge (2 f ex Sandy Times by Footstepsinthesand) was a surprising winner of the Sirenia Stakes (Gr 3, 6f) at Kempton on Saturday for trainer Charlie Fellowes, giving Ardad (Kodiac) a second individual stakes winner as a sire. **Drefong** - Three-time US Grade 1 winner Drefong (Gio Ponti) sired his first stakes winner since taking up stud duties in Japan, as Geoglyph (2 c ex Aromatico by King Kamehameha) scored in the Sapporo Nisai Stakes (Gr 3, 1800m) on Saturday. The two-year-old made a winning debut in June over the same trip and kept his unbeaten record intact when defeating Ask Wild More (Kizuna) by a convincing four-length margin. Tosen Vanno (Vanquish Run) finished third, a further one and a half lengths behind. Geoglyph is out of the stakes-winning, Grade 1-placed mare

**Exceed And Excel** - Exceed And Excel sired two new stakes winners last week to take his tally to 189. Trained by Ed Walker, the four-year-old was winning for the fourth time in 13 starts as he ran on well to beat Tabdeed (Havana Gold) by a length and a half. Fivethousandtoone (Frankel) was the same margin away in third. Great Ambassador is the fifth foal out of the Listed-winning Montjeu (Sadler's Wells) mare Snoqualmie Girl. Exceed And Excel stands at Kelvinside for a fee of \$132,000 (inc GST).

**Frankel** - Triple Time (2 c ex Reem Three by Mark Of Esteem) ran out a comfortable winner of the Ascendant Stakes (Listed, 1m) at Haydock on Saturday to give sire Frankel (Galileo) a 78th individual stakes winner. The George Boughey-trained filly showed good speed to race in the front rank and dug deep for jockey Mickael Barzalona when she came under pressure three-out. Corazon battled to grasp the lead through the final furlong and held the runner-up and race favourite Dizzy Bizu (Caravaggio) by a neck, with third-placed Illustrating (Showcasing) a further short-neck behind. Corazon debuted in July with a solid fourth over five furlongs on

the Wolverhampton Tapeta surface and opened her account next time over the same distance on Lingfield's Polytrack before proving the switch to turf and a step up in class in Paris to be well within her compass. The filly's dam, Disko (Kodiak), was a juvenile winner with enough quality to run fourth in a Newmarket Listed contest. Her second dam, Dissonance (Rossini), is a sister to the Firth Of Clyde Stakes (Gr 3, 6f) winner Golden Legacy (Rossini). It is also the family of Prix de Meautry (Gr 3, 1200m) third Stake Acclaim (Acclamation). Markaz stood the 2021 season at Derrinstown Stud at a fee of €3,000 (approx. AU\$4,800).

**Mikki Isle** - Mikki Isle (Deep Impact) sired his third individual elite-level winner when Namura Clair (2 f ex Sun Queen by Storm Cat) made it two wins in three starts with a victory in Sunday's Kokura Nisai Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). Trained by Kodai Hasegawa, Namura Clair beat Sri Pada (Mikki Isle) by two lengths. Anegohada (Kizuna) was another length and a quarter away in third. Mikki Isle stands at Shadai Stallion Station for a 2021 fee of ¥2,500,000 (approx. AU\$30,545).

**Motivator** - Hamish (5 g ex Tweed by Sakhee) defied a 442-day absence to take the September Stakes (Gr 3, 1m 4f) at Kempton for trainer William Haggas to provide sire Motivator (Montjeu) with his 34th individual stakes winner. The gelding had finished a solid fourth on his first foray into Group company in the Hardwicke Stakes in June 2020 (Gr 2, 1m 4f) but had not been seen since. However, Hamish, bred by William's father Brian Haggas, tracked the leaders throughout the contest and showed his staying power to get up near the finish and deny long odds-on favourite Hukum (Sea The Stars) by a neck. Fox Tal (Sea The Stars) was a further half-length back in third. A first foal, Hamish's dam was herself a winner over a mile and a half and half-sister to Listed winner/Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) fourth Vow (Motivator), Australian Group 1 winner Beaten Up (Beat Hollow) and Group 3 winner Harris Tweed (Hernando), all

of which were also trained by William Haggas and bred by his father Brian. Sire Motivator stood at Haras De Quesnay in 2021 for a fee of €7,000 (AU\$11,000).

**Pivotal** - Pivotal (Polar Falcon) was among the winners at Longchamp on Sunday when Varkesha (4 f ex Varana by Sea The Stars) gave him his 173rd individual stakes winner with a comfortable success in the Prix de la Cochere (Listed, 1600m). Ridden by Christophe Soumillon for Alain De Royer-Dupre, the four-year-old filly was out of the gates well and made all to readily see off the late challenges of British-raider Maamora (Dubawi) by a length and a quarter with Layla (Lope De Vega) another length and a quarter further behind in third. Bred and raced by the Aga Khan, Varkesha is the first foal of the Listed-placed winning mare Varana, who herself is a half-sister to French Oaks (Gr 1, 2100m) winner Valyra (Azamour). Former Cheveley Park stallion Pivotal was pensioned earlier this year at the age of 28.

**Proisir** - Soldier Boy (3 g ex Forty Love by Ekraar) caused a minor upset when winning the Wanganui Guineas (Listed, 1340m) on Saturday at Wanganui to give sire Proisir (Choisir) a sixth individual stakes winner. Trained by Gavin Sharrock, the three-year-old was making his first start since catching the eye when coming home nicely in the Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Awapuni in April. Ridden by jockey Kate Hercok, Soldier Boy broke well from barrier eight and was restrained to sit in behind a steady pace before being produced to lead rounding the bend and remaining there until the line to comfortably beat race favourite Yeaboi (Belardo), with the debutant Princess Biddy (Unencumbered) shaping nicely back in third. "He went some nice races as a two-year-old without winning, but I knew he was only going to get better at three," Sharrock said. "He was ready to go today off the back of some good hard gallops but will take a heap of improvement." Future targets will now be plotted for the gelding, who is bred

Bred and raced by Merry Fox Stud Limited, Acer Alley is a half-sister to Group 1 winner Digital Age (Invincible Spirit), while her dam is an unraced half-sister to Group 1 winner Cursory Glance (Distorted Humor). Siyouni currently stands at Haras de Bonneval for a fee of €140,000 (approx. AU\$223,000).

**Smart Missile** - More Prophets (5 m ex Set To Skelter by Reset) landed the Mona Lisa Stakes (Listed, 1350m) at Wyong on Friday to give her sire Smart Missile (Fastnet Rock) his 22nd individual stakes winner. The John Thompson-trained mare took her career tally to five wins from 14 starts, with her latest success following a victory in a Benchmark 78 at Caulfield on August 21. More Prophets charged down the outside under James McDonald to lead close home and scored by a neck from Bring The Ransom (Sebring), with third-placed Great News (Uncle Mo) three-quarters of a length behind. Offered by Yarraman Park Stud at the 2018 Classic Yearling Sale, More Prophets, who is expected to tackle the Tibbie Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Newcastle at her next start on September 17, was passed-in at \$100,000. She is a half-sister to Group 2 winner

Prophet's Thumb (I Am Invincible), being out of the 1200-metre winner Set To Skelter (Reset), a full-sister to Listed winner Module. Twin Hills Stud's Smart Missile is standing the 2021 season at a fee of \$16,500 (inc. GST). McDonald dominated the Wyong card with four wins.

#### Starspangledbanner

Starspangledbanner's (Choisir) Flotus (2 f ex Floriade by Invincible Spirit) romped to victory in Ripon's Champion Two-Year-Old Trophy (Listed, 6f) last Monday, becoming the 21st individual stakes winner for the Rosemont Stud stallion. Owned by Jean-Etienne Dubois, the trainer of Todman Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Aylmerton (Siyouni), as well as Ben Kwok, Flotus won by four and a half lengths over Hellomydarlin (Galileo Gold), with Atomic Lady (Kodiac) six lengths behind the winner in third. A €65,000 foal, the Simon and Ed Crisford-trained Flotus was purchased for 125,000gns at the Tattersalls October Book 1 Yearling Sale and is the seventh individual stakes winner this calendar year for Starspangledbanner, which includes Saratoga Derby (Gr 1, 9.5f) winner State Of Rest, and the Rosemont-owned Brooklyn Hustle, winner of the Dane Ripper Stakes (Gr 2, 1300m) at Eagle Farm in June. Starspangledbanner will stand for a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST) this season.

**Stay Gold** - Meiner Fanrong (6 h Stay Gold - Meine Theresia by Roses In May) made a belated breakthrough in stakes company when the six-year-old took out the Niigata Kinen (Gr 3, 2000m) to provide the late Stay Gold (Sunday Silence) with his 55th individual stakes winner. Trained by Takahisa Tezuka, Meiner Fanrong was winning for the fifth time on his 30th start as he beat Tosen Surya (Lohengrin) by half a length, Third place went to Clavel (Epiphaneia).

**Time Test** - Little Avondale Stud's Time Test (Dubawi), whose book for 2021 was announced as full last week, sired his second and third individual stakes winners last week. Rocchigiani (2 c ex Ronja by El Corredor) remained unbeaten when stepping up to Group

3 level on just his second start on Wednesday, winning the Renate und Albrecht Woeste Zukunftsrennen (Gr 3, 7f) at Baden Baden. The Peter Schiergen-trained colt defeated Arnis Master (Tai Chi) by a length and a half, with Calif (Areion) third, a further two lengths in arrears. On Thursday,

**Romantic Time** - (2 f ex Percy's Romance by Sir Percy) stuck to the far rail and charged home from deep to land the Dick Poole Fillies' Stakes (Listed, 6f) at Salisbury. Hollie Doyle drove the juvenile to finish a length ahead of second-placed Pearl Glory (Cotai Glory), with third-placed Crazyland (Kodiac) a further short-head behind in the 12-runner contest. The victory was Romantic Time's third at her sixth start. The filly, out of a half-sister to the Listed-placed Top Tug (Halling), is the first foal out of her dam, Percy's Romance, who is a maiden daughter of the Oh So Sharp Stakes (Listed, 7f) winner Top Romance (Entrepreneur), herself a half-sister to the multiple Group-race placed National Anthem (Royal Academy). Time Test stood the northern hemisphere at the National Stud at a fee of £8,500. His southern hemisphere fee is NZ\$8,500 (inc. GST).

**Toronado** - Mouillage (3 c ex Hazely by Cape Cross) gave Toronado (High Chaparral) his 17th individual stakes winner as a sire when successful in the Prix Millkom (Listed, 1600m) at La Teste de Buch on Friday. The Jean-Claude Rouget-trained colt tracked the lead in second under Jean-Bernard Eyquem and took all but the final half-furlong of the home straight to grind his way to the lead and land his fourth victory from 11 starts. Mouillage was a neck in front of the runner-up Leopards Park (Siyouni) with the pace-setting Izlaz (Epaulette) a further length behind in third. Rouget purchased the winner for €37,000 from Normandie Breeding at the 2019 Osarus September Yearling sale. His dam, Hazely (Cape Cross), was a two-time winner at around two miles and is out of the dual Californian Listed winner Sentimental Value (Diesis) who is a half-sister to six

winners in Japan. Toronado stood the northern hemisphere season at Haras de Bouquetot at a fee of €8,000 and is standing the southern hemisphere at Swettenham Stud for a fee of \$45,000 (inc. GST).

**Wandjina** - Express Pass (5 g ex Pass The Parcel by More Than Ready) gave Wandjina (Snitzel) his third individual stakes winner when the Nick Ryan-trained gelding scored the biggest win of his career so far in the Chautauqua Stakes (Listed, 1200m) on Saturday. The five-year-old was placed on debut in the Redoute's Choice Stakes (Listed, 1200m) before finishing a close third in the Danehill Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) a couple of starts later, and he takes record to five wins from 17 starts with victory. Ridden by Jye McNeil for the first time, the unfancied \$15 chance scored a comfortable two-length success from race favourite Bella Nipotina (Pride Of Dubai) with the big-priced Irish Flame (Zed) a further three-quarters of a length back in third. "The race mapped well and Jye rode him a treat," Ryan said. "We can see what this horse can do on his day. He ran third in a Danehill as a three-year-old and he's got a good finishing burst and we saw it today." A third foal from winning dam Pass The Parcel (More Than Ready), the gelding is a half-brother to six-time winner Express Courier (Foxwedge) and three-time winner Wrapsody (Hinchinbrook). Bred by Pepac Atf Ept, Express Pass was bought by JJ Consultants/Nick Ryan Racing for \$38,000 at the Inglis Melbourne VOBIS Gold Yearling Sale in 2018. Wandjina currently stands at Larneuk Stud for a fee of \$8,800 (inc GST) in 2021.

**War Command** - Artistic Rifles (5 g ex Chatham Islands by Elusive Quality) provided jockey Andrea Atzeni with a stakes race double when landing the Superior Mile Stakes (Gr 3, 1m) at Haydock for up-and-coming trainer Edward Bethell. The win also marked an eighth individual stakes winner for sire War Command (War Front). After breaking well out of the stalls, Atzeni took his mount to the lead early on and the pair established a good four length break

on the field with only three furlongs to go and despite the best efforts of second placed Bell Rock (Kingman) and third placed My Oberon (Dubawi), they could not catch the five-year-old. Bred by Lynn Lodge Stud, Artistic Rifles was originally sold by the stud for €60,000 (AU\$95,500) but the gelding was picked up for just 5,000 guineas at the Tattersalls August sale for owner Zaro Srl. A seventh foal, he is a half-brother to Group 3 winner Balty Boys (Cape Cross), six furlong winner Shore Step (Footstepsinthesand) and all-weather winner Catsbury (Teofilo). Sire War Command stood at Haras De Gelos in 2021 for a fee of €3,500 (AU\$5,500).

**Wootton Bassett** - Coolmore's shuttle sire Wootton Bassett (Ifraaj) sired his 22nd individual stakes winner when Wootton Asset (3 c ex Love Liu by Librettist) landed the Virginia Derby (Gr 3, 9f) at Colonial Downs on Tuesday. Now the winner of three of his ten starts, Wootton Asset, who started his career with two victories in France, beat Slicked Back (Quality Road) and It Can't Be Done (Temple City) by three-quarters of a length and a length and three-quarters. Wootton Bassett will cover

his first book of Australian mares this season at a fee of \$71,500 (inc GST).

**Zoustar** -Zoustar's (Northern Meteor) Zouzarella (3 f ex Zazparella by Al Maher) ran home an impressive two-length winner of the Atlantic Jewel Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Moonee Valley on Saturday, remaining unbeaten from two starts as she stepped up to stakes level with consummate ease and became the 24th individual black-type winner for her Widden Stud stallion. The Cambridge Stud-owned filly, a \$250,000 buy from the Glastonbury Farms draft at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, defeated Larkspur Run (Shamardal) with Literary Magnate (Written Tycoon) third, two and three-quarter lengths behind the winner, as they stacked up behind, leaving favourite Argentia (Frankel) nowhere to go on the inside, and could only finish eighth. She is the second named foal out of Al Maher (Danehill) mare Zazparella, a winner of six from 42 starts in her racing career, and sister to the stakes placed Almachino, while she is a half-sister to Inglis 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) third Let's Get Nauti Gal (Harbour Watch). Zoustar stands for a fee of \$154,000 (Inc GST) this year.

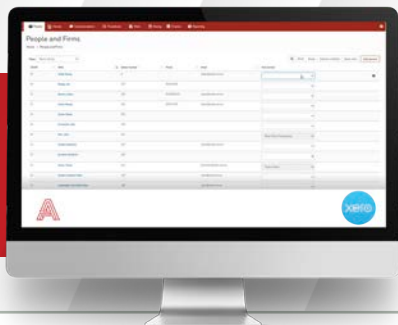
