Canning Downs soaking up Extreme experience with exciting Blue Sapphire winner

Warrior could provide owners with ultimate reward in Group 1 Coolmore Stud Stakes

The decision to send Extreme Warrior (Extreme Choice) to an Echuca maiden to start a make-or-break spring preparation might've raised eyebrows amongst the owners of the talented colt but less than a fortnight later the group are staring down the barrel of a Group 1 and a horse worth north of \$10 million.

On Wednesday, the Mick Price and Mick Kent Jnr-trained Extreme Warrior destroyed his opposition in the Blue Sapphire Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), surging to favouritism for October

30's Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) as a result, and as a result providing John Barnes and Joy Mackay of Canning Downs Stud and their fellow owners with a nervous fortnight until Derby Day.

Extreme Warrior's emergence is not a total surprise given he was placed in a Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m) and Blue Diamond Preview (C&G) (Listed, 1000m) at two, but the manner of his explosive victory, in which he put nearly four lengths on his nearest rival, arguably was his best performance despite him putting a wide margin on his opponents 12 days earlier in country Victoria. *Continued on page 3>>*

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<< *Continued from page 1* “He has come back as a really exciting horse and he’s always shown those glimpses of brilliance, but it takes a while to put it all together. All the pieces of the puzzle seemed to have fallen into place (on Wednesday) and that was good to see,” Mackay told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

“I think he was a horse that needed to experience that (first) win, and to Mick and Michael’s credit, we were thinking, ‘we thought this horse was really good, does he really have to go to Echuca?’ but it just gave him that little bit of confidence and if he can gain that much confidence from Echuca, let’s hope he can gain even more from Caulfield.”

Price cut a bemused figure post-race at Caulfield in the minutes after Extreme Warrior had demolished the field including Profiteer (Capitalist), the race favourite who, it was later revealed, had the better of his stablemate in a track gallop last Saturday.

That information had been filtered through to Extreme Warrior’s owners prior to the Blue Sapphire which had

tempered the ownership group’s expectations.

“Profiteer had the edge (in the gallop), that’s right. I think they thought, as did we, that we would have been absolutely delighted if he’d run in the first three and I don’t think anyone could have forecasted he’d win the race like he did but they did expect him to run a very competitive race,” she said.

“On everything that they could see on the track, Profiteer seemed to have the edge.”

Canning Downs has breeding rights in Pierata (Pierro), Microphone (Exceed And Excel) and Kitchwin Hills’ newcomer Graff (Star Witness), while Barnes and Mackay had been involved in late Widden Stud sires Sebring (More Than Ready) and Stratum (Redoute’s Choice).

Despite sitting on a potential gold mine if Extreme Warrior can fulfil the second leg of his Group-race spring preparation, Mackay and the colt’s other owners, which includes Rosemont Stud, are not rushing off to sign a future stallion deal just yet.

He is, of course, from the same small crop by Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt) which has also produced Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) hero Stay Inside, Group 2 winner Tiger Of Malay and Listed scorer Xtremetime.

“Look, I am sure you could think of half a dozen studs where you would be thrilled to have him go, including Rosemont.

“I am sure there will be a few discussions in the next few weeks, but we are in no hurry

to do anything. Quite frankly, if the status quo remained that would be good, too.”

While better known as breeders, foaling down about 20 mares a year and consigning yearlings at the major sales each year, particularly its home-state Magic Millions Gold Coast auction, Canning Downs Stud decided to invest in a pool of young horses to race.

Barnes and Mackay called on Irish agent Dermot Farrington for his assistance and it was on his recommendation while he was on the grounds at last year’s Magic Millions on the Gold Coast, that they bought into a \$160,000 yearling who would become Extreme Warrior.

“Dermot’s bought several horses for us in the past with some good results, so we were very happy to do that and we have interests in a couple of other horses with the Price Kent stable as well,” Mackay said.

“Principally, we were looking for a nice horse to race, but *Continued on page 5*>>

<< *Continued from page 4* increasingly in this day and age everyone always has an eye out for a colt, so if you can identify something that is a nice physical with a good pedigree.

“We have some shares in some other horses and you hope that one of them might make the grade and I think this fellow seems to have done that which is very exciting.”

As with much of the past two years, Mackay and Barnes won't be at Flemington later this month to see their star colt in the flesh and they hope to keep the anticipation to a minimum.

“Fortunately the horse can't read and, really, we are just passengers because it is all up to the stable and up to the horse,” she said.

“Hopefully he takes the next step. Michael (Kent Jnr) sent us a video after the race and he was back at the tie-ups and he was very interested in some of the fillies going out for the next race and what he might be able to do there, so he seemed to have managed the race quite comfortably.”

THE WEEK IN ROWE-VIEW

trained three-year-old colt won the Randwick Group 1 at just his third start.

“We haven't had a big enough sample here to see how good Deep Impact is, but they are great horses and they've proven it all over the world,” Messara said soon after toasting another Group 1 success via the Arrowfield-bred and co-owned Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Yearning (Snitzel).

“It looks like (our investment in Deep Impact) is going to justify itself, but there is more for that horse to do and I have still got another one or two up my sleeve by Deep Impact yet to come out.

They include fellow three-year-olds and Arrowfield-owned Always On My Mind, a filly with Ben and JD Hayes who is a daughter of 2015 Thousand Guineas winner Stay With Me (Street Cry - Miss Finland by Redoute's Choice) and the Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained filly Polyphonic, a daughter of Madrigals (Lonhro), who is co-owned by Jonathan Munz.

Octavio and Wendy Galletta, the owners of

Profondo, received numerous enquiries about the colt's future following his Group 1 win, but he told us during the week that he was not yet making any call on any potential stud deals or selling him to race in Europe.

“To win a Group 1 win at only his third start over 2000 metres was very impressive and I am really pleased for the Gallettas,” Messara said.

“I was more relieved than they were after Saturday because they spent a lot of money buying that horse and, I have to tell you, after they went past the post, I am not sure if it was more happiness or relief that they got a result out of the horse.”

As for Profondo becoming Arrowfield's homegrown son of Deep Impact to stand at stud, Messara was non-committal.

“I will wait and see what he does next year. They will do what they do, the Gallettas, as they are good friends of ours. If it suits us and it suits them, we will do something, and if it doesn't we won't,” he said.

“There's no pressure from anybody.”

Sydney jockeys granted exemptions to ride in Melbourne

The Victorian government has granted permission for five of Sydney's leading jockeys to participate in the Melbourne spring carnival. Moonee Valley Racing Club CEO Michael Browell confirmed on Twitter that Hugh Bowman, James McDonald and Glen Boss will all ride in tomorrow week's Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) after receiving official clearance yesterday. McDonald will reunite with the Annabel Neasham-trained race favourite Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux), while Bowman jumps aboard stablemate Mo'Unga (Savabeel) with Boss on Sir Dragonet (Camelot). Kerrin McEvoy and Rachel King have also been cleared to head south for the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) carnival a week later. The Cox Plate trio will all ride at The Everest (1200m) meeting at Randwick tomorrow before travelling to Victoria where they are expected to complete a six-day quarantine period. They will also need to return negative tests to Covid-19 before riding at Moonee Valley.

Young Werther ready for next step

Young Werther (Tavistock) will be looking to score just his second career win when he lines up in tomorrow's Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m). The four-year-old won on debut over 1500 metres at Geelong last September and has since posted six placings from nine starts, including in the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) and Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m). His trainer Danny O'Brien believes the gelding's runner-up effort behind

Incentivise (Shamus Award) in the Turnbull Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) last time shows he has come of age. "We were happy with his performance in the Turnbull and he seems to have improved out of it," O'Brien told SENTrack. "He worked strongly on Tuesday morning at Flemington on the course proper. He seems to have come up in good shape, but he still needs to take another step up on Saturday." Young Werther has handled soft ground but connections do not want it a Heavy 9 or 10 for the \$10 chance.

Oliver on track to make cup weight

Damien Oliver will ride at his lightest for more than a decade when he gets the leg-up on Delphi (Galileo) for tomorrow's Caulfield Cup. A 2017 rule change means that this year the Caulfield Cup top-weights Homesman (War Front) and Incentivise will shoulder 55.5 kilograms, whereas before the topweights could have been raised to 57 kilograms. Without that uplift, Oliver must ride Delphi at 53 kilograms. "I must say a lot of the jockeys weren't happy the weights didn't go up," Oliver said. "Apparently, the argument is the internationals aren't happy that if the topweight doesn't accept, the weights go up, but that's irrelevant, it's our race and I don't see the reason in making them ride so light. It's all relevant if the weights go up anyway. It's not just one horse that goes up, it's all horses." Oliver said he was tracking well to get down to 53 kilograms having ridden at Wednesday's Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) meeting at 54 kilograms. "I've been training three times a day and just eating brown rice, fruit and vegetables and fish with no salt, no sugar," Oliver continued. "We're in

lockdown, I can't do much else. It's the spring carnival, I'm a jockey, that's what I do. I've been doing it for a long time, so I know how to manage it."

Bates praying for rain

Declan Bates is hoping the wet weather forecast proves to be right ahead of his date with Quick Thinker (So You Think) in the Caulfield Cup. The Irish-born rider will partner the five-year-old for co-trainers Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman. "For him it's the wetter the better, I think a heavy track will bring a lot of the field unstuck, whereas him, he would absolutely relish it. I'll be doing a rain dance for sure," Bates told Racing.com. "If things go his way on the day, he's a genuine chance really, in the right conditions." The 2020 Australian Derby winner has never finished out of the placings on heavy going, so far in his career. "If it ends up in the heavy range you'd have to think him to be a good chance to be in the place-money, for sure," Bates added. Quick Thinker is a \$61 outsider for the Caulfield Cup.

Port Guillaume to undergo fitness test

Racing Victoria vets yesterday passed 16 of the 17 runners inspected so far ahead of the Caulfield Cup but a question mark lingers over the fitness of Port Guillaume (Le Havre). The Ben and JD Hayes-trained four-year-old was showing signs of lameness in the off foreleg and will be re-examined today, with the stable reporting the gelding had not missed any work. RV vets inspected 15 of the 18 runners plus the two emergencies and will also go over Quick Thinker, The Chosen One (Choisir) and She's Ideel (Dundeel) today to complete their mandatory Caulfield Cup inspections.

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Godolphin hold strong Saturday hand

The in-form Godolphin operation is hoping for another big Saturday with its runners at Caulfield tomorrow, led by Colette (Hallowed Crown) in the Tristarc Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m). The five-year-old mare was forced to miss the Turnbull Stakes with a foot abscess and has not raced since her fifth placing in the Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) on September 11. "She ran really well at this trip first up last preparation, so it's not uncharted territory for the mare, and if we get a bit of weather during the week it would be welcome," Godolphin representative Sean Keogh told Racing.com. Meanwhile, Gaulois (Street Cry) will contest the Moonga Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m), and Victoria Derby hopeful Micro (Medaglia D'Oro), who Keogh said is "excelling", will take in the Caulfield Classic (Gr 3, 2000m). The three-year-old filly Stalking (Animal Kingdom) could go on to the VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m) if she pleases in the Ethereal Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m), while Varda (Lonhro) and Emanate (Lonhro) will contest the Alinghi Stakes (Listed, 1100m) and Vianello (Teofilo) will represent Godolphin in race two.

Weather key to Chaillot start

Archie Alexander is considering pulling Chaillot (Testa Rossa) from the Tristarc Stakes if the predicted rain pushes the track into the heavy range. Rainfall on Wednesday night brought 15 millimetres to the Caulfield track and between 20 millimetres and 50 millimetres more could fall before race time. "She's in really good form, it looks a good race for her, but it's just the weather, what can you do!" Alexander said. "So, if the track does come up heavy, we might not run." Chaillot won the Testa Rossa Stakes (Listed, 1300m) first-up and if she misses out tomorrow, could head directly to the Empire Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m), in which she finished fourth last year. "At least she is that natural, fit, fresh sprinting type, so if we don't run, it's not the end of the world," Alexander added. "And if she doesn't run, we can still go straight to the Empire Rose. At least if it does rain ahead of Flemington, it will be day one there, rather than day three at Caulfield."

Jazz puts Derby hopes on the line

A wet track is not expected to dampen the

hopes of Lindsay Park's possible Victoria Derby contender Reset The Jazz (Reset) in the Caulfield Classic. The gelding has raced on only two occasions but shapes as a stayer in the making for trainers Ben and JD Hayes and he posted a 1600-metre maiden win on heavy ground at Bendigo on October 3. "He's a really nice horse that is on a path to the Derby," Ben Hayes said. "So, if he can run a good race on Saturday we'll be definitely heading in that direction. He's by Reset and is bred to stay and he was an impressive winner last start. That was on a heavy track too and that is what it's likely to be on Saturday, so that's only going to help him as well. He's a big scopey horse, built like a Derby horse, so hopefully he can run the trip."

Ethereal run to determine Oaks bid for Adele

The John Sadler stable will get a definitive answer as to whether Adele Amour (Sebring) is an Oaks filly when she runs in the Ethereal Stakes tomorrow. After winning at Sandown, Adele Amour was beaten into a smart second at the same track, with subsequent Listed winner El Patroness (Shamus Award) in third, but was then a disappointing fifth in the Edward Manifold Stakes (Gr 2, 1610m) last time when heavily supported. "She just didn't give a kick," said Tom Sadler, assistant trainer and co-trainer-in-waiting to his father. "She led, didn't go that hard after having to do a little work to get across, but she was disappointing in the run home. We really feel that she will stay, and she had some really good form around her through Barb Raider and El Patroness and when El Patroness won, we were probably even more confident." Sadler said the VRC Oaks at Flemington on November 4 had been a long-term aim for the filly who is out of two-time Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) runner-up Divine Rebel (Don Eduardo). "I think we'll have a pretty definitive answer after Saturday when we ride her a bit quieter."

Eduardo poised to reach peak

Eduardo (Host) blew his lines when he faded to finish 11th of 12 in last year's Everest (1200m) but his trainer Joe Pride is confident the eight-year-old is in top shape as he prepares for redemption in tomorrow's running of the \$15m

contest. Eduardo has since defeated Nature Strip (Nicconi) in the Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1000m) and earned elite wins in The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) and Doomben 10,000 (Gr 1, 1200m) before scoring first up this season in The Shorts (Gr 2, 1100m). "We've been able to give him the proper preparation to peak this time and the autumn really helped me with that. Whereas before I was feeling my way through it not really knowing what was required to get him to peak fitness," Pride said. Eduardo's only defeat last autumn came when third behind Nature Strip in the TJ Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and Pride said it was the preparation rather than the distance that was the main factor. "I think anytime a horse puts in a peak run like he did in The Galaxy, you're entitled to a little dip and that's what we got from the horse," Pride continued. The trainer is being philosophical about this year's Everest tilt. "If it's our turn, it's our turn. We've done everything we can to make it our turn and the rest is out of our hands. He has had a beautiful, faultless preparation," he added.

McDonald predicts epic Everest battle

Nature Strip has missed a place in two Everest attempts but his jockey James McDonald anticipates his mount, along with arch-rival Eduardo and last year's third placegetter Gytrash (Lope De Vega), hold the aces in the \$15 million sprint tomorrow. "They're the tough heads and I think that's what we're going to need here," McDonald said. "A fit horse ready to fight out the last hundred with some pretty sturdy customers." With a wet track expected, punters are warming to the Chris Waller-trained Nature Strip, who joined Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt) at the top of Everest markets yesterday. The speedster has won six of his nine starts on rain-affected ground and unlike 12 months ago, this campaign has been incident-free as he heads in off the back of a sizzling first-up win in the Concorde Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) and a narrow second to Eduardo in The Shorts. "I reckon we'll see a pretty special performance from him," McDonald continued. "The horse can't look any better, he can't feel any better and his headspace is in the perfect spot. There will be no excuses if he does get beat, but I think whatever beats him will win the race."

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O'Shea stays relaxed with Lost And Running

John O'Shea is certain tomorrow's Everest will be Lost And Running's (Per Incanto) best performance this preparation. The five-year-old started the spring as the X-Factor horse of the \$15 million sprint, having won six of his first seven races, but he failed to beat a horse home in his first big test in the The Shorts first-up this season before running a length and a half second behind Masked Crusader (Toronado) in the Premiere Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m), off a wide run. "It's what we call a humble bounce back," the trainer said. "When you have a disappointing performance I always say to my owners, you don't erase ten lengths in two weeks. You erase six or seven lengths and then next time out you get to ten. We erased a good few lengths from a poor performance first up into second up." Lost And Running will break from gate two under Hugh Bowman and the likely hot tempo should suit. "Hopefully they go too quick, he gets a nice run into the straight and hopefully he goes on with it," O'Shea said. "I think you want to draw soft and he's going to lob into that lovely sweet spot in behind the speed, he's got good speed himself but not silly speed. There's an opportunity there for him to run particularly well."

Second Kosciuszko beckons for Canberra stalwart

Handle The Truth (Star Witness) will aim to become the first horse to win the Kosciuszko (1200m) twice but with Covid travel restrictions preventing his trainer Keith Dryden from being at Randwick tomorrow, Dryden has enlisted the help of champion trainer Chris Waller. "We're in lockdown still, so I can't attend but Chris Waller is going to saddle him up for me," the Canberra horseman said. Handle The

Truth heads Kosciuszko betting having finished fourth behind the Waller-trained Nature Strip in the Concorde Stakes two starts ago then seventh behind Eduardo in The Shorts. "They were excellent runs," Dryden continued. "He's not up to that class, we knew that when he went in, but it gives you a guide that the horse is going well. He's going to be competitive on those runs." Handle The Truth won the Kosciuszko in 2019 and finished fourth from a wide draw last year. "I think he's probably going as well," added Dryden. "He's a little bit older and more mature and a little bit more settled as a racehorse. I wouldn't say he's gone backwards at all." This year, the 59 kilogram top-weight, a \$4.40 chance, has drawn gate one under Nash Rawiller.

All clear for Everest field

Racing NSW vets and stewards completed an inspection yesterday of all runners engaged in tomorrow's The Everest at Randwick. All horses passed their inspections and were deemed suitable to start, and samples taken from the runners were submitted to the Australian Racing Forensic Laboratory for routine analysis.

Front Page scratched ... again

For the second year running, Front Page (Magnus) has been scratched from The Kosciuszko. The gelding was taken out of the contest the day before last year's race after he was injured on the float during transit and this time his trainer Geoff Duryea has advised Racing NSW stewards that the unfortunate five-year-old has sustained a ligament injury to his near-hind leg. A replacement runner is set to be announced from among the four emergencies.

Lipp to aim up for summer carnival

Stablemate Simply Fly (Spirit Of Boom) and Tycoon Evie (Written Tycoon) will clash in the Sky Racing Handicap (1000m) at Eagle Farm tomorrow with their co-trainers Rex Lipp and Nicholas Hahn pointing the pair towards the Queensland Summer Racing Carnival. Both had aborted winter plans with Simply Fly bowing out of a Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) mission and Tycoon Evie pulled out of a Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) tilt after sub-par lead-up

runs. "They're both resuming and have won a barrier trial each but they've got a long campaign ahead so there's plenty of improvement in both of them," Lipp said. "It's not an easy field they're up against and it's only 1000 metres but both have won first up in the past so it wouldn't surprise me if either of them wins. But they're a long way off being match fit." Simply Fly is being aimed at the George Moore Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Doomben on December 4, into The Gateway (1400m) at Doomben, which is a ballot-free race into the Stradbroke, while Tycoon Evie heads towards the Just Now Quality (Listed, 1300m) at Eagle Farm in December. "We tried Tycoon Evie as a stayer and it didn't work out," Lipp said. "She's definitely a sprinter and her best distance is between 1400 and 1600 metres."

D-Day looms for Aysar

Leneva Park paid more than \$1 million for Aysar (Deep Field) as a stallion prospect out of the Shadwell dispersal but the clock is ticking on last year's Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) runner-up who is still without a major win on his record. The four-year-old was scratched from last weekend's Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) with a hind quarter strain and there have even been suggestions his ownership group should cut their losses and geld him, but victory in the lucrative Golden Eagle (1500m) on October 30 would book his place on the stallion roster. "The Golden Eagle is a bit of a crossroads run for him," Leneva Park general manager Mick Sharkie told Racing.com. "The Golden Eagle was always on the cards; if he ran well in the Toorak, he was going there anyway. It's not a Group 1 race but, it's a bit like The Everest, if you win it, you probably carry as much clout. We could happily stand him off the back of a Golden Eagle if he happened to win."

Hinged spelled

Part-owner Brae Sokolski told Radio TABAus yesterday that Hinged (Worthy Cause) will be spelled following her sixth-placed effort in Wednesday's Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). The Chris Waller-trained filly will enjoy a break before being set towards an autumn campaign that could feature the Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Rosehill in March and the ATC Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) at Randwick in early April.

Litt making most of Profondo opportunity

Richard Litt has worked his way up the ladder in Sydney racing from a stablehand to become the trainer of Group 1-winning colts Castelvechchio (Dundeel) and Profondo (Deep Impact), both for owners Ottavio and Wendy Galleta. Castelvechchio proved to be among the best of his generation as a juvenile and Profondo's imperious display in the Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) already puts him among the best of his generation. "This was different to when Castelvechchio was winning his big races," Litt said. "It was huge to see Profondo deliver like that, knowing what he's capable of and then to actually do it. He's in the paddock now, which was always the plan, and he'll come back to prepare for races like the Randwick and Rosehill Guineas. We're not thinking so much the (ATC) Derby, but if everything went to plan the Queen Elizabeth is a race we could consider." Profondo is a hot stallion prospect, being a son of Japan's super sire Deep Impact (Sunday Silence). "Ahead of the Magic Millions Sale, I knew (Ottavio) was keen on Arrowfield's Deep Impact colt, but I wasn't under any illusion that he would actually end up with him," Litt said. "I'd love to go international with him, he'd be the ideal horse to travel. He's incredibly intelligent, happy with his own company and you can lightly train him, he's such a natural."

Armory to join Maher stable

Armory (Galileo) will leave Aidan O'Brien's Ballydolye stable to continue his career in Australia under the care of co-trainers Ciaran Maher and David Eustace, after Tim Porter, who is also part of the ownership group of Caulfield Cup contender Explosive Jack (Jakkalberry), sealed a deal for last year's Cox Plate runner-up. The entire, a five-year-old by southern hemisphere reckoning, is scheduled to land in Australia before the month is out and will leave quarantine in early November. Armory won the Huxley Stakes (Gr 2, 1m 2.5f) at Chester in May and also placed third behind Love (Galileo) in the Prince of Wales's Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 2f) at Royal Ascot in June but was only sixth of eight in the Mr D. Stakes (Gr 1, 10f) in Chicago last

time. He is likely to be targeted at autumn features like the Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) and Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) in Sydney.

Kembla Grange called off

Yesterday's racing at Kembla Grange was called off after the fourth contest due to inclement weather and the state of the track. The surface was rated a Heavy 10 at the start of racing with stewards continuing to monitor conditions, but after heavy rain, the decision was made to postpone races five through eight.

White suspended pending treatment charges

New South Wales stewards have charged Hawkesbury trainer Garry White under Rule AR 254 related to injecting horses at prohibited times. White is charged with having injected four of his horses - Hot Dancing (Sizzling), Fine Impact (Real impact), Dreamline (Dream Ahead) and Timely Shadow (Uncle Mo) - on October 9, within one clear day of their intended race engagements at Hawkesbury on October 10. The horses were scratched from their engagements and samples were taken and sent to the Australian Racing Forensic Laboratory for analysis, as well as items seized from White's stables. White's licence has been suspended pending determination of the charge and Racing NSW stewards may issue further charges and White will be required to attend an inquiry into further allegations, once analysis of the samples and exhibits has been completed.

Umoff new president of South Australian Racehorse Owners Association

Allie Umoff is taking the reins from Ken Cock as president of the South Australian Racehorse Owners Association (SAROA). Cock has taken the decision to stand down after three years in the role, during which time he worked to improve relationships between SAROA and other industry bodies. Umoff, the association's vice-president, was elected president unopposed at a recent committee meeting, at which Cock agreed to stay on as vice-president. Umoff will bring to the role a passion for racing

NEW ZEALAND

Tavi Mac returns in Sweynesse

Tavi Mac (Tavistock) will try to get his spring preparation back on track at Arawa Park on Sunday when he lines-up in the Sweynesse Stakes (Gr 3, 1215m). The Group 2 winner put in an uncharacteristic subpar performance when ninth in the Foxbridge Plate (Gr 2, 1200m) at Te Rapa last month but his trainer Allan Sharrock was able to find the reason behind the poor showing. "He had a shoulder injury and a slight heart murmur, so we had to kick for touch and try to get him back to where we wanted him," Sharrock said. Tavi Mac then missed the Hawke's Bay Spring Carnival but Sharrock believes he has the six-year-old back on track. "I am pretty sure he is 95 (per cent), he seems pretty right at the moment and won a jump-out on Monday. Hopefully we are on target for Sunday." Tavi Mac will jump from barrier seven with Danielle Johnson aboard and will meet Tarzino Trophy (Gr 1, 1400m) runner-up Spring Tide (Darci Brahma) and Foxbridge Plate winner Mascarpone (Shooting To Win). "He's a 1400-metre to a miler, so he has got to kick-off somewhere and 1200 metres seems good enough at this stage," the trainer continued. "Mascarpone is a good horse and I think the ground (rated Slow 8 on Thursday morning) will suit Spring Tide," Sharrock added.

Brando ready for starring role

Talented galloper Brando (Savabeel) will bid to emulate one of Matamata trainer Jamie Richards' best horses, Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle), when he contests the Red Badge Spring Sprint (Gr 3, 1400m) at Hastings tomorrow. A win would put him on course for the Coupland's Bakeries Mile (Gr 2, 1600m) at Riccarton on November 10. "The Coupland's is an option. We won this race on the way there with Te Akau Shark. He's probably not in that horse's league but that's something we'd seriously think about," Richards said. Brando has won four of eight starts, including a 1200-metre handicap at Te Rapa last time. "He's going really well. He won well first-up. He got a nice run from a good draw and he was well-weighted in that race. It looks kind of the same again for Saturday. He's got a nice draw, nice weight and up to 1400 metres should suit him. He should be a good chance. He's come on a bit from that Te Rapa run. He's tightened up a bit and seems to be training well."

Aegon pleases in Taupo trial

Aegon's (Sacred Falls) Golden Eagle (1500m) tilt took a hit when he finished 11th in the Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) last month but it appeared to be back on track after a 1225-metre trial at Taupo yesterday. The four-year-old travelled midfield in his trial until asked to accelerate up the inside in the home straight by Craig Grylls. He ran away to pass the post three and a quarter lengths in front. "It was obviously a pretty slowly run heat and he just sprinted, and the others went around for a bit of a hit-out, but it served a purpose for us, and it was nice to see him stretch out like that and pull up so well," said Andrew Forsman, who trains in partnership with Murray Baker. Forsman was not able to be trackside as a result of Covid-19 border restrictions. Aegon was found to have blood in one nostril after his Makybe Diva disappointment and returned home to New Zealand. "They (vets) scoped him after the race and didn't class it as a pulmonary hemorrhage. The poor performance is a little bit hard to explain," Forsman added. Aegon is now set to fly to Sydney on Sunday-week ahead of the Golden Eagle at Rosehill on October 30

NZB Ready to Run breeze-up videos online

New Zealand Bloodstock's annual Ready To Run Sale Breeze-Ups saw 255 two-year-olds gallop down the home straight of Te Rapa racecourse earlier this week, and this year the accompanying video footage for each horse has been lengthened. The videos, which are available to view online at www.nzbc.co.nz, also carry vision of the mounting yard prior to horses breezing. This follows previous extensions to the video clips in 2020 to include additional footage near the 600-metre mark to capture horses before they fully extended into their gallop, while horses also had the last 200 metres of their work individually timed. NZB also filmed the majority of the two-year-olds being paraded in the mounting yard at Te Rapa prior to their gallop. Each heat is recorded in high definition and the video clips can be downloaded from Vimeo or viewed in couch mode under the sale catalogue 'Breeze Up' tab on the website, playing all clips from start to finish. Breeze-Ups will also be broadcast lot-by-lot on Trackside in New Zealand, Racing.com and Sky Racing in Australia. The Ready to Run Sale will see over 300 quality juveniles go under the hammer on November 18 and 19.

Pair cleared after wrong test results

Jockeys Jason Laking and Corey Campbell have been exonerated after the Racing Integrity Board found that non-negative tests they returned at Invercargill on May 14 were found to be wrong. The two were stood down for the rest of the day. "Subsequent analysis determined that there was no unlawful substance in the samples of the two riders. To be clear, the screening test was wrong and the riders were cleared of any wrongdoing whatsoever," an RIB statement said. As a result, the RIB said that following a thorough investigation, it found that "the non-negative result was attributable to a very small margin of error in the testing equipment", and, as such, "drug screening tests will no longer be relied upon to determine the suitability of a rider to continue riding." The IRB will instead now select riders for drug testing and a sample will be taken and forwarded for analysis, after which the IRB will take action on

any positive once it has been formally advised. Alcohol screening processes are not affected by the change.

HK: Naboo Attack chases first Group 2 win

Naboo Attack (Warhead) will attempt to boost his rating off a low weight in the Premier Bowl Handicap (Gr 2, 1200m) at Sha Tin on Sunday. David Hayes' charge has emerged as a possible contender the Hong Kong Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) in December after two wins and a second-place off only three starts, but with a rating of 101, he needs to put in a big performance under a 114lb featherweight. "He needs to win to get his rating (101) up a bit more so, if he can win this race, I probably wouldn't run him again until the big sprint in December to give him his best chance in that race," Hayes said of the five-year-old who will face stablemate Super Wealthy (Epaulette), the recent winner of the National Day Cup Handicap (Gr 3, 1000m). "They're very even, but I probably have a slight preference for Naboo Attack with the lower weight. He's got only 114lb and he's a pretty impressive, big horse. They've both held their form, but I would say that Naboo Attack is the best he's been this preparation," Hayes continued. Alxeis Badel will partner Naboo Attack, with Zac Purton unable to make the weight, and Chad Schofield will be aboard Super Wealthy. The field also features Sky Field (Deep Field) and the unbeaten four-year-old Courier Wonder (Sacred Falls) who is first-up for the campaign.

HK: Trophy test for Sky Darci

Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) winner Sky Darci (Darci Brahma) will aim to build on a first-up third in a Group 3 handicap last time when he takes in the Sha Tin Trophy Handicap (Gr 2, 1600m) at Sha Tin on Sunday. The five-year-old is building towards December and a possible clash with Golden Sixty (Medaglia D'Oro) in the Hong Kong Mile (Gr 1, 1600m). "He's come out of the first race very well. Hopefully, he can make his presence felt. He's still improving, his best races will still be in November, December," the gelding's trainer Caspar Fownes said. "But, in saying that, he gets his chance to win on the weekend. His work on Tuesday morning was really good." Fownes' nine-year-old Southern Legend (Not A Single Doubt) will shoulder top-weight of 133lb. "The old champ worked well on Tuesday. Blake Shinn was very happy with him. He said he felt enormous," Fownes said. "He's getting there. The races in November and December will be to his advantage with the ratings." Stayer Columbus County (Redwood) completes Fownes' entry in the race, which also features Sha Tin Group 1 winners Waikuku (Harbour Watch) and Panfield (Lookin' At Lucky).

SGP: Six Al Rashid horses leave Clements

Al Rashid Stable, the racing operation fronted by Kuwaiti businessman Fahad Ibrahim Khalid Al-Rashid, has moved six of its horses from Michael Clements' yard at Kranji to continue their racing careers in the Middle East. Almugir (Union Rags), Jacksa (Lemon Drop Kid) and Zahau (Fed Biz) are already in quarantine in Dubai and will shortly be followed on a November 11 flight by Al Meqdam (Exceed And Excel), Day Approach (Dawn Approach) and Mellad (Oasis Dream). "Fahad already has racing interests in Dubai and Kuwait. These horses who left were mostly Class 4 types here, so they won't be running in the Dubai Carnival, but the lesser races first," said Clements. "I understand some may even come back to Singapore if things don't work out for them there." Five Al Rashid Stable horses will remain under Clements' training at Kranji, while Mark Walker will also continue to train some of the operation's horses in Singapore.

INTERNATIONAL

Nine for Highland Reel

Dancing Rebel (2 f ex London Plane by Danehill Dancer) landed a five-furlong maiden at the Curragh yesterday to become the ninth individual winner from the first crop of Swettenham Stud shuttler Highland Reel (Galileo). The Ken Condon-trained filly, who had raced three times previously, was pushed out to score by three quarters of a length from Special Power (Slade Power), with New York City (Invincible Spirit) a further length and a half behind in third. The filly is the fourth foal out of London Plane (Danehill Dancer), making her a half-sister to Waikuku (Harbour Watch), winner of the Stewards' Cup (Gr 1, 1600m) and Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (Gr 1, 1400m) in Hong Kong. Highland Reel covered 161 mares last year and he is standing for a fee of \$15,000 (plus GST) this season.

UK: OTI purchases Australia-bound Frankel filly

A Frankel (Galileo) filly is heading to the Warrnambool stables of Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr. after OTI Racing purchased the youngster for 220,000 guineas (approx. AU\$426,000) out of Wednesday's Book 2 at Tattersalls. The filly is out of the Group 2-winning and Group 1-placed South African mare Alderry (Al Mufti), making her a half-sister to the South African Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Al Sahem (Silvano). Blandford Bloodstock's Stuart Boman, acting for OTI, secured the yearling from the Hazelwood Bloodstock consignment. "Group 1 form in any region, the top of any region, is world standard," Boman said. Turnover was up 13 cent year-on-year to 54,512,000 guineas (approx. AU\$107.5m), the first time that Book 2 has ever broken the 50,000,000 guineas barrier. The average hit 83,865gns (approx. AU\$162,400), a ten per cent increase on 2020's corresponding figure and a seven per cent rise on the previous best set in 2017, while the median closed at 62,000gns (approx. AU\$120,000), fully 24 per cent more than the figure generated last year. The clearance rate was 88 per cent as 650 yearlings found a buyer.

UK: Derby hero Adayar gets green light to run in Champion Stakes

Charlie Appleby confirmed yesterday that Adayar (Frankel) will take his place in the Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 2f) at Ascot tomorrow. The Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) and King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 4f) hero was fourth in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) less than two weeks ago, off a 71-day break due to a setback that forced his absence from an intended prep run. "Adayar pleased us yesterday in an easy piece of work and showed his well-being. He ticked all the boxes and had all his checks. After discussions with the team the intention is to run him at Ascot," the Godolphin trainer said. Adayar will meet the multiple Group 1 winner Mishriff (Make Believe), last seen when successful in the Juddmonte International Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 2f) at York in August.

UK: Love misses Champions Day as O'Brien reroutes Snowfall

Snowfall (Deep Impact) will line up in the British Champions Fillies and Mares Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 4f) at Ascot tomorrow rather than the Champion Stakes. The dual Classic winner will take the place of her year older stablemate Love (Galileo) in the distaff contest after that filly's blood tests were unsatisfactory. "We just weren't 100 per cent happy with Love's blood results this morning. She hasn't quite come right since her temperature before Longchamp so she won't be running on Saturday," said trainer Aidan O'Brien. The Ballydoyle stable's La Joconde (Frankel) will join Snowfall in the fillies and mares race, leaving Bolshoi Ballet (Galileo) as the stable's Champion Stakes representative, while Mother Earth (Zoffany) will take on Palace Pier (Kingman) and Baaeed (Sea The Stars) in the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes (Gr 1, 1m).

Messara also confirmed that Archanna (Snitzel), the three-quarter sister to five-time Group 1 winner and Arrowfield stallion The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice), would be covered by young stallion Castelvecchio (Dundeel) this season.

Archanna herself was a \$1.3 million yearling from the Inglis Easter sale and raced by a group of owners including Arrowfield. When the recommendation was made by her trainer Chris Waller to retire the five-year-old as a winner of three of her 11 starts, Messara jumped at the chance to buy out his racing partners in the mare for \$900,000.

"She is going to Castelvecchio. He has admirable foals and we think he will suit her perfectly as a physical," he said.

"After all, he was the equal top-rated two-year-old colt and among the best three-year-olds in the world after he ran second in the Cox Plate on the international rankings. He's throwing beautiful foals, so we've decided to go there."

Incidentally, the dual Group 1 winner was also trained by Litt and owned by the Gallettas.

For 18 months, every report into wagering in Australia has suggested that punters are betting at record levels and, importantly, a lot of it is on racing after a long period of shedding market share to sport.

TopSport bookie Tristan Merlehan gave an indication about just how much punters have been engaged in racing during an interview last week.

"Some of our bigger customers drop in and out at times, but our turnover has been solid and it's increasing, but the thing we have been really, really happy with is the number of tickets we've been writing and the number of customers who

have been using our site. It has gone through the roof," he said.

"To put it in perspective last Saturday (October 2) was the most tickets we've ever written on a day in our history, which is not a Melbourne Cup day and there was also no footy on either, and that blew me away when I had a look at the data.

"Footy is obviously a big component of our business as well and when there's not a game, that naturally takes a bit off the ticket numbers, so it was huge.

"I am really looking forward to the next six weeks of spring because I would expect the numbers to continue to climb."

Conventional wisdom suggests short-priced favourites are detrimental to encouraging people to bet, but Merlehan has a differing view, particularly when it comes to the sport's elite horses.

"I think there are a lot more people interested in the spring compared to recent years. Zaaki and Incentivise, two of those out-and-out stars, have really contributed to that," he said.

"When Winx was around, even though she was too short to really back for a lot of punters, it would get them engaged in the race day a lot more.

"The rest of your day would be a lot busier whenever she was running. The casual fans would want to watch the races on the back of her performing and I think we are starting to get something similar on the back of Zaaki and Incentivise.

"That match race (in the Turnbull Stakes) between Verry Elleegant and Incentivise, there were so many people talking about it, and I think that is so positive for the industry if we can get more of these people interested in racing and involved."

There was much relief last week when Magic Millions boss Barry Bowditch gave the strongest indication that the Gold Coast sale would be open for business to all and sundry come January.

The timing of the message was clearly calculated because no sooner had ANZ

hit the email inboxes that the Queensland government ramped up its push to increase the Covid vaccination rate ahead of the yet-to-be announced reopening of the state's border to NSW and Victorian residents.

Bowditch's public statements also helped quell some of what we were told were a few anxious vendors who were starting to consider whether to hold back some of their most valuable yearlings for the Inglis Easter sale, instead of risking some of the country's biggest buyers being unable to be on the Gold Coast.

You will never hear me bagging someone for having an opinion in this industry. After all, it is what makes the whole game tick.

But I, for one, am siding with the Godolphin hierarchy in their call to bypass tomorrow's Everest with talented three-year-old colt Paulele (Dawn Approach) who won last week's Roman Consul Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick in good time.

There were plenty of pundits and ratings gurus who were kicking up for Paulele to fill Godolphin's vacant Everest slot, which eventually went to the consistent Trekking (Street Cry).

If Paulele, by Dawn Approach (New Approach), is to carry serious commercial stallion appeal he will likely need to win a Group 1 and that could be as soon as next week.

By skipping the Everest, Paulele can run in next week's Manikato Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Moonee Valley, for which he is the \$3 pre-post favourite. He was \$13 for The Everest on Saturday night after his Roman Consul success, a more than 25 per cent difference in perceived chances of winning each race.

It is smart placement by the Godolphin hierarchy of Vin Cox, Jason Walsh and James Cummings who, unlike the majority of the pundits, were in fact taking into account the associated breeding value of a Group 1 win would bring even though the prize-money differential between the Manikato (\$1 million) and The Everest (\$15 million) is stark.

Cerberus (Dundee) remained on track for the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) with his breakthrough win in the Hill Smith Stakes (Listed, 1800m) at Morphettville last Saturday. The three-year-old had signalled his potential with a pair of third-placed efforts at Bendigo and Cranbourne in September and delivered at the third time of asking under Todd Pannell with a performance that suggested a further stamina test should suit.

The Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained galloper raced third-last in the field of eight, three wide, but was only four lengths off the lead with 800 metres remaining and rounded the home turn four deep but placed handily for a winning effort. Cerberus took his time to reach top gear but made gradual headway to edge ahead close home for a long-neck success over Jungle Magnate (Tarzino), with Max Fire (Star Turn) a half-length behind the winner in third.

“It was a tough performance, it’s never easy to sit wide and win like that, but he was strong to the line,” said Anthony Freedman. “I will get him home and see how he comes through the trip, but he could head to Moonee Valley for the Vase then back up into the Derby or potentially head straight to the Derby.”

James Harron went to \$750,000 to purchase Cerberus out of the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale in 2020, the colt having been offered by Mill Park Stud. Better known for securing speedier types, Harron could not have helped but be attracted by a page choc full of high-class performers. The family, shaped by Ecurie Wildenstein, features the Group 1 winners Volga (Caerleon), Vallee Enchantee (Peintre Celebre), Vespone (Llandaff) and Maid’s Causeway (Giant’s Causeway), as well as Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) and Hong Kong Vase (Gr 1, 2400m) runner-up Purple

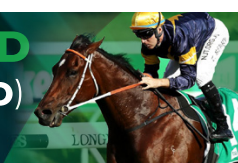

Moon (Galileo), and Landfall (Myboycharlie), who as Rise High won the Sha Tin Trophy (Gr 2, 1600m) and was third in the Hong Kong Cup (Gr 1, 2000m).

Cerberus, who races for a James Harron Bloodstock ownership group, was bred by South Australian Hall of Famer Harry Perks’ Country Wide Breeding Syndicate and is the third foal and third winner out of his dam, Scarlet Moretta (Fastnet Rock), a winner of two races, at 1200 metres and 1540 metres, from 18 starts. The mare was a \$300,000 Inglis Easter yearling and sold for \$87,500 as a breeding prospect to Hancock Quality Bloodstock at the 2015 Inglis Great Southern Sale. She has a two-year-old by Churchill (Galileo) and a yearling by Tosen Stardom (Deep Impact).

The promising colt was the most expensive yearling by Dundee (High Chaparral) sold in 2020 and he became his sire’s, who stands at Arrowfield Stud for a fee of \$66,000 (inc GST), 16th individual stakes winner. Dundee has produced six stakes winners to mares by Danehill-line stallions including the Group 1 winners Super Seth and Atyaab.

EYE IN THE SKY

FRANKEL TO EXERT YET MORE INFLUENCE IN AUSTRALIA

Chris Waller produced one of the more impressive trialists at Rosehill last Monday.

On a soft-rated track, Sacrimony (Per Incanto) caught my eye with a strong finishing third placing to Far Too Hot (Rubick) over 900 metres.

After jumping well, rider Glynn Schofield eased back on the gelding and seemed focused on getting the three-year-old to relax racing in a wider position.

When Schofield gave him a rev-up in the straight, Sacrimony attacked the line with plenty of purpose and got within half a length of the winner at the post.

The Waller yard also produced another runner at Monday's trials I found interesting.

UK import Born A King (Frankel) was given a quiet time on the fence by Kerrin McEvoy in his first Australian trial over 900 metres.

He raced half a dozen times in the UK

and won his maiden over 2000 metres on the synthetic at Lingfield a year ago, in the hands of "Aussie Tom" Marquand.

There was a bit of depth to Monday's trial and I look forward to seeing one more trial effort from Born A King over a longer distance before he is ready for the races.

The five-year-old is rated 67, so there is plenty of scope with him to go through the grades off that favourable first impression.

Another name to keep an eye on is Parlayed (American Pharoah).

This three-year-old filly, trained at the track by the Hawkes family, worked to the line strongly into third place in Heat 5 over 900 metres. The trial was won by Superbellagante (Super One) in one of the better times of the morning (55.43 secs) in the wet conditions.

Trialing in the Coolmore silks, Parlayed produced a similar closing performance at the Rosehill trials a fortnight earlier and is a worthy one for the blackbook.

Espiona brilliant on debut

Espiona (Extreme Choice) was heavily backed to win on debut at Warwick Farm on Wednesday and she didn't let her followers down in the 1200-metre maiden.

Following some impressive trials on her home track at Rosehill, she started the \$1.45 and, wow, wasn't she impressive.

Although only five starters, there was plenty of depth to the field and the filly cruised up to stablemate, Arranmore (Astern), at the 200-metre mark, going straight on past.

In the post-race interview jockey James McDonald, with a beaming smile, declared: "She oozes class."

Her dam Dahooil (O'Reilly) also won her maiden at Warwick Farm four years ago and did it in a Benchmark 67 race over 1400 metres, which also appears in the distance range for Espiona next time out.

Her trainer Chris Waller pulled the right rein in scratching Gracilstyla (Medaglia D'Oro) from the race and running him in the following

American Pharoah struck for his first southern hemisphere-bred stakes winner at the end of last month when Head Of State duly delivered in the Gloaming Stakes (Gr 3, 1800m), and since the start of the new season he has produced seven winners, as well as Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) fourth Wild Calm. Parlayed, a \$300,000 buy for Hawkes Racing from the Inglis Easter yearling sale out of the Coolmore draft, was an impressive enough yearling to convince the breeding and racing giant to maintain an interest. She is the second foal out of Jolie's Pearl, a sister to Group 2 winner and Group 1 placed Formality and daughter of multiple Singapore stakes winner Jolie's Shinju (Jolie's Halo). Jolie's Pearl has a two-year-old sister to Parlayed named Egyptian Pearl, and the mare was sold by Coolmore for \$80,000 to Fairhill Farm at this year's Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale.

maiden race on the day over the longer trip of 1400 metres.

Although beaten in his two lead-up races there had been genuine excuses for the Ingham-raced gelding, who went on to trounce his rivals after obtaining the lead comfortably in the first few hundred metres.

His dam Catkins (Dubawi) was a great mare for the Ingham's, accumulating 16 career wins, including 12 at stakes level.

By the time I arrived in Sydney in 2015, she was the grey 'Queen Of Rosehill' who handled all types of going and I have fond memories of calling several of her wins late in her career.

At three years of age, Gracilistyla has plenty of grey hairs coming through and should win again next time in the right grade.

The grey to remain King of the Mountain

On the topic of greys, the timing looks spot on for Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt)

to defend his Everest (1200m) title tomorrow afternoon.

Randwick has had some consistent rainfall in the days leading up and that won't do his chances any harm.

It has been a race against time for his trainer Les Bridge to get the six-year-old where he needs to be, without having raced since his flop stint in Hong Kong last December.

In his first Randwick trial six weeks ago it appeared the veteran trainer had a real job on his hands to get Classique Legend fit enough for The Everest. He won his trial, but it was a bit of a battle.

A fortnight later he trialled again and the old spark was there, running the final 600 metres in 33.42 seconds in what was a much more significant victory.

And then, in his final trial on October 8, regular rider Kerrin McEvoy resisted the temptation to let him go, strangling the grey

down the straight. I'm told he didn't blow a candle out afterwards.

I've seen and heard enough now to side with Classique Legend in his bid to remain King of the Mountain and provide McEvoy with his fourth Everest win in the saddle, becoming the second dual winner of the race after Redzel (Snitzel).

With a revised capacity crowd of 10,000 allowed on course, many of them will be giving the grey flash a good cheer home.

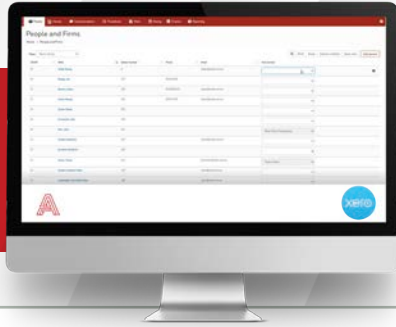
I'm also looking forward to seeing Fangirl (Sebring) run in the fourth race, the Reginald Allen Quality (Listed, 1400m).

Her trainer Chris Waller declared for the Flight stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) a fortnight ago, but elected to save her from the quick back up from her maiden win at Goulburn a week earlier.

Although I believe 1400 metres would be the minimum of her capabilities, she looks very well placed in this class tomorrow.

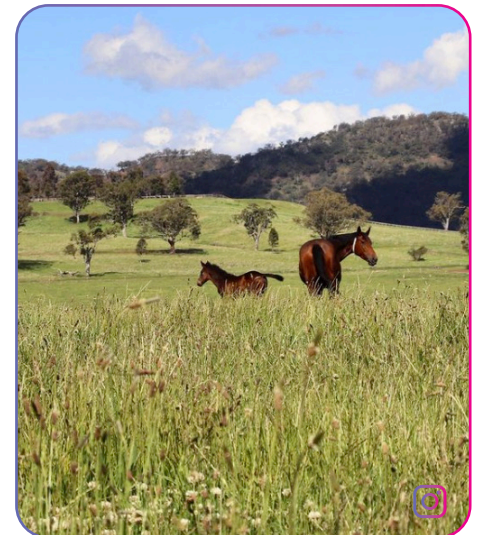

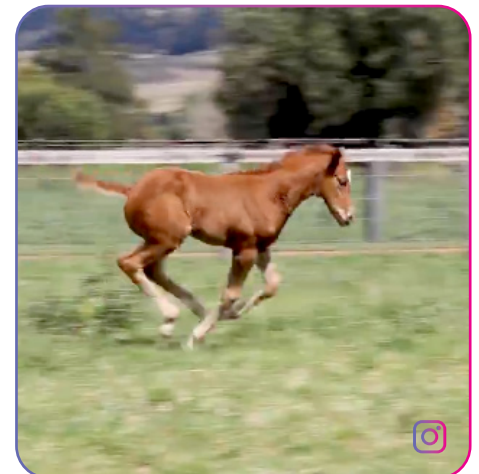
