Subdued lead-up to Magic Millions, but horsepower set to draw buyers' attention

Sale underway today with majority of big players expected to flex their muscle on the Gold Coast in search of next racetrack star

This time last year, leading industry figure John Messara was upbeat about the prospects of a buoyant market at the Magic Millions Yearling Sale, a prediction which came to fruition, but this year the Arrowfield principal is more cautious in his outlook ahead of the 2022 season-opening auction.

The first of seven straight days of selling will get underway on the Gold Coast this afternoon and, while the atmosphere in the lead-up to the

important Australian thoroughbred sale has been more subdued than in past years, the vast majority of the professional buying bench has been on site and appear ready to do business.

The shortened day one session, comprising 180 lots, features colts by leading sires such as I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit), Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) and Deep Field (Northern Meteor) as well as topline fillies by the likes of Zoustar (Northern Meteor), Fastnet Rock (Danehill) and Justify (Scat Daddy) that will quickly help set the market trend which is expected to be far from downcast.

Messara said with much conviction last year about his beliefs of how the market was about to trend at the Gold Coast sale, and for the remainder of the sales series, but yesterday he was far more apprehensive about making any bold predictions with any level of certainty.

"It is so hard to say because I am finding out, as the days progress, that quite a number of players have contracted the (Covid-19) disease or are frightened of contracting the disease and they are not coming (to the sale)," Messara told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"They might still buy through agents or remotely online, but I am just a little concerned because of the velocity of the pandemic now, that people are saying to themselves, 'you know what, I just think I'll stay home, I don't think I'll go there'.

"I don't know what impact that will have because people have got used to bidding online and using agents, etcetera."

Vinery Stud general manager Peter Orton agreed that while a cohort of players are not on the ground for this year's sale, he expects bidding from all corners of the auditorium floor and from online bidders throughout the sale with racing's key fundamentals, particularly high levels of prize-money, fuelling interest in the sport.

"There are quite a few

people missing, but I am finding that the people (who are not here) are being represented by other people," Orton said.

"I think all those who are usually interested and are usually here are looking at horses, but I haven't identified too many new people.

"There's quite a bit of activity from within the colts groups and the fillies groups. There's quite a bit of diversity from the buyers in how they are approaching the market, so I can't see why this isn't as strong a sale as there's ever been."

Last year's Book 1 sale, the first time a larger catalogue had been compiled, achieved a record aggregate of \$197,240,000 at an average of \$253,888 and a median price of \$180,000 and, despite the optimism of Orton and other industry participants, there remains suggestions that those benchmark figures could fall by somewhere between five and ten per cent at this year's sale.

Others argue, though, that while the Omicron variant runs rampant around the eastern states of Australia at present, the key drivers of the racing industry are largely unaffected and remain similar to last year, which spurred an increasing appetite to invest in racehorses.

Melbourne agent Suman Hedge, who will be representing the Rosemont Stud-led Victorian Alliance colts *Continued on page 6>>*

<< *Continued from page 4* partnership, as well as leading Perth trainers Grant and Alana Williams in their plans to expand their client base, is of the view that there will still be strong competition across all levels of the market from the buying bench.

"I have seen the whole catalogue now and I have got a good impression of the sale. I feel like there's enough there for everyone," Hedge said.

"There's some elite colts, there's some lovely fillies there and there's horses there that will fit every part of the market, so I am pretty buoyant about it and I think we will be fairly active.

"I think it is always hard to know what's going to happen until the sale starts but all of the markers would suggest that it will be a strong sale. The quality (horses are) here and everyone is here to buy, so I am anticipating that it will be a very strong sale."

Magic Millions managing director Barry Bowditch said that the history of the Gold Coast sale, which has produced the likes of Farnan

(Not A Single Doubt), Capitalist (Written Tycoon) and Sebring (More Than Ready), among others, kept buyers coming back year after year.

"There's a great middle to this catalogue," Bowditch said.

"There will obviously be fireworks along the way but it is an outstanding middle, there's an outstanding depth (of horse) and what this sale represents is the product it produces on the racetrack, which is second to none, and no sale can compare to it."

While the Victorian Alliance is certain to be a player at the top end, so too are the likes of fellow colts syndicates such as the James Harron partnership, the Coolmore group, the Newgate Farm-China Horse Club syndicate and the Mark Player and Rob Roulston-organised group, all of whom are set to underpin the male division of the sale.

However, the sudden decision by the US-owned Spendthrift Farm to sell its Australian operation means one high-end buyer, who would have been expected to be participating only a few weeks ago, is now out of the market.

"The depth of the market, it could always be questionable given that we're going through a pandemic and not everyone is here and it is a huge number of horses we've got to sell, but in saying that I am very confident in the horses we've got," Bowditch continued.

"One thing that Magic Millions does is ensures we've got a horse here for every number and at every budget, so I think buyers have got to keep their lists long and whatever market you're looking to play in, and whether you're here or you are not here, you should be taking time to look through the catalogue and do your work because there's a quality line of horses who will sell at all numbers."

Day one of the Magic Millions sale starts at 12pm Australian standard time.

Magic Millions 2YO and 3YO fields confirmed

The fields for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic and 3YO Guineas have been finalised. Coolangatta (Written Tycoon) unsurprisingly heads the betting for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) while New Zealander Bright Blue Sky (Fastnet Rock) managed to sneak into the field in the final spot. The Jamie Richards-trained daughter of Fastnet Rock (Danehill) was an impressive debut winner in her native country before then going on to finish well when fourth behind favourite Coolangatta in the B J McLachlan Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Doomben on Boxing Day. Brett Prebble will take the ride aboard the filly, with the barrier draw set to be held this morning on the Gold Coast. Meanwhile, in the Magic Millions 3YO Guineas (RL, 1400m), James McDonald will again team up with Chris Waller when the champion jockey rides Starman (Zoustar). McDonald, who rides Coolangatta in the 2YO Classic, was aboard the gelding when he finished fourth over 1400 metres in December. The John O'Shea stable will have Bend The Knee (Snitzel) and I Am Lethal (I Am Invincible) to go to war with, while Paul and Peter Snowden will saddle up I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) pair King Of Sparta and Construct.

Coolangatta set to be shortest favourite in six years

Coolangatta could start as the shortest-priced favourite for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic since Capitalist (Written Tycoon) in 2016 after the final field was revealed yesterday. Saturday's contest currently has the filly as the \$1.80 market leader with TAB after she has won both her starts to date, both Group 3 affairs. The two-year-old is not far off the \$1.40 price that Capitalist started six years ago. Meanwhile, the Magic Millions 3YO Guineas field was also finalised yesterday and looks a far more open contest, with I Am Lethal (I Am Invincible) the current \$5.50 favourite. The Magic Millions Cup (RL, 1400m) has Kementari (Lonhro), trained by James Cummings, as the \$5 market leader while Tony Gollan's Isotope (Deep Field) heads into the \$970,000 Magic Millions Snippets (1200m) as the \$3.80 favourite before acceptances are finalised.

Hardy looking to keep form rolling

Joanne Hardy has enjoyed a couple of successful months with three winners and seven placings from her last 15 runners, a run she is hoping to continue when Endangered Species (Hinchinbrook) lines up in the Highway (1500m) at Rosehill on Saturday. The son of Hinchinbrook (Fastnet Rock) is set to line up in the handicap over 1500 metres looking to make it three successive wins after victories at Lismore and home surface Coffs Harbour. The four-year-old, formerly trained by Team Hawkes, was an unraced online purchase for Hardy and currently has three wins, six placings and over \$72,000 in earnings from just 15 career starts for connections. "We bought him in an online Inglis auction in November 2020 for \$25,000," Hardy said. "He's been a good buy, he's certainly paid his way. A win on Saturday would definitely put us a long way in front. He's in good form at the moment and we'll see how he measures up with the rise in class to Highway grade. He should get a run (in the Country Championships qualifier heat), he's a 61 rater. But I think it's important to bring him down and take him for a trip away and see how he goes stepping up."

All-Star Mile sees 77 nominations

A total of 77 horses have been nominated for the fourth running of the All-Star Mile (1600m) after initial nominations closed yesterday. The contest, set to be run at Flemington on March 19, is worth \$5 million and raced over the mile distance. Of those entered, 22 have earned more than \$1 million in total prize-money, while no less than 20 are Group 1 winners. Chris Waller leads the number of entries with 15 nominations, including the reigning Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Verry Elleegant (Zed) who bids to race over 1600 metres for the first time since finishing third in the Edward Manifold Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) in October 2018. Annabel Neasham has nominated Underwood Stakes (Gr 1, 1800m) winner Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux) for the race, in which the field is partly decided by a public vote. Other notable nominations include the Ciaran Maher and Dave Eustace-trained Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) winner Hitotsu (Maurice). The late nomination stage for the race closes on January 17 with voting opening on January 24 and closing on Sunday, February 13, with the top ten horses making the field together with another five wildcard runners plus four emergencies.

Behemoth targeted at Mile

Longevity is now the thinking with three-time Group 1 winner Behemoth (All Too Hard) as connections prepare to keep runs spaced out with the aim of keeping the son of All Too Hard (Casino Prince) racing for at least another two seasons. "We've started thinking long term with the horse now," Grand Syndications manager Sam Lyons said on SENTrack. "We've come up with a plan that means three short preps for the year and two to three runs could see him out each time." Behemoth is yet to be seen on the racetrack since finishing sixth in the Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield in September, which followed a win in the Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at the same track three weeks earlier. "He's a big horse and although he has always been sound there are starting to be little aches and pains but nothing major at all. We want to look after him as he's really looked after us." Behemoth is set to begin

this preparation with a run in the Durbridge Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Morphettville on January 29, with the Australia Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Moonee Valley on the same day also being considered. "I'd say we'll still kick him off in the Durbridge just to keep him home for that week," Lyons said. "If he runs well then we'll go through the Futurity once again and hopefully he gets a bit more luck in that this time and then straight to the All-Star Mile."

Plane issue grounds Parnham's Pacific

Western Australian-based trainer Neville Parnham has admitted that it is unlikely Indian Pacific (Zoustar) will take up an entry in Saturday's Standish Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) at Flemington due to issues with transport. Parnham had been targeting the \$250,000 feature with his Group 1-placed sprinter, but has been forced to halt those plans with WA's tight border regulations meaning he is unlikely to get the gelding onto a plane in time. Indian Pacific is now likely to head for the Miss Andretti Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Ascot on Saturday instead. "At the moment it's a day-by-day situation. We haven't secured a flight yet and, to be honest, it's probably unlikely," Parnham told Racing.com. "We were aware that it could have been the case. It's not something that's a surprise. We thought we'd take our chances and see where we finished up. But it's not looking flash. I'll just prepare him like he is coming and if he is not, we will run him here on Saturday." Parnham has said that the son of Zoustar (Northern Meteor), who finished behind Zoutori (Zoustar) in last year's Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m), would need to leave by tomorrow at the latest to have any chance of taking up a spot.

Artorius headed for open company

Artorius (Flying Artie) looks set to make the jump to open age company in the autumn as his new preparation begins with the weight-for-age Rubiton Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) at Caulfield on February 12. Co-trainer Sam Freedman has signalled the intention to keep the son of Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) to sprint strips this autumn with races such as the Newmarket Handicap at Flemington in March and the T J Smith

Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) being targeted. The trio of contests would emulate the same path taken by former sprinting star Chautauqua (Encosta De Lago), as he won the Rubiton Stakes, was notably second to the three-year-old Brazen Beau (I Am Invincible) in the Newmarket, before going on to win the T J Smith in 2015 as a four-year-old.

Harrison notches rare feat

David Harrison's fantastic run with two-year-olds continued as his four runners filled the first four placegetters in the Magic Millions Plate (1000m) at Ascot on Saturday. The longest priced runner of the four, Sunny Honey (Patronize), managed to get her head in front to beat Lucky Sue (Lucky Street) by a head with stablemates Snippenova (Snippets) and Vonsnip (Snippets) finishing a further half-length and length away respectively. "That was a bit of a surprise," Harrison told TABradio's The Sports Daily. "It was good. I don't know if it ever has happened, I'm not sure. Obviously Chris Waller would've done it over there because he has seven or eight horses in races, but I'm not sure with just four runners." Sunny Honey, ridden by Paul Harvey, had to survive a stewards' room enquiry after the race as Lucky Sue's jockey Natasha Faithfull protested alleged interference over the final 150 metres of the race. However, the protest was dismissed and the result left to stand unchanged. "I was pretty casual," Harrison said. "I just said to the stewards, 'you blokes can work it out, I won't say a word and you can work it out with the jockeys and the other part-owner that was in the room'. I just stayed out of it."

Stars jump-out for Maher and Eustace

The Ciaran Maher and David Eustace stable had a few of their stable stars jump-out at their new base at Cranbourne yesterday morning, including the talented filly Enthaar. The daughter of Written Tycoon (Iglesia) was a winner of the Doveton Stakes (Listed, 1000m) in November, a first success since January for the dual Group 3-winning juvenile and one-time Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) favourite, and the filly is set to begin her new preparation back at Caulfield

in a Listed contest later this month. "She's very forward and ready to run a big race on Australia Day," Cranbourne-based racing manager Reece Murphy told Racing.com. Fellow three-year-old Generation (Snitzel) also stepped out yesterday along with Grandslam (Myboycharlie) and stable recruits Normandy Bridge (Le Havre) and Le Baol (Orpen). Generation is set to head for the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m), while Alister Clark Stakes (Gr 2, 2040m) winner Grandslam is to take a little longer to get back to the track. "He (Grandslam) went well," Murphy said. "He'll take a bit of time, but he's in good order." French import Normandy Bridge is yet to have a first start in Australia, with Murphy admitting another trial is likely. "He obviously had a soft trial, he'll have another one," Murphy said. "He'll be targeting the BMW (Tancred Stakes), races like that. He's got good staying ability. He should be spot on coming into the autumn, even towards the Brisbane races as well."

Tillett joins Ellerton stable

Group 1-winning trainer Mathew Ellerton has appointed Matt Tillett as racing manager. Tillett has amassed plenty of experience in the thoroughbred industry, having previously worked for Darley, Woodside Park Stud and, most recently, as racing manager for McEvoy-Mitchell Racing. "I'm looking forward to the future with Matty and the new direction of his business," said Tillett, who is currently at the Gold Coast inspecting yearlings. "If he keeps training as many winners as he has been, it'll make my job selling some bloodstock for him quite easy. He's had 12 winners in five weeks so I don't think he could've started any better."

Dunn fined for galloping horses on turf track

Matthew Dunn was yesterday handed a fine of \$3,000 after pleading guilty to a charge of failing to follow an order of the Tweed River Jockey Club trackwork supervisor. Racing NSW stewards handed Dunn his punishment after finding he had instructed his staff to continue working horses on the course proper at Murwillumbah racecourse on the morning of December 11 despite being informed the

racecourse was closed for trackwork usage. The fine was dropped from \$5,000 due to the guilty plea and other mitigating factors.

Rosehill nominations extended

With the predicted wet weather and low number of nominees, the nomination deadline for four of the ten races at Rosehill on Saturday has been extended until today. Still in the considered 'off-season' of racing in Sydney, the 1100-metre Benchmark 88 will headline Saturday's meeting. Nominated horses include the Gerald Ryan and Sterling Alexiou-trained Mr Mosaic (Rubick), and the Kris Lees-trained The Bopper (Nicconi), both of who won last time out. The Group 3-placed mare Belluci Babe (Per Incanto) and Godolphin runner Valaquentia (Street Boss) will be aiming to add to their impressive first-up records, while the Wyong-based trainer Kristen Buchanan has nominated Princess Rihanna (Showcasing) for the contest. Champion trainer Chris Waller will potentially saddle up mare Starla (Snitzel) and Liberty Sun (Statue Of Liberty).

Rapid Racing teams announced

Melbourne Cup-winning jockeys Brett Prebble and Jye McNeil will headline the Metropolitan team that will be bidding to win a third consecutive Rapid Racing event at Flemington later this month. The duo will work alongside Group 1 jockeys such as Jamie Kah, Damian Lane and Michael Dee, as well as apprentice jockeys Matthew Cartwright and Josh Richards in the sprinting series. In a day that will include seven races down the Flemington straight on Friday January 21, the Metropolitan team will take on a Country team that will include the likes of Craig Newitt, Patrick Moloney, Will Gordon, Declan Bates, Jarrod Fry, Damien Thornton and Dean Holland. Each team was picked based on the current standings in the Victorian Country and Metropolitan Premierships following yesterday's Sandown meeting. As well as having the chance to win \$50,000 in prize-money in each race, the jockeys will also collect points based on their finishing positions, with prizes on offer for the winning team at the end of the seven contests.

NEW ZEALAND

Oaks goal for La Crique

Despite looking a speedy horse for most of her career, La Crique (Vadamos) could be aimed at the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) according to her trainers Katrina and Simon Alexander. The pair are confident that the daughter of Vadamos (Monsun) can stay the trip as she won for the third time on Sunday, beating the New Zealand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner The Perfect Pink (Savabeel) over 1500 metres at Ellerslie. "She's been very sharp and there was probably a thought she wouldn't stay, so it was lovely to see her be able to settle in behind the speed," Katrina Alexander said. "The longer distances might be better for her as a four-year-old but we will see what's best for her." Both La Crique's dam and sire won at the 2400-metre trip, and Alexander said La Crique's next race, the Desert Gold Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Trentham on January 29, would play a key part in deciding where the John Cassin-owned filly heads next. "If she were to go exceptionally well, then for John's benefit she could go to Australia," Alexander said. "Whether she would go to Sydney or Brisbane would probably depend on the timing. She had a couple of weeks off between her last two races and she really thrived, so she might benefit from more time after Trentham."

McNab booked to ride Entriviere in Telegraph

Michael McNab has picked up the prize ride on Entriviere (Tavistock) in the Telegraph (Gr 1, 1200m) at Trentham on Saturday. Te Akau's retained rider Opie Bosson was set to ride the mare this weekend but those plans were cut short as he was handed a six-day

suspension at Ellerslie on Sunday after using the whip in two consecutive strides on his mount The Perfect Pink in the Brookby Stables 1500. "She is good and did some nice work on Saturday. Everything has gone according to plan apart from Opie getting suspended yesterday," Entriviere's trainer Jamie Richards told Weigh In. "These things happen from time-to-time and Michael McNab will ride her in the Telegraph. Michael has ridden Group 1 winners for us before and I am certainly looking forward to him having a sit on Entriviere on Saturday." Meanwhile, Richards will trial a couple of his stars at Matamata tomorrow, including Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m) favourite On The Bubbles (Brazen Beau) and All-Star Mile (1600m) aspirant Probabeel (Savabeel).

Maiden training success for Cumming

Cambridge-based horsewoman Chloe Cumming has pursued several avenues within the thoroughbred industry and has now added a training win to her CV. Cumming saddled Pahi Lass (Iffraaj) to break her maiden in decisive style over 1600 metres on Sunday at Ellerslie under apprentice Yuto Kumagai. "It was very exciting, I was absolutely stoked. I expected her to run a good race and I definitely thought she was a top three chance," Cumming said. "She had been working out of her skin and just feeling super. She blew them out of the water so I was over the moon." Cumming continues to combine her boutique training operation with her breaking in and pre-training services under her Rintoul Equine banner, while also riding trackwork. Pahi Lass was first offered at the Book 2 session at New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sale in 2019

by Woburn Farm, but after failing to meet her \$30,000 reserve, Cumming subsequently purchased her privately. "She was the first thoroughbred that I broke in, I had done a few sport horses before, and had worked for Lyndhurst Farm and Regal Farm previously," Cumming said.

17 for Orfevre

Lilac (3 f ex Viva Bouquet by King Kamehameha) provided her sire Orfevre (Stay Gold) with a 17th individual stakes winner when winning yesterday's Fairy Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Nakayama. Trained by Ikuo Aizawa, the three-year-old filly managed to hold on well to beat Stars On Earth (Duramente) by a neck with a further length and a quarter back to Bijou Noir (Kitasan Black) back in third. The fourth foal out of winning mare Viva Bouquet (King Kamehameha), Lilac is closely related to Group 3 winner Black Hole (Gold Ship) and to two-year-old winner Miracle Blood (Dream Journey). Orfevre currently stands at Shadai Stallion Station for a fee of ¥3,500,000 (approx. AU\$424,735).

“Racehorses are like vegetables. They’re perishable products, and whoever re-stocks their fridge every year is going to have a lot of success.”

It’s something Mark Walker - looking to reload his fridge on the Gold Coast this week - learnt in Singapore.

If it does not sound like eastern mysticism it’s because it came from his fellow New Zealander, the late, great Laurie Laxon, a friend and supporter in the five or so years the pair spent together in the city-state, where each became multiple premierships-winning trainers.

Walker, 49, cherished the time he had

around Laxon in the close and different quarters of Singapore racing, their bond one of several avenues there which developed Walker as a trainer.

“Initially, there was a lot of rebuilding to be done, with staff and systems, and it was pretty hard to get going actually in those early days,” Walker tells ANZ Bloodstock News.

“So I was very hands-on, and I probably still am, but one of the other quotes from Laurie that stuck in my head was, ‘Slow down - the CEO of Singapore airlines doesn’t fly every plane himself!’”

If it was in fact Laxon, then ensconced on the equator, and another New Zealand

thoroughbred giant in Sir Peter Vela, who convinced a 38-year-old Walker to move to Singapore, having conquered racing in his homeland through five premierships.

Eleven years and four Singapore titles later - to follow Laxon’s nine - Walker is at the Magic Millions before moving home.

Or at least that was the plan. Just as Covid has kept him away from the sale for two years, it’s now also checking his return passage to Matamata to replace Hong Kong-bound Jamie Richards as Te Akau Racing’s head trainer.

So used to coming first, Walker now finds himself in the unusual position of 9,642nd. Without cover. And not suited by the pattern one little bit.

“The hardest thing in returning to New Zealand is getting the quarantine spot,” he said. “I applied the other day and they only had 3,000 spots, and unfortunately I was number 9,642 in the queue.”

“I might have to hire a kayak and row back!”

He’ll return to Singapore after the Millions, which was always the plan. With compatriot Donna Logan having taken over his stable, including Te Akau’s Singapore runners, he had hoped to spend a couple of weeks packing before returning to New Zealand. Now, he’d be happy to make it home in the year’s first quarter - hopefully in time for Karaka in March. But recent events have shown him nothing is guaranteed.

“I flew into Sydney, had to spend three days in isolation, and then spent another 14 days hanging around before I could travel to

Queensland," he said. "So it's been a drawn-out process to get here. Mind you, I know Covid hasn't been much fun for anyone."

The brightest light at the end of that tunnel for Walker has been that for the first time in two years he's seen his children Xavier, 15, and Alexis, 12, who live on the Gold Coast.

"That's been the main highlight," he said. "With technology it's easier to keep in contact now than, say, when people would send their kids to boarding school in the old days, but still it's been great to see them again."

Christmas presents duly exchanged, the other business at hand, of course, is that re-stocking.

With Te Akau's David Ellis and Karyn Fenton-Ellis sourcing most of their yearlings at Karaka, they've honed just a brief shortlist for Walker to peruse and pursue. But he's hoping to strike some more gold on the Coast. His four-time Group 1 winner Princess Coup (Encosta De Lago) was bought by Ellis at the National Yearling Sale in 2005, while Te Akau's Magic Millions 2YO Classic entrant Bright Blue Sky (Fastnet Rock) was a \$600,000 purchase last January.

"David and Karyn, even though they're not here, we've had a good team talk and got our shortlist," Walker said.

"Ideally, you'd love to buy horses like Princess Coup and Probabeel - a horse that can run at two but particularly those who train on to be better at three, four and even better at five. We don't necessarily want horses that are early two-year-olds who don't train on.

"It's an exceptional catalogue. Probably the three most dominant stallions are Written Tycoon, I Am Invincible and Fastnet Rock. We've had luck with Fastnet Rock, with (nine-time Group 1-winning mare) Avantage a very good horse for the stable at home.

"But first and foremost we look for the athlete; look at the horse first, then look at the pedigree. It doesn't matter what it's by or what it's out of - if it's legs are on backwards it's not going to run fast."

Walker will - eventually - return to a Te Akau operation bigger and better than that he left to move to Singapore, with "a good group of core staff who are young and hungry to learn".

He's pleased to be returning to the same old place at Matamata - "so I don't have to learn the tracks again" - but he will not be the same old trainer. Singapore has changed him, and his methods, with necessity the mother of invention.

Despite that saying about stable replenishment, the fact Singapore's are capped at 60 horses restricts the intake somewhat. It's a move to keep the trainers' premierships competitive - validated by five different winners in the past seven years. And one offshoot is Walker believes he's grown more adept at keeping horses racing for longer.

"It's not like you've got 40 yearlings coming in every year. You've got your horses people have paid money for and they go up and down the grades," he said.

"The key to success in Asia is knowing the racing system and keeping your horses very sound and very happy to keep performing. In New Zealand and Australia, once they've reached their level they'll often be sold to make way for another one. Asia's not like that, so you learn how to keep horses going for longer."

Despite its culinary reputation, there's one form of spice that's hard to come by in Asia - variety - especially in life as a racehorse.

Australia and New Zealand have more

options to change things up, like beaches or a multitude of spelling farms. And with the world's easiest job being that of a Singapore weatherman - "stinking hot and humid and 32" - there's not even a perceptible change of season there to liven things up.

Thus Walker has become not just a better delegator, as per Laxon's advice, but more creative.

"A sound and happy horse will give you its best, whereas if they're not sound or not happy, at the 200 metres when it starts to hurt a bit, they'll go backwards pretty quickly," he said.

"Every time they come out of their box, you're trying to keep them guessing what they're doing that day. Your options in Singapore are a bit limited, like swimming and treadmills, but at least there's an uphill track, and probably five different training tracks, whereas Hong Kong is more limited because of the size of the land.

"I think I've probably got the ability to keep horses up in a campaign for longer and keep them happier for a longer campaign. You never stop learning. As soon as you're not open to new ideas it's probably time to hang it up."

Walker will have some less-than-enticing aspects to re-acquaint himself with in New Zealand: a far higher tax rate than Singapore's dreamy 16 per cent, and working hours that do not compare too well with the city-state's trackwork times of 6 to 10am.

"I asked someone this week what time the Gold Coast track opens, and they said 3.45am," he said like a man hit by an unpleasant memory. "You can see why a lot of people are short-staffed. Young people just don't want to do that any more.

"There are signs of change - such as the welfare of horses after racing, which is very positive - but in other areas, the industry's still struggling to come to grips with what modern-day society expects. The sooner we can get in line with that a bit more the better we'll be."

Edinglassie seeing there is power in a union

The name Edinglassie conjures a joining of two halves.

The combination of Scotland's two largest cities, it was in fact once mooted for a certain settlement not far north of today's Magic Millions sale complex, until it was decided to honour the then governor of New South Wales, Sir Thomas Brisbane.

Instead, the name has been carried on by a thoroughbred farm that's become a fixture in Australian breeding for many, many years.

And this year's Millions will showcase the first draft offered by an Edinglassie Stud itself empowered by a twinning of forces.

Since the start of the season, Mick and Michelle Talty have been joined by former long-time Gooree breeding and racing manager Andrew Baddock and his partner, breaker and breeder Natasha Akland.

And after some three decades of running

the nursery, which now numbers around 120 mares - 80 of whom foaled down this season - the Taltys are certainly feeling there is power in a union. Indeed they're no doubt wondering why they didn't do something similar sooner.

"It's been great," Mick said, on the eve of presenting Edinglassie's 15-horse draft.

"The way it's taken a lot of the work off Michelle and I has been very much appreciated. Andrew lives right on the farm there, so he's around the whole time. Plus the experience and expertise he brings is invaluable. He's been in the game a very long time.

What the non-cognoscenti might not appreciate about the unstoppable cycles of a stud farm is that the time that mares are foaling overlaps with the time yearlings must be prepared for the Magic Millions sale.

"When they come in for the start of their

prep in early November, there's still mares to foal down. Andrew's helped with that and Michelle and I can concentrate more on getting the yearlings ready, so it's enabled us to do a little bit more," Talty said.

Edinglassie has celebrated many triumphs through its long history, from the near-ancient - like Chester's 1877 VRC Derby-Melbourne Cup double - to the more modern, including breeding Deep Field (Northern Meteor).

Its Millions draft this year will comprise a broad spread of stallions - 11 different sires across 15 lots - with two in particular catching many an eye in pre-inspections.

Lot 205 is a colt by Darley's much-discussed first season stallion Harry Angel (Dark Angel), out of Legal Eagle (More Than Ready), a sister to West Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Dreamaway, and three-quarter sister to Celebrity Miss, the stakes-winning dam of Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) joint-winner Celebrity Queen (Redoute's Choice).

"The colt's got a lot of attention" Talty said. "People are saying the Harry Angels are very nice types and this guy is a very nice horse."

And **Lot 655** is a filly by aforementioned Edinglassie product Deep Field, the second foal out of Fastnet Rock (Danehill) mare Uptown Gal.

"There should be a lot of speed in her," Talty said. "It's a Fastnet Rock mare with Deep Field, and we bred him so I know how fast he could go."

Other sires in the draft include Hellbent (I Am Invincible), More Than Ready (Southern Halo), Rubick (Encosta De Lago) and Kermadec (Teofilo).

Family affairs

He died before his findings were published but Australian Bruce Lowe left a huge legacy when he devised a breeding system based upon tracing Classic winners to their earliest-known roots.

Assigning the number one to the family that produced the highest total of Classic winners (he used the Derby, Oaks and St Leger), led to a total of 43 separate families.

His late 19th century works were expanded, first by Herman Goos and during the middle of the 20th century were further researched and expanded by the Bobinski-Zamoyski partnership, with The Bobinski Tables.

Lowe's actual numbers have lost their relevance in terms of performance but his original idea of categorizing by family remains a key ingredient of pedigree research. When faced with two mares of the same name, Lowe's family number (and the year of foaling) ensures accuracy.

The writer wishes the numbers were retained in sales catalogues, an opinion held by none other than Sir Patrick Hogan in his biography, "Give A Man a Horse."

Nonetheless, Lowe was a strong believer that the mare's bloodlines were hugely important regarding breeding good horses. Obviously, breeding is not possible without a stallion yet stallions have mothers too.

Families are the feature this week initiated by the result of the Marton Cup (Listed, 2200m) run at Awapuni on Saturday.

Taking her record to eight wins from 20 starts is Our Hail Mary (Ocean Park) who, interestingly, was bred by Sir Patrick and Lady Hogan, the mare adding to her Trentham Stakes (Gr 3, 2100m) victory a year ago.

Soon after straightening she was not making any impression on the leader Sir Nate (Nadeem), who was seemingly well in control. The latter was swamped at the 50 metres and Our Hail Mary, developing a second wind, dived past for the win.

Winning trainer Alan Sharrock was aware that she might hit "a flat spot" and advised jockey Johnathan Parkes to "just try and ride through it", to keep her going and she would respond, and that's exactly how it panned out.

Runner-up, House Of Cartier (Alamosa), enjoying her career-best form, also got going late and was taking ground off the winner, yet a shade too late.

The two are very closely connected. Our Hail Mary's dam Repenting (Ekraar) and House Of Cartier's dam Shez Sinsational (Ekraar) are sisters, keeping things very much in the same family.

That fact was not lost on Sharrock. "Interestingly enough the runner-up is out of (our) Shez Sinsational, so it was a real family result to the race," he said.

Repeating managed a maiden win but her sister, Shez Sinsational, trained by Sharrock, was named Champion Stayer of 2011-12 and claimed the 2012 Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m).

It was pure class that saw her get the 3200 metres Group 1 because she also won three elite-level races at weight-for-age, namely the Zabeel Classic (Gr 1, 2000m), the Hawkes Bay

Spring Classic (Gr 1, 2040m) and the Waikato International Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m), these days run as the Herbie Dyke Stakes. In other words, the big three WFA middle distance races of each season, making her a special mare indeed.

She retired with 12 wins including the Hollindale Stakes (Gr 2, 1800m) in Queensland and, at the back end of her three-year-old season, finished a long head second in the Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) won by Shootoff (Duelled).

Dam of two stakes winners, Shez Sinsational also foaled Sinarahma (Darci Brahma), a Listed winner and Group 1 placed in the Thorndon Mile (1600m).

Grandam Original Sin (Shinko King) was an Ellerslie Listed placed dual winner and produced just five foals, all of which were winners.

Popular bloodstock agent Robert Dawe purchased Original Sin as a yearling at the Karaka Select Fillies Sale in 2001 on behalf of the Karaka Group (managed by Mike Tololi) who bred Repenting and Shez Sinsational.

The next dam, Hope Chest (Balios) is a sister to Marlboro Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Brutus (Balios), the winner of 13 races.

Two, good. Three, better?

An annual tradition at this time of year is leafing through the Karaka sales catalogues, sitting in the sun with a cup of coffee and hoping to discover a gem.

The writer is always surprised upon finding a yearling from a mare that one would swear has only just finished racing. Time certainly does rush by.

From the day that the late Glyn Tucker, former Keeper of the New Zealand Stud Book, gave an interesting lesson on inbreeding, the subject has been one of continued fascination. Verry Elleegant (Zed) was bred to a formula by her breeder Don Goodwin. He was very keen to double up on the Eight Carat (Pieces Of Eight) blood. Eight Carat is the fourth dam of sire Zed (Zabeel) and dam Opulence (Danroad). In fact, Eight Carat's daughter Cotehele House (My Swanee) is their third dam. Due to the double up taking place in the fourth generation, the term line-breeding is perhaps more appropriate here.

To that add Danehill (Danzig) who is the sire of Danroad as well as the sire of Zed's dam Emerald Dream.

John Corcoran of Grangewilliam Stud will offer a three-quarter blood sister (**Lot 293**) to Verry Elleegant in March but the filly is bred, not twice, but three times to her own dam's line.

Danehill appears in the exact same position as set out in Verry Elleegant's lines but this mix is all the more interesting because the Danehill stallion in this case, Viking Ruler, is a grandson of Diamond Lover (Sticks And Stones), in turn a daughter of Eight Carat.

Corcoran offered a brother to the filly last year but passed him in. The difference, this year, is that Lot 293 is a filly, her second foal.

The Glyn Tucker lesson discussed the female line of a wonderful miler named Triton (Pakistan II) who began his racing career in New Zealand, winning, from memory, his first six in succession. His last win here was at Riccarton in the 1971 Winter Cup (Gr 3, 8f) before heading across the Tasman where he proved to be right up with the best.

The following March (1972) he bagged a seven furlong Group 2 at Rosehill then ran into champion Gunsynd (Sunset Hue) in the Doncaster Handicap (Gr 1, 8f). Gunsynd

claimed victory that day with Triton second. Triton backed up four days later to snare the All-Aged Stakes (Gr 1, 8f).

Triton then went north to Brisbane and scored Queensland's greatest race, the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 7f) but in October, back at Randwick, he had his revenge against Gunsynd, getting to the line first over the "Goondiwindi Grey" in Randwick's other chief mile, the Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 8f).

In 28 starts, Triton won 13 before retiring to stud. He stood just three seasons and according to Arion Pedigrees sired two stakes winners and 60 individual winners from 74 foals.

Compared to Verry Elleegant's bloodlines, Tucker's Triton example definitely fits the category of in-breeding as his dam, Hauani (Davey Jones) was, very close up, chock full of Cinna blood. Cinna (Polymelus), a Classic winner of the 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 8f), features three times within four generations of Hauani's bloodlines.

Hauani's sire, Davey Jones, was by Neptune (Hyperion) out of Celebrity (Nothing Venture) from Cinna. By some coincidence, Davey Jones took out an Epsom Handicap and also ran second in the Doncaster Handicap, identical to Triton.

Hauani's dam, Into Wind (Whistling Wind), was from Celebration, a sister to Celebrity. Another twist: Whistling Wind was the grandson of Cinna.

Cinna's impact on the New Zealand Stud and Australian Stud Books was immense. No fewer than five of her sons were imported, two of which were champion sires including the amazingly successful Beau Pere (Son-in-Law).

Beau Pere took New Zealand and Australia by storm in the 1930s, was champion sire twice in New Zealand and three times in Australia. That caught the attention of famous film-maker Louis B Mayer who purchased the stallion for \$100,000 and stood Beau Pere for the then-unheard-of fee of US\$2,500 in 1946.

Cinna's unraced Balloch (Obliterate) also became Champion New Zealand Sire (twice) and Champion Broodmare Sire (five times). The next most successful would be Mr Standfast (Buchan) who is also the sire of Gunsynd's grandam.

Although less successful than these three, both Dink (Nothing Venture) and Gay Shield (Gay Crusader) would sire stakes winners and can be found in many pedigrees.

In more modern times, Vice Regal (Bismark II) is from the Great Northern Oaks (Gr 1, 12f) winner Kind Regards (Le Filou) whose dam Waft was bred 3x3 to Cinna. Waft's dam Illustrious ranks as a sister to Davey Jones and a sister-in-blood to Hauani's dam Into Wind. Vice Regal enjoyed a top-class reputation as a sire.

Cinna herself was in-bred. Her sire Polymelus (Cyllene) and her dam Baroness La Fleche (Ladas) were out of half-sisters.

Happy hunting for Westbury

Ellerslie's Gingernuts Salver (Listed, 2100m) on Sunday gave us a glimpse of a possible Derby contender when White Noise (El Roca) put up a sound staying performance to claim his fourth career victory and second stakes success at start eight.

A patient Ryan Elliot bided his time near the back of the field until after the 1000 metres then went forward at the 800 metres and although three deep, was much handier past the 600 metres. Wider rounding into the straight he found himself in tight quarters, got a narrow split at the 250 metres then kept driving between runners to take over inside the 200 metres. To the line he was hounded on his inner by Regazzo (Tavistock) but had enough in reserve to hold out the challenge.

Sticking on like a stayer, the gelding will attempt either the Waikato Guineas (Gr 2, 2000m) or the Avondale Guineas (Gr 2, 2100m) as one of his lead ins for the New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) in March.

At his previous start he ran on for sixth in the Auckland Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) but two starts back White Noise scored with a good finish in the Wellington Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Otaki.

He is the second winner (both by El Roca) from his unraced dam White Nymph (Sir Percy), a sister or half-sister to five winners, the best being Freshwater Storm (One Cool Cat) who earned close to \$400,000 from 11 wins in Australia.

His third dam, Italian Group 3 winner Spring (Sadler's Wells) produced the French dual Listed winner Inglenook (Cadeau Genereux) and is a half-sister to the successful sire and dual Group 1 winner Pentire (Be My Guest).

Ipswich on Saturday proved a happy hunting ground for Westbury Stud sires Tarzino (Tavistock), Redwood (High Chaparral) and Swiss Ace (Secret Savings).

Tarex (Tarzino) got the ball rolling with his breakthrough win in race two. He was having his third start and was probably due having lost in a head-bobber after a strong finish over at the Sunshine Coast. Back early, he improved quickly short of the straight, then half way down the straight raced away for an easy win.

Also breaking his maiden was Gambu (Redwood). From the Chris Waller stable, Gambu was having his first start, got back early, saved ground before the last corner then pulled out into the centre of the track from the 300 metres. In a couple of decent strides he took over. The winning margin was shrinking late but he had the race under control.

Formerly trained in New Zealand where she won three times and was Listed placed, Serena (Swiss Ace) claimed her first win in Australia by leading all the way over the 1350 metres in race nine. The mare had been racing mainly in Sydney and found this class a little easier, her previous win taking place a year ago at Wanganui.

Belardo back-to-back

Haunui Farm's Belardo (Lope De Vega) had a day to savour on Sunday, his Fellini and Bella Luce taking out races two and three, both over 1200 metres.

Fellini's earnings will assure him a start in the rich Karaka Million (RL, 1200m) to be run at Ellerslie on January 22 and brings him well into contention for the feature.

From the powerful Jamie Richards Te Akau stable, the gelding was having his third start and second win, wearing down the pacemaker and favourite Time Flies (Time Test) who is also trained by Richards, the two split at the post by Alabama Gold (Turn Me Loose).

On debut, Fellini finished a distant third at Matamata in October to tearaway winner Mascarinto (Per Incanto) before heading to Pukehohe for his clear-cut maiden success.

Race three resulted in Bella Luce's second win in five starts, finding reserves late, similar to her Te Aroha maiden victory two starts prior.

Good clash

Two very good fillies, La Crique (Vadamos) and The Perfect Pink (Savabeel) staged a great finish in the Brookby Stables 1500, race five at Ellerslie on Sunday.

The latter was a last-start winner of the New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) while La Crique showed great fight when finishing a buffeted third behind the then unbeaten Pareanui Bay at Listed level at Te Aroha later the same month.

At the 100 metres these two separated themselves from the rest with The Perfect Pink looking to hold the upper hand but La Crique, in identical fashion to her determined finish at Te Aroha, came back hard near the line to gain a first class win.

John Thompson of Rich Hill Stud, home to the winner's sire Vadamos (Monsun), proudly commented: "It was a very brave effort on the part of both fillies. They were well clear of the rest which indicates a superior performance."

Unfortunately, neither filly is eligible for the upcoming Karaka Classic (RL, 1600m) in a couple of weeks' time. Their clash would have been well worth the price of admission.

Hellbent - Miss Hellfire (2 f ex Peace Time by War Front) provided her sire Hellbent (I Am Invincible) a first winner when she won the Aquis Gold Pearl (1100m) in good style at the Gold Coast on Saturday. The Peter and Paul Snowden-trained filly was second behind Soaring Ambition (Not A Single Doubt) on debut in the Wyong Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1100m) and improved on that impressive performance to strike here under Ben Thompson. The two-year-old surged clear in the closing stages to beat Perfect Mission (The Mission) by three-quarters of a length with a further length and a quarter further back to Stroll (Snitzel) in third. A \$60,000 Magic Millions purchase from the Newgate Farm draft for owners Triple Crown Syndications, the filly is a half-sister to the ill-fated stakes-winner Xtremetime and the US Group 1-placed colt Caracaro. Hellbent stands at Yarraman Park for a fee of \$22,000 (inc GST).

Invader - After showing promise in both his trials to date, the Sarah Acornley-trained Red Hot Poker (2 g ex Radiator by Mossman) made a successful debut in the Brown Brothers Handicap (1000m) at Townsville on Saturday, handing

Aquis Farm-based first season Invader (Snitzel) a fourth individual winner in the process. The two-year-old gelding defeated Altar Boy (The Mission) by a nose with just a neck back to Queen Nola (Lord Of The Sky) in third. The son of Invader looks an investment well-made as he cost \$4,500 at the Inglis May (Early) Online Sale last year for Journeyman Lodge out of the Aquis Farm consignment. Red Hot Poker is a half-brother to the winner Mirror Model (Sepoy). Invader currently stands at Aquis Farm for a fee of \$22,000 (inc. GST).

Satono Aladdin - Kabugee (2 g ex Kabuki by Shinko King) looked a nice prospect in the making when winning at Te Aroha on Monday over 1000 metres, providing his sire Satono Aladdin (Deep Impact) with his first New Zealand-bred winner. Sent off as the short-priced \$1.40 favourite, the Jamie Richards-trained two-year-old was settled three-back on the fence under Opie Bosson after starting a little slowly from the barriers. Angled out to get clear running in the straight, Kabugee careered away from his rivals to beat Contagious (Proisir) by two lengths with a further head back to Speedrun (No Nay Never) in third. The fourth foal out of winning mare Kabuki (Shinko King), Kabugee is a half-brother to winner Akerra (Ekraar). Satono Aladdin stands at Rich Hill Stud for a fee of \$12,500 (plus GST).

Spieth - Jaguar Stone (2 f ex Leopard Skin by Tale Of The Cat) scored on debut at Hobart on Friday to give Aquis Farm's first-season sire Spieth (Thorn Park) his first success. The stallion's first-crop yearlings sold for up to \$180,000 last year and Jaguar Stone was purchased by her trainer and part-owner Adam Trinder for \$28,000 out of the Berkeley Park Stud draft at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. Jaguar

Stone displayed a smart change of pace under apprentice Erika Byrne Burke to win the Unique Doors and Windows Maiden (1000m) by two lengths from Decisive Choice (Decides) with Bold Instinct (Impending) a half-length back in third. Jaguar Stone's dam Leopard Skin is out of the two-time Listed winner La Chasseuse (Lion Hunter). Spieth sired his second individual winner in as many days after Wild Botanica (2 g ex Colosimo by Foxwedge), deemed good enough by trainer Kacy Fogden to contest the ATC Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) in the spring, broke through for her maiden victory at Ipswich. Having her third start, Wild Botanica surged clear to defeat Mishani Embrace (The Mission) by one and a quarter lengths in the 2YO Maiden Plate (1200m). Spanish Angels (Sidestep) ran third. Wild Botanica, who was runner-up at the Gold Coast on Boxing Day, was a \$4,000 purchase at last year's Magic Millions National Yearling Sale. Her dam Colosimo (Foxwedge) was purchased by Avesta Bloodstock's Jimmy Unwala for \$20,000 at last year's Inglis Australian Broodmare Sale and was covered by Coolmore's first season sire King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice) last September. Spieth stands at a fee of \$8,800 (inc. GST).

Artie Schiller - Trainer Matthew Brice O'Connor earned his first black-type victory by turning US\$25,000 claim Clear Vision (6 g ex Refreshing by Invincible Spirit) into a graded winner when the gelding struck in Saturday's Tropical Turf Stakes (Gr 3, 8f) at Gulfstream Park. The six-year-old was winning for the sixth time in 19 starts as he drew clear to defeat Value Proposition (Dansili) by two lengths, and in the process became the 56th individual stakes winner for the now Victoria-based stallion Artie Schiller (El Prado). Belgrano (War Front) was a further length and three-quarters away in third. Bred in Kentucky by Candy Meadows, Clear Vision is the first foal out of the Invincible Spirit (Green Desert) mare Refreshing. The mare has three winners from as many starters as well as a two-year-old Maclean's Music (Distorted Humor) colt named Yes Mo and a yearling Catholic Boy (More Than Ready) colt. Refreshing sold in foal to War Of Will (War Front) for US\$52,000 at the 2021 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. Breeders Cup Mile (Gr 1, 8f) winner Artie Schiller stands at

Daiwa Major - Shadai Stallion Station resident Daiwa Major (Sunday Silence) sired his 40th individual stakes winner when his son Matenro Orion (3 c ex Parthenon by King Kamehameha) made it two wins from three starts with a narrow success in Sunday's Shinzan Kinen (Gr 3, 1600m) at Chukyo. Trained by Mitsugu Kon, Matenro Orion followed up his win at Hanshin on his previous outing as he beat Solitario (Maurice) by a neck. Red Belle Ame (Heart's Cry) finished two lengths behind the winner in third. Daiwa Major stands for a private fee in 2022.

Denman - Twin Hills Stud stallion Denman (Lonhro) secured his 17th individual stakes winner as a sire when his son Prime Candidate (7 g ex Coolroom Candidate by Mister C) landed the Christmas Classic (Listed, 1200m) at Canterbury on Friday. Prime Candidate led the field off the home turn under Jason Collett and held at bay his pursuers to win by a length and a quarter from the second-placed Special Reward (Demerit) with Through The Cracks (Wanted) a further neck behind in third. Prime Candidate is out of the 2006 Sapphire Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Coolroom Candidate (Mister C) who has also produced the Listed winner and Group 3-placed Coolring (Sebring) among her five winners. The mare has a Denman two-year-old filly and a yearling colt by the same sire. Denman stands at a fee of \$8,800 (inc. GST).

Pioneer of The Nile - The late Pioneer of The Nile (Empire Maker) sired his 40th individual stakes winner when Under The Stars (3 f ex Untouched Talent by Storm Cat) saw off a determined bid from Awake At Midnyte (Nyquist) to take out the Santa Ynez Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) at Santa Anita on Saturday. Trained by Bob Baffert for the Coolmore partners, Under The Stars was winning for the second time in her four starts to date as triumphed by three-quarters of a length, the front two pulling six and a half lengths clear of the third home, Miss Mattie B (Tonalist). The daughter of the Storm Cat (Storm Bird) mare Untouched Talent is a half-sister to Baffert's Grade 1 winner and

2012 Kentucky Derby (Gr 1, 10f) and Preakness Stakes (Gr 1, 9.5f) runner-up Bodemeister (Empire Maker), now a stallion in Turkey. She is the ninth of 11 foals from her dam and her second Graded stakes winner. The Grade 1-placed Untouched Talent's most recent foals are two-year-old and yearling colts by Triple Crown-winning shuttler Justify (Scat Daddy).

Savabeel - Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) runner-up Zebrowski (5 g ex Polish Princess by Polish Precedent) continued his good start to life in Hong Kong when he struck in Wednesday's January Cup (Gr 3, 1800m) at Happy Valley and in so doing provided Savabeel (Zabeel) with his 124th individual stakes winner. Formerly in the care of Team Hawkes, the now Casper Fownes-trained five-year-old justified his position as market leader when he stayed on well to defeat Sunny Star (Flatter) by a length and a quarter. Savvy Nine (Anodin) was a further length away in third. Stakes placed three times prior to export, Zebrowski has now won as many times in Hong Kong as he did in Australia. Seven-time Champion New Zealand Sire Savabeel stands at Waikato Stud where his 2021 fee was listed at \$100,000 (plus GST).

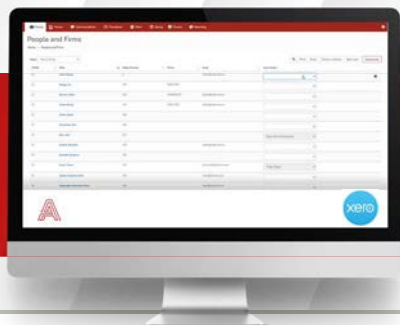
