### Glentree swoop for juvenile stakes-winning I Am Invincible filly Fake Love

*An opportunity too good to pass up for boutique thoroughbred farm, who go to \$505,000 in Magic Millions Online Sale*

Glentree Thoroughbreds saw the opportunity to add the I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) two-year-old stakes-winning filly Fake Love to their select broodmare band as too good to refuse when the Victorian farm went to \$505,000 to secure her at a Magic Millions Online Sale, which closed yesterday and was topped by last-start Vo Rogue Stakes (Gr 3, 1350m) winner Tiger Heart (Better Than Ready).

The Ciaran Maher and David Eustace-trained Fake Love was a winner of the Debutante Stakes (Listed, 1000m) on debut in October 2020, in which she defeated subsequent Group 3 scorer Extreme Warrior (Extreme Choice) by a length and a quarter.

"She was a bit of a flashlight for us. I Am Invincible fillies and mares are an extremely expensive commodity and to purchase a stakes-winning daughter by 'Vinnie' at that price we saw as value and an opportunity to acquire her," said Glentree Thoroughbreds stud manager Luke Simpson.

“Being by I Am Invincible, and an extremely precocious daughter of his, out of a very fast Fastnet Rock mare, with that speed influence we thought she would complement our broodmare band very well.”

Glentree made a splash at last month's Magic Millions Yearling Sale, but on the buyers' side of the coin, going to \$1.35 million for a filly by Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) out of Group 2 winner Sweet Sherry (Bel Esprit). Her purchase added to the securing of two-time Group 3 winner Chica Fuerte (Hinchinbrook) at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale in 2021. She was sent to I Am Invincible for her first

cover in the spring.

“We've got a boutique broodmare band of about 25, and we're always on the lookout for when these opportunities arise to add to that,” Simpson added.

Fake Love's career-opening stakes win at Caulfield has proved to be her only victory from six starts to date, however the filly also placed second behind unbeaten Queenslander

Anatina is herself a half-sister to the stakes-winning Pricked (Thorn Park) and stakes placegetters Acupuncture (Pins) and Fluffy Duck (Tale Of The Cat), as well as Quack *Continued on page 5>>*

<< *Continued from page 3* It (Ustinov), the dam of Group 2 winner Quackerjack (Not A Single Doubt).

Although returning at three to race three times during the spring after a ten-month absence, Fake Love's new owners are yet to decide whether to race on with the filly.

"There are no breeding plans in place and at this stage we're undecided as to whether she'll race on, but the focus is for her to be a breeding prospect and we'll make those decisions over the next couple of weeks," Simpson said.

"There are plenty of options, either to go back to speed or go for stamina. She's lightly raced and we certainly saw that as another positive."

Topping the February sale, however, was the Tony Gollan-trained Group 3 winner Tiger Heart, who realised a platform-record price of \$650,000 when knocked down to Bon Ho's Legend Racing.

The three-year-old is a winner of three races from eight starts since his \$85,000 yearling purchase by Bevan Smith Bloodstock, and was an impressive two-and-three-quarter-length winner of the Vo Rogue Stakes at Doomben on New Year's Day.

He was owned by the late Thai racing identity Krit Chittaseni, who died in May of last year.

"He's a successful young horse and we're delighted to have secured him," Ho said. "He will join the stable of Les Bridge and be campaigned in Sydney."

# MORNING BRIEFING

## AUSTRALIA

### Two for Hellbent

Yarraman Park Stud's first-season sire Hellbent (I Am Invincible) brought up his second winner at Pakenham last night when Hell Hath No Fury (2 f ex Diamond Cove by Octagonal) broke her maiden at start two. Sporting owner Brae Sokolski's tartan silks, the Danny O'Brien-trained Hell Hath No Fury justified odds-on favouritism in scoring by three-quarters of a length over Denied (No Nay Never) with Zloties (Snitzel) a further half-head away in third. A \$160,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale purchase last year, she is the tenth foal to race - and the tenth winner - out of Tasmanian Listed winner Diamond Cove (Octagonal), with Hell Hath No Fury's most prominent sibling being Group 3 winner Montauk (More Than Ready). Her 11th foal, also by Hellbent, has been withdrawn from next week's Inglis Classic Yearling Sale, where he was set to go through as Lot 500, while Diamond Cove was served by Kitchwin Hills' Graff (Star Witness) in October. Hellbent stood for \$22,000 (inc GST) in 2021.

### Ruthless Dame to improve with distance

Ciaran Maher and David Eustace looked to have unearthed another talented juvenile following the debut success of Ruthless Dame (Tavistock) at Sandown yesterday. Purchased by her trainers out of Book 1 of the NZB Karaka Yearling Sale, realising NZ\$90,000 from the draft of Curraghmore, Ruthless Dame made a taking introduction over 1300 metres, pulling a length clear of Maroubra (Boulder City) under Jamie Kah. Ruthless Dame hails from a far-ranging family that includes South African Grade 2 winner Oracy (Zabeel) and three-time Group

1-winning sprinter Sea Siren (Fastnet Rock), but Kah expects her to improve as she goes up in trip. "I was impressed with her professionalism," said the winning rider. "It was her first start so she was entitled to be green, but she came around that turn just super and hit the front a bit too soon, but she was still strong to the line. She is a nice filly going places. She had a really good turn of foot for that today but obviously she is going to want a bit further and she has got the right brain on her, she settled. The team has done a great job to get her to the races like this."

### Here To Shock back to form

Also at Sandown, one-time Guineas contender Here To Shock (Shocking) returned to form when winning over 1600 metres under Damien Oliver. Trained by Brent Stanley, Here To Shock saluted for the first time since January 2021 when outclassing his rivals by two and a half lengths under 62.5 kilograms, going some way to justifying his participation in three Guineas last autumn. He was also running over a mile for the first time since last March, a trip Oliver believes suits well. "He was good, it was my first time on the horse," he said. "A couple came up to him early and kept him honest. He is a big, strong, free-going type of horse and I felt it was in his best interests to hold the lead. I could really feel him picking up momentum as I came down the hill and into the bend. He kicked nicely off the bend and I felt he was always going to be hard to run down. I like him at the mile, maybe 1800 metres, and he might squeeze 2000 metres out of him. I probably like him around the mile to 1800 metres on a big track. That would really suit him."

### Ancient Girl shows her class

Kiwi-breds enjoyed a fine afternoon in Australia, winning three of the seven races on

Randwick's Kensington track as well as taking out four contests on Sandown's eight-race card. Ancient Girl (Turn Me Loose) was the last of the Sandown quartet to get her head in front when she secured a second win from four starts under Mark Zahra. The three-year-old was thought good enough to contest the Thousand Guineas Prelude (Gr 2, 1400m) at Caulfield in September, running eighth, and trainer Clinton McDonald expressed his delight with the way his filly has progressed since the spring. "She did a really good job last time in and it was probably all a little bit too soon for her," he said. "She has just matured mentally and started to settle down. She was in a little bit of a hurry last time in and this preparation she has just started to relax. It was a really nice starting point today. She is still learning what the game is about and needs to be taken quietly. We'd like to get her to Adelaide, which is our target, and we think she is a filly that will make the grade in time."

### Oliver taken to hospital

Champion jockey Damien Oliver was last night awaiting results of precautionary scans on his neck after a rare trip to Warrnambool ended abruptly yesterday. Oliver had flown in by helicopter earlier in the day to ride a number of horses for Rosemont Stud, including Ethekwini (Savabeel) in the Cri-Tech Plumbing BM64 Handicap (1400m). However, Ethekwini played up in the stalls and became cast, with Oliver becoming awkwardly placed as a result. Ethekwini was scratched and will be required to trial to the satisfaction of stewards before racing again. For Oliver, he was transported to Warrnambool Hospital for precautionary scans and was awaiting clearance to ride at tomorrow's Caulfield meeting, where he has seven rides.

## Sejardan to continue Classic run in Millennium

In its short history, the \$2 million Inglis Millennium (RL, 1100m) has been won each time by a graduate of the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale, with Castelvechio (Dundeel), Prime Star (Starspangledbanner) and Profiteer (Capitalist) all successful. Trainer Gary Portelli hopes that trend continues at Randwick tomorrow with Sejardan (Sebring), who is set to start favourite in the Inglis Millennium after wins in the Breeders' Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) and the \$1 million Golden Gift (1100m) from two starts. "He might be steaming home when it's all over, looking for that 1200 (metres), that's probably the only query for me, so I've kept a little bit of a speed in his legs," Portelli said. The other

Inglis Classic graduates in tomorrow's Millennium are Vaderzan (Invader), Fire And Ice (Hellbent) and debutant Russian Assassin (Russian Revolution).



## Collett's Millennium intel to the fore

Jason Collett takes the plum ride on Sejardan, but he also enters the \$2 million feature having ridden El Padrino (Street Boss) to win the main lead-up, the Inglis Nursery (RL, 1000m). "He's a progressive horse. He was still very raw when he won that race and he still looked a bit raw in his recent trial," Collett said of El Padrino. "The stablemates are both nice horses and among five or six chances in the race." While Collett is complimentary about El Padrino, he still wouldn't switch away from Sejardan if offered the choice, believing that Portelli may be capable of winning a second Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) with Sejardan. "I ran third in the Magic Millions on the stablemate, Snitcat," Collett said. "She was three lengths off Coolangatta, so if I use that as the benchmark with Coolangatta being favourite for the Golden Slipper, I hold Sejardan a few lengths better than Snitcat, so I think he is a very good Slipper chance."

## Paulele set for Eskimo Prince

Roman Consul Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Paulele (Dawn Approach) will remain in Sydney to run in the Eskimo Prince Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at the same course and distance tomorrow. Paulele remains among the acceptors for the Manfred Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield, but trainer James Cummings yesterday confirmed he would run at Randwick. "He will get the opportunity to keep building on his already enviable Randwick record," Cummings said, mentioning that he was pleased with a recent fourth in a barrier trial. "There were good horses in his trial and he was out there to take improvement from it, which he did. He's come right on from then. It was a good, solid hit-out to be ready for a solid six furlongs first-up."

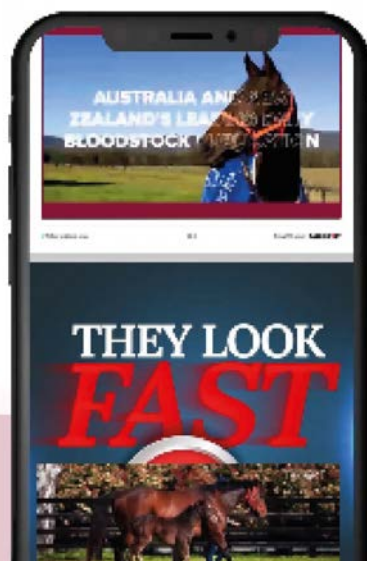

the fifth time with either Spacewalk (Exosphere) or Plymstock (Ribchester), although the former would be a particularly fitting winner. Spacewalk is a paternal grandson of Lonhro (Octagonal), with his son, Exosphere, the sire of the colt. Only once before has Godolphin won the race with a descendant of Lonhro - 2018 winner Veranillo (Medaglia D'Oro) boasted Lonhro as his damsire - but that year, the race was named the Hinchinbrook Plate, meaning success tomorrow would be the first time that one of Lonhro's descendants have won the Lonhro Plate. Spacewalk finished fifth in the Breeders' Plate at his only run during the spring. "He looks like getting a far more economical run than he got during the Breeders' Plate last year given he is going to jump from barrier two in this race," Cummings said. "We like the way he was able to tough his way through a wide run in his barrier trial, he has tightened up nicely from that. He is an interesting colt, Spacewalk, and it would not be beyond him to be beating these horses, provided he's forward enough first-up."

## Malkovich bound for Oakleigh Plate

Trainer Bjorn Baker is using a big weight in a Benchmark 94 handicap to prepare Malkovich (Choisir) for what is set to be his biggest test yet in the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) at Caulfield later this month. Baker has elected not to claim on Malkovich, instead using Tim Clark's experience to offset the big weight of 62.5 kilograms. "Tim is riding as good as any and it's only over 1000 metres," Baker said. "I think an outside gate is actually good for him and he will be able to ride his own race. The plan is to go to the Oakleigh Plate after Saturday and I think this is the ideal race to get him there. He trialled magnificently and he looks amazing."

## Unflinching to emulate Portland Sky

Another set to use tomorrow as a springboard to the Oakleigh Plate is unbeaten colt Unflinching (I Am Invincible), who steps out in stakes company for the first time in the Manfred Stakes at Caulfield. Unflinching will look to follow Portland Sky (Deep Field), who won the Manfred last year before dead-heating with Celebrity Queen (Redoute's Choice) in

the Oakleigh Plate three weeks later. "It may be the right way to go getting into that race, but he would have to win I would imagine to get enough rating points to get into the race," Sam Freedman, who trains Unflinching in partnership with his father, Anthony, told RSN. "I think having a run at 1200 (metres) and then going back to the 1100 could certainly suit. Last start gave us a little more confidence than we might have had prior. He relaxed pretty well outside the lead, and I think the key with him is to not go too slow on him because his asset is winning his races with a turn of foot for 200 or 400 metres. Damien Thornton knows him really well and he'll know when to push the button. He's going to be in front for a long way. It's going to be the last 100 metres that he's left wanting but hopefully he's created a bit of a buffer."

## Zethus to spring Manfred shock

Making his long-awaited return in the Manfred Stakes is Zethus (Exceed And Excel), a colt who hasn't raced in almost a year but who was good enough to defeat subsequent Group 1 winner Home Affairs (I Am Invincible) in the Canonbury Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) last year. "If we have him forward enough to run a good race, he might just give them a bit of a surprise," trainer James Cummings said. "It's important to know where he fits in now coming into the autumn and how much improvement he might need if he's not quite up to winning fresh-up." Earlier this week, Zethus was handed an entry for the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) at Flemington next month.

## From Canberra to Caulfield for Mrs Patmore

The path from Canberra to Caulfield is not one often trodden these days, but Annabel Neasham remains confident that Mrs Patmore (Snitzel) is capable of securing black type in tomorrow's Chairman's Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) in Melbourne. Mrs Patmore, who races in the same Carl Holt colours as stable star Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux), was accepted for a second start at Canberra today but has been scratched to contest tomorrow's two-year-old feature at Caulfield. "She went to Canberra the other day and ran a good race," Neasham's assistant

trainer Todd Pollard told RSN. "She was beaten by a horse that looks like it has got a bit of ability. We had accepted for Canberra again on Friday but when we looked at the acceptances, we thought we might as well take the challenge (at Caulfield) as it might be one of the better chances she has of getting some black type. Being a Snitzel filly with some black type on her page, if she could run first three on Saturday, then she could be a valuable filly."

## Kiko to emerge a Diamond contender

Also contesting the Chairman's Stakes is Kiko (Capitalist), who returns for her second start tomorrow. The Jim Conlan-trained filly, a \$720,000 purchase from last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, finished sixth in the Merson Cooper Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at this course and distance on debut in November. Conlan believes Kiko has strengthened over the summer, but he expects that his rivals would report the same. "I think it was a pretty fair race where she made her debut and she got beaten less than four lengths and I know that she will be going every bit of four lengths better than she was then," Conlan told Racing.com. "Whether that translates to her being in the finish, we'll find out. I thought her first race was a nice run as she went into that with all sorts of difficulties getting there, because she misbehaved getting her barrier certificate and ended up having to jump out on the Tuesday before her debut. She just wasn't as well prepared as she could have been for her first race, but I thought we could get one run under her belt and come back in the autumn and see what she's got. And here she is. I couldn't be any happier with what I am with her. Her head's good, her coat's in great order. Her work has always been restrained but good, but the only time I will find out if this filly has the amount of ability to contest a Blue Diamond is in a race."

## Ziegfeld suited at Caulfield

James Cummings can't quite believe that Ziegfeld (New Approach) has been given little respite by the handicapper during his time in Australia, but he is certain that the gelding will be competitive at Caulfield tomorrow. Ziegfeld steps up to 1800 metres tomorrow and also

steps back from stakes company, with arguably his best Australian performance coming over a similar course and distance when second in the Heatherlie Handicap (Listed, 1700m) in August. "He's a one-paced style of horse and that's why the step up to 1800 metres should be in his favour," Cummings said. "But would you believe he's had eight starts in Australia for two placings and no wins and he's rated higher now than he was when he landed here."

## Angel Like heads to Valley

Last-start Murray Bridge winner Angel Like (Divine Prophet) will race in a fourth state in her year-long career when she heads to Moonee Valley tonight. Angel Like debuted at Grafton in NSW in January last year before she contested a series of hot Queensland maidens behind Group 1 placegetters Hinged (Worthy Cause) and Startantes (Star Turn). Sold at last year's Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale to Will Clarken in South Australia, she has had three starts in her new home state for a win and two placings and will now add Victoria to her list of destinations. "She's going to go to The Valley," Clarken said on RadioTAB. "She's going terrific, and I like her over something a bit shorter. They are going to really run along, she's against her own age group, and she'll be flashing late." Angel Like drops back from 1200 metres to 955 metres with apprentice Madison Lloyd to take the mount.

## Hamblin set for rare metropolitan ride

Paul Hamblin is best known as a jumps jockey these days, but the 55-year-old will have a rare opportunity to win a Flat race in the city tomorrow when he rides Bargannon (Elzaam) and Last Chance (Tycoon Ruler) at Doomben. Hamblin, who has won many of Australia's biggest jumps races, moved to the Sunshine Coast five years ago and rides around country Queensland, but he has had only one metropolitan win in that time, taking the 2020 Country Stampede Final (1110m) on Hard Stride (Street Sense). "I've got my weight down to about 59 kilograms," he said. "I owe my ride on Bargannon to his owner, Sam Mayer, who convinced David Vandyke to put me on. Sam was a top trainer in Toowoomba before he

gave it away a few years ago and Last Chance has been weighted out of racing in central Queensland when he was with Olivia Cairns."

## Ballantyne eyes Greysful feature

Former Fremantle Dockers forward Hayden Ballantyne experienced plenty of pressure during his AFL days and he is putting it to good use as he prepares She's Greysful (Vert De Grece) for tomorrow's Magic Millions WA 2YO Classic at Pinjarra. She's Greysful, a \$25,000 yearling, sprinted sharply to win an Ascot two-year-old event in impressive style two weeks ago and Ballantyne, who retired from the AFL three years ago to join the training ranks, is hopeful that he may have a feature-race contender with the filly. "It will be massive," Ballantyne said on TABradio, "It's what a lot of the trainers target, these two-year-old type runs, this is the one that they want. David Harrison is a mentor of mine and he always aims for this race. And with the sales coming up it's pretty handy if I could pick it up. It's a race I'm aiming for."

## Stewart confident in Street Parade in WA 2YO Classic

The Russell Stewart-trained Street Parade (Lucky Street) finished third behind She's Greysful at Ascot last month, catching the eye having been taken back from a wide draw before making a sustained run which only flattened out in the closing stages. Stewart believes his juvenile has improved significantly for that outing, only the second of his career and his first since November 6, as he prepares to meet his old rival again in tomorrow's Magic Millions WA 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m). "I've found three lengths and I think that's all I've had to find," Stewart said on TABradio. "He's gone on since the run and is very good. No disrespect to the other runners, the horses that raced in that race will be winning the Magic Millions. I think that's where the winner is going to come from, that's the form race going in."

## Sparring attracts seven-figure offers

Trainer Ron Stubbs is continuing to knock back offers from Hong Kong, but he expects them to increase after Sparring (Fighting Sun) lived up to a recent 11-length barrier trial win by claiming

a 900-metre maiden by six and a half lengths at Albury yesterday. The dominance of his victory quickly sparked a flurry of bids, with some agents reportedly ready to offer seven figures for the three-year-old. "It's all well and good to see it in a trial, but you want to see them do it on raceday - and he certainly did," said Stubbs. "He's got that real strength of being able to travel comfortably and then really kick when asked. We actually had a few Hong Kong interests contact us after the trial win but we said we're keen to push on in Australia and have a bit of fun with him. I've never been offered a million in my life, though, so I don't know about that. We'll enjoy the moment and see what happens."

## Tregea to farewell Incentivise

Queensland horseman Steve Tregea, the breeder and former trainer of Incentivise (Shamus Award), is likely to sell his remaining share in the three-time Group 1 winner after a rumoured falling out between the ownership group, Racing.com reported yesterday. Incentivise is currently at Tregea's property near Toowoomba but is expected to return to training with Peter Moody in the coming weeks.

## Third time lucky for Kah and Behemoth

It has been a long time coming but, finally, Jamie Kah will partner fellow South Australian Behemoth (All Too Hard) in a race when he contests next Saturday's CF Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield. Kah was supposed to ride the Grand Syndicates-owned Behemoth in the Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at the course and distance last year but missed the ride due to her spring-long suspension, incurred just a couple of days prior. Behemoth landed the race with Brett Prebble aboard. "We've booked her, that's definitely on," Grand Syndicates' manager Sam Lyons told Racing.com. "We've had her half-booked on the horse a couple of times, one time she couldn't quite make the weight in The Goodwood, and I don't need to go into what happened a couple of days before the Memsie. Hopefully it's third-time lucky! She's obviously been a leading rider over the last couple of years, so it makes sense to give her an opportunity on the horse."

## Overpass heads for Orr

Trainer Bjorn Baker announced yesterday that Expressway Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Overpass (Vancouver) will head to Melbourne to contest next weekend's Orr Stakes. The weight-for-age contest has been a popular stepping stone for three-year-olds, with Alabama Express (Redoute's Choice) the most recent of the age group to take the prize. Overpass is likely to step up to the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) or return to 1200 metres in the Newmarket Handicap depending on his performance in the Orr.

## Dabernig ready for Mascot return

Next Saturday's Geoffrey Bellmaine Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) looms as the starting point for Flying Mascot (Tavistock) as she embarks on a campaign aimed at the All-Star Mile (1600m) at Flemington. Flying Mascot currently sits tenth in the voting order for the \$5 million feature with just over 2,000 votes. She is almost 150 votes clear of 11th-placed Lighthouse (Mizzen Mast), with the top ten granted an automatic berth on March 19. "She's in great shape. She's done well from the spring to the autumn and she physically looks stronger," trainer Tom Dabernig said. "I've given her two trials, she's had one at Geelong and we went up to Horsham. Her fitness is now ready to go to the races. We are going to kick her off next Saturday at Caulfield and then hopefully go to the Mannerism two weeks later. And then into the All-Star Mile if we are lucky to get a run."

## Streetcar set for Oakleigh Plate test

Trainer David Jolly remains hopeful that his Caulfield specialist Streetcar Stranger (Stratum) may be able to gain a start in the Oakleigh Plate after his last-start win in the W J Adams Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at the track. "He really enjoys that track and the style of racing there, those sprints out the chute really suit the style of racing he's got," Jolly told Racing.com. "He seems to have developed a love affair with Caulfield and we're probably looking at this stage giving him a fly in the Oakleigh Plate with the weight relief. I think he loves a high-pressure race, whether his rating will let him

get into it or not I'm not sure. At the top end of the tree is the Oakleigh Plate, but there are two or three other sprints that he could also run in if we didn't go that far. I'll probably play it by ear and just see how he is, I'd probably prefer going to the Oakleigh off the longer break, but I'm not convinced we'd get into it, so I'd have to just speak to the handicapper there and just see how things are travelling."

## Galaxy next for Isotope

One sprinter not heading to the Oakleigh Plate is top Queensland mare Isotope (Deep Field), who will instead travel to Sydney for The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m). Isotope returned last month, taking the Magic Millions Snippets (1200m) impressively and once again stamping herself as a Group 1 winner-in-waiting. "She's back in now, ticking along, but at this point in time we'll run in The Galaxy in Sydney," trainer Tony Gollan told Racing.com. "I'm not totally sure what we do from there, do we maybe look at the T J Smith Stakes or do we try and dodge that next level and save our cherries for the Doomben 10,000 up here? I do think The Galaxy suits, we saw her really good fresh up Magic Millions day and it's nine weeks between runs, I think we can have her spot on for The Galaxy in the autumn."

## Contamination likely to blame for positive swab: Team Williams

A tumultuous week for the Grant and Alana Williams training partnership continued yesterday when they announced they had been informed of a positive swab result. The husband and wife team dissolved their professional union on Tuesday due to Western Australia's Covid mandate, with Grant Williams now listed as the sole trainer at the powerhouse stable. However, the duo will have to face Racing and Wagering WA (RWWA) stewards together over the positive codeine swab returned by Sugar Cain (Americain) after she won at Belmont in late September. In a statement, Grant Williams said: "While we are still unclear as to how this substance has entered Sugar Cain's system, initial thinking suggests it has entered her via some form of cross contamination. As a part of this process, we will be undertaking a

comprehensive review of our internal protocols to firstly try and understand how this issue has occurred and importantly to ensure more stringent processes are implemented around the stable. This is the first time Alana and I have returned a positive swab in over 20 years' participation in the racing industry."

## Stanaway cops three-year disqualification

Trainer Bryce Stanaway has been disqualified for three years by the Victorian Racing Tribunal after he was found guilty of eight misconduct charges relating to an incident involving his horse Moorabool (Seventh Reason) in 2020. The eight charges relate to Stanaway's conduct with the stewards and raceday personnel. The three-person tribunal, headed by John Bowman, will release a detailed summary of the penalty, including the reasons for the decision, in the coming days.

## Reece Goodwin joins training ranks

Young horseman Reece Goodwin has taken out his trainers' licence, joining the growing list of handlers based at Pakenham. Hailing from a racing family, Goodwin was surrounded by champion horses from a young age, with the first horse he patted being Doriemus (Norman Pentaquad) and his first ride coming aboard Schillaci (Salieri). He took to the saddle, partnering 124 winners from 533 rides, before joining his father Barry's stable. Goodwin received a tick of approval from champion trainer Peter Moody, who said: "Only just met this young man but hard not to be impressed. (He is) a good addition to Pakenham."

## Sharrock to target Levin with Shamus

After tasting a first defeat in Wednesday's Waikato Guineas (Gr 2, 2100m) at Te Rapa, Allan Sharrock still holds faith in stable star Shamus (Shameexpress). However, he will keep the gelding to shorter distances going forward, starting with the Levin Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) on March 16. "I thought it was a brave effort at Te Rapa, but I've pulled him out of the Derby.

## Our Hail Mary out to prove Cup credentials

Sharrock's Our Hail Mary (Ocean Park) will put forward her claims for the Auckland Cup (Gr 2, 3200m) when she takes on the Taranaki Cup (Gr 3, 1800m) tomorrow. The six-year-old daughter of Ocean Park (Thorn Park) claimed her eighth career win from 20 starts in the Marton Cup (Listed, 2200m) at Manawatu on January 8. Stablemate Sinarahma (Darci Brahma) could also head to the two-mile feature and runs in the Wairarapa Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Listed, 1600m) on Monday. "Our Hail Mary is a genuine Auckland Cup chance and Sinarahma might come up a bit short on mileage so we'll just play it by ear with her," Sharrock said. "Our Hail Mary will run a race on Saturday and then she'll either go to the Avondale Cup or the Nathan's Memorial and then the Auckland Cup. I'm very happy where I am with her and down to 54 kilograms, it looks a great race for her on Saturday."

## Soft ground to suit Sophmaze

The Sharrock-trained Sophmaze (Derryn) has displayed her fair share of talent but the juvenile has had her progress hampered by shin soreness in recent months. The first-crop

daughter of Derryn (Hinchinbrook) finished third on debut at Taranaki in December and steps up to stakes level for the Taranaki 2YO Classic (Gr 3, 1200m) on her home track on Saturday, with the predicted rain set to suit. "She was very, very good and was chronically shin sore. She was good late and the rain that is predicted won't worry her at all," Sharrock said. "She doesn't mind a bit of moisture and her shins are fine so I can see her being a player."

### HK: Pagan to Hayes stable

Promising three-year-old Pagan (Shamexpress), who supplemented his promising debut second at Pakenham with victory in a Sandown maiden on December 22, has joined the Hong Kong stable of David Hayes. Previously in the care of Hayes' sons, Ben and JD, Pagan was one of 16 horses who departed Australia for Hong Kong last week. "We're really excited to get him," David Hayes told Racing.com. "I think the horse will do well. He's going to get in on the minimum (rating), 63 or 64, and he'll have no trouble in that class." Regarding taking the horse off his sons, Hayes explained: "I

obviously don't want to deplete them too much, but that horse was bought out of trials in New Zealand and they looked after him for a couple of months and got the job done. I'd like to buy trial winners probably out of other stables, rather than ours, and put them into Lindsay Park to assess them."

## INTERNATIONAL

### FR: Fabrice Vermeulen banned for six months

Group 1-winning trainer Fabrice Vermeulen has been banned for six months by France Galop after a lengthy investigation into claims he falsified the ownership details of 12 horses. Three months of the sentence will be suspended for five years. The Belgian-born, Chantilly-based trainer is best known for sending out Lily's Candle (Style Vendome) to land the Prix Marcel Boussac (Gr 1, 1600m) on Arc day in 2018. Many of the administrative breaches of which Vermeulen has been found guilty relate to the involvement of an ownership entity called SAS Le Marais, a company registered to his longtime associate Jeremy Para. Le Marais was subject to an investigation by the Service Central des Courses et Jeux – the branch of law enforcement with specific oversight of the racing and gambling sector – which came to a head in July 2020 and whose findings led France Galop to bar the company from racehorse ownership. As well as being a key part of Vermeulen's set-up, Para is also a licensed bloodstock agent and the France Galop case alleged that the pair used third parties to hide Le Marais's ownership of shares in a number of horses.

# TORRYBURN STUD

**R**enowned Hunter nursery Torryburn Stud returns to the scene of one of its greatest triumphs hoping history repeats through a superb draft at the Inglis Classic sale.

It was here six years ago the boutique operation sold - for a bargain \$90,000 - the colt by Denman out of De Chorus who became Hot King Prawn. The grey is now a Hong Kong hero with 12 wins, Group 1 success, \$6.4 million and a listing on the 2021 Longines World Best Racehorse Rankings (along with another of Torryburn's finest in Home Affairs).

Torryburn also sold G1 ATC Sires Produce winner Peggy Jean for just \$46,000 at Classic in 2013, while also achieving the sale-topper in 2020 - a \$380,000 Deep Field colt which debuted, as Voyage Bubble, with a fighting short-head second at Sha Tin last Sunday.

And the "love-heart farm" is confident of providing more joy for buyers with its choice selection of nine lots this year.

**Lot 368**, described by the stud's Mel Copelin as a "glamour filly with a huge walk", is by Dundee out of the three-time Melbourne city winner Aliberani (Redoute's Choice).

With Dundee a 1200m winner at two before taking six Group 1s from 1600m to the 2400m of the ATC Derby, and Aliberani successful up to 1800m and descending from an Oaks heroine, this filly screams Classic potential on top of early promise.

This September foal's third dam was AJC Oaks winner Savana City, winner of the AJC Oaks and joint top filly on the 1987-88 Australasian 3YO classification.

And she brings by far Dundee's best nick, with Redoute's Choice mares having thrown him 24 winners from 38 runners, including Caulfield Guineas victor Super Seth.

Early promise abounds in **Lot 459**, a well-developed son of exciting first season sire Harry

Angel. The powerful, silky-moving August foal is out of provincial winning mare Chicquita - a daughter of Commands, who's been a top-12 broodmare sire for the past four years and rose to eighth last season.

The city-placed Chicquita is out of a Sydney 1500m G2 winner in Prisoner Of Love (Canny Lad), whose dam Professionelle threw three other stakes-winners in Sportsman, Hoystar and King Of Prussia.

"We're pretty excited about this boy," Copelin says. "He's a strong, forward colt who's had real star appeal from early on."

There will be speed to burn in Lot 196, another colt showing early potential from the second crop of G1-winning sprinter Hellbent out of Red Hot Chillies, a winning daughter of blistering American sire Red Ransom.

Red Hot Chillies - a half-sister from city-winning Danehill mare Endearment to the stakes-placed Privlaka - has had three foals to race for three winners, including Howwonderfullifeis, a metro-winner of five races blessed with abundant pace.

"This colt has really jumped out of the ground in his prep and I'm sure he'll be a genuine runner going off his progress this summer," Copelin says of the close-coupled October drop, whose sire Hellbent's lightning-

quick daughter Miss Hellfire has pushed him to fourth on the first-season sires' list.

That chart is topped by Russian Revolution, who's exploded onto the scene with three early winners including Magic Millions 2YO Classic runner-up Russian Conquest. And the young dual G1-winning sire's best traits are encapsulated in **Lot 194**, a late-August colt from an extremely rich female line.

This slick, ultra-athletic youngster is out of the winning Lonhro mare Red Hearts, daughter of an exceptional Torryburn favourite in Crimson Reign, a three-time winner at two including in the G3 Kindergarten Stakes, and ultimately a Black Type winner twice in Sydney and once in Melbourne.

Crimson Reign - narrowly beaten only by the mighty Alinghi in the G2 Reisling Slipper trial - is out of another stakes-winning sprinter in Crimson Road, and has thrown five winners from seven track performers. These include Deploy, winner of eight races - two at G2 level, including the ATC Theo Marks Stakes - who, like **Lot 194**, is from a Danehill-line sire.

Rounding out Torryburn's impressive draft are **Lot 6**, a colt by Pierro, **Lots 568** and **622**, colts by Merchant Navy, **Lot 678**, a Deep Field filly, and **Lot 772**, a filly by Pride Of Dubai.





# INGLIS CLASSIC YEARLINGS

Over the past two years Redbank North stud has emerged as a major force at the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale, punching above its weight in making the top 10 averages table in 2020 and rising to seventh last year.

And the trend looks set to grow only stronger this time around as the stud which bred the outstanding Single Gaze sends its biggest Classic draft yet, of 14 prime lots.

Redbank North - which sits amid the rich horse country of the NSW South-West Slopes near Cootamundra - has been run by James and Fiona Middleton for more than 40 years, and has forged a reputation for raising thoroughbreds with the sort of care and attention to detail which a family-run boutique stud can best provide.

**Lot 7** embodies those qualities in breathtaking style. She's a beautifully balanced bay filly by the new sire who was the talk of last month's Magic Millions, The Autumn Sun, who comfortably topped that sale's first-season gross and averages tables.

She's the third foal of the unraced Lady Chelle, a half-sister to the stakes-winning I Have No Fear from two generations of stakes-winning sprinting mares. Dam Countess Christie, by Marsday, won four from nine, three in succession including the Group 2 Magic Night Stakes and G3 Sweet Embrace Stakes. And her American speed dam Brilliantdeduction was a five-time winner up to 1200m, including in Listed class in the USA.

With Lady Chelle a daughter of the Zabeel sire Reset, this filly contains one of the most potent crosses of The Autumn Sun's super sire Redoute's Choice, with Zabeel mares his top nick by way of 55 winners from 73 runners.

Redbank North has three lots boasting the bloodlines of its cherished city-winning broodmare Redaluca's Gaze (Intergaze). She's the dam of the stud's undoubted star Single Gaze, the G1 winner and triple G1 runner-up

whose versatility brought success from 1100m to 2200m. Redaluca's Gaze has thrown six other runners, all of them winners including the stakes-winning Le Val and six-time winner Resurge, who won two in a row last month including the Strathalbyn Cup (2050m).

**Lot 197** is a half-brother to those winners, a powerfully-built colt by exciting first season sire Merchant Navy, giving him the same blend of a Danehill-line sire over Redaluca's Gaze as Single Gaze and Le Val. He also boasts a 4x4 cross of the outstanding sire Lunchtime, through Merchant Navy's Blue Hen dam Legally Bay and Redaluca's Gaze's sireline.

**Lot 195** brings a different speed-based sireline, a superbly-proportioned grandson of Redaluca's Gaze by the surging Spirit Of Boom, Queensland's Champion Sire through the past three of his four crops, father of G1-winning sprinter Jonker, and currently a Top 10 Australian two-year-old sire.

This colt is an enticing first foal from a daughter of Helenus in Red Heat, a five-time winner from 1600m-2000m, and thus promising great versatility.

And **Lot 380** is a bay filly bringing other speed lines to granddam Redaluca's Gaze's family. She's out of the Snitzel mare Amoret,

a winner at 1500m, and is by the G1-winning sprinting son of the great I Am Invincible, Hellbent, whose blistering daughter Miss Hellfire has propelled him to fourth among Australia's first-season sires.

There's a coveted, gender-balanced 3x3 cross of Danehill in **Lot 211**, an imposing, beautifully-moving bay colt by former speed machine Pariah (Redoute's Choice, by Danehill) out of Rose Of Falvelon, a flying city winner of eight races by another star speedster, Falvelon.

Second dam Run For Roses (Danehill) has had 12 foals to race with no fewer than 10 winners, including Medal Kun/King Louis, a stakes-winning six-time victor in Australia and Singapore.

A recent study showed having Danehill through a son and a daughter was the best way to double-up on the great sire (by stakes-winners to runners), with no lesser examples than Verry Elleegant, Sunlight, Guelph and Bivouac.

# Murray Baker to call time on career

Iconic trainer Murray Baker has made the decision to retire on April 30. The 75-year-old will bring the curtain down on a glittering career that has included 56 Group 1 wins, with 22 of those coming across the Tasman in Australia.

A pioneer for targeting feature races in New Zealand's prize-money rich neighbour, Baker won five Australian Derbys (Gr 1, 2400m) in Sydney, headlined by arguably his greatest horse - six-time Group 1 winner Dundee (High Chaparral) - and a Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) with Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor). The announcement of his retirement comes just days after the handler brought up his latest Group 1 win with The Chosen One's (Savabeel) success in the Thorndon Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) at Trentham on Saturday.

Baker was inducted into the New Zealand racing Hall of Fame in 2018.

In a letter to owners, Baker said: "It has been a long and enjoyable road since I started with Harry Greene at the old Greenmeadows Napier track in 1958. During this time, I have

been fortunate to have had some very good horses along the way, met a lot of marvelous people and had a lot of fun times.

"Andrew Forsman will take over training in his own right on May 1, 2022 with a wealth of experience behind him having worked for and with me over the past 18 years. I am sure you will support him as you have supported me over the years."

Baker trained his first winner in 1978 and won his first Group 1 race in the New Zealand St Leger in 1985 (Gr 1, 2800m) courtesy of Sir Vigilant (Sir Tristram). In 2008, he entered into a training partnership with his son, Bjorn. The pair won in excess of 30 stakes races during their three seasons together, before Bjorn decided to ply his trade from his Warwick Farm base in Sydney.

Reflecting on his father's retirement, Bjorn said in a statement yesterday: "A great racehorse trainer and a New Zealand Hall of Fame inductee, he's been through the highs and lows of racing and competed at the best levels on his own terms.

"Winner of five Australian Derbys and

having won more Group 1 races in Australia than any other New Zealand-based Kiwi trainer, I am sure his dry wit will be missed at the Cambridge track - lucky Mum!

"I am grateful to have learned from a master. An excellent mentor, he's cheered home nearly every winner I've had, from Randwick to Orange and back ... Although it's doubtful the dent in his armchair can get any deeper, after years of relentless hard work, he deserves a wonderful retirement."

Having worked with Murray since 2004, Andrew Forsman joined Baker in a training partnership in 2012, and will take over the running of the stable in a solo capacity upon Baker's retirement in April.

"Andrew has been wanting to go on his own, so this gives him that chance. He's ready," Baker said.

"Andrew has been dealing with the owners and attending the races for the stable for a while now, so I don't see the transition being a problem. He's learned a lot, come a long way, and I hope something has rubbed off from me in the way he trains."



# Cheerful Days snares Chinese New Year Cup for Lui, Badel

**C**heerful Days' (Smart Missile) emergence as one of Hong Kong's most consistent performers elevated sharply at Sha Tin yesterday when the under-rated gelding provided Francis Lui and Alexis Badel with Class 1 Chinese New Year Cup Handicap (1400m) triumph.

Stereotyped as a Happy Valley 1650-metre specialist after four of his first five wins were posted at the city circuit, Cheerful Days upstaged more accomplished rivals Californiadeepshot (Deep Field) and Lucky Express (Toronado) to log his fifth victory from his past six starts.

Given a copybook ride by Badel, the 86-rater drove hard late to clinch his most important success so far and to join Hong Kong Classic Mile (Listed, 1600m) winner, the unbeaten Romantic Warrior (Acclamation), as the only horses to win five races in Hong Kong this season.

"Great win from the horse, we knew he had improved so much. He's been very consistent in Happy Valley and we came back to a shorter trip from where he's been winning as well, so today was a great challenge," Badel said.

"Bottom weight helped the horse and

he fought really hard through the line. It was a solid win. He's a nice horse. I don't see any reason why he will not keep improving."

Lui will next target the DBS x Manulife Million Challenge Finale at Happy Valley on February 23, when the five-year-old will return to his most successful course and distance in search of a share of the HK\$1 million bounty on offer in the lucrative series.

Currently sitting in second place with 45 points behind Fa Fa (He's Remarkable) on 60, Cheerful Days would earn a further 15 points with a fifth 1650-metre win later this month to potentially tie the series.

Lui was taken aback by Cheerful Days' latest achievement yesterday

"I thought he was good in Happy Valley because he kept winning there. Now, he can handle Sha Tin again – I'm surprised. Now we'll focus on Happy Valley at the end of the month (DBS x Manulife Million Challenge Finale)," he said.

Badel doubled his haul immediately when John Size's Country Boy (Shamardal) landed the second section of the Class 4 Prosperity Handicap (1400m) as Cordyceps Six (Star Turn) continued his startling rise with emphatic

success in the Class 3 Good Fortune Handicap (1000m) for Richard Gibson and Blake Shinn.

The victory was Cordyceps Six's fourth over the five-furlong straight course.

"You've got to remember he's only three-years-old and I thought it was a very impressive performance today. We expected him to win and I thought he won with style," Gibson said.

"He's only three and he can only get better with age. He's in really good nick and he's a pleasure to train."

Winner of 11 trainers' titles, Size vaulted into the lead for the 2021/22 championship with a treble which included Beauty Fit's (Ilovethiscity) runaway success in the first section of the Class 3 Kung Hei Handicap (1400m) for Joao Moreira.

"He was impressive," Moreira said of Beauty Fit, winner now of three races in Hong Kong after prevailing twice in Australia when named Barocha.

Running Glory (Kermadec) and Joao Moreira sealed Size's treble, giving the Australian a 44-42 lead over Frankie Lor after 42 of 88 scheduled meetings.

Entered for the BMW Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) at Sha Tin on March 20,

Running Glory overcame barrier 12 to provide Moreira with a three-timer.

"He had to make a wide run on him but the tempo of the race was good enough for him to do that and he had plenty of cover on the circle. Coming down the side, he was comfortable," Size said.

"He's a nice sort of horse – he's just a little bit small, but his heart's in the right place. He's a determined racehorse, as you saw today."

Caspar Fownes-trained Galaxy Witness (Star Witness) gave Moreira the second leg of his three-timer, striding away with the Class 4 Kut Cheong Handicap (1200m) to remain unbeaten after two starts.

"Galaxy Witness is doing what we expect him to do. He's still very green, he's still doing a lot of things wrong but, apparently, he's got a lot of ability. He won with a lot of authority," Moreira said.

David Hall's talented Flying Ace (Swiss Ace) remained unbeaten after three starts with victory in the Class 3 Great Profits Handicap (1200m) under Matthew Poon.

"He's had three starts for three wins so, how high he gets, we'll just wait and see and what distance he can run is probably another question as well – whether we can increase him up to 1400 metres to 1600 metres?" Hall said.

"The stallion's horses can run a mile, no problem. So, it's exciting that we've got some options – we've been to Happy Valley, Sha Tin and it looks as if we can increase his distance. It seems he's got some more to give."

Poon completed a race-to-race double when Danny Shum's Charity Go (Harbour Watch) claimed the Class 2 Fat Choi Handicap (1800m).

Manfred Man had the honour of sharing the first winner in the Year of the Tiger with Derek Leung, who piloted Good Beauty (Hard Spun) to success in the Class 5 Yue Yee Handicap (1200m).

"He dropped in class, he drew barrier one, so what can you expect?" Man laughed after posting the stable's 16th victory of the season.

Maximize Heart became the latest winning

Go Waterhouse, Adrian Bott and Bruce Slade's Kestrel Thoroughbreds look to have already made a shrewd purchase this year after parting with \$600,000 at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale last month to secure a Zoustar (Northern Meteor) filly out of the Fastnet Rock (Danehill) Miss Debutante - a mare trained by Waterhouse to Listed success.

Just three weeks later Queen Of The Ball, her two-year-old half-sister by I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit), secured a Group 3 triumph when taking out the Widden Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) at Rosehill on Saturday - a performance earning the filly this week's Maiden of the Week accolade.

The Richard and Michael Freedman-trained Queen Of The Ball backed up her narrow second in October's Kirkham Plate (1000m) to win at her second start. Crossing from the wide barrier, the juvenile led the field into the home straight before drawing away impressively to salute by a commanding three and three-quarter lengths at the post.

She now presents as another Golden

Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) candidate for the training brothers, who won the feature juvenile event last year with Stay Inside (Extreme Choice).

"I was thinking a couple of weeks ago we might be a little light-on for a Slipper horse," Michael Freedman said.

"I'd say off the back of that, you'd have to be thinking she is somewhere in the mix anyway.

"There's not much of her but she is as tough as old boots, as big an eater as we've got in the stable and just loves her racing."

The first foal out Scone Carnival winner Miss Debutante, Queen Of The Ball is a granddaughter of Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (Gr 2, 8f) winner More Than Real (More Than Ready).

Miss Debutante was a \$430,000 yearling purchase for Paul Moroney Bloodstock and raced in the silks of Sir Owen Glenn, who retained her for the breeding barn. She was covered by Newgate stallion Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) on an October 18 mating.



# THE WEEK IN ROWE-VIEW

**Every Friday in ANZ, lead reporter Tim Rowe delivers his thoughts on the week that's been, discussing the prevalent issues in racing and stories beyond the headlines**

The door is ajar for Kiwis domiciled in Australia to get back to New Zealand in time for the Karaka Yearling Sale, which runs from March 7 to 12.

New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern outlined her international border reopening plan yesterday, confirming expatriates could travel home from Australia from 11.59pm on February 27.

They would be required to undertake ten days of home isolation, a stint which is expected to be reduced to seven days in the near future.

If that is the case, then agents such as Guy Mulcaster, Bevan Smith, Dean Hawthorne and Dave Mee and trainers such as John Sargent, Bjorn Baker, Chris Waller and Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young would have the option to head to Auckland and exit isolation in time for day one of the New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka sale.

However, in order to achieve this, they would have to miss being at Oaklands Junction for the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale, which gets underway on February 27.

Ardern has promised to reopen the international border to Australians "by July" and to all countries by October.

Lock me in now for the 2022 NZB Ready to Run Sale in November.

\*\*\*

The competition between Magic Millions and Inglis is as intense as it has ever been – and the winners are the owners and trainers buying horses from the respective auction houses.

Earlier this week, Inglis announced a raft of prize-money increases for some of its signature races – and a \$1 million Pink Bonus series for horses predominantly owned by women.

There's nothing wrong with copying what works, and the lucrative women's bonus offered by rival Magic Millions has been a raging success for a number of years, so there's no reason why the Inglis one won't be a winner, too.

It's tremendous for participants of the industry that the auction houses are giving back some of the increased commissions generated by turbo-charged bloodstock sales over the past 18 months. Prize-money hikes by Inglis came just three weeks after Magic Millions introduced the \$1 million The Syndicate (1200m) and the \$500,000 The Debut (900m), with both races to be run on its pinnacle day each January on the Gold Coast from 2023.

On top of the enormous prize-money available in Australia – more than \$800 million generated by the punters – there are also significant owner and breeder bonus schemes, such as VOBIS, BOBS and QTIS, Racing SA Rewards, TasBreeders and WestSpeed.

Long may the competition continue.

Marquee Stud's Mark Alati spends his time at the track on Saturdays, riding the ups and downs of life as an on-track bookmaker.

While he could spend his spare time on Sydney Harbour or enjoying some other relaxing pursuits, Alati prefers the cut and thrust of the track, mixing with punters, despite the bookmaking profession seemingly being a dying art.

"It's a bit of a hobby for me. Some people play golf, some people go fishing, some people

go skydiving on a Saturday whereas I like to go to the track and be a bookmaker," Alati said this week.

"Look, would I like to rely on it to feed my family? Absolutely not, but it is OK. There's a good sense of comradery between the bookmakers and we all realise what it is and I suppose it is like everything else, the stud or any of my other businesses, you try to have connection with my clients and incite a bit of loyalty and that generally happens.

"It's a lot of fun, but the halcyon days are well and truly gone."

After More Sundays (Fastnet Rock) won the Midway (1300m) at Rosehill on Saturday, Sam Kavanagh's first success since relocating to Newcastle, the trainer revealed that a form confidant of his prior to the meeting suggested that Rosehill would be "rails or die".

And the astute Northern Beaches form analyst was spot on. Rails in run was dynamite and any horse not hugging the fence prior to entering the home straight was basically condemned to racing for the minor placings at best.

Bias - or a track pattern - happens at almost all racecourses, but at some tracks it's more exaggerated than others.

The uproar from punters, rightly in my opinion, about Saturday's Rosehill track was the degree of advantage those with the rails in run were provided by the bias. Kavanagh's form advisor was not alone in predicting a biased Rosehill, as a summer firm track with the rail at six metres often plays that way.

But how much advantage did the fence provide? I've read anywhere from 1.7 lengths to three to four lengths, depending on which ratings analyst you listen to, which is too much in a game won and lost by small margins.

One thing's for certain, there will be some big form turnarounds in the coming weeks when horses of the ilk of Anamoe (Street Boss) hit their peak for races like the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m).

As for More Sundays, jockey Hugh Bowman was awake to the bias from the get-go, sending Centimental (Snitzel) to the front in race four to score, his first ride on the card, and ducking to the inside on Kavanagh's horse to win race five.

Kavanagh's form analyst, I'm told, is yet to receive a sling for his pre-race advice.

"Patience is the cheapest thing in racing and the least used."

The oft-quoted Bart Cummings line came to mind last week when Lou Roberts won a maiden with eight-year-old gelding Kennywyn (Time Thief) at Scone last Friday.

The frustration of owning and training Kennywyn must have been immense, placing 21 times from 52 starts prior to his unlikely breakthrough in the Buy Better at Inglis 2022 Maiden Handicap (900m), but the victory must have been enormously satisfying for Muswellbrook trainer Roberts.

The victory took Kennywyn's earnings to \$95,130.

A notable absentee from the Inglis Premier vendors list this year is Victorian operation Glentree Thoroughbreds, with stud manager Luke Simpson revealing a change of policy in that all of their 2022 yearlings and beyond will be retained to race.

The Modewarre-based operation topped the average vendor list at last year's Premier sale, selling six yearlings at a mean price of \$330,000, among which featured a \$550,000 son of Dundee (High Chaparral) that went the way of John O'Shea.

"We're not selling this year, we're retaining our yearlings to race going forward," Simpson said.

"It's just a change in our business model

and we want to enjoy the racing scene a bit more. Particularly the way the prize-money is at the moment, but it also gives us full control over developing our pedigrees and creating them ourselves. That's our plan for the foreseeable future."

\*\*\*

China Horse Club last week announced a restructuring of their organisational hierarchy in the wake of Michael Wallace's departure from the business in December. Three separate roles will be created to oversee the US, Europe and Australasian divisions, with the latter set to be headed up by the promoted Michael Smith. Matt Houldsworth will fill the European spot, while Fabriccio Buffolo will lead the US division.

On Michael Smith's appointment, China Horse Club's vice president Eden Harrington told ANZ Bloodstock News: "Mike's done a fantastic job in Australia for several years since he's been with us and he's certainly deserving of the extra responsibility.

"He's across our portfolio of horses and has a wonderful relationship with our key partners, especially Newgate Farm and Henry Field, and all of our trainers there. We're very fortunate to have someone of his skill set."
