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Triple Crown seeking a Golden Revolution with Slipper contender

Blue Diamond Stakes runner-up Revolutionary Miss a fifth starter in the world's richest juvenile race for the prominent syndicator

The 1995 Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) has, so far, had the greatest impact of any two-year-old race on Triple Crown Syndications, even though the business itself was not established until more than a decade later. But that could change tomorrow when their filly Revolutionary Miss (Russian Revolution) becomes the fifth representative for the ownership group in the \$5 million feature.

The 1995 race is best remembered for the rails run of Flying Spur (Danahill) under replacement rider Glen Boss, who secured the mount on race morning from the suspended Jimmy Cassidy. A Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) runner-up, just like Revolutionary Miss, Flying Spur came through to defeat Octagonal (Zabeel) by a long head in a vintage edition that also included juveniles like Our Maizcay (Maizcay), Strategic (Zeditave) and Ravarda (Rave Report).

<< *Continued from page 1* However, it was third-placed Millrich (Rubiton) that would turn out to be the life changer for Triple Crown owners more than two decades later when her final foal, Redzel (Snitzel), went down as the first - and second - winner of The Everest (1200m). His two victories in the world's richest turf race under Kerrin McEvoy took his earnings beyond \$16 million and cemented Triple Crown directors Chris and Michael Ward among the biggest players in the syndication business.

"Flying Spur, Octagonal and Millrich - what a trifecta that was and it is great to see all three of them go on to have a big influence on the breeding side having produced some outstanding racehorses in subsequent generations," Chris Ward told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

The Triple Crown red and white colours that are now so etched in Australian racing folklore were first worn in a Golden Slipper 16 years later when subsequent Group 1 winner Hot Snitzel (Snitzel) finished 12th to Sepoy (Elusive Quality) in 2011. A year later, Cavalry Rose (Charge Forward) would finish a late-closing eighth in Pierro's (Lonhro) Slipper, while Charlie Boy (Myboycharlie) and Dothraki (Mossman) would finish eighth and 16th respectively in 2013.

Since then, though, they have not had a Golden Slipper runner, but in 2022, they head to Rosehill with arguably their greatest chance yet in the Peter and Paul Snowden-trained Revolutionary Miss, to be ridden by McEvoy.

"The Golden Slipper ownership experience has always been amazing," Ward said. "We are in the fortunate position to share those experiences with different ownership groups and to see the unbridled joy and excitement they get from competing in time-honoured races like the Golden Slipper, it's hard to explain. These are experiences that cannot be replicated anywhere else and to have played a part in helping provide these life experiences to people is very satisfying.

"Obviously it is an almighty thrill for anyone to have a contender in the Golden Slipper but from a business point of view, it is an important bonus that people see our red silks competing and winning in these big races. It just demonstrates what is possible for anyone looking to get into racehorse ownership and that these types of life experiences are open to

anybody keen to get involved."

Revolutionary Miss has won only one of her four starts, taking the Blue Diamond Prelude (Gr 2, 1100m) for fillies at Caulfield in February. However, her form otherwise has been solid with three runner-up finishes: on debut to subsequent Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) heroine Fireburn (Rebel Dane), in the Widden Stakes (Gr 3,

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1100m) behind Black Opal Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Queen Of The Ball (I Am Invincible) and when producing arguably the run of the race in the Blue Diamond Stakes behind Daumier (Epaulette) last start.

Unlike fellow Blue Diamond runners Daumier, Jacquinet (Rubick) and Sebonack (Capitalist), as well as third emergency Semillion (Shalaa), Revolutionary Miss has had the benefit of two races in Sydney.

"It's always an extra challenge for the Melbourne horses to come to Sydney and go in our direction for the first time," he said. "They need to get on the right leg and adapt straight away, which some will and some won't. Revolutionary Miss has been Sydney based and has done all her work the Sydney way except for the lead up to her two runs down south so she won't have any dramas on that front.

"The only question mark with her following on from the Blue Diamond is the fact that this will be her fifth run in her first prep. It's been a pretty full prep but she is showing no signs of being over it and Peter, Paul and Kerrin couldn't be happier with her work so we are expecting her to perform very well."

Sydney's big wet has muddied the Golden Slipper picture this year, with each of the main lead-ups since the Silver Slipper (Gr 2, 1100m) a month ago run on rain-affected tracks - something that Revolutionary Miss has managed to avoid.

"It's definitely a plus," he said. "You just never know how much of a toll these recent heavy tracks will take on a horse, especially two-year-olds. That's one aspect that we don't have to worry about.

"It's possible that the Blue Diamond is the right form race but it is very hard to know this year. It is such an open race and most of the lead-up performances have been pretty even across the board. Throw in a few horses having lead-up runs on bog tracks or unconventional preparations and it will be a tough ask for people punting with absolute confidence."

One potential negative is a wide draw, with Chris's brother, Mike, pulling out gate 17 for Revolutionary Miss in Tuesday's barrier draw. However, given the possibility of a soft track, that may not be as difficult as it appears on paper.

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"I was calling for Mike's head when he drew barrier 17!" Ward said, laughingly. "But she should jump from barrier 14 and Mike was quick to point out that there have been six previous winners from barrier 14. We will need some luck in the first furlong when finding a position but there are some other good horses out a bit wider, too, so hopefully Kerrin can find the back of the right one who will take her into the race. I wouldn't be surprised to see her flashing down the outside late and let's pray she sprouts wings and gets there in time.

"Kerrin is all class. He is a very reliable and consistent jockey who gives every horse its opportunity to produce its best. His composure has been noted in the big races which is why we were keen to have him on board. We have obviously had a lot of success with Kerrin in the past with the likes of Redzel and many others, so we know Revolutionary Miss is in safe hands on Saturday."

From the first crop of Newgate Farm's Russian Revolution (Snitzel), Revolutionary Miss is the second foal to race out of New Zealand mare Percentage (Onemorenomore), who herself is out of the Group 1-placed Spurcent - fittingly for Triple Crown, a daughter of Flying Spur.

Percentage's first foal, Equation (Press Statement), won the Canberra Guineas (Listed, 1400m) last year.

Offered by Sledmere Stud at last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Ward said that they were taken by the bay filly the moment they saw her and were thrilled to secure her for \$195,000.

"We first inspected her on farm at Sledmere Stud prior to the sales," he recalled. "As soon as she walked out of the barn I said to Mike 'she's a ripper' and thankfully he agreed. She immediately caught the eye as just a beautifully balanced and athletic type. We know Sledmere raise their horses well and she was an obvious target from that moment.

"We were quick to recommend her to a number of our clients and thankfully she has really rewarded their faith in us."

Russian Revolution will join rare company with three Golden Slipper runners from his first crop, making him the third stallion since the turn of the century to achieve that feat. He joins his Newgate Farm barnmate Capitalist (Written Tycoon), who had three runners from his first crop last year, as well as Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) in 2003.

Champion first season sires such as Flying Spur, General Nediym (Nediym), Redoute's Choice (Danehill), More Than Ready (Southern Halo), Exceed And Excel (Danehill) and Written Tycoon (Iglesia) had only one runner each in the Slipper from their inaugural crops, while Choisir (Danehill Dancer) had two. Even the remarkable Danehill (Danzig) had two runners in his first season.

Ward believes that the Russian Revolutions will continue to prove popular for years to come.

"I love them," he enthused. "We obviously watched his career very closely when he was running for the Newgate and China Horse Club team under the Snowdens' training and knew what a talent he was. As soon as he went to stud, we were keen to find some good ones from his stock.

"He has certainly started his career at stud in blazing style and it's no mean feat to have three runners in the Golden Slipper with a stallion's first crop, so Newgate has another very smart stallion on their roster with a big career in front of him."

While the focus is rightly on tomorrow's feature, there is always one eye on the future, particularly with the yearling sale season about to reach its zenith with the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale next month.

However, for Triple Crown, most of their buying has already been done through a bumper season that saw them acquire three yearlings at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale - including a filly by Russian Revolution - as well as five youngsters at the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale and a further four from the Inglis Premier Yearling Sale.

"The buying has been tough but good," he said. "Racing in Australia is thriving and going from strength to strength with prize-money increases seeming almost commonplace these days. Off the back of such a healthy industry, it is no surprise to see the sales figures all go up as well.

"Everybody operates differently but we work incredibly hard in the lead up to selecting and hopefully buying our horses. There are always good opportunities if you have thoroughly done your homework and we have been particularly pleased with the crop of horses we have managed to get this year.

"I'm sure there are some very exciting times ahead for our owners and we can't wait to see how it all unfolds."

Revolutionary Miss was last night rated a \$15 chance with TAB, with Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) winner Coolangatta (Written Tycoon) the solid \$4.60 favourite.



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Shalatin bids to make Slipper history

Shalatin (Shalaa) will be bidding to become the first maiden winner of the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) in more than 50 years when he tackles the feature race at Rosehill tomorrow. The Joe Pride-trained colt managed to book his spot for the race in November when narrowly beaten by current Golden Slipper second favourite Sejardan (Sebring) in the \$1 million Golden Gift (1100m). Since that effort, Shalatin is yet to reproduce that form but Pride feels he has had excuses, notably when needing the outing in the Silver Slipper Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m), while he failed to handle the heavy conditions when finishing a respectable third in the Todman Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). "Because I didn't need to have him ready for the early runs, I had him further behind in fitness than what I would have if I was coming in having to win one before the big one," Pride said. "But I just knew I didn't, so it took the pressure off. When you've got to run a peak to get into a race, it's sometimes a problem then peaking again. I think he is ready to peak on Saturday. I just hope he gets a track that he can get good traction on."

Jacquinet to sport shades

Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr will race their colt Jacquinet (Rubick) in blinkers in tomorrow's Golden Slipper in order to try and eke out more improvement. Hugh Bowman will ride the son of Rubick (Encosta De Lago), who was last seen finishing third in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m). "I'm trying to find a length," Price told Racing.com. "I think he's genuine without them and if he can get that

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push with them. I didn't want to think about them after the Slipper if I didn't use them." A \$14 chance in the market, Jacquinet drew barrier 11 at Tuesday's draw. "He's drawn barrier eight if the emergencies don't get a run, so he's going to midfield or rear thereof," Price said. "I think the track is a Soft 5 ... and if that's the case and there is a strong finisher in the Slipper, which there can be, he'll be a strong finisher. I have been aware it's his first preparation ... but his overall demeanour as a colt has been fantastic and he's thrived. He freshens up with a little break which we have had a couple little breaks. I think his preparation leading into the Slipper has been fantastic."

Fogden eyes Group 1 breakthrough

Undefeated colt Best Of Bordeaux (Snitzel) will bid to provide trainer Kacy Fogden with a first Group 1 victory when he lines up in the Golden Slipper at Rosehill tomorrow. Fogden had been exclusively part of the Aquis Farm team since its inception in 2015, before deciding to take out her own licence in 2019 and opening up to outside ownership in December 2020. The Kiwi expat is pleased with her colt, who races in the silks of Aquis supremo Tony Fung, ahead of the \$5 million race for two-year-olds after

a winning effort in a barrier trial at Warwick Farm last week. "He's super," Fogden told Racing.com. "He came through that trial really well last week. His work on Tuesday was nice. He's very bright and very well in himself, I'm very happy." Best Of Bordeaux has virtually made all in his two wins to date - on debut in the Canonbury Stakes before backing up in the Silver Slipper three weeks later - but Fogden is adamant that he is far more versatile than that. "I think everybody was quick to brand him after that Canonbury win where he went straight to the front, and he got marked as a simple, front-running horse with a lot of speed, so that's definitely not the case with him, a lot of his gallops and his work, he goes in behind horses and settles well," Fogden said.

Godolphin colt shoots for stars

James Cummings is hoping that multiple stakes winner Paulele (Dawn Approach) can gain a valuable maiden Group 1 success despite having the outside draw in tomorrow's The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) at Rosehill. The Godolphin-owned colt has been kept fresh since his first-up win in the Eskimo Prince Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Randwick on February 5 and Cummings believes that is a huge positive to his chances. "He will be the widest of 14 runners here which is a shame from that (1100-metre) shut, but the horse is feeling very good," Cummings said. "We have kept him very fresh since winning the Eskimo Prince. He beat Converge into third place that day and Hilal in behind him and there has been nothing wrong with that form. We'd like to think he's got that potential to convert all of this good form that he's got on his resume already into a Group 1 performance."

Big day for the Cummings team

As well as Paulele in The Galaxy, Godolphin have several other runners in contention for stakes honours in what is a big Saturday for trainer James Cummings. For the first time since his second in the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m), Anamoe (Street Boss) steps up to 2000 metres in the Rosehill Guineas (Gr 1, 2000m) after running on strongly to finish second in the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) last time out. James McDonald has been booked and the pair will jump from barrier nine. "Anyone watching the Randwick Guineas would have thought he would be beautifully suited up to 2000 metres," Cummings told Racing.com. "He's got a brilliant turn-of-foot so he could have been competitive in either the Rosehill Guineas or the George Ryder (Stakes). Since resuming from a spell his three performances suggest the 2000 metres is perfect." Cummings also saddles up Colette (Hallowed Crown) in the George Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m), another to be ridden by McDonald. "The prospect of having the sting out of the ground suits her," Cummings said. "She is third-up with three weeks since that rather lacklustre finish in the Chipping Norton and is ready to run well. Her Golden Eagle victory affirms her penchant for the course." Meanwhile, Ojai (Exceed And Excel) will head for the Golden Slipper Stakes and Cascadian (New Approach) will tackle the \$5 million All-Star Mile (1600m) at Flemington. "It's been a target race, fourth-up and he's ready to fire, but there's certainly no shortage of depth in the race," Cummings said of Cascadian. "It's his pet trip, he's on the seven-day back-up and he's got the strength of that run last week under his belt."

Track conditions key for Waller's Ryder pair

Chris Waller will be targeting an eighth win in the George Ryder Stakes if he runs Kolding (Ocean Park) and Hungry Heart (Frankel) in tomorrow's Group 1 contest, but has admitted that their participation hinges on the state of the Rosehill track. With both runners effective on better ground, Waller is hoping the surface can improve from its Heavy 8 rating before post-time. "Her and Kolding, the better the

track the better they will run," Waller said. "I'm hoping it's the better side of soft for both of them because they both showed signs of improvement last start." Hungry Heart was last seen finishing a solid first-up fourth to Think It Over (So You Think) in the Apollo Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) on February 12, while Kolding was comfortably beaten in the Apollo first-up but was then fourth to Forbidden Love (All Too Hard) on a Heavy 9 track in the Canterbury Stakes (Gr 1, 1300m) on March 5. "Hungry Heart, her first-up run was terrific. She just hasn't been suited with all the wet weather and subsequently we have looked after her and kept her at home. But she is ready to race," Waller said. "(Kolding's) run last start was very good on an unsuitable track so he can certainly be a top three chance, provided the track continues to improve."

Mo'unga returns to Sydney

Eye-catching Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) second Mo'unga (Savabeel) will make a return to Sydney this weekend as he lines up in the George Ryder Stakes tomorrow. The son of Savabeel (Zabeel) has been enjoying the sunshine on his back, according to trainer Annabel Neasham. "He's actually still down here making use of the drier tracks," Neasham told Racing.com. "He had a gallop Tuesday morning and he'll head back up Wednesday night. He will handle a wet track but I am pleased to hear from Todd (Pollard), my assistant, the sun is out today and yesterday so hopefully it gets back to the soft range. If it does, I think he is a very good chance. He's as well as we've had him, I think." Mo'unga has drawn barrier four under Tommy Berry and is currently the \$4.20 favourite in the market. "His work has been super, he hasn't always been the best track worker," Neasham admitted. "He did a piece with Zaaki on Saturday and was very good. I can't fault him, he looks amazing in the coat and the best I have had him looking and working so hopefully that translates."

Litt: Profondo can bounce back in Guineas

Group 1 winner Profondo (Deep Impact) will bid to get his autumn campaign back on the right track when he takes on rivals Anamoe and

Converge (Frankel) in tomorrow's Rosehill Guineas. The son of Deep Impact (Sunday Silence) endured a torrid run when unplaced last time out in the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) but Litt feels the signs are positive for an instant rebound with his Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) winner. The colt will be ridden by Hugh Bowman for the first time tomorrow. "Hugh Bowman has had a couple of rides on the horse and he's happy with him and we're happy with him at home," Litt said. "We're not too worried about the competition on Saturday, it is what it is. They're all good horses and they're all hard to beat. We're hoping to get the driest possible track for the horse because that's what we think he prefers." Profondo also holds nominations for the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) on April 2 and the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) a week later, but Litt knows the three-year-old has to pass tomorrow's test before concentrating on anything else. "I'd love to think he could run in a Derby and a Queen Elizabeth," Litt said. "But we can't think that far ahead. We really need to get through Saturday, concentrate on that and then see how we go moving forward."

Elleegant holds all the aces in Ranvet

Chris Waller is confident that a small field in tomorrow's Ranvet Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) will be no negative to the winning chances of his star mare Verry Elleegant (Zed). There was a time when a small field would have given the trainer sleepless nights, but he said she is now more the finished article and expects her to justify the \$1.35 favouritism in the market. "The prospect of a small field doesn't worry me anymore," Waller said. "Seeing her relax as well as she did in the Melbourne Cup was a good indication of a furnished racehorse. From barrier four (in the Ranvet), it gives James (McDonald) the option to be outside the leader or back last, just depending on speed. Her only downfall is when she gets cluttered up down on the fence so we'll try and avoid that if we can, but at the same time, it's the shortest way home if we need to. She has trained on well and the track conditions are not a problem, good tracks or heavy tracks, she seems to be effective."

Icebath hoping to cash in on late Mile call-up

After receiving a late call-up for tomorrow's All-Star Mile (1600m) after the withdrawal of Espiona (Extreme Choice) earlier this month, Brad Widdup is hoping that Icebath (Sacred Falls) can make the most of her opportunity in this year's \$5 million feature at Flemington. The daughter of Sacred Falls (O'Reilly) finished a narrow second in the Cantala Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at the track last spring, a week after having won the \$2 million The Invitation (1400m) at Randwick. With two unplaced efforts so far this preparation, Widdup is confident she can get back to something like her best tomorrow. "It's happened in the past with her, she only snuck in the Golden Eagle and she only snuck in the Doncaster and she gave them a real good shake so let's hope we're third time lucky," Widdup told Racing.com. "We're very happy to get in the race and I'm sure she's there to give it a shake. After she went terrific in the Cantala it was always on the radar but we just had to get in the race, it has been a little bit tricky but she snuck in there. She seems to be improving third up, obviously it's a solid test for her going down there. I think it's a pretty good race, I think they've done a great job with the field that they've got so she's going to have to be at her best and let's hope that she can be."

Inspirational Girl 'tip top' for Mile task

The Danny O'Brien-trained Inspirational Girl (Reliable Man) has made the necessary improvement to be considered a real threat in tomorrow's All-Star Mile, according to jockey Damian Lane. The jockey produced the daughter of Reliable Man (Dalakhani)

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to win the Blamey Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) at Flemington a fortnight ago, beating race favourite Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux) to earn her place in this year's line-up. The switch from the set-weights-plus-penalties conditions of the Blamey Stakes to standard weight-for-age in the All-Star Mile now means Zaaki meets Inspirational Girl four kilograms better in at the weights, but Lane feels she has improved from that contest. "I galloped her at Barwon Heads on Tuesday morning and I couldn't be happier with where she is at, she's in a really good frame of mind and seems in tip-top order," Lane told Racing.com. "She has really taken some good improvement from the Blamey run and I'm looking forward to the race on Saturday."

Moody worried about Lightsaber in Mile

Lightsaber (Zoustar) will get a second chance to grab a big Flemington pot this campaign when he tackles the All-Star Mile tomorrow. However, trainer Peter Moody is worried about how much is left in the tank for the son of Zoustar (Northern Meteor) after three runs this preparation, two at Group 1 level. After resuming well with a fourth-placed finish in the Australia Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Moonee Valley in January, Lightsaber then finished 11th in the CF Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield on February 12, before being scratched at the barrier stage in the CS Hayes Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Flemington the following week. A brilliant second to Hitotsu (Maurice) in the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) a fortnight ago gave the three-year-old a wildcard entry into Saturday's \$5 million feature. "It took him a few days to get over that hard run in the Guineas, but he seems to have bounced back OK, so we're happy to be there," Moody said. "That run at Caulfield and then missing the CS Hayes didn't help his preparation into the Guineas which was his target race, but now we've got that \$5 million carrot in front of us. The horse has had that hard, tough run, but it's a fine line of wishing he had that hard, tough run to bring him on fitness wise, but at the same time hoping it hasn't flattened him. He seems good at home, so we'll find out on Saturday."

Sierra Sue barrier makes it 'very difficult'

Trent Busuttin is under no illusions as to the task that Sierra Sue (Darci Brahma) faces after drawing barrier 13 in tomorrow's All-Star Mile at Flemington and feels she will need to be at her very best to be in with a shout. "Obviously the barrier makes it very, very difficult," Busuttin, who trains in partnership with Natalie Young, told Racing.com. "We were towards the end of the draw when there was only three left, it was 3, 13, or 15, and the representative drew out 13. Whichever way you look at it, it's certainly made her task very difficult." Coming into the race on the back of her second Group 1 win in the Futurity Stakes, Busuttin admits that the 1600 metres may be a query. "I would imagine she'll be going back from that draw and trying to ride for a bit of luck, which is a query at the 1600 metres," Busuttin said. "I thought she'd get 1600 metres if we got a soft barrier and could put her to sleep, but it looks like a pretty hot tempo on speed, if we push forward, we're going to be working and wide, if we go back and around, we have to work at some stage. She's perfect, three weeks in between runs we couldn't be any happier."

De Kock happy with King Magnus draw

One trainer that is happy with the outcome of the All-Star Mile barrier draw was Mathew de Kock after King Magnus (Magnus) drew barrier five. The Cranbourne Cup (Listed, 1600m) winner is rated an \$81 chance in the market and only made the field after the last-minute withdrawal of star Kiwi mare Probabeel (Savabeel), who has been retired due to injury. "If he runs in the top half, we will be ecstatic," De Kock, who trains in partnership with Robbie Griffiths, told Racing.com. "He is going to need all the assistance he can get because it's a stellar edition of the field with ten Group 1 winners. Hopefully we can get a nice trail in and we can see his best performance. We've been happy with him, he's had two runs leading into Saturday's event and he is going to be pretty well at peak fitness, so all systems go."

Tofane team try different tactics

Four-time Group 1 winner Tofane (Ocean Park) is set to be ridden more conservatively in tomorrow's All-Star Mile in order to see out the 1600 metres strongly. The daughter of Ocean Park (Thorn Park) has recorded all her victories to date over the 1400-metre distance but did finish fourth behind Incentivise (Shamus Award) in the Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and runner-up to I'm Thunderstruck (Shocking) in the Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) last spring. "I think she has drawn nicely in the All-Star Mile, of course you need luck no matter what barrier you have got," trainer Mike Moroney told Racing.com. "But I can just see there's a couple that go forward inside of her (Streets of Avalon and Mr Brightside) and there's three that can go forward outside of her (Callsign Mav, Lightsaber and Zaaki), so she can just go with the wave and then slot in where she can. I'm sure that's how the race will pan out so from that draw she can go either way, forward or get in with cover. My first thought is that we'd take a bit of a sit because she's got to relax to get the mile." Tofane will be ridden by Jamie Mott and the pair will jump from barrier seven.

McEvoy's try to revive Group 1 winner

Expectations were understandably high for the previously Lindsay Park-trained Cape Of Good Hope (Galileo) after he came out of quarantine following his import from Europe to win the Caulfield Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) in October 2019. However, it has not been plain sailing since, with the son of Galileo (Sadler's Wells) about to embark on a new campaign after 18 months on the sidelines, racing just seven times since that Group 1 success, and now in the care of Tony and Calvin McEvoy. "We got a phone call out of the blue," Calvin McEvoy said. "Some of the original owners bought the other owners out and gave him six months off and thought they would like to give him one more opportunity. We were very happy to try, and the general consensus was whether the horse was willing and wanted to race and what he's shown us has been really

good. He's been off the scene for a very long time, and he'll certainly improve off what he does but he's had a couple of trials, his gallops have been good, and it will be nice to see him back at the races."

Series final on Begg's mind

Grahame Begg is confident that Gracias Amigo (God's Own) can make his presence felt in the Country Mile Series Final (1600m) at Flemington tomorrow if he handles the extra weight on his back. The trainer had picked out the Wangaratta heat on March 5 to qualify the son of God's Own (Redoute's Choice), but as luck would have it, the meeting was washed out due to heavy rain. The heat was then held over until March 9 at Sandown, a track the gelding had previously shown a slight disliking for, but he ended up running out a comfortable winner that day. "He's not advantaged this week at the weights, he's gone up to 60 kilograms, but it's a pretty condensed weight scale," Begg said. "But he's had a good week since his win. He's drawn in ten if the emergencies don't get a run. He likes a bit of room in his races, so hopefully he can even be three-wide with a bit of cover, that should be alright. But he's had a good week since his win."

Underdog Street Parade aims to surprise

He may be a \$12 underdog for tomorrow's Perth Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Ascot, but trainer Russell Stewart feels that Street Parade (Lucky Street) has a good chance of being in the shake-up. The son of Lucky Street (Oratorio) got off to an ideal start by winning on debut in November and has since finished third three times, including in the Magic Millions WA 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) at Pinjarra on February 6. "I was a bit surprised when markets opened, I thought he must have lost a leg," Stewart told The Races WA. "I thought he would be around half his current quote. He's a real tradesman and hasn't finished outside the first four. I thought he was unlucky not to win the Magic Millions and he hasn't copped the best barrier draws. From an improved barrier and the addition of visors, I'm sure he'll acquit himself well."

Melham provides injury timeline

Group 1-winning jockey Ben Melham is hopeful of returning in six weeks after having surgery on his shoulder. The hoop suffered a broken collarbone and shoulder blade after a fall at Morphettville on Monday. "Had a plate and screws fitted to my collarbone. (Six week) injury. Can't speed healing in Scapula fractures," Melham tweeted. "Wait and see for them to heal on their own. Absolutely shattered to ruin my momentum. Appreciate all support I've received thus far from owners and trainers. Start physio ASAP."

NEW ZEALAND

Oaks contender Self Obsession to offer Richards winning send off



Self Obsession

In-form filly Self Obsession (Shocking) will be bidding to give Jamie Richards a timely send off when she lines up in the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) at Trentham tomorrow. Richards will take to the Hong Kong training ranks in May, where the filly's owner David Price is a resident. "Hopefully, the door might stay ajar for me up there. David has a very unique business and buys a lot of yearlings to then sell to Hong Kong if they are good enough to go," Richards said. Self Obsession, who was also bred by Price, has won the Royal Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m), the David & Karyn Ellis Fillies' Classic (Gr 2, 2000m) and the Lowland Stakes (Gr 2, 2100m) at her last three appearances and is currently the \$2.80 favourite for the Classic. "The trip will suit her, she's by Shocking and a genuine stayer suited to a big, roomy track. She has a few things in her corner and is holding her form really well," Richards said.

Solid pace key to Glory's chances

Trainers Stephen Autridge and Kris Shailer will be hoping for a strongly-run race in tomorrow's New Zealand Oaks at Trentham in order to give Glory Bound (Tavistock) her best chance of winning. The training partnership has been satisfied with the daughter of Tavistock's (Montjeu) lead-up performances and her condition ahead of the Classic. "Her form is sound, her sectionals have all been good in her races and we just want the race to be run at a good tempo," Autridge said. Currently an \$11 chance for the Group 1 contest, Glory Bound was a close second behind tomorrow's favourite Self Obsession two runs back in the David & Karyn Ellis Fillies' Classic. "That day, they went three-quarter pace and sprinted home and she was doing her best and matched strides with the other one, but couldn't get her head in front," Autridge said. "What we are wanting is a genuinely run mile-and-a-half race. She's as good as we can have her and believe in the last four or five days she has really come right so we're hoping for a good run in transit."

Auckland Cup placegetters retired

Last Sunday's Auckland Cup (Gr 2, 3200m) placegetters, Concert Hall (Savabeel) and Sound (Lando), will now be retired after finishing second and third respectively behind the winner Uareastar (Jakkalberry). Retirement had been sounded for seven-year-old mare Concert Hall and nine-year-old entire Sound, and stud careers now beckon for both. The Roger James and Robert Wellwood-trained Concert Hall retires as the winner of 11 races. "We were all keen to see her go out on such a strong note – just not quite on top, but she still put in an absolutely top effort," Wellwood said. "We certainly didn't want to be greedy and try and go back to the well later in the autumn."

She has had a long prep and been very genuine and been such a good mare for us. We are so glad to see her retire a sound and happy horse." Meanwhile, the three-time Group 2-winning Sound won AU\$1.8 million in prize-money, with nine wins and 13 placings from 48 starts for trainers Michael Moroney and Pam Gerard. "Let's hope he can find a stud in New Zealand now because he deserves a chance and is a gorgeous horse, he has a good temperament and has a lot going his way," Moroney said.

ASIA

HK: Barrier challenge for Purton

Zac Purton believes California Spangle (Starspangledbanner) will have to produce a monumental performance to win the Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) at Sha Tin on Sunday after drawing barrier ten. Chasing a second Derby victory, Purton concedes he faces a daunting task to succeed on the front-running galloper, while California Spangle's trainer Tony Cruz remains committed to vying for the lead with the Hong Kong Classic Cup (Listed, 1800m) winner. "I don't think ten is a great barrier for us at all. Unfortunately, we have a number of speedrunners drawn inside us who are no doubt going to try and hold their positions," Purton said. "In the Derby everyone gets a little bit of a rush of blood and

they are probably a little bit more positive early than maybe they would be otherwise. But our horse has got an established racing pattern, so we have to use his speed and hopefully we can get across without making too much use of him. I have just got to hope that the other riders ride their horses sensibly to give their horses a chance to win the race. My horse is not a sit-and-sprint-type horse, he likes to get into his rhythm and roll along. If he can pull it off it's going to be a monumental performance."

HK: Yiu chases first Derby crown

Ricky Yiu will saddle just his sixth and seventh runners in the Hong Kong Derby since first contesting the race with Multi-Star (Grosvenor) in 1998. Yiu has high hopes on S J Tourbillon (Galileo) developing into a quality performer in Hong Kong, especially now with five runs under his belt after drastically turning his form around last start to finish within a length of the winner. "His form in England showed he was more of a staying type, so he's had a few runs in Hong Kong and his last run was quite convincing – we changed tactics and settled him more forward; from there he was more focused all of the way through and he was only beaten by a small margin," Yiu said. Mr Ascendency (The Gurkha) will be Yiu's other runner, with The Gurkha (Galileo) gelding having raced three times in Hong Kong, closing for fourth two starts ago, before fading to near last in the HK\$12 million Hong Kong Classic Cup. Luke Ferraris takes the reins for the second time this weekend alongside his stablemate in barrier 11. "He's showing a bit, it took him a few runs, but the only concern is whether he will get the trip," Yiu said. "That was a really good run (two starts ago), he's coming along and he's showing good progress."



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SGP: Le Grange disappointed with draw

Trainer Ricardo Le Grange expressed disappointment at the outside draw for sprinter-miler Rocket Star (Star Witness) but still expects a good run from him in the lead-up towards his Kranji Mile (Listed, 1600m) target. After recovering from a bleed, the talented five-year-old son of Star Witness (Starcraft) ran a solid first-up third in a Class 2 race last month. Inside the concluding stages, he couldn't quite match strides with the unbeaten Lim's Kosciuszko (Kermadec), who he will likely run into again in the first feature race of the season on May 21. The Paolo Mendoza-owned Rocket Star has kept improving, but drawing the outermost barrier in 13 for tomorrow's \$100,000 Class 1 race over the 1200 metres has been a bitter pill to swallow. "What more can I say? I'm disappointed with the outside barrier, but the draw is the draw," Le Grange said. "He has improved nicely from his first-up run. I'll leave it to (jockey) Manoel (Nunes), he is the pilot, and he knows what he is doing. He will need a bit of luck from that draw but bearing

in mind that his main objective is the Kranji Mile, this run will bring him on."

INTERNATIONAL

US: More Than Ready colt tops Ocala Sale

A colt by More Than Ready (Southern Halo) has topped the Ocala Breeders' Sales March Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale when he was purchased for US\$1.2 million (approx. AU\$1.63 million) by Kaleem Shah. "There are always a few select horses everybody seems to be on every year, and this year was no different. Most of the big players were there; I was just fortunate to get these horses," Shah said on Wednesday evening. The cumulative aggregate figures for the sale rose 30.7 per cent as 375 horses from 431 went through the ring for final figures of US\$49,656,000 (approx. AU\$67.6 million) compared to 2021, when 325 horses changed hands of the 389 offered for receipts of \$37,970,000. The average of US\$132,416 (approx. AU\$180,262) was up 13.3 per cent over the 2021 average of US\$116,831, while the US\$75,000 (approx. AU\$102,000) median

jumped 25 per cent compared to last year's US\$60,000. The 56 horses that went unsold over the two days represent an RNA rate of 13 per cent. Last year, 73 horses failed to meet their reserve to represent an RNA rate of 16.4 per cent.

US: Shadwell to sell two American studs

Two divisions of Shadwell Farm, Shadayid Stud and Erhaab Stud, are being sold as part of the restructuring of Shadwell Farm. The two farms, brokered by Justice Real Estate, are priced at US\$17.75 million (approx. AU\$24.16 million) and US\$12 million (approx. AU\$16.34 million), respectively. These farms are separate from the original main division where Shadwell will continue to raise thoroughbreds, Justice Real Estate said in a release. Shadwell, a worldwide racing and breeding operation, announced in September it would downsize following the death of its owner Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum last March. This transition has included relocating some stallions and selling a substantial number of its racing and breeding stock.

THE WEEK IN ROWE-VIEW

Every Friday in ANZ, lead reporter Tim Rowe delivers his thoughts on the week that's been, discussing the prevalent issues in racing and stories beyond the headlines

Many commercial breeders are cashed up after continued record yearling sales and the majority of pinhookers have been so far well-rewarded in the rising market in 2022.

With that in mind, how many breeders will choose to hold onto more of their foals for the yearling sales who normally would take drafts to the Magic Millions and Inglis weanling sales,

an important cash flow generator which helps pay the service fees due from the previous year's breeding season?

Will some breeders contemplate swimming against the tide and offer commercial weanlings to the market in the hope of a windfall given the strong possibility that demand could outstrip supply?

Entries for the Inglis Australian Weanling Sale officially close today, as do entries for the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale, while nominations for the Great Southern sale close on April 29.

Entries for the New Zealand Bloodstock National Weanling Sale, to be held on June 17, close on April 14.



\$1 million Savabeel ex Chandelier colt

In this column last week, Cambridge Stud's Henry Plumpton and Rich Hill Stud's John Thompson said that, in their opinion, on balance, the NZB Karaka Yearling Sale should return to its late January slot next year.

However, we hear that the view is not shared by all Kiwi vendors, many appreciating this year's March date because they enjoyed the luxury of a Christmas break for the first time.

No matter what decision NZB and the vendors make, next year's sale probably won't be a true reflection, as the international buying bench returning to Karaka is sure to boost the figures.

The argument of getting a crack at the money early in the season, just weeks after the Magic Millions on the Gold Coast, I think is a compelling one.

It might not be as vital in a booming market, particularly with locked out internationals flocking to New Zealand next year, but if there is a downturn in demand, whatever the triggers for it may be, then a sale's placement could have a significant impact on the end results.

We'll continue to follow the developments from across the Tasman.

Adelaide trainer Will Clarken is already plotting a return to Dubai for next year's carnival just days after his two horses began their long journey back to Australia.

Seven-year-old gelding Parsifal (Darci Brahma) raced three times for Clarken at Meydan, finishing third in the Blue Point Sprint (Gr 2, 1000m) on February 18 as well as finishing sixth twice at stakes level over 1200 metres, either side of his placing.

Five-year-old stablemate He's A Balter (Spirit Of Boom) raced twice in the United Arab Emirates for a second over 1200 metres and a fourth in the Blue Point Sprint, finishing a neck behind Parsifal.

"They are on the way back home now but it will take a little while to get back here through



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quarantine and we're in no rush. They're going to end up (racing) in the back-end of the spring," the trainer said from the Magic Millions Adelaide sale this week.

"They weren't the highest-quality horses in our yard to go over there, so there's no real grand final for them. They wouldn't have been good enough for a Goodwood."

Clarcken intends to take a younger team to Dubai in 2023.

"I've got a couple of theories that I've come back with. I think that our two-and-a-half-year-olds will be able to be competitive with their three-year-olds when we get over there, so we'll have a go at that next year," he said.

Cornerstone Stud stallion Sir Prancealot (Tamayuz) will return to the South Australian farm in 2022.

Sam Pritchard-Gordon, who was promoted to general manager earlier this year to allow co-owner Sam Hayes to pursue a real estate business venture, confirmed that the US shuttler would be back later this year for a sixth straight southern hemisphere season.

He will stand alongside Valencia (Fastnet Rock).

"He had runners in the two-year-old stakes race (Cinderella Stakes) and one in the Adelaide Guineas (on Monday at Morphettville)," Pritchard-Gordon said.

"He only had 38 yearlings entering into the stables from his first crop, so we weren't expecting big announcements from that crop, but from his second crop there is a bit of movement and I am looking forward to seeing what happens as they develop."

Cornerstone Stud enjoyed a successful Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling Sale, the Barossa Valley farm's draft of 27 horses raking in \$2.072 million to see it crowned leading vendor by aggregate.

The best evidence that advertising works is when it creates discussion and that was the case on Monday when Newgate Farm announced that Tiger Of Malay, the Group 2-winning son of Extreme Choice, would stand for a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST) later this year.

The front page advertisement in ANZ's Monday edition had breeders, rival studmasters and nominations team members discussing the merits of the stallion and his fee, some even suggesting, if they owned him, they would have stood him for more.

Other industry figures questioned how Henry Field and the Newgate team would

handle having so many new stallions on the roster, with Tiger Of Malay standing alongside fellow newcomers Wild Ruler (Snitzel), Stay Inside (Extreme Choice) and Profiteer (Capitalist) whose fee has also been set at \$16,500.

Decisions about fellow Newgate-controlled Group 1-winning colts In The Congo (Snitzel) and Artorius (Flying Artie) have so far not been announced, although Royal Ascot was touted for the latter by co-trainer Sam Freedman earlier this week.

Field and co, though, only need to look back to 2017 when Newgate did launch four stallions - Extreme Choice, Flying Artie, Capitalist and Winning Rupert - and that huge investment has thus far paid off handsomely for the stud and its supporters.

I now know why Magic Millions has David Chester "opening the batting" at its respective sales. The long-time auctioneer is nothing if not punctual, and he expects others to be the same. I'll never again dare suggest I'll be late to a pre-arranged dinner engagement!

David's company was, of course, worth the effort and his years of experience is borne out when playing host.

He does it well, and the early finishes are appreciated, even if others lead you astray when attempting to get home at a reasonable sale-eve time.

1-winning graduate in May 2020 through Robert Sangster Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) heroine Bella Vella (Commands), tomorrow the platform could be celebrating a Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) winner among its ranks when She's Extreme (Extreme Choice) bids for victory in the world's richest juvenile race.

The filly, who in winning last Saturday's Magic Night Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) earns ANZ Bloodstock News' Maiden of the Week status, was a \$32,500 weanling purchase for One Plus Investments, before she was resold through the Willow Park draft for \$275,000 at the next year's Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale.

Offered on the Inglis Digital platform by Aquis Farm, who at the time were in a period of restructuring, the filly is indicative of the opportunities that now present itself in the bimonthly auctions.

Part of the group who purchased the filly as

a weanling was Coolmore's Colm Santry, whose constant surveillance of the Inglis Digital catalogues has brought dividends.

"We're always looking to find nice horses," Santry told ANZ Bloodstock News. "It was myself and Michael Kerwin who purchased her as a weanling online and we onsold her at Easter and obviously Extreme Choice came up and exposed himself in a big way."

"She was such a nice foal and that's why we bought her. Michael Kerwin saw her at Emirates Park and he rang me and said 'we'll buy her' and then we found her online, and it was upwards from there."

What transpired over the following nine months after Santry and Kerwin snapped up the bargain-priced filly on Inglis Digital, could only be described as the perfect storm for her resale as a yearling in April.

Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt)

Inglis Digital has surely been one of the most successful introductions to the Australian bloodstock market in recent years. Having launched in May 2017, the platform has gone from humble beginnings in achieving a clearance rate of 29 per cent and gross receipts of \$285,000 for its inaugural catalogue offered, to grossing over \$6 million in 2021's June (Late) auction.

But it's the corresponding June (Late) sale a year earlier that could be the opening chapter of the online auction's most successful story to date.

While Inglis Digital saw its first Group

became an instant phenomenon, with Stay Inside's Golden Slipper victory for the stallion just a fortnight before the sale fresh in the minds of Easter buyers, the Newgate Stud sire's only offering at Australia's preeminent yearling sale became a must-have commodity.

Combine that with the success of Ruru (So You Think), She's Extreme's half-sister and first foal of her Group 2-placed dam Keysbrook (So Secret) that sold for \$250,000, and her appeal broadens further.

A then three-year-old Ruru had three wins to her name in Queensland by the time of the Inglis Easter sale, before running eighth in the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) in June.

"She was just a nice, well-bred filly. She had a So You Think filly the year before that which we really liked and it went into the Chris Waller stable, so we knew of her. She ran in the Queensland Oaks so the pedigree got a bit of an upgrade with her and Extreme Choice was going well at the time," Santry added.

"We couldn't have wished for a better outcome, which doesn't happen that often ... Anthony loved her. She looked like a red-hot two-year-old type, and that was it."

She's Extreme, who races in the colours of Dorrington Farm's Robert Crabtree, secured her ballot-free berth in this year's Golden Slipper with a one-and-a-half-length win over Magic Carpet (Lonhro) in last Saturday's Magic Night Stakes to break her maiden at her third appearance, having finished runner-up in the Sweet Embrace

Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) to Fireburn (Rebel Dane) the start prior.

Trainer Anthony Cummings will be targeting his first win in the Golden Slipper, with She's Extreme his first contender since the late withdrawal of the rearing Smart Missile (Fastnet Rock) from the Slipper field at the barriers, 11 years ago.

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EYE IN THE SKY

Drying Rosehill track sees two stand out from the field in Golden Slipper

Tomorrow's Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) meeting will again be run on rain-affected ground, but hopefully, with no further weather forecast, the track could creep into the soft range and therefore I'm focusing on two runners that will benefit from a good tempo and have each drawn well enough to get the right runs in the race.

Gary Portelli's colt Sejardan (2 c Sebring - Miss Amajardan by Hinchinbrook) drew gate five and is one of the strongest finishers in the race. Jockey Jason Collett has been aboard him for all of the colt's three wins and the camp are confident he will not be getting too far back, now that he has finally drawn well.

She's Extreme (2 f Extreme Choice - Keysbrook by So Secret) has a great sense of timing, having secured the final position in the field after winning the last lead-up race, the Magic Night Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Rosehill last Saturday.

Despite getting quite buzzed up in the parade ring, the Anthony Cummings-trained filly was very strong over the final furlong and ran an overall time six lengths quicker than the

colts and geldings in the Pago Pago Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m).

More rain would really strengthen her prospects of providing Newgate sire Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt) with a back-to-back winner in the Slipper after Stay Inside took the spoils last year.

There is no shortage of pace in the race and

the favourite Coolangatta (2 f Written Tycoon - Piping Hot by More Than Ready), although drawn barrier 11, has good tactical speed to position well on settling. The big concern will be if the track remains heavy, as she has been dodging the rain-affected tracks in the lead up and has not raced since her victory in the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) at the Gold Coast on January 15.

Of the earlier runners on the card, Mazu (3 g Maurice - Chatelaine by Flying Spur) is impossible to go past in Race 2, the Darby Munro Stakes (Listed, 1200m).

Since being gelded after winning the Brian Crowley Stakes (Listed, 1200m) in October at Randwick, the Peter and Paul Snowden-trained three-year-old has returned a much more furnished horse, winning all three of his races and earning rave reviews from his trainers and regular jockey Sam Clipperton.

In the following race, I feel Clipperton could land an early double legging up on UK import Surefire (4 g Fastnet Rock - Modesta by Sadler's Wells) in the Queen's Cup (Gr 3, 2400m).

A winner at Royal Ascot last year, the Juddmonte-raced gelding got under the guard

of trial watchers when winning first up in Australia three weeks ago at Randwick at a starting price of \$17.

On the Heavy 10 rated track, Surefire rounded up his rivals to win impressively and he appears to have more upside than his opponents on Saturday, off his current rating of 84.

Now trained at Rosehill by Chris Waller, the import had already won over 2400 metres in the UK and will have the luxury of carrying the minimum weight of 53 kilograms.

After weeks of rain and a potential flood threat, Warwick Farm had recovered sufficiently to stage grass trials on a Heavy 8 surface last Monday.

Pantonario (2 f Not A Single Doubt - Rhodamine by Success Express) won her 813-metre trial in good style after racing wide throughout. Partnered by James McDonald, the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained filly let down to win comfortably in one of the slower times at this distance, but was very pleasing to the eye.

She would have to rate as one of the better maiden two-year-old fillies around, having been placed behind three subsequent Golden Slipper finalists at each of her three runs from early October to late January.

Pantonario had been a pace-setter at each race appearance, but Monday's trial would suggest the training duo have taught her to race more patiently and conserve energy.

Unraced filly Tintookie (2 f Winning Rupert - Lady Marionette by Dylan Thomas) was noted as closing off really well into second place. She jumped well, but was eased back towards the rear before making a good run home behind the winner Pantonario.

Local trainer Bjorn Baker would be happy with the performance of his two-year-old filly Ginger's Gal (2 f Exceed and Excel - Cerberus Gal by General Nediym) who won the following trial.

She won both her trials in October and now looks ready for the races on the strength of her all-the-way win on Monday. Ginger's Gal showed good pace out of the gates to lead and extended nicely when asked in the straight, displaying a good action in the heavy ground. Her two previous wins were on a good surface, so it would seem the ground either way is no issue with her.

Although this Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained filly may not have made it into the final Slipper field on Saturday, after three third-place finishes in hot company, Pantonario is certainly one to keep a close eye on. A \$750,000 purchase for her trainers and Kestrel Thoroughbreds, the daughter of Not A Single Doubt was a big pinhook success for Suman Hedge Bloodstock and Grant Bloodstock, who picked her up for \$280,000 from the Lauriston Thoroughbred Farm draft at the Inglis Australian Weanling Sale. The filly is the fourth live foal out of Success Express (Hold Your Peace) mare Rhodamine, who has already produced the Group 2-placed Legend Of Condor (Not A Single Doubt), while her final foal, a colt from the final crop of Not A Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice), sold to Coolmore for \$1.1 million at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale in January.

The distances of the sprint trials changed several times as the session progressed, but the Waterhouse and Bott-trained Gulf Of Lion (2 g Thronum - Rosa Perlato by Encosta De Lago) ran about the quickest of the morning, covering the 810 metres in 48.28 seconds.

The unraced two-year-old gelding was nicely positioned early on before extending well when let down over the final furlong and put a good margin on all his rivals.

Gulf Of Lion looked a lot sharper on Monday than his first trial three weeks ago when finishing midfield after a wide trip.

Another that caught my eye was the Torryburn-raced three-year-old gelding Jamesonheart (3 g Deep Field - Alecia Beth by Street Cry).

Trained at the track by Ciaran Maher and David Eustace, the unraced bay was ridden by Jason Collett at his second trial and there seemed to be real intent to bury him back in the field, as finished in sixth position, five lengths from the winner Press Ahead (Dream Ahead).

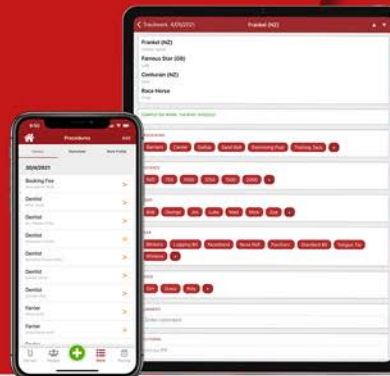
This contrasted with his debut trial a month earlier at the same track, when apprentice-ridden and was taken to control the trial from the front in the quickest time of the morning over 801 metres, 47.22 seconds.

Having passed in at the Inglis Easter sale in 2020 and retained to race by Torryburn, I like what I've seen of him on both occasions now in varying roles and will be keen to see him on debut in the right maiden.

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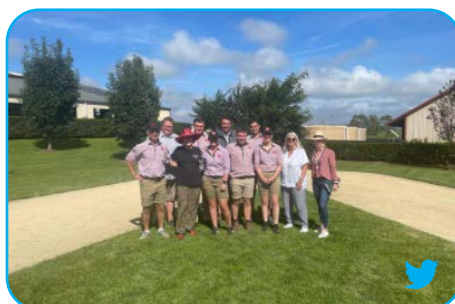
