# Almanzor earns fee increase after strong start to life at stud

Cambridge Stud's son of Wootton Bassett continues to prove popular in the sale ring and sired Karaka Million winner Dynastic in first crop

ambridge Stud has rewarded exciting stallion Almanzor (Wootton Bassett) with an increase in service fee to \$50,000 (all fees plus GST) as the New Zealand operation released its service fees yesterday.

The stud will also welcome Group 1-winning two-year-old Sword Of State (Snitzel) onto their roster this breeding season after confirming a CAMBRIDGE STUD

four-strong line up, with the Te Akau-trained three-year-old set to embark on a Queensland Winter Carnival campaign before his fee is set later this year.

Almanzor, whose first two-year-olds this campaign have included Karaka Million 2YO (RL, 1200m) winner Dynastic as well as the stakes placed Andalus, stood his first four seasons at stud in the southern hemisphere for a fee of \$30,000, but his rise sees him become the country's joint-second highest priced stallion. *Continued on page 3>>*

<< Continued from page 2 His first-crop juveniles have also included two Australian winners among five in total from 18 runners in the southern hemisphere, namely the Liam Howley-trained Virtuous Circle and Cranbourne debut winner Roznamla for the Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young team.

Furthermore, he produced his first northern hemisphere-bred stakes winner on Saturday when the British-bred Unanimous Consent won at Aqueduct in the US, the three-year-old colt out of the Fastnet Rock (Danehill) mare Fast Lily remaining unbeaten from three starts.

However, Cambridge Stud CEO Henry Plumptre said yesterday it is the returns in the sale ring that ultimately convinced the Brendan and Jo Lindsay-owned operation to elevate the fee of Almanzor, whose secondcrop yearlings have averaged \$170,559 this year following on from the \$189,594 they averaged in 2021 when selling to a high of \$800,000 and finding their way into the leading stables in Australia, courting popularity with trainers such as Chris Waller as well as Ciaron Maher and David Eustace.

"We weren't in a position to make that judgement call (on increasing his service fee) in January or February, but picking up the Karaka Million within his first crop, that was quite a big win for us," Plumptre told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"But I think probably the most telling factor was the great yearling market results again this year, which represents a great return to the



breeders that bred to him, but importantly shows us that the market likes him; the trainers like him and the owners like him.


"The rise to \$50,000, in the New Zealand context, is probably enough, but the level of interest in the horse would tell us that we're not going to have any problems filling his book."

Dynastic, a \$360,000 purchase for David Ellis from the New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka yearling sale, followed up his Karaka Million success in January with a second-placed finish in the Sistema Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Ellerslie in March and Plumptre believes he and a number of his stock will only improve with age. << Continued from page 3 "His yearlings last year, they didn't look like natural two-year-olds and I don't think anyone would have looked at Dynastic and thought he'd be getting anywhere close to it. But horses have a habit of making fools of you and that was a very exciting day for us (for the Karaka Million)," Pumptre said.

"But he's had a number of other winners in Australia and New Zealand that are marking everyone's card. They look like three-year-olds, his yearlings, with plenty of scope and some of them have got plenty of leg under them and that's not normally the formula for two-year-olds in this part of the world. But you sometimes get a horse that gets a line up of very athletic horses that are still winning as two-year-olds but look like they need the extra six months."

Almanzor will once again be joined by barnmate and fellow shuttler Hello Youmzain (Kodiac), with the dual Group 1 winner standing for an unchanged \$30,000. The pair are each limited to 140 mares per season in accordance with Cambridge Stud's agreement with Haras d'Etreham, where the stallions stand the northern hemisphere season in France.

A key strength for both, Plumptre said, is the supportive syndicate of breeders behind them.

"We are blessed to have a very strong syndicate behind Almanzor, he's got some great breeders in there, and they've got some lovely broodmare bands behind them. That's very much part of his strength in having that support from these breeders," he said.



"Many of our shareholders in Almanzor are in Hello Youmzain as well, and that gives us a headstart in terms of numbers."

Hello Youmzain, winner of the Sprint Cup (Gr 1, 6f) in 2019 and the Diamond Jubilee Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) at Royal Ascot a year later, was well received by New Zealand breeders, with the son of Kodiac (Danehill) filling his book for his first year shutting south.

"Hello Youmzain could have covered 200 mares last year, he was very popular, and we won't have any trouble filling him again," Plumptre said.

"He's got a great physique and a great CV, winning two Group 1s in England including the signature race at Royal Ascot and Kodiac just keeps kicking goals. He's getting a reputation now in Continued on page 7>>

<< Continued from page 5 Europe of being a sire of sires and that only helps our horse.

"The moment the New Zealand breeders, who are, quite rightly, highly critical of type, saw when he came down that he was such a great physical. He's got fantastic bone and a great head and eye, a very good shoulder and hip, it's hard not to like him."

Cambridge Stud also confirmed Sword Of State would join their roster later this year, with the Sistema Stakes winner being given a final shot at Australian black type with a campaign in Queensland.

The three-year-old most recently claimed two Group 3 events in New Zealand in impressive fashion, but he endured a failed campaign in Sydney in the spring, where a foot abscess disrupted a three-race preparation, but Plumptre said Australian success this time around would be 'immeasurable' for the stallion's stud prospects, with connections targeting next Saturday's Gold Coast Guineas (Gr 3, 1200m) before a potential tilt at a Group 1.

"We had a shy at the stumps in Australia in the spring and nothing went right at the time. He's going to go back to Brisbane and we're praying

that we get some dry weather as he's much more effective on a dry surface than a rain-affected one. But what we'd really like to see is if we can improve his CV by getting some Australian Group form," Plumptre said.

"He's going to start off in the Gold Coast Guineas over six furlongs and if he runs really well in that we might have a tilt at something like the Kingsford Smith Stakes at Eagle Farm at weight-for-age on May 28.

"It also puts the horse in front of the Australian racing public as well so that they can see him and see what type of horse it is, so they can come to Cambridge Stud and they can remember him."

Rounding out the Cambridge Stud roster is Embellish, with the son of Savabeel (Zabeel) once again standing at a fee of \$4,000 despite impressive figures in the sale ring. His first yearlings brought an average of \$40,128 and a median of \$42,000 at the delayed Karaka yearling sales in March.

The stallion covered a book of 158 mares in 2021, his largest to date, with 132 foals on the ground from his first two crops.

"Any of those stallions that stand for that sort of service fee, if you can average what he is at the yearling sales you're definitely doing something right. But I think the most important thing about Embellish is that he's got numbers on the ground, which is a great testament to (nomination managers) Scott Calder and Cameron Ring, who have done a great job," Plumptre said.

"We've supported him well with some of those great Cambridge families and we've got some lovely stock out of some decent mares. We're keeping half a dozen of them ourselves, so he's going to get every chance."

# Lighthouse heads black type supplementaries for Magic Millions

Coolmore Classic (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Lighthouse (Mizzen Mast) headlines the first of 24 supplementary entries for the Magic Millions National Weanling and Broodmare Sales, which are now online. Six new lots have been added to the National Weanling Sale including youngsters by sires Brutal (O'Reilly), Hellbent (I Am Invincible), Territories (Invincible Spirit), So You Think (High Chaparral), Magna Grecia (Invincible Spirit) and Omaha Beach (War Front). Lighthouse has been supplemented to the first day of the National Broodmare Sale, which will feature race fillies and maiden mares. Other black type mares released today include

the stakes-winning juvenile Sweet Dolly (Real Saga) and the Group-performed Fastnet Rock (Danehill) mare Violinist. Stakes winners Catch A Fire (Sebring) and Grazia (Savabeel) are among 11 broodmares added yesterday with covering sires including

Camelot (Montjeu), Justify (Scat Daddy), Maurice (Screen Hero), Shamus Award (Snitzel) and Too Darn Hot (Dubawi). The 2022 Gold Coast National Sale will commence on Thursday, May 19, with the first day of weanlings.

# **Abscess rules El Patroness out of Oaks**

El Patroness (Shamus Award), a leading contender for tomorrow's Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m), has been ruled out of the contest with a foot abscess. Trainer Danny O'Brien took the decision to scratch the daughter of Shamus Award (Snitzel) from the Group 1 yesterday morning, with the move now providing the Patrick Payne-trained first emergency Bundle Of Fun (Written Tycoon) a chance at the Morphettville feature. El Patroness was the \$7 second favourite for the Oaks behind the Jamie Kahridden My Whisper (Frankel), who is now a \$4.40 chance for Peter and Paul Snowden in the silks of Yulong.

# Payne relief at Fun start

The scratching of El Patroness from the Australasian Oaks has given Patrick Payne his second starter in the Group 1 feature at Morphettville tomorrow as Bundle Of Fun sneaked in as the first emergency. Payne believes the daughter of Written Tycoon (Iglesia) deserves her spot in the race after her win in the Tasmanian Oaks (Listed, 2100m) in February, but found herself below two lower-rated rivals in the order of entry for this race due to the condition that gave fillies placed in the top four in Group races a spot ahead of her. "The whole idea of the ratings system is to get your rating up to get into these races," Payne said. Meanwhile, Douceur (No Nay Never) has been targeted with this race in mind for a while and will be having her fourth outing this preparation tomorrow following a spring campaign that saw her finish third in the Wakeful Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) and second in the VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m). "Getting up to the 2000 metres is a trip she is looking for, as well as the set weights, so from a trainers' point of view, she's in good order, so we've just got to trust her."

# **Orman relishing Rothfire ride**



Brisbane jockey James Orman admits he can't wait to get onboard Rothfire (Rothesay) tomorrow as the sprinter once again makes a return to the racetrack after time on the sidelines. The classy four-year-old will resume in the Victory Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Eagle Farm and will take on rivals such as last year's Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) runner-up Vega One (Lope De Vega) and the New South Wales raiders Count De Rupee (Real Impact) and Jamaea (Headwater). Orman was aboard the Robert Heathcote-trained son of Rothesay (Fastnet Rock) when he won a recent trial at Doomben and has been pleased with the gelding's improvement. "He trialled well. He gave me a really good feel," Orman said. "I have been doing his trackwork as well, so I am starting to get to know the horse quite well. It's my first day on him on a race day so I'm really excited." Rothfire has seen the track just twice in the last 18 months due to a leg injury sustained when odds-on favourite in the 2020 Golden Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m). A fourth to Eduardo (Host) in The Shorts (Gr 2, 1100m) in the spring was followed by another break, before last seen when unplaced behind Masked Crusader (Toronado) in the Premiere Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). "He's a fast horse and there's not a lot of speed. I'd say he will get across quite well," Orman said. "I'm pretty confident with him. He goes well first up and he finds quite a winnable race for him so it's a nice kick-off point."

# Price to take Rupee and Jamaea to Queensland

Co-trainer Luke Price has announced that Jamaea will join stablemate Count De Rupee in Queensland for the Victory Stakes at Eagle Farm tomorrow. Persistent rainfall in Sydney has forced the hand of Price, who trains in partnership with his father Robert, and both headed north on the float last night in search of a dryer surface. "Unfortunately, they will clash but they will be getting onto a good track which is the most important thing," Luke Price told Racing Queensland. "I can't fault either of my horses. It's going to come down to luck in running and I wouldn't be surprised if they fight out the finish. They are both going extremely well, they've just got to travel up there now in one piece and they're both pretty good travellers."

# **Cassidy has faith in Derby** hope Southern Stock

Larry Cassidy made the decision to keep the ride on up-and-coming stayer Southern Stock (Tavistock) as the pair head for the Queensland Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) at Eagle Farm tomorrow. The jockey has always held the son of Tavistock (Montjeu) in high regard and will maintain his partnership with the gelding despite options elsewhere, as he gears up for a crack at the Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) at Eagle Farm on May 28. Cassidy had also been given the option to ride the now scratched Green Belt (Declaration Of War) after being onboard when he finished second in the Daybreak Lover Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Eagle Farm on April 16. "I was offered the ride on Green Belt in the Guineas but I decided to stay loyal and ride Southern Stock for our Queensland stable and Chris Munce," Cassidy told Racing Queensland. "I know Southern Stock will stay and will be one of the best stayers in the Queensland Derby. It's just a matter of whether he has the class."

# **Green Belt scratched**

Strong Queensland Guineas favourite Green Belt was scratched from the contest vesterday after co-trainer Mick Price reported the colt had pulled up poorly from a gallop on Tuesday morning. The improving three-year-old was last seen finishing second in the Daybreak Lover Stakes and was a \$2.80 favourite to get back on the winning trail in the \$350,000 race, despite drawing barrier 13. However, Price confirmed the son of Declaration Of War (War Front) would now head to the paddock after disappointing in a piece of work at Eagle Farm during the week.

# Quality field for inaugural Archer

The \$440,000 The Archer (1300m), the richest race in the 154-year history of Rockhampton racing, has managed to attract a quality field for next Saturday. The contest is expected to be held in front of a large crowd and will offer \$652,000 in prize-money, which represents an all-time record for a Rockhampton race meeting. Half of the 12-runner field have earned over \$1 million in prize-money, including Group 1 winners Tyzone (Written Tycoon) and Streets Of Avalon (Magnus). Add to this three multiple Group 3 victors, including Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott's Dawn Passage (Dawn Approach) as well as Desleigh Forster's Apache Chase (Better Than Ready) and the Victorian-trained two-time Group 3 winner Crosshaven (Smart Missile). The eightyear-old Niccanova (Nicconi), a Group 2 winner, is the oldest horse in the line-up, while leading Australian trainer Chris Waller will send the sixtime winner Kubrick (Shooting To Win).

# Lees' Eagle to take flight in Guineas

Kris Lees is hoping that his three-year-old Loch Eagle (Lonhro) can pass a further test of his credentials when he tackles the Hawkesbury Guineas (Gr 3, 1400m) tomorrow. Having scored back-to-back wins at Newcastle and Warwick Farm, the son of Lonhro (Octagonal) was second to Vilana (Hallowed Crown) in the South Pacific Classic (Listed, 1400m) at Randwick on his first attempt in black-type company. "That last run was about whether he was up to this better grade and he has shown that he is with his progressive runs," Lees said. "He's a smart horse but this is a good test for him. It's a pretty good race on paper." The Hawkesbury course was in the soft range vesterday and Lees was hoping it can stay around that mark after feeling Loch Eagle did not appreciate the Heavy 10 conditions last time out. "I'm looking forward to seeing him on that bit better ground hopefully, rather than on that heavy ground he found himself on the other day," Lees said.

Having moved to the Robert and Luke Price stable in the summer, the five-yearold has taken time to get settled into the yard. "She can tie up and get tight in the muscles," Price said. "It took me a fair while to work her out, but I've got her sussed now. We gave her five weeks off and she has just come up so well. She loves the rain, she's got a lovely barrier and she has been set for the race. Her preparation has just been spot-on, so I'm really confident she will run well."

# Loy seeks winning farewell to Sydney

Brodie Loy is hoping he can farewell Sydney racing with a winner before he begins a new chapter in his riding career in Queensland next month. The standalone meeting at Hawkesbury will be Loy's last weekend fixture based in NSW before he moves to the Gold Coast where he will team up with Annabel Neasham at her new satellite operation. "I feel like I have that itch I want to scratch in the metro ranks, but I just don't see myself scratching it in Sydney over the next four or five years," Loy said. "I'm going up to Queensland, it's a fresh start, I've got a great stable behind me and I'll try to really get in among the metro ranks up there. I'd like to think that over the last two years I've set myself up as a person who works extremely hard and will go anywhere and get the job done." Loy will ride Olmedo (Declaration Of War) in the Hawkesbury Gold Cup (Gr 3, 1600m) and the two-year-old Invasive (Invader) in the Clarendon Stakes (1400m).

# McDonald booking key for **Beer's Lane**

Mitchell Beer is delighted with the booking of champion jockey James McDonald for his three-year-old Hardware Lane (Scissor Kick) as the pair line up in the Highway over 1100 metres at Hawkesbury tomorrow. Hardware Lane resumed this season with an easy six-length victory at Albury in September and was second last time out at Goulburn over 1200 metres. "I'm mates with James (McDonald); I'm a cousin to the Mallyons, when he first met Katlyn and we all spent a lot of time together," Beer told Racing NSW. "For two years James knows I've always had a big opinion of this horse. We booked James for a Highway a few weeks ago but the horse had an elevated temperature and we decided not to come all the way from Albury. His two runs back have been as good, he just needed racing. We were waiting for a rainaffected track. He's where we want him now this prep. He's back to 1100 metres and in going where he thrives. He can jar up on firm. But James doesn't just take rides for mates. He and his manager only accept when they think they can win - it's high-pressure business."

# Hellbent's Hound bids to stay unbeaten

The Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr-trained Hell Hound (Hellbent) will bid to make it two wins from two starts when he lines up in the Two-Year-Old Handicap (1000m) at Sandown tomorrow. The daughter of Hellbent (I Am Invincible) scored a debut win at Terang on April 10 and although Kent Jnr admits she can be a bit of a handful, he feels the filly makes up for it with her ability. "She's a very good filly, a gorgeous horse," Kent Jnr said. "I've been riding her during the week, and she's got strength, scope, quality and a turn of foot. She did a lot wrong the other day, but she did let down well. She's got a great action, but she's one of those fillies you don't work next to other horses. She tries to kill them. It's a good trait to have, especially in a filly and she pins her ears back on race day and has a try."

# Gear change key to Legend's chances

Starry Legend (Zoustar) will have his sights

lowered when he lines up at Sandown secondup after a lengthy spell tomorrow. After a firstup fifth at Mornington on March 26, Starry Legend will now line up in the Benchmark 84 Handicap over 1000m metres. Tom Sadler, who is assistant trainer to his father John ahead of joining him in a training partnership, said the son of Zoustar (Northern Meteor) will wear a cross-over noseband for the first time tomorrow in order to help with the three-yearold's breathing. "He's not blessed with the best wind," Sadler said. "I don't think he'll be a horse that will get out over much further than 1200 metres anyway, but the cross-over noseband it seems to help him breath and get into a better rhythm, so I suppose we'll see if it's effective on Saturday. It's a race with plenty of speed as you would expect of most 1000-metre races. He's drawn out which is better than drawing in for him and if anything wants to take him on, I think it will be suicidal. I think it is proven now that there is only one way to ride him and with these types of horses if you try to reinvent them, you will cost yourself a few runs with them."

# **Bedggood** after form turnaround for Ziegfeld

Former Godolphin inmate Ziegfeld (New Approach) will make his stable debut for Gavin Bedggood tomorrow in the Anniversary Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Sandown, with the French stakes winner and Group 2-placed four-year-old out to relight his career after failing to win in ten starts for James Cummings. "I thought he might have lost his way a little bit and I was looking around for a horse that might be competitive in a Cranbourne Cup later in the year and I thought he fitted the profile," Bedggood said. The trainer has decided to give the son of New Approach (Galileo) a different training program where he is not stabled during the day and uses a number of the different facilities at Cranbourne in a bid to reinvigorate his love for the game. "He lives outside during the day, and he does most of his work out in the sandhills at Cranbourne, so he's not following around white running rail all the time," Bedggood said. "We've just tried to do something different, I guess. He's had one jump-out for us. He jumped out well and if we get the forecast rain on Saturday it will only enhance his chances."

# Alligator Blood sharp in jump-out

Having not been seen since late December, Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) took yet another big step towards a comeback to the racetrack when winning a jump-out at Doomben yesterday morning. "We're very happy, absolutely. There were a lot of good sprinters in that jump-out, so we were really impressed with him," owner Allen Endresz told Racing. com. "He seems to have really strengthened up again, Adrian (Bott) and Gai (Waterhouse) have got him on a great program." The Group 1 winner is now back in the care of Queensland trainer Billy Healey, but under instructions from Sydney-based pair Waterhouse and Bott. Now a five-year-old, Alligator Blood will have another trial before then heading for Brisbane's lucrative Winter Carnival after being banned from racing in NSW. "He'll have a formal trial on May 10, then he'll go to the BRC Sprint and that will take him into the Stradbroke," Endresz said. "We're really rapt. He's got through what we wanted him to do nicely, next will be a real serious trial. Win, lose or draw, it'll just be great to have him back and competitive."

# Argentia shows form in Mornington hit-out

The Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained filly Argentia (Frankel) showed she is on course to have a crack at her first Group 1 contest after she won a strong jump-out at Mornington on Wednesday morning. The daughter of Frankel (Galileo) is considered a \$9 chance by bookmakers for the Robert Sangster Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) in Adelaide next Saturday after the decision was taken to scrap a Sydney autumn trip in favour of freshening the three-year-old up to target the fillies and mares sprint. "She had

a couple of weeks off in the paddock and we just let her get her head down for a little bit," Sam Freedman told Racing.com. "What we didn't want to do was to take her to Sydney and run her on Heavy 10s. We just thought that she was profiling a little bit like (2018 Sangster winner) Shoals when she went to the race a few years ago. We think she can be highly competitive. Her pedigree says she should be stepping right out in distance, but we are treating her as she is. We've always loved her and thought that she can achieve at the top level. This is her first crack at it and she's still learning what it is all about and is still doing a few things wrong."

# **Champion Nature Strip first** to secure Everest spot

Last year's The Everest (1200m) champion Nature Strip (Nicconi) is the first horse to secure a spot in October's \$15 million renewal of the race with his trainer Chris Waller confirming the rising eight-year-old for his slot. Nature Strip, who most recently won the TJ Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) this month, his eighth success at Group 1 level, is targeting a Royal Ascot campaign in June and will be prepared for a defence of his crown upon his return. "Following his dominant victory in the TJ Smith Stakes, I felt it was an opportune time to be putting a deal forward to secure him again for 2022," Waller said in a statement. "Whilst we very much look forward to his immediate Royal Ascot campaign, I am also equally as excited that we have clarity around the spring and Nature Strip will be able to return to defend his title in the TAB Everest."

# Possible racetrack return for Odeum

Connections of Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Odeum (Written Tycoon) have not ruled out a return to the racecourse for the now four-year-old, who is recovering from bone lesions that caused her to miss both the spring and autumn carnivals. "If she responds to treatment, we would be happy to put her back into work. Mick (Price) and Mick (Kent Jnr) know her very well, as do her pre-trainers and riders, so if there is a hint of an issue, they'll pick it up straight away," part owner Sheamus Mills told Racing.com. "If you look through her form and what those horses who finished behind her in a lot of her runs have done since, I think it is fair to say there is some unfinished business there in terms of her level of ability and what she still is capable of being a race mare". Mills said the mare had been put back into light work recently, but if she fails to make it back to the racetrack she would be covered by I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) this spring.

# O'Callaghan joins Randwick **Bloodstock Agency**

An interview was arranged and as they say, the rest in history." O'Callaghan said: "Working closely with Brett and Rachael is going to be an amazing experience. I am very much looking forward to the future and being able to broaden my knowledge on everything bloodstock, as well as being able to help RBA's existing clientele with all their bloodstock needs."

What he did for this club can't be measured and we're all still grieving his loss, but in Sam we have a very good replacement." Fitzgerald, who had been in the role of acting manager prior to yesterday's confirmation, said: "Dubbo City Turf Club is in a wonderful position now thanks to the leadership of Vince Gordon and a strong Board of Directors, and it's important to recognise the hard work that has been done over many years to get it into the shape it's now in. "I'm really happy to get her back and she has really trained on well since. She was still carrying a fair bit of condition and she's improved out of sight since Awapuni," Latta said. "I thought she would go a bold race, but didn't know if she could win. It did surprise me and I thought she may have been a run away."

# Sutherland bags a first winner

Jockey Lily Sutherland posted her first win in the saddle with victory aboard the Kevin Myerstrained Shockproof (Shocking) at Hawera yesterday. "It was very exciting. I quite like the horse, I know her well. Kevin has been really generous putting me on her," Sutherland, 18, said. "I didn't want to lead but she was travelling so well I thought I would go across to the good ground and sit there and wait. Once she got to the straight, she just kept going. She has got the biggest heart, she tries really hard."

# HK: So optimistic with Enjoying

Enjoying's (Dundeel) career in Hong Kong hasn't been straightforward but trainer Chris So is optimistic the son of Dundeel (High Chaparral) can expel stamina queries and requite his owners with victory in the Queen Mother Memorial Cup Handicap (Gr 3, 2400m) at Sha Tin on Sunday. "It's a small field and I think he can manage the distance, for sure, I'm not worried because even the owner Mr Wong believes he can go further but in Hong Kong there's not much on offer," So said. "He ran well in Australia over the distance, so that's why we're trying it this weekend, we'll see, he's still in good form and it's a small field. He's been so-so in Hong Kong, before he joined my stable he was found with blood and had a heart irregularity once too, so I think he just needed time. He ran well in the Hong Kong Classic Cup, he ran close but after that he's been only so-so, luckily we got a win with him and his last few runs have been good."

# SGP: Le Grange has faith in Katak

Lim's Stable will have a strong hand for tomorrow's Class 1 race over 1400 metres at Kranji, with both 2021 Horse of the Year Lim's Lightning (Lope De Vega) and the unbeaten Lim's Kosciuszko (Kermadec) in line for a start. However, Ricardo Le Grange believes his Katak (Potala Palace) can upset the race favourites. "I respect all the horses in the field," said Le Grange. The Charlie Appleby-trained star is the mount of William Buick, while his stablemate Coroebus (Dubawi), drawn on the other side in stall one, is second favourite at 9-2 and will be ridden by James Doyle. Aidan O'Brien, who has won the race ten times, saddles two runners, including

> the also unbeaten Vertem Futurity (Gr 1, 1m) winner Luxembourg (Camelot), the mount of Ryan Moore, and Point Lonsdale (Australia), who finished second to Native Trail at the Curragh on his final start at two and will be ridden by Frankie Dettori. Jim Bolger and Kevin Manning will hope to repeat last year's success with outsider Boundless Ocean (Teofilo), while French jockey Christophe Soumillon maintains the partnership

# US: Two-year ban for Baffert recommended

A judge has declared a two-year ban from the New York Racing Association should be given to Bob Baffert for a string of medical violations. The recommendation was made by retired New York Supreme Court justice, Judge O. Peter Sherwood, who served as the hearing officer in NYRA's dispute with Bob Baffert. "NYRA has reasonably concluded that it will not condone Baffert's reckless practices, outrageous behaviour and substance violations, each of which compromises the integrity of the sport," Sherwood said. "I conclude that NYRA has reasonably determined that he should be excluded from the Racetracks for a lengthy period."



Every Friday in ANZ, lead reporter Tim Rowe delivers his thoughts on the week that's been, discussing the prevalent issues in racing and stories beyond the headlines

olden Slipper winner and twice champion Australian stallion Marscay's name was brought up during the week and it led me to stumble across a June 1990 article in the Australian Financial Review about service fees.

While the Australian yearling market is currently at an all-time high, those industry figures who have been around a while will not have forgotten the economic turmoil of the late 1980s and the early 1990s and the impact it had on the racing and breeding industries.

It is a timely reminder with the interest rates forecast to go up, although hopefully not to those almost debilitating double-digit highs experienced more than three decades ago.

In part, the AFR article read: Thoroughbred studs have been feeling the unkind cuts of a double-edged sword.

First, yearling prices went into a spectacular freefall (which, the realists must admit, merely brought them back to reasonable levels).

Now, studs have had to cut stallion service fees dramatically.

The two are connected. High interest rates knocked out many syndicates and speculative buying, so yearling prices took a beating.

Commercially minded breeders need to realise three to four times the stallion's service fee to make a profit on a yearling.

So, in turn, many owners of mares have become reticent about paying the stud fees which, in some cases, were inflated to make the most of the easy money available in past years.

Even the best and brightest stallions have not escaped unscathed - nominations to Australia's leading sire, Bletchingly (for the lucky who can fluke one at auction) have fallen from \$170,000-\$190,000 at Easter last year to \$80,000-\$100,000. (His average yearling price was \$152,604 at the William Inglis Easter sale this year, taking into account a 1987 fee of \$75,000.)

also hacked the fee for Marscay from \$100,000 to \$60,000 despite his Easter average being \$73,000 with a 1987 fee of \$20,000.

"There's just no demand at \$100,000," said Mr Derek Field, administration manager at Widden Stud at Denman, NSW.

"The old way was to never drop a stud fee," he said, "but you have to be more flexible to meet the market these days. There has to be something in it for the breeder."

Among Marscay's fellow stallions at Widden, True Version has slid from \$15,000 to \$10,000 and Military Plume, in his third season at stud, has dropped by \$5,000 to \$10,000.

But Widden is not alone. All the studs at the top end of the market are feeling the pinch.

In general, a stud makes about one third of its income from service fees, with the bulk of the remainder coming from yearlings sold at auction.

The article also stated that Mike Willesee's Trans Media Park at Cootamundra (now Twin Hills Stud) decreased Sir Dapper from \$15,000 to \$6,000, Rubiton from \$25,000 to \$20,000 and Snippets from \$17,500 to \$15,000 while Sir Tristan Antico's Baramul Stud (now owned by Gerry Harvey) and Newhaven Park, home to Luskin Star, Marauding and Zeditave at the time, also dropped their service fees.

John Messara, whose Arrowfield Stud was then at Jerrys Plains where Coolmore is today, maintained the service fees for Rancher and Bellotto. Incidentally, Danehill stood for \$37,500 in 1990 while Kenmare went from just \$5,000 to \$60,000 on the back of his success.

Apart from the names mentioned above those still involved in the industry and those that THE WEEK IN ROWE-VIEW

aren't - what also made for stark reading was the number of mares covered in 1989 in Australia compared to the 19,676 covered in 2020, which saw 12,302 live foals born earlier this season.

The article continued: A high proportion of yearlings are not even returning the service fee, much less the \$15,000 or so to support the mare and progeny between conception and sale.

The message has begun to penetrate. The Australian Stud Book shows that only 36,000 mares were covered in the 1989 season, a fall from 44,000 the previous year.

Another ten per cent fall is expected this season, for times have certainly changed in the thoroughbred business.

The industry - hardly alone - was carried along on a wave of almost terminal optimism in the mid to late 1980s.

Tax incentives were the buzz words, syndications involving the rich and indiscriminate were thick on the ground and prize-money continued to rise.

Yearling prices zoomed, with a Biscay-Tommasina Fiesco colt going for \$1.5 million to Bart Cummings at the 1989 Inglis Easter sale.

Speaking of service fees, a correction. Home Affairs (I Am Invincible), the high-profile dual Group 1 winner retiring to Coolmore this year at a fee of \$110,000 (all fees inc GST), is among the highest-priced first season sires to

go to stud in Australia, but he is not the most expensive.

Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr Prospector) shuttled in 2001 at a fee of \$110,000; in 2002 Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) stood at a fee of \$137,500 and Rock Of Gibraltar (Danehill) came the following year at \$132,000, all shuttle stallions standing at Coolmore.

Elusive Quality (Gone West) also shuttled to Australia in 2003 at a fee of \$82,500 while, of course, more recently Pierro (\$77,000), Trapeze Artist (Snitzel) (\$88,000), The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) (\$77,000) and Justify (Scat Daddy) (\$77,000) have gone to stud. Stay Inside retires this year to Newgate Farm at a fee of \$77,000. Of stallions that were bred in Australia, we believe he is the highestpriced first season sire.

\*\*\*

The long-term future of Corumbene Stud, which is to return to standing stallions this year with Menari and Standout on the roster, is in good hands.

Established by George Altomonte in 1980, the Corumbene Stud founder, 86, is mentoring his grandson Tommy Altomonte, 21, about the intricacies of breeding elite racehorses to ensure the thoroughbred farm continues for decades to come.

Altomonte Snr, who bred Golden Slipper winners Sebring and Overreach among other top horses, has had his grandson by his side for the past three years helping with the matings of Corumbene Stud's band of 45 broodmares.

"It has been a privilege to have a lot of the knowledge passed on to me from grandad," Tommy Altomonte said this week.

"As he says to me, he is essentially trying to get 35 to 40 years worth of information and things that he's learned and fast track it to me in the space of a few years.

"I have certainly been lucky to get the fasttracked version of everything he's learned. It is no fluke what he's been able to achieve."

Tommy is close to graduating from university and he is poised to join the family's motoring company Alto Group as well as becoming more involved in Corumbene Stud.

Of his grandson, Altomonte Snr said: "This will be the fourth year he's done breeding with me.

"It would have been a pity not to pass on some of the knowledge that I've got in breeding, and I've been pretty successful at it. "I just wanted to pass it onto someone and he has got hold of it, he is keen on it, and he's done very well."

The Mitchell family is in the enviable position of having I Am Invincible spearhead the Yarraman Park stallion roster in the Hunter Valley. This year he will stand for \$249,500 (inc GST).

They also realise the star stallion, rising 18, can't go on forever and Arthur Mitchell said this week that Yarraman has been, and continues to be, on the search for another stallion to add to the roster alongside I Am Invincible and his sire son Hellbent.

They're not easy to come by, though, particularly with the colts syndicates dominating the space from the yearling stage and the likes of Newgate Farm buying into unproven colts and hoping to hit the jackpot - as Henry Field and his co-investors did with Golden Slipper winner Stay Inside.

"We are looking for a stallion, but they're not easy to buy at the moment and we're probably looking for a colonial horse," Mitchell said.

"They are very expensive at the moment.

We syndicated Hellbent (when we bought him), so if we found one, we'd probably syndicate one again."

Yarraman Park does have shares in a couple of highly talented geldings by I Am Invincible who are in training at the moment.

Magic Millions 3YO Guineas (RL, 1400m) winner King Of Sparta is back in work with Peter and Paul Snowden while Quantico, who won three in a row last spring, is "flying" but trainer John O'Shea is tearing his hair out trying to find a dry track for the sprinter.

Quantico has trialled twice this month on rain-affected tracks at Randwick.

\*\*\*

In the cut-throat world of media, it's not the done thing to give your rival a rap. If anything the opposite applies, particularly publicly, but yesterday TDN Bren (O'Brien) departed day-today bloodstock journalism.

Sometimes you have to acknowledge another farm's good stallion, a rival agent,



trainer or a jockey, and it's the same with Bren, a good journo.

Competitive at the keyboard, Tasmania's number one ambassador is also great company at the sales and is good for a post-sale debrief or a punting tale of woe, so next week's Inglis Chairman's and the Magic Millions National sale soon after won't be the same without him.

He's also been desperate to have his name published in Australasia's most-read bloodstock journal, so this means it's officially a bucket-list item ticked off for him. All the best, mate.

ynamic Syndications' Adam Watt feels that his ownership group could have a potential Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) contender on their hands after African Daisy (American Pharoah) produced an eye-catching performance at Wyong yesterday when destroying her rivals in the Hma Group Maiden Plate over 1350 metres.

Making the fourth start of her career, the daughter of American Pharoah (Pioneerof

The Nile) had previously finished sixth on her debut at Scone, coming home strongly when the penny dropped, before going on to finish second and fourth respectively in two Canterbury maidens to round off her debut campaign.

Reappearing under jockey Brodie Loy after two encouraging trials at Warwick Farm, the Annabel Neasham-trained three-year-old filly broke well from the barriers and made all against the rail to come easily clear of her closest pursuer in the final furlong, beating Gracious Gracie (Dream Ahead) by five and a quarter lengths with a further length and a quarter back to Australian Citizen (More Than Ready) in fourth.

"We were thrilled with her. The ground was a genuine concern for us beforehand with her going first up at 1350 metres on a Heavy 10 track, but she was scintillating today, wasn't she?" Watt told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"We thought she'd be hard to beat given her price, but it was the ease in which she did it and the time that she produced in the final 600 metres on that Heavy 10 surface without being asked for an effort, that was quite exciting for us.

"We'll likely be looking to target the Class 1 race over 1600 metres at the standalone Scone weekend meeting on May 13 provided she pulls up well. Then I think two weeks after that there's a three-year-old Benchmark 72 race over 1800 metres in town on a Saturday which is crazy prize-money, and obviously the Queensland Oaks has always been in the back of our minds too, along with the Winx Guineas at the end of the carnival."

Having originally been purchased by Aquis Park for \$115,000 as a yearling when consigned

by Bhima Thoroughbreds, Adam and his father Dean were able to buy the filly for \$50,000 at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale last year when unraced.

"We were fully aware that Aquis were no longer interested in racing a huge amount of fillies and we bought her out of the dispersal there at Magic Millions, alongside another filly Notions (twice a winner from five starts). Annabel (Neasham) was very positive about the filly and we bought her for Annabel to train," Watt said.

The 24th Australian winner this season for Coolmore Stud shuttler American Pharoah, who returns to their roster this year at a fee of \$49,500, African Daisy is the fourth foal out of the stakes race-winning Latent Heat (Maria's Mon) mare Ciguaraya, a half-sister to the stakes winners Silver Time (Indian Charlie) and Midnight Soiree (Include), while the filly herself is a half-sister to the winning gelding Euro Gold (Malibu Moon). | 22 |


