# Yulong out to repeat Hungry trick with purchase of Pivotal-line mares

Victorian farm fast out the blocks at Tattersalls July Sale, sourcing mares bound for Juddmonte's champion stallion

rue to form at breeding stock sales both in Australia and New Zealand and overseas, it was Yulong Investments that struck the first telling blow of the Tattersalls July Sale when winning out in a protracted bidding duel to land Le Designe (Siyouni) for 180,000gns (approx. AU\$330,000) yesterday.

In 2016, Yulong ventured to the Tattersalls July Sale, purchasing Pivotal (Polar Falcon) mare Harlech for 60,000gns, who went on to produce their first Australian Group 1 winner in Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) and Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Hungry Heart (Frankel).

And the emerging global powerhouse again showed their affinity for the bloodline of the late Cheveley Park stallion when purchasing a daughter by the sire *Continued on page 2>>*

Bidding online, Yulong showed their purchasing prowess to outlast underbidder Matt Houldsworth for three-year-old Le Designe, who is out of Group 3 winner and Irish 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) placegetter Oh Goodness Me (Galileo).

"Mr Zhang has had a lot of success with the cross, so we've come to get a bit more of the blood and hopefully we can replicate what we've done with Hungry Heart," Yulong's chief operating officer Sam Fairgray said.

"We're looking for nice type fillies by good stallions with a bit of pedigree. It's great to be able to get the types that we want and by stallions that we think will nick well with stallions back in Australia."

Le Designe, who has raced once, finishing 12th of 12 in a novice race over a mile at Newbury last month, is a half-sister to the Australian-bred, three-time winner in South Africa Lloyd's Legacy (More Than Ready), as well as Gymnast (More Than Ready), who is the dam of New Zealand stakes placegetter Victorem (Shooting To Win).

Also from the family is dual Australian Group 3 winner and Metropolitan (Gr 1, 2400m) runner-up Brimham Rocks (Fastnet Rock). She was catalogued as Lot 33.


Later in the day, Yulong went to 28,000 guineas (approx. AU\$51,340) to secure Taaqat (Pivotal), a filly from the Rabbah Bloodstock offering with a deep US pedigree.

Placed three times from seven starts, the three-year-old is a daughter of the stakes placed Taaqah (Arch) and traces back to three-time Grade 1 placegetter Bright Candles (El Gran Senor), who is the dam of dual Grade 1 winner Grand Slam (Gone West).

The pair are likely to stay in the UK to be covered by Juddmonte's Frankel (Galileo), in a bid to replicate the success earned with Hungry Heart.

"Those two mares will likely be covered by Frankel. They're two nice mares and the plan would be to do that and then take them out to Australia," Fairgray said.

"Some of the other mares will stay [in the northern hemisphere] and be covered by Lucky Vega in his second season here." *Continued on page 4>>*

AU\$870,00) to secure Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare Shining Bright, herself a daughter of US Grade 2 winner Lady Lara (Excellent Art) and a sister to UK Group 3 winner Changing Of The Guard.</p>

The Yuesheng Zhang-owned operation also purchased a second Galileo mare in La Petite Reine for 18,000gns (approx. AU\$33,000), stakesperformed Fastnet Rock (Danehill) filly Twisted Reality for 165,000gns (approx. AU\$302,500), a Kingman (Invincible Spirit) filly Eternal Summer for 20,000gns (approx. AU\$36,670) and parted with 62,000gns (approx. AU\$113,500) for a Camelot (Montjeu) filly named Married In A Fever, who is a half-sister to US Grade 1 winner Byrama (Byron) and Group 3 winner Klammer (Exceed And Excel). She will also be bound for Yulong's Lucky Vega at the Irish National Stud.

Elsewhere during yesterday's opening session, Blandford Bloodstock went to 540,000gns (approx. AU\$942,000) for Shadwell's well-related mare Rihaam (Dansili) and 200,000gns for Group 1 winner Chachamaidee (Footstepsinthesand).

The former smashed the previous record price for a lot at the Tattersalls July Sale, eclipsing the \$460,000gns set at the 2010 midsummer auction by Business As Usual (Invincible Spirit), who went on to earn five wins on Hong Kong.

The unraced mare was bought in foal to Dark Angel (Acclamation) and is a half-sister to three Listed winners as well two stakes placegetters, while her dam is a half-sister to dual Group 1 winner Bahri (Riverman) and a sister to Group 2 scorer Bahhare.

Rihaam has already produced the Listed-placed colt Ribhi (Dark Angel).

Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock, who was stood next to Coolmore's MV Magnier when bidding, said: "I think she is by far the best mare here, she is a beautiful Dansili mare carrying to Dark Angel who is a great stallion.

"She is from one of Sheikh Hamdan's best families, tracing to Bahri and lots of superstar colts and fillies, mares such as this really don't grow on trees. The top Shadwell mares are as exciting as it comes, her new owners will definitely make the most of it."

Trade developed steadily through day one of the July Sale, kicking into gear when the sought-after drafts from giants Godolphin and Shadwell went through the ring. At the time of publication, the sale average was hovering comfortably above the 30,000gns mark (approx. AU\$58,000), eclipsing the 25,114gns achieved on day one last year.



# Kilner remains in ICU

Apprentice Leah Kilner remains in intensive care, three days after she was seriously injured in a race day fall at Grafton. Kilner was airlifted to Brisbane's Princess Alexandra Hospital following the accident, undergoing surgery to relieve pressure on her brain on Sunday night after being placed in an induced coma. Kilner had briefly drifted in and out of the coma on Tuesday, enough to squeeze her mother's hand, and Racing NSW provided a further update on her condition yesterday. "Leah's father Greg reports that she has had a good night's rest," Racing NSW reported. "She remains in ICU and will continue to be monitored today." It has been confirmed that Kilner has suffered fractured ribs and a fractured clavicle, but has been cleared of spinal injuries. Fellow apprentice Elissa Meredith, who was airlifted to John Hunter Hospital in Newcastle following fall at Gunnedah the following day, was yesterday reported to be in a stable condition.

# Inundation going for four straight

Inundation (Headwater) will be back in action at Caulfield on Saturday as the Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr stable get their potential stable stars tuned up for the spring. The three-year-old son of Headwater (Exceed And Excel) has three wins from four career starts, unbeaten since his debut second, and was an easy three-length winner at Caulfield last time out. "He's come through his last run very well," Kent Jnr told Racing.com. "We're just trying to build his profile and rating. We have no grand ambition

with him yet as he's got to keep doing it. But he's a lovely horse. He's got a lot of scope and he's still not really furnished so I think if we look after him, it'll be a lot of fun for the owners." Inundation will step out to 1100 metres for the first time since his debut this weekend having only raced at the 1000-metre trip for his three wins.

# Kent confident Illation in for good prep

Michael Kent Jnr is confident that threeyear-old So You Think (High Chaparral) colt Illation can take a step up this spring after his debut campaign saw him go unbeaten in three starts, including the Adelaide Guineas (Listed, 1600m) at his most recent run in May. "He's very exciting," Kent Jnr told Racing.com. "The thing for us is that we never really saw that blistering turn of foot at home and always thought he was a mile [1600m] to ten-furlong [2000m] horse. He drew three inside barriers with no speed or tempo on and he had an electrifying turn of foot, so we can't wait to get him out over a little further. We are trying to give him a similar path to the Golden Eagle that we gave I'm Thunderstruck last year so hopefully Rupert Clarke, Toorak and Golden Eagle but, of course, all the plans are fluid."

# Fresh is best for Dream Circle

Dream Circle (Dream Ahead) will bid to add to his consistent first-up record when he kicks off his latest preparation for his trainer David Payne at Randwick this weekend. The five-year-old gelding will tackle the Bowermans Handicap (1200m) on Saturday having not been seen since finishing fourth to subsequent The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) winner Shelby Sixtysix

We thought we would start him off there rather than trialling him. We will see how he steps up and then decide where we head."

# Saturday next for Hypothetical

The Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained Hypothetical (Pride Of Dubai) grabbed an important win at Sandown yesterday as the stable look to win as much as they can before life gets tougher next month. The three-year-old filly has all but booked her spot for a \$130,000 race at Caulfield on July 23 after her win in the \$50,000 Ladbroke It! Maiden Plate (1200m). "There's a three-year-old fillies 1200 at Caulfield in a couple of weeks and she could head to a race like that just try and add a bit more to her pedigree page before she has to take that step to four-year-old grade," Freedman stable racing manager Brad Taylor said. A \$310,000 Inglis Premier Yearling Sale buy, the daughter of Pride Of Dubai (Street Cry) finished second on debut at Mornington and was sent off the \$2.70 favourite for yesterday's contest under in-form jockey Billy Egan. She scored by one length from Only Human (Animal Kingdom) with Brechen (Capitalist) a further three-quarters of a length away in third on the Soft 6 track. "She just relaxed that whole lot better when she got to the front and that was the telling factor in the end," Taylor said. "She was still a little bit vulnerable late, but it was a good ride by Billy. He stacked them up to the corner there and then sprinted away and got the job done nicely."

# Diva gives Corstens reason to smile

Still recovering from a serious bike accident last Saturday that left him hospitalised for several days, Group 1-winning trainer Troy Corstens was given a reason to smile yesterday after Defiant Diva's (Dissident) win in the Ladbrokes Same Race Multi BM70 Handicap (1300m) at Sandown, a first win for the stable since the incident. "It's obviously been a tough week but hopefully this has lifted him up out of bed and put a smile on his face," Will Larkin,

representing the winning owners, said. Defiant Diva took her career record to four wins from 11 starts as she came home over the top of her rivals to score a one and a half length win over Awapuni Princess (Deep Field), an improvement on her first-up sixth placing at Mornington. "She was going really good leading into the first-up run and it looked a bit plain but the way the race was run...nothing really went her way on a heavy track and her fairness just gave out late," Larkin said. "We really thought she'd improve into her second-up up in trip."

# Think It Over suffers tendon injury

The future racing career of dual Group 1 winner Think It Over (So You Think) is in doubt after the rising seven-year-old suffered a tendon injury that has ruled him out of the spring carnival. The gelding's trainer Kerry Parker confirmed the news yesterday and said that no risks would be taken. Having won four of his six starts last spring, Think It Over, affectionately known as 'Sid' in the yard, then returned in the autumn to produce a scintillating performance in the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m), beating Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux) by half a length. Parker had hoped to aim the son of So You Think at the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) this campaign, but he will now be spelled and sent for a rehabilitation programme. "I am sure his fans, particularly the groundswell of support from his hometown in Wollongong, will be as disappointed as we are, and it would be heartbreaking to think that this could end his career," Parker said. "But if ever there was a horse that can beat the odds and make a successful comeback, it is our Sid." Owner Richard Johnston of Bylong Park said: "Think It Over has brought me, my family, Kerry and a legion of fans so much joy during his career. But at the end of the day, we need to put the horse's needs first. We will do all that it takes to ensure Sid is looked after."

# Litt happy with Profondo

Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Profondo (Deep Impact) took in a barrier trial at Warwick Farm yesterday as his trainer Richard Litt started the slow and steady approach to his spring carnival preparation. The three-year-old colt settled last in his 740-metre heat on the

Polytrack before being eased to the outside by Josh Parr and finishing strongly under minimal urging behind the Gary Portelli-trained The Empire (Not A Single Doubt). "He is happy, he has pulled up well and we're very pleased with him," Litt said. "Over the next few days, we will discuss when we trial him again. We are just going about our business nice and quietly."

# Moody excited by Incentivise recovery





Peter Moody feels he has noticed big changes in his star stayer Incentivise (Shamus Award) as the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) winner and Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) runner-up steps up his preparation for the spring. "He's furnished since last time around," Moody told Racing.com. "He was a big, coat hanger-type horse, but he's started to thicken out into his frame, so I'm really pleased with the way he's been building. All being well, we'll probably head to something like the Makybe [Diva Stakes] or maybe the Dato' [Feehan Stakes] around the same timeframe of last year, so we're pleased where he's at. He had a sevenweek prep with Lee Evison where he did a bit of rehab on his suspensory attachments and he had a spell and [has] been back in work about six or seven weeks again now. We're just ready to start cranking up his work a bit."

# Melbourne Cup sole Mission for Spanish

Peter Moody is excited about the return of his UK import Spanish Mission (Noble Mission) and said last year's Melbourne Cup third will be all out to go two places better this time around. "The Melbourne Cup is his sole target," Moody told Racing.com. "He's a bit more forward than Incentivise. He's a big, strong seven or eight-

year-old stallion. We've kept the work up to him and I was nearly going to trial him [on Monday] at Cranbourne, but he probably didn't really need to come over onto a wet track, which he doesn't really appreciate, so he'll probably trial up over the next couple of weeks. He's in really good spirits. I am really pleased off the back of a nice spell and he's really settled into our routine now. We mix his workload with a bit of jumping and a few different things. It'll be something like a Herbert Power or Caulfield Cup lead-in and he'll probably have a run or two before that. He'll tell us a bit more as he gets closer."

# Converge on track for Golden Eagle

Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Converge (Frankel) will be aimed at the Golden Eagle (1500m) this spring by his training partners Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott. The rising four-year-old has reportedly enjoyed a nice break since his disappointing Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) effort when he beat just two rivals home and the \$10 million Rosehill feature on October 29 will be the main target. "He seems in really good shape, he spelled really well and has put on some good condition," Bott said. "He's nice and well and above himself in the early stages of the preparation. A race like the Golden Eagle at the back end of the carnival is going to be the ideal target for him. He had a taxing campaign, probably just reached the end of the road by the time we got to the Doncaster. The number of runs he had on those testing tracks just ultimately caught up with him."

# Nature Strip back on home soil

Recent King's Stand Stakes (Gr 1, 5f) winner Nature Strip (Nicconi) has arrived back on Australian soil after his Royal Ascot triumph and will now complete his time in quarantine. The champion sprinter will now be aimed at defending his The Everest (1200m) title, for which he has already secured a slot. His trainer Chris Waller shared a video on social media yesterday of the seven-year-old rolling in some sand at his new home for the next fortnight. The post read: "The champ has arrived safely into quarantine overnight where he will spend the next two weeks under the watchful eye of CWR travelling foreperson Sinead Earle".

# Home Affairs touches down

Coolmore Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Home Affairs (I Am Invincible) also touched down on Australian soil yesterday alongside his stablemate Nature Strip. The three-year-old colt ran to be a disappointing 20th of 24 runners in the Platinum Jubilee Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) on the Saturday of Royal Ascot and will now begin his career at stud after quarantine, standing at Coolmore this upcoming breeding season for a fee of \$110,000 (inc GST).

# Williams back in the saddle

Craig Williams is set to return to the saddle this weekend for the first time in a month after his latest humanitarian mission to Ukraine. The 45-year-old was last seen in action on Stradbroke Handicap Day at Eagle Farm on June 11 where he rode Charmmebaby (Charm Spirit) to victory in the Wayne Wilson Stakes (Listed, 1600m). Since then, Williams and his Ukrainian-born wife Larysa have helped deliver over 1000 kilograms of first-aid and survival trauma kits to the war-ridden country. Williams currently sits in fifth placing on the Victorian Jockeys Premiership with 42 metropolitan winners and will be looking to add to that on Saturday with six rides at Caulfield, including last-start winner Designer Chef (Master Of Design) as well as Outlaws Revenge (Reward For Effort) in the feature Sir John Monash Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m).

# Scone to host Wyong meet

The Wyong race meeting scheduled for Saturday has been transferred to Scone after Racing NSW stewards yesterday deemed the Wyong track to be unsuitable for racing following 64 millimetres of rain over the previous 24 hours. Any race distance amendments can be found here.

# New Hawkesbury meet programmed

The Hawkesbury meeting scheduled for Sunday has been rescheduled to the following Sunday, July 17. Hawkesbury's track has received 202.5 millimetres of rainfall during the past seven days making the course unsuitable for racing. The race program remains unchanged with nominations closing at 11am on Tuesday.

# **CEO Eriksson departs Tasracing**

Tasracing CEO Paul Eriksson is set to leave and return to Sydney after more than three years in the role. Eriksson said that the past two years during covid, given the lockdowns and other restrictions, had been personally challenging and he was returning to Sydney to spend time with his family before looking for a new role. Tasracing chair Gene Phair thanked Eriksson for his work. "Paul made a significant contribution to the development of the broader Tasmanian racing industry during his tenure in a number of areas," he said. Eriksson's last day with Tasracing will be tomorrow, with current chief operating officer Andrew Jenkins appointed as interim CEO while the search for a new permanent replacement continues.

# SA govt calls time on jumps racing

Jumps racing will be banned in South Australia with the state government planning to support a legislative bill to put an end to the sport. South Australian deputy premier Susan Close made the announcement yesterday afternoon, saying the decision removes all debate about the sport's future in South Australia. "We want to create certainty for the industry, backing in a decision already made by Racing SA and by Oakbank to no longer hold jumps racing events," Close told Racing.com. "The community and the racing industry gave up on jumps racing some time ago and the parliament is reflecting this change in attitudes. The time for this business, the time for this industry has now elapsed. There's a reason there were only ten jumps races left in South Australia."

# Portelli pays tribute to Fireburn's late owner

Gary Portelli yesterday paid tribute to owner Ray Gunston after the 64-year-old's sudden death after suffering a heart attack on Tuesday. Former AFL executive Gunston owned a 60 per cent share in the Portelli-trained Fireburn (Rebel Dane), who would go on to become one of the stars of the autumn by winning two Group 1 contests. "It's been a massive kick in the guts," Portelli told Racing.com. "I'd only met Ray four or five times in racing, I had

nothing to do with him outside of racing, but it's a huge loss. We were in a euphoric state when we met. The first time I'd met him we won the Sweet Embrace, he came up for the big one [Golden Slipper] and then we had a few more celebrations after that. He was just a gentle bloke who just had this allure about him, you just wanted to know more about him and talk to him. He came across as one of my good mates and I'd only met him a couple of times. He was just a really good bloke, that's it, you found yourself a friend without even trying. Just a man's man, easy to deal with, he cared about everyone else in the room and you just warmed to him without even trying. He was just everyone's mate without even trying."

# Vale John Cannon

Long-standing Armidale Jockey Club chairman John Cannon has died aged 84. Cannon held a number of executive roles on the Hunter & North West Racing Association as well as on the Armidale Racecourse and Recreation Trust and was honoured as a life member of Armidale Jockey Club. "John contributed so much to the broader community by making the Armidale Autumn Festival one of the city's biggest annual events which is still running to this day," Jim Dedes, Armidale Jockey Club's secretary/ manager, said. "John was also a successful businessman having the Ford Dealership, then known as Cannon Ford, which was one of the biggest Country Ford dealerships in Australia and more recently ran Cannons Used Cars, right up to his passing. John will be sadly missed."

# Breeders get behind Sword Of State

Cambridge Stud have been buoyed by the early interest in their freshman sire Sword Of State (Snitzel) ahead of the coming breeding season. "It [interest] has been very good," Cambridge Stud chief executive Henry Plumptre told SEN. "We are very lucky that we have got some good shareholders in our two horses we have brought in from Europe – Hello Youmzain and Almanzor. A lot of them have taken a share in Sword Of State. There is quite a bit of Australian interest in the horse, which

is fantastic. We have got three Australian shareholders that have taken a share in the horse and will be sending mares over." Sword Of State won six of his 11 starts, including the Sistema Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and Waikato Slipper (Gr 3, 1200m) on his way to being crowned New Zealand's champion two-year-old of last season. He will stand at Cambridge Stud this coming breeding season for a fee of NZ\$15,000 (plus GST).

Coolmore's three-time Group 1-winning sire covered 161 mares last season, three ahead of the Cambridge Stud resident Embellish (Savabeel), who covered 158 mares. Multiple Champion Sire Savabeel (Zabeel) sat in third position on the table after covering 148 mares at his Waikato Stud home. Fourth on the list was Embellish's barnmate Almanzor (Wootton Bassett), who covered 142 mares last year.

# Chokito aiming to reignite Cup fire

The Warwick Coles-trained Chokito (Vespa) will be aiming to get her Winter Cup (Gr 3, 1600m) aspirations back on track with a win at Ashburton today. The four-year-old mare had been ruled out of the Group 3 contest by her trainer when a tying up issue hindered his plans to race the daughter of Vespa (Elusive City) at 1600 metres earlier this preparation. However, with that problem cast aside, and a last-start second at Riccarton over 1200 metres to call on, Chokito will now tackle the Norm &

Leanne Stewart 1600 in a bid to keep the dream alive. "We got two wins on the board early in the preparation and then she got tying up issues. Every time we got her fit to get her up to a mile, she tied up," Coles said. "We haven't had any issues over the last six weeks so we think we're on top of it. We changed her feed and got some medication that actually suited her. We'd tried about five or six different things then finally found one that worked. We missed a couple of nice races I wanted to run in because of it, but hopefully she'll keep. I had hoped to have a crack at the Winter Cup but we lost our momentum so that's why we weren't going to get there. The Winter Cup is probably off the table, unless we go super tomorrow. We'd have to pay a late entry fee of course but we'll just assess what she does tomorrow and see. There's always next year."

# Innes trio primed for Hastings

Opaki-based trainer Gerald Innes will saddleup a trio of runners at Hastings on Saturday led by in-form five-year-old Cross Roads (Sweet Orange), who has won two of his last four starts as well as placing in his other two outings. The son of Sweet Orange (War Front) scored his latest win over 2200 metres at Hastings last weekend in Rating 74 grade and Innes feels he can handle the rise in class, tackling the Bayleys Feilding 2200 this weekend. "He has come through the weekend really well, I couldn't be more pleased with him," Innes said. "He is adept to soft tracks so we will keep him going while he is in form. He has thrived since Saturday." Cross Roads will carry the topweight of 60 kilograms alongside the Stacey Dougantrained Charlie Horse (Zacinto), and Innes has booked Jonathan Parkes to ride the gelding. "Before nominations I thought he would get in on the minimum and I would put young Ashvin Mudhoo on, who is riding the other two [of my horses on Saturday]," Innes said. "He is top weight and Jonathan [Parkes] has always loved the horse, so I wouldn't leave him sitting in the stands." Innes will also line up Sailor Jack (Jakkalberry) in the Rayner Building/BJW Motors LTD Stayers (2200m), while the trio will be rounded out by Tui Rocks (El Roca) in the J & J Walters LTD 3YO (1650m).

# HK: Shinn's stint comes to an end

Yesterday's Happy Valley meeting marked the final rides for Blake Shinn. The Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m)-winning rider announced back in April that he would not be renewing his Hong Kong licence at the end of the season, instead choosing to return to Melbourne in August. Shinn will keep himself ticking over with a short riding stint in Singapore this month and is confident he is making the correct decision. "Money's not everything in life and as much as Hong Kong is so lucrative, and such a great place to ride on the track and the competitiveness of it, I love that side of it, the lifestyle point-of-view for the past two-anda-half years has been extremely challenging, just with the restrictions placed on jockeys, and things like that, to keep racing going, has taken its toll," Shinn told Racing.com. "I'm at a point in my life where I just want some normality and I want to feel like a human being again. If things settle down in the future in Hong Kong and are back to normal, well, there's a chance I'll come back but for the foreseeable future, I just want to get back to feeling like a normal person again and just get some quality of life back in my life."

# IRE: Williams swoops to buy Melbourne Cup hope Cleveland

Chester Cup (2m 2.5f) winner Cleveland (Camelot) has switched stables from Aidan O'Brien to son Joseph after being bought by

Lloyd Williams and his new trainer is hoping he can develop into a Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) contender. Touted as a potential English Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) runner having won a Curragh maiden impressively at two he never appeared as a three-year-old after a setback. He belied a lack of experience to win the Chester Cup on only his fifth start in May under a masterful Ryan Moore ride and was then second to Get Shirty (Teofilo) in the Copper Horse Stakes (1m 6f) at Royal Ascot on his most recent start. O'Brien is well aware that Cleveland will need to improve to become a genuine Melbourne Cup contender but has pencilled in the valuable Ebor Handicap (1m 6f) at York next month as a potential stepping stone. He told the Racing Post: "Cleveland has been bought by Lloyd Williams. He had a lovely run at Royal Ascot and he looks like he's a nice, progressive stayer. We will discuss things with Lloyd and Nick [Williams] and see how the horse is over the next few weeks but something like the Ebor might be a nice race for him if we are happy with him. If he happened to be going well enough here the Melbourne Cup would be a possible target in the autumn, absolutely. He looks to me like a nice progressive stayer and is a nice addition to the yard."

# UK: Inspiral to face four in Falmouth with Dettori back on board

Impressive Royal Ascot winner Inspiral (Frankel) will face a maximum of four rivals when she tries to extend her unbeaten record to six in tomorrow's Falmouth Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) at Newmarket. The Coronation Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) winner will once again be partnered by

Frankie Dettori on what will be just the jockey's second ride for trainers John and Thady Gosden following their apparent falling out at last month's royal meeting. The Gosdens have also booked Dettori to ride Mighty Ulysses (Ulysses) in today's Sir Henry Cecil Stakes (Listed, 1m).

# US: Joseph O'Brien reveals plans for satellite yard

Joseph O'Brien will break new ground this summer by establishing a small satellite operation at Saratoga in New York. Having won the Saratoga Derby Invitational Stakes (Gr 1, 9.5f) with State Of Rest (Starspangledbanner) on his maiden voyage to the world-famous track last August, the 29-year-old is set to have six stalls on site over the coming months. The enterprising move has been supported by a number of O'Brien's prominent North American-based owners, with his stateside adventure beginning at Belmont Park on Saturday when Debutante Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) winner Agartha (Caravaggio), who will be ridden by Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez, lines up in the Belmont Oaks (Gr 1, 10f). O'Brien has already made one journey to New York this summer, with the Team Valorowned Maritime Wings (Gleneagles) failing to fire in the Paradise Creek Stakes (Listed. 7f). "We'll possibly have a couple of horses going out there. Agartha could go there after this weekend, and we might have a couple of others there for some of the races during the meeting as well," O'Brien said. "The prizemoney is very good and we have some owners who would like to be there. They're keen to compete there and so are we. My team will be there, and I'll be over there a bit myself."

# 'Calculated bets' behind the rise of Newgate Farm

t has taken just over a decade for Newgate Farm to sprout from little more than a patch of grass and a pipe dream into a colossus, hitting the top end among consignors and hosting a roster of the country's fastest young stallions.

Reaching such targets has required expertise and no shortage of ambition, with the restless nature of managing director Henry Field and his team of partners and shareholders meaning they now have an eye trained upon success outside their established jurisdiction.

To have reached such a position of influence in a vibrant Australian scene is a remarkable achievement, with Newgate now subsuming vast acreage in the Hunter Valley, standing 11 stallions and producing plenty of smart winners.

Field is very much the public face of the organisation and its driving force. An early graduate of the Darley Flying Start programme, he gained technical credibility with five years of experience working for Coolmore and Ballydoyle. However, it is his skills as a people person which seems to have been key to Newgate's rapid rise.

He attracted two significant partners to the business in Australian educational entrepreneur Matthew Sandblom and another compatriot in Gavin Murphy, one of those people of sentient computer-level intellect operating on Wall Street whose SF Bloodstock, a thoroughbred investment business run with agent Tom Ryan, has bought into the likes of US stars Justify and Authentic.

Through watching the scene together, they refined a strategy to identify stallions.

"We found that when these colts have won a Group 1 race and they're ready for stud, the Australian market would nearly be the strongest in the world as far as what the value of these horses are sold for when they retire," Field explains.

"A few years ago we underbid [top stallion] Pierro for huge numbers, huge numbers, and

we were very deflated after we got beaten for him, but from that point on we decided to take a different approach, started trying to develop racehorses, buying them as yearlings or when lightly raced.

"We take calculated bets on buying younger horses with more upside, and trying to get more right than we get wrong. That's really been the making of Newgate."

Other investors such as New Zealand transport tycoon Sir Owen Glenn have also been involved, allowing Field to bolster his own list of employees. He encouraged long-serving Coolmore stud manager Jim Carey to join, alongside director of bloodstock Bruce Slade and former Goffs UK man Williams.

"Finding an unbelievable powerhouse team of young guys who have huge energy to keep building Newgate, that's been the most important part of our success," says Field.

"If you look at every great business, it's the people that are really the key to it; we've managed over the last decade to build what I would look at as an all-star team from the stud manager to the finance part.

"I do believe if you get the people right, your partners and your core team, then the horses will follow."

Newgate's roster includes the country's most expensive advertised stallion in the fertility-challenged Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt), whose fee for 2022 has been set at \$275,000, as well as young sires Capitalist (Written Tycoon), Flying Artie (Artie Schiller), Deep Field (Northern Meteor) and champion first season sire elect Russian Revolution (Snitzel).

While shuttle stallions from Europe to Australia have long proven a successful venture, Field and his team have looked at the options for promoting their flourishing stallions abroad, and have toyed with setting up their own stallion shop around Newmarket in order to showcase some of their other names, although this is nothing more than a distant idea at this stage.

"[Australian stallions] have probably performed better than the market gives them credit for," he says. "Exceed And Excel was around a long time, Starspangledbanner has done an excellent job, Fastnet Rock more than pulled his weight.

"There haven't been that many come up. We've horses like Extreme Choice, the best young stallion in the southern hemisphere, Deep Field, champion sire in Hong Kong, and Capitalist, who's just a gun two-year-old sire. You've always got to keep looking at the options and possibilities and I do think there's a place for our real Australian speed sires in Europe to inject that prepotent-type speed into the broodmare band."

On Saturday, Newgate will hope their Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Artorius (Flying Artie) can improve upon his eyecatching third in the Platinum Jubilee Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) at Royal Ascot. 

# Can the colts step up to the plate next season?



Stay Inside winning the Golden Slipper Stakes

ast year, Newgate Farm had a stranglehold on the country's most sought after rising three-year-old colts with the Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Stay Inside (Extreme Choice) firmly in Henry Field and his partners' keeping as the nadir among a collection of valuable stallion prospects at their disposal.

Artorius (Flying Artie) and Profiteer (Capitalist) were also on Newgate's books, purchased after the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and in the days before the Inglis Millennium (RL, 1200m) respectively, to join Wild Ruler (Snitzel), a yearling purchase who would go on to justify racing on at four by winning at Group 1 level, as future additions to the Newgate roster.

In early August 2020, just into the new racing season, Kia Ora made a major statement by purchasing that year's Slipper winner Farnan (Not A Single Doubt) in a deal with Aquis Farm and Phoenix Thoroughbreds, while King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice), a dual Group 1-winning two-year-old, had landed in the hands of Coolmore.

This year, however, obvious colt prospects appear to be in short supply, at least for now.

The fillies have largely dominated the big Group 1 two-year-old races: Fireburn (Rebel Dane) completed the Golden Slipper and Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) double, She's Extreme (Extreme Choice) won Sydney's Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and Sheeza Belter (Gold Standard) won the JJ Atkins Plate (Gr 1, 1600m) in Brisbane.

Coolangatta (Written Tycoon) also won the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) and another filly, Xtravagant Star (Xtravagant), won the Inglis Millennium (RL, 1200m), both important juvenile races on the Australian calendar.

In New Zealand, fillies landed the country's two juvenile Group 1 races, Lickety Split (Turn Me Loose) in the Sistema Stakes (1200m) and Maven Belle (Burgundy) in the Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m)

The only Group 1-winning colt of the current season was Blue Diamond scorer Daumier (Epaulette), a homebred for Godolphin and who is assured of a place on the Darley roster, either in NSW or Victoria as a readymade replacement for his own sire Epaulette (Commands) who was sold by Darley to the Turkish Jockey Club early last spring. He won't be on the open market and neither will Godolphin's rising four-year-old Anamoe (Street Boss), already a three-time Group 1 winner across four campaigns.

Coolmore swooped on what it deemed to be this season's most likely prospect, purchasing a controlling interest in the Kacy Fogden-trained Best Of Bordeaux (Snitzel) after his second placing to Fireburn in the Slipper. He had won the Canonbury Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) and Silver Slipper Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) at his only other starts this season.

His male contemporaries were left behind in the "majors" by the fillies, either through inferior talent or perhaps thwarted by the ongoing wet weather, particularly in Sydney.

So, who will the stallion investors pin their hopes on in order to bolster their rosters ahead of the 2023 and possibly 2024 breeding seasons?

The aforementioned Newgate, again, has a strong hand via rising four-year-olds Artorius, a luckless third in the Platinum Jubilee Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) at Royal Ascot last month who contests Saturday's July Cup (Gr 1, 7f) at Newmarket; this season's Golden Rose (Gr 1, 1400m) winner In The Congo (Snitzel) and Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) winner State Of Rest (Starspangledbanner), who has also furthered his stud credentials via wins in France and at Royal Ascot so far this year.

But, at this stage at least, the powerful group appears a bit light on for rising three-year-olds and potential targets aren't as obvious as they were in previous seasons.

Rosemont Stud's Victorian Alliance, in its first structured foray into the yearling market searching for the elusive next stallion in 2021, has got off to an encouraging start.

The Nigel Austin and Anthony Mithenled Victorian Alliance has Doull (Snitzel), a dominant winner at Flemington in May, as perhaps the horse most likely. Such was the colt's performance at his first start that bookmakers have him as the early favourite for the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) during the spring.

The Alliance also races Millane (Zoustar), who took out the Foundation Plate (Listed, 1000m) at Flemington in March at his only juvenile appearance, while Maribyrnong Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) winner Brereton (Zoustar) raced during the Brisbane winter and remains a colt.

There are also high hopes for Hafey (I Am Invincible), a Bendigo debut winner who reportedly "went to pieces in the yard" prior to his unplaced Blue Diamond Stakes before being given a spell.

Rosemont Stud also races the Peter Moody-trained colt Rampant Lion (Frankel), who showed talent with placings in the Marbyrnong Trial (Listed, 1000m) last October and the Blue Diamond Preview (C&G) (Listed, 1000m) in January, and could find a home at the Victorian farm if he backed up his talent as a three-year-old.

However, again, if any of the colts deliver during the spring, they will be off limits to rival stud farms.

As will Coolmore's Best Of Bordeaux and the Chris Waller-trained Political Debate (So You Think), runner-up in the JJ Atkins Plate last month and deemed a colt capable of achieving at the highest level. Waller also has the one-start winner Conqueror (Churchill), a colt raced by Star Thoroughbreds, who is bred to succeed at three.

The James Harron colts partnership, a constant at the Australian yearling sales each season, still appears to have a chance of adding another colt to the honour roll, headed by 2016 Slipper winner Capitalist (Written Tycoon), and if it does they are well placed to cash in.

The syndicate races the Anthony Freedmantrained pair Cannonball (Capitalist), a winner of the Redoute's Choice Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Caulfield in April, and the Dorrington Farmbred Crosswinds (Written Tycoon) who made it two from two with a victory in the Valley Pearl Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Moonee Valley in March.

Dorrington Farm's Robert Crabtree, who retained a share in the \$1.1 million Inglis Premier Yearling Sale graduate, also races the beautifully bred Maximillius (Written Tycoon) with Mick Price and Mick Kent Jnr who landed the David Coles Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) in Adelaide in May.

Carrying a "stallion's pedigree", Maximilian is a son of the Group 2-winning, Group 1-placed juvenile Scandiva (Fastnet Rock), herself from the family of successful sire Magnus (Flying Spur) and champions Black Caviar (Bel Esprit) and All Too Hard (Casino Prince).

Price and Kent Jnr also have Blue Diamond-placed colt Jacquinot (Rubick) and exciting rising four-year-old Illation (So You Think), a winner of three from three during the autumn.

The Hawkes Racing outfit of brothers Michael and Wayne and their father John have long forged a reputation as being stallion-making trainers - Star Turn (Star Witness), Brutal (O'Reilly) and Exceedance (Exceed And Excel) just some of the most recent examples - and they could have a strong hand next season if things fall their way.

At their disposal are MRC Chairman's Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) Sebonack (Capitalist), winner Kindergarten Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) winner Semillion (Shalaa), the twice stakes-placed colt Magic (Snitzel), who was bred and is co-owned by Arrowfield Stud, as well as the promising five and three-quarter length juvenile winner Foujita San (Maurice).

Gerald Ryan and his training partner Sterling Alexiou have JJ Atkins Plate third placegetter Brosnan (Snitzel), who races in similar interests to Semillion, Baillieu Handicap (Gr 3, 1400m) and Fernhill Handicap (Listed, 1600m) winner Williamsburg (Snitzel) and the Todman Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) placed Boyfriend (Snitzel), the latter pair wearing the Tony Fung Investments aqua colours.

The juggernaut that is Ciaron Maher and David Eustace could also have some potential stallion prospects in their barn, most notably three-time Group 1 winner Hitotsu (Maurice), who is on the comeback trail from injury, and fellow rising four-year-old Bruckner (Snitzel), runner-up in the Coolmore Stud Stakes last October and who was unseen during the autumn.

Stablemate Warby (Hellbent), runner-up in the Black Opal Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), could have the potential to figure in Group 1s during the spring while colts Lofty Strike (Snitzel) (Julius Sandhu), Sejardan (Sebring) (Gary Portelli), Shalatin (Shalaa) (Joe Pride), Letsrollthedice (Dundeel) (Danny O'Brien) and Zamborghini (Zoustar) (Matt Laurie) could make the necessary improvement when they return from their spells next season.

# Lor moves closer to trainers' title with Happy Valley double

rankie Lor took another significant step towards securing the Hong Kong trainers' championship with a Happy Valley double last night, while also bearing down on the Hong Kong record for the number of wins in a season by a trainer.

Lor leads 11-time champion John Size 90-84 and, with 30 races left across the remaining three meetings of the 2021/22 campaign, Lor also has Size's single season record of 94 wins, set in 2016/17, seemingly within his grasp.

In the throes of just his fifth season as a trainer after working for Size and John Moore as an assistant trainer, Lor's previous best seasonal haul is 65 - a figure he has reached three times since being granted a full licence in 2017/18.

Despite the mid-week double and an imposing buffer over Size, self-effacing Lor continues to dismiss suggestions the championship race is all but over.

"At this moment, I need to try to win more because the old boss [Size] is really strong, one of the really top trainers, I must keep on trying to win," Lor said. "I just want to keep on winning more races for my owners."

Lor's warning over Size's capacity was duly borne out with Ping Hai Galaxy's (The Factor) dazzling display to win the Class 3 Drake Handicap (1200m) for Alexis Badel, who notched his 50th victory of the season and sealed a double in the process.

Lor's latest spree started with Hyperion Tree's (Redwood) dominant performance in the Class 4 Tamar Handicap (2200m) under an enterprising front-running ride by Badel.

"This horse [Hyperion Tree] won well. He appreciated the light weight and maybe we can ride him this way again. I will probably run him again over 1800 metres on the last day of the season at Sha Tin," Lor said.

The gelding was followed into the winners' circle by stablemate Go For Tea (Smart Missile), who was posted a comfortable victory under Zac Purton in the first section of

the Class 5 Tim Mei Handicap (1650m).

"I'm very happy with Go For Tea because he had barrier 12 but Zac was able to get him to the front and he was able to have a good run without any pressure which is good because he's one-paced," Lor said.

The win was Purton's 130th of the campaign and was the first leg of a double for the rider, who subsequently partnered the Manfred Man-trained Compassion Super (Super Easy) to victory in the first section of the Class 4 Harcourt Handicap (1200m).

"The horse is improving and the jockey did a good job," Man said. "The horse will now have a two-month holiday before next season."

The brace left Purton with a two-win lead -131-129 - over arch-rival Moreira, who started the night in perfect fashion with a copybook ride aboard Tailor Made (Archipenko) to win the first section of the Class 5 Tim Mei Handicap (1650m).

Jumping from barrier two, Moreira settled the gelding midfield before fanning into clear running in the straight to prevail by a length over This Is Charisma (Smart Missile).

Matthew Chadwick enhanced hopes of securing the Tony Cruz Award for the most successful local jockey when the Chris Sotrained Classic Unicorn (Per Incanto) set a cracking pace before hanging onto to snare the Class 2 Albert Handicap (1000m) in a cliffhanger finish from Rock Ya Heart (I Am Invincible) and Handsome Bo Bo (Helmet).

The success left Chadwick with 53 wins for the season, five ahead of triple Tony Cruz Award recipient Vincent Ho (48), who teamed with the Me Tsui-trained Wind Speeder (Written Tycoon) to land the second section of the Class 4 Harcourt Handicap (1200m).

Harry Bentley notched his 25th victory of the campaign, lifting a refreshed Momentum Galaxy (The Factor) to victory in the Class 4 Garden Road Handicap (1000m) for Jimmy Ting.

Ting, who celebrated his 30th success of the term, said Momentum Galaxy had benefited from a short spell and would now be sent for a longer break.

"He races best fresh and in the middle of the season, I probably raced him too much," Ting said. "We gave him a break and brought him back and he was back to his best form. I was worried about the forecast of rain but thankfully it stayed dry and Harry rode him very well."

Douglas Whyte and Lyle Hewitson combined successfully for the 18th time this season when Big Two (Dandy Man) broke through in the Class 4 Lung Wui Handicap


