Malaysia back on Australasian racing map



Follow

hen thinking of racing in
Asia, the sport in Malaysia
isn't what immediately
springs to mind, with the
jurisdiction often seen as the poor cousin of
neighbouring Singapore and a world away from
Hong Kong, but the industry in the region is on
a big upward curve.

Fuelled by renewed interest from a wave of old and new owners and co-mingling of

betting pools into North America, Australia and India, racing at the Selangor Turf Club in Kuala Lumpur, not only the capital of Malaysia but also the national hub of the country's thoroughbred industry, the sector is being revitalised after coming to a standstill during the peak of the pandemic.

Expatriate Kiwi trainer Simon Dunderdale has run a successful stable from Selangor for almost six years and he believes that racing in Malaysia - its thoroughbred population is made up largely of Australasian bred horses - can develop into a more *Continued on page 2>>*

<< Continued from page 1 prominent export market for Australia and New Zealand in the years ahead.

"Selangor has nearly 700 horses in work now, which I think they've got more horses than Singapore at the moment, so there's a lot of owners around," Dunderdale told ANZ Bloodstock News from Kuala Lumpur.

"We're racing most weekends and the Selangor Turf Club is heading towards having a meeting every weekend, but for now they have to fit in with Ipoh and Penang, but their numbers and race days have cut right back. Selangor has got 46 race days planned for next season.

"There's always been a great following of racing at Selangor. I can't really quite pinpoint why they're all here [and showing interest] but I think some of it has got to do with the downturn in Singapore, but I don't really want to put Singapore down, as there's always been a big connection between the two.

"I've been here for nearly six years and the horse numbers have gone up. There's owners everywhere, the betting is getting strong again. The club is heading in the right direction and people are wanting to get involved."

 $Dunderdale, 55, will join about 20 fellow Malaysian racing participants, \\ made up of owners and trainers, at next week's New Zealand Bloodstock \\ Ready to Run Sale.$

He has 35 horses in work, including top-class sprinter Awesome Storm (Phenomenons), a Benalla maiden winner in September 2020 who has won seven of his eight starts in Malaysia for Dunderdale, the highlight being this year's 183,150Rgt (approx. AU\$60,965) Tunku Gold Cup (Listed, 1200m) at Selangor in April.

Ipoh and Penang also host race meetings in Malaysia but much fewer dates.

"All this [international betting turnover] is added revenue for the club to be able to finally look towards getting the stake money up because stakes earnings have been low for a few years," the well-travelled trainer said.

"If they can get it back closer to what it was back in the golden days [in the late 1990s and early 2000s] that would be fantastic.

"Years ago, when I was flying horses for IRT, we used to bring horses to Malaysia that were of similar quality to those who were going to Singapore.

"The class of Hong Kong has always been out in front but nowadays Malaysians are buying a lot more horses and I know at the New Zealand sales next week there's a big team going over there."

Dunderdale attended the recent Magic Millions 2YOs In Training Sale on the Gold Coast but came home empty handed.

"I couldn't land one [at Magic Millions] and it's my own fault. In the first third of the sale I bid on a few and then I thought I'd easily get a horse for \$30,000 to \$35,000, particularly by the time you take into account the cost of air freight and everything [about AU\$15,000], so I thought I'd wait and then the second half of the sale went crazy and I couldn't get close," he said.

"The other thing is, we can't bring a horse to Malaysia who has had Hendra virus vaccine because they can't come directly to us. They have to go via Singapore [to quarantine] and a large part of the catalogue, 50-odd, had had that vaccine, so I had to take them out of the equation, but I was able to buy a couple of tried horses privately in Victoria."

Starting his career in the thoroughbred industry working at Haunui Farm in New Zealand before periods with trainers Robbie Laing and Tony Noonan in Victoria and Mike Moroney in New Zealand, Dunderdale then rode trackwork in Macau, England, Ireland and Germany.

At the age of 40, Dunderdale took up training in Turkey, his intended one-year stint lasting a decade, before the opportunity came to move to Malaysia.

"Every year they have a reciprocal race with the MRA sponsoring a race in Turkey and the Turkish Jockey Club sponsors a race over here and the CEO of Selangor was there, Mike Fong, looking for new trainers and he asked me if I would be interested," Dunderdale said of his approach to relocate to Malaysia.

"I said, 'not really, but I will come over and have a look.' One thing led to another and, politically, it was unsafe in Turkey at that time.

"There were bombs going off and all sorts of things going on and I thought, 'oh well, a change is needed and that I should head back towards home' and I've now been here for five years."

<< Continued from page 2 Dunderdale trains alongside fellow New Zealander Sharee Hamilton, Englishman Richard Lines, who rode in Sydney as a jockey before joining the training ranks, Australian expatriate Frank Maynard, a Karrakatta Plate (Gr 2, 1200m) winning trainer who has been in Malaysia for two decades.

For a long time, racing in Malaysia had a stigma attached to it, arguably unfairly that not everything was above board, but Dunderdale said the

industry's image problem has turned around after a concerted effort from the Selangor Turf Club and the MRA's stewards, led by Fin Powrie, a respected Western Australian expat with significant international racing experience.

"The Selangor Turf Club realised it had to put out a much better image than what Malaysia had previously. That is why I think there's quite a lot of new owners coming into the game now," Dunderdale said.

"If you go back five years ago, if anyone mentioned Malaysia, they'd say it's corrupt, it's this and that, but the racing has definitely cleaned up."

He also credited the investment made by the Selangor Turf Club in its apprentices school.

"When I was in Melbourne [for Derby Day at Flemington] there were 11 races on the day [at Selangor on October 30] and ten of them were won by apprentices," Dunderdale said.

"The apprentice who rides for me here, she won six on the day [Singaporean Clyde Leck]. Fin Powrie when he came here, he said to the club that they needed a good apprentice school, that they needed to improve it as they've always had one, and now all these young apprentices are coming through.

"It won't be long and you'll see quite a few of them starting to head to Australia and New Zealand and Singapore for extra experience. It is really looking good."

Verry expensive share in Elleegant up for grabs

A significant share in champion racemare Verry Elleegant (Zed) is set to be offered through online platform Gavelhouse Plus.

With reluctance, Auckland businessman Tim Barry has made the decision to part with his 12.5 per cent share in the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner and offer it to a global audience due to personal reasons.

Barry joined Verry Elleegant's ownership group following the second of two New Zealand wins that led to her relocation to Australia.

Along with childhood friends and a group of New Zealand and Australian interests, over the next four years he enjoyed a ride like no other.

Verry Ellegant's retirement was recently announced after a challenging European campaign, but she will always be remembered for her raft of achievements under the care of champion trainer Chris Waller.

Her full career tally stands at 42 starts for 16 wins and prize-money earnings of \$14.9 million. Her 11 Group 1 wins ranged in distance from 1400 to 3200 metres, in handicaps and at weight-for-age.

"We could never have predicted the champion racehorse she was to become," Barry said of the 2021 Australian Horse of the Year.

"There are so many wonderful memories, but if there's one that stands out it was her Melbourne Cup win.

"It was just an incredible performance to carry 57 kilos, and see her cross the line so far in front of a very strong field, that will be my lasting memory."

It has been agreed by the ownership group that the best and fairest way to sell Barry's 12.5 per cent shareholding was through an online auction, and New Zealand Bloodstock's Gavelhouse platform will conduct the sale, which is due to commence next week.

The winning bidder will join the existing ownership group in the daughter of Zed (Zabeel), with her breeding career set to begin with a service by a leading European stallion in February of 2023, with champion racehorse and sire Sea The Stars (Cape Cross) currently the leading contender.

After foaling down in Europe in early 2024, she will likely visit another European sire in the 2024 season but be served to southern hemisphere time and return to Australasia to foal down her second foal. The ownership will race and/or sell Verry Elleegant's progeny as the group decides.

"Now a broodmare career awaits her and she's due to arrive at Norelands Stud in Ireland, where she will let down before being covered early next year," Barry said.

"The final decision has yet to be made as to which stallion she will visit, but expert advice has Sea the Stars high on the list."

The auction will launch at 5pm (NZT) on Monday with worldwide bidding opening at 12pm (NZT) on Wednesday. The auction will close from 8pm (NZT) on November 21.

Swettenham shuttler Highland Reel to stand in Japan

Shuttle stallion Highland Reel (Galileo) will stand in Japan in 2023 at the Takaya Shimakawa-owned S T Farm on Hokkaido. The globetrotting seven-time Group 1 winner has stood at Coolmore Stud in Ireland for five seasons and shuttles to Swettenham Stud in Victoria where he is advertised at \$16,500 (plus GST) this year. The son of Galileo (Sadler's Wells), whose elite-level wins came in Britain, Hong Kong and the US, is the sire of two Group or Graded winners and also recently sired his first southern hemisphere stakes winner in TAB Trophy (Listed, 1800m) victor High Approach. Shimakama races his horses under the 'Tosen' banner.

Godolphin triple-handed in The Hunter

After winning the inaugural running with Savatiano (Street Cry) in 2019, Godolphin has three live hopes in this weekend's \$1 million The Hunter (1300m) at Newcastle with Vilana (Hallowed Crown), Ingratiating (Frosted) and Gravina (Sebring). "Vilana won first-up in the

Silver Eagle, won convincingly. Then the other day in the Golden Eagle he just drew off the track, went back and had a wide run, no fault of the rider," stable representative Darren Beadman told Sky Racing. "That day I just felt the ground might have been a little bit firm. He didn't quite let down as good as he did in the Silver Eagle, so a bit of moisture around would help. If you took his win in the Silver Eagle into this you'd be saying he's in the first three. There was genuine excuses last time." After failing in a strong The Everest (1200m) on his latest effort, stablemate Ingratiating is another looking to return to form. Sam Clipperton gets the mount from barrier four. "He ran in The Everest and had good form in Melbourne prior to that," Beadman said. "The Everest run did take a little bit out of him. He didn't back up too quickly after it, so they've given him a little time to get over the run. He trialed [finished fourth] really nicely the other day at Warwick Farm, so he's in a very good headspace which is encouraging to see." Gravina scraped into the field as the 16th acceptor, drawing the inside barrier under Kerrin McEvoy. "Two starts ago he won nicely at Caulfield, and I didn't really think he handled the straight all that well [at Flemington last time out]," Beadman said. "He will appreciate going around a corner, so they've all got a good chance in the race."

Berry aiming to keep up momentum

With eight wins from his past 33 rides, Tommy Berry is aiming to maintain his good run of form and will line up with a strong book of rides at tomorrow's The Hunter meeting at Newcastle. Berry will be aboard the Greg Hickmantrained Eleven Eleven (Fastnet Rock) in the feature race and is hopeful he can overcome

drawing barrier 16. "He's a nice horse who has got tactical speed if we want to use it, but his best runs have been when he's ridden off the speed," Berry told Sky Racing. "He had a really good preparation last prep and he's headed to the Magic Millions again, which he's had a very good few years there. He's always shown he improves second and third-up as he gets on with his preparation, and he's just a horse that keeps getting better with age. He's done really well in between runs, so I'm very confident with his chances on the weekend." Berry also rides the John O'Shea-prepared Sound Of Cannons (Nathaniel) in the The Beauford (2300m), with the hoop placing three times from six rides on the five-year-old import. "He'll go very well on the back-up," Berry said. "He did a great job in a very slowly run race the other day and was very strong to the line. He's a horse that takes a lot of racing to get him right in a prep, usually four or five runs in he's ready to peak. He gets into the race at 54 kilograms, so he'll handle himself really well from a good alley [2]." Berry will also ride another O'Shea runner, Saveadateforme (Savabeel), in the Spring Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m).

Waihaha ends up in Benchmark, misses out on Hunter

John O'Shea had been hopeful of running Waihaha Falls (Sacred Falls) in The Hunter however, the new race has attracted a capacity field of 16 with four emergencies, and Waihaha Falls sits at the bottom of the pecking order. Stable representative Tom Charlton told Sky Racing it just comes with the territory, with many stables targeting the riches on offer. "It's a new race so it's probably quite a difficult race to get a grasp on," Charlton said. "This year's a good renewal with lots of highly rated runners

and unfortunately it's probably going to mean that Waihaha will miss out." As a back-up plan, O'Shea has accepted the five-year-old gelding in the Benchmark 88 over 1300 metres on the same card, with stablemate Cotehele (Tavistock) also taking part. "Two nice chances in that race," Charlton said. "Waihaha writes his own story. He ran a huge race in the Sydney Stakes at weight for age level. He drops back to a handicap, will carry 63 kilograms [less 1.5 kilograms with the claim] which could be an impediment, but he's a class horse. Cotehele was excellent the other day, always been a progressive horse, and gets a nice run with James McDonald."

Gibbons to partner Our Candidate

A year on from his first Group race win, Dylan Gibbons is aiming to mark the anniversary at Newcastle tomorrow aboard the Kris Leestrained Our Candidate (Camelot) in the \$300,000 The Beauford (2300m). From five rides on the seven-year-old import, Gibbons has managed three third placings including last week's minor cheque behind Pale King (Dabirism) in a slowly run race at Rosehill. The Cessnock Cup (2100m) winner from two starts back drops five kilograms on that placing and Gibbons said the slight drop back from 2400 metres could be key. "He's been knocking on the door," the rider told Racing NSW. "He's been ultra consistent and when Kris dropped him in grade he was able to get a win which was warranted and back up in grade up to 2400 metres the other day he was right there. He presented like he was going to dash and be the winner but I think up to 2400 metres, it took away that bit of brilliance. This time over 2300 metres, I won't be riding him so much to be able to dash with them and it looks a nice race for him for a good bit of coin."

Callsign Mav to be reunited with Mott

Jamie Mott won his first elite-level race aboard Callsign Mav (Atlante) in September's Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and he is aiming to land tomorrow's \$500,000 Cranbourne Cup (Listed, 1600m), seven days after logging his second elite-level success

aboard Roch 'N' Horse (Per Incanto) in the Champions Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) at Flemington. Callsign Mav may have been beaten in both his starts since winning the Rupert Clarke but Mott explained Danny O'Brien has made a gear change for the weekend. "He's been ordinary in his two runs since, but they've had a little issue with his breathing," Mott said. "They tried the crossover [noseband] last start and he was still the same as the start before, but they've gone for the tongue tie crossover, which I worked him in on Tuesday, and he was perfect. I was really happy with his work and if he can run up to somewhere near his best he's going to be awfully hard to beat." Callsign Mav is the 61-kilogram top weight and will carry at least two kilograms more than all other runners, but Mott said that is a winnable weight if the gear change does its job. "I'm not worried about the 61 [kilograms] at all," the rider said. "This is definitely a peg back from what his last few runs have been in, so I'm just banking on the tongue tie and crossover together helping him breath properly."

Wide draw a concern for Clarken

Will Clarken is concerned about a wide draw for his import Ironclad (Dubawi) in tomorrow's Cranbourne Cup. Clarken addressed his worries about how much ground jockey Ethan Brown will have to concede from barrier 13 in the field of 15. "I was praying that we drew barrier five or six but we've drawn wide again – I can't seem to draw a gate wherever I am at the moment," Clarken told Racing.com. "From there, it makes it a little bit hard for him because he's going to have to concede ground and you don't want to be spotting them too far at Cranbourne." Ironclad finished third behind Old Flame (Invincible Spirit) in last

week's Linlithgow Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Flemington. "He was terrific first-up and I'm sure he's come on since then but to win the race he's most likely going to have to run a career-best," Clarken said. "He's going as good as I've ever had him going so hopefully he can show that." Clarken said there are several options for Ironclad following tomorrow's race. "If he was to run super there's The Gong, which would be a seven day back-up and up to Sydney or hypothetically, he could be on the same plane as Beau Rossa to Perth," he said. "He could run on Saturday, fly on Monday and run in one of those races in Perth. But it all depends on [tomorrow] and he's a horse that had a few ailments so maybe giving him a lighter preparation might work well."

Brayden to make debut in Shooting Star

Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young are looking forward to the Australian debut of Brayden Star (Twilight Son) in the \$175,000 Shooting Star (1500m) at Cranbourne tomorrow, albeit with reservations. The four-year-old was a last-start winner of a Class 3 Handicap (1m 2f) for threeyear-olds by seven and a half-lengths in the UK on May 12. Busuttin is excited about getting the half-brother to Group 3 winner Wentwood (Pour Moi) started. "He looks a good horse, but whether 1500 [metres] around a tight track like Cranbourne will be his go, I don't know," he said. "Ultimately, he's going to be a very smart horse though, definitely a 2000, 2400-metre horse, so I'm very excited about him but guarded about him going into Saturday." The Shooting Star is a race for horses who have won up to three starts but not competed in any more than nine races. Brayden Star, who will be ridden by Damien Oliver, has prepared with two impressive jump-outs at Cranbourne during October. In the first, over 1000-metres, he swept home from second-last at the 400-metres under light riding to finish second, beaten a head, and more recently was prominent throughout in a 1200-metre workout and cruised home three and a half lengths clear of his rival. "If he wins, certainly it'd be no surprise but I'm picking he's going to be backed heavily on the back of those two jump-outs but there's still that little query over him," Busuttin said.

Krispyn excited with Alaskalot

Joshua Krispyn admits to being pleasantly surprised by the attention Alaskalot (A Lot) received on debut last month when the threeyear-old finished second to Kosta's Crown (Supido). The performance certainly caught the imagination of interested buyers and before the gelding had time to cool down, Krispyn's phone went into overdrive. As a young trainer reasonably new to the sport, and also a part-owner, Krispyn was taken aback by the interest, but politely and firmly said there was no sale. That resolve remains in place, even after Alaskalot's stylish winning effort over 1400-metres at Ascot on Wednesday. "The phone has been ringing quite a bit, but I can't sell him," Krispyn told Racing WA. "I'm only young into training and this is the horse you dream about. This is the horse that can get me going and attract new owners to my stable. It's a great position to be in, but I'm not selling him." Krispyn gathered invaluable experience with Lloyd Williams in Melbourne and was Justin Warwick's stable foreman in Bunbury before setting up on his own in 2016 and he's hoping Alaskalot is the game changer. "One of the other reasons why he isn't for sale is he's the first horse I've bought at the sales," Krispyn said. "I bought him on type and he only cost me \$16,000 which is looking good now. Along with the other owners we can't wait to see how he progresses."

Emotional win for Fancylanski

Fancylanski (Polanski) cheated death as a foal and the four-year-old supplied small breeder/trainer Simon Lee with his first winner at Pakenham yesterday when winning a 1400-metre maiden at her third start. Lee and his wife Jacqui McGregor stand Polanski (Rakti) at Ducks Crossing Stud in Tyabb on

Victoria's Mornington Peninsula. McGregor remains an equine veterinarian to financially support the breeding venture with Polanski and was justifiably emotional post-race. "It's been a big Polanski project, there's been a lot of blood, sweat and tears going into getting this far," McGregor told Racing.com. "Simon [Lee] has been really resilient, just like everyone, you get dramas all the time, so it's so pleasing to finally pull one off. We nearly lost her [Fancylanski] whilst she was foaling, the mare didn't lie down, she nearly suffocated and we did have to resuscitate her, so I keep thinking 'Thank goodness that we did.' We're stoked, we can't describe it. They're all part of the family of our horses, so that's why we're emotional about it. We can't thank Ross and Fran Warner [who raced Polanski] enough because they trusted us with Polanski. It will be nice to go home and Polanski is there in his box and gets an extra feed tonight."

More Group 1 aims for C'est Magique

Grahame Begg will continue to aim high with C'est Magique (Zoustar) following her runnerup effort in the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Flemington last month. The threeyear-old half-sister to Begg's Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Written By (Written Tycoon) has been sent to the spelling paddock and will be aimed up at the Surround Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Randwick in late February. "To say the least, we were delighted, I wouldn't have run her unless she was competitive," Begg told Racing.com. "I took a gamble on running her in the Cap d'Antibes and she ran very well and on the third start she was luckless in the Thoroughbred Club from an inside gate and went to the line hard held. She has always shown us well above-average ability, she is very understated and won't break the clock in a track gallop but does it effortlessly." C'Est Magique is bred and raced by Begg's father Neville. "When she got beat in the Thoroughbred Club my father said to me 'What do you think you want to do with her next'? And I said 'Run her in the Coolmore', and there was stunned silence on the phone," Begg recalled. "One thing I know about the breed, and I identified it early on, is the Zoustars go very well up the straight."

Begg also has a two-year-old brother to C'est Magique named De Bergerac in the stable, while a filly by Capitalist (Written Tycoon) was born on Tuesday.

Sandhu confident that Lofty can improve

Julius Sandhu is confident Group 3 winner Lofty Strike (Snitzel) will return a better horse in the autumn. The three-year-old colt has headed out for a break after a three-run spring campaign that saw him finish third in the Blue Sapphire Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) and fourth in the Coolmore Stud Stakes before a close-up seventh in last Saturday's Champions Sprint behind Roch 'N' Horse. "I think the physical maturity is going to come a little bit more because he's so lightly raced," Sandhu told Racing.com. "He's developed over the break between autumn and spring, he absolutely came back a monster. I can't help but think with a second preparation under his belt, albeit a small one, he's going to develop more physically. I think the real big advantage that he has now is the experience of being to the races five times. He's a smart horse, he learns every time he goes out, that's just who he's always been as an animal, so the fact that he's had three runs and he's been out with the best of the best in the sprinting stakes, at least as far as we're concerned here in Australia, he's going to go out and he's going to take a lot of benefit from that mentally in terms of experience. He's going to be very comfortable matching it with the big boys when he gets back." Sandhu has no concrete plans at this point for Lofty Strike, with races like the Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m), Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m), Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) and TJ Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) all potential options. "We'll bring the horse back into work after he's had a break, then we will start a preparation with a view that we want to kick off over 1000 metres down the straight with the Lightning and if that doesn't come to fruition for whatever reason, we can go to the Oakleigh Plate," Sandhu said.

"I'm here for a little while," Pike told The Races WA. "I don't really have a lot of plans at the moment. I've got a saddle in my hands, I'm ready to travel. I'll be here for a month, six weeks. See the carnival out. I'm hoping to head back across for the Magic Millions. See where the journey takes me. I have no set plans. I know the rumours are rife at the moment. I've got no concrete plans, I'm here at the moment and that is where my focus is."

Deagon-based Bruce to open Sunshine Coast stable

A promising start to his training career has led Jack Bruce to expand his operation. Bruce, who had his first runner in May after formerly being an assistant trainer to Ciaron Maher and also Bjorn Baker, will now have an expanded presence in Queensland. Bruce already has 24 horses stabled at Deagon, in Brisbane's outer north, and has now been granted 20 boxes on the Sunshine Coast. "I'm pleased to announce I have taken on an additional 20 boxes at the Sunshine Coast to complement my 24-horse stable at Deagon. A huge thanks to everyone who has supported me in making this possible and I look forward to many more winners going forward," Bruce said in a statement on his Facebook page.

Smith to close Perth stable

Lindsey Smith will close his Perth stables at the end of the year, allowing him to focus on his Warrnambool operation. The 63-year-old Western Australia native left Perth several years ago to open his satellite stable in Victoria. "I've only got a couple of horses left, one will see out until the Perth Cup if he continues his form, then that will be all she wrote, I'll cancel my licence over there," Smith told Racing.com. "Not really a tough decision. I was getting no new horses, most people wanted me there all the time, so it just got a bit tricky. I just needed to focus, being hands on I'm better off in just one place. It also means I

won't be classed as a city trainer, which opens up some pretty lucrative races which I haven't been able to enter in the last couple of years." Smith's WA representative Donna Riordan will continue with a handful of horses from Smith's property, with the trainer confirming the homestead isn't for sale. "Donna is going to poke around and pre-train a couple until she figures out what she wants to do," Smith said. "I'll just leave it there, it's the family home. If we ever go home for a holiday or if I take some horses over there at Derby time or Oaks time, I've got somewhere to go."

Record turnover at Flemington carnival

The Victoria Racing Club (VRC) said engagement with the Melbourne Cup Carnival continues to reach new heights. In releasing the wagering figures for the recent four-day carnival, the VRC said this year's meeting generated a total domestic wagering turnover of \$776 million with an additional \$95 million in international turnover, which resulted in a record \$871 million for the four days. Turnover across cup week was up seven per cent from last year, with record domestic turnover on Victoria Derby day (\$166 million), VRC Oaks day (\$95 million) and Champions Stakes day (\$144 million), with the revamped Champions Stakes day recording a 21 percent increase year-on-year. Turnover for Melbourne Cup Day continues to be the highest of any race day in Australia and was the second highest ever at \$371 million (just behind last year's record of \$375.6 million), including an increase in turnover on the Melbourne Cup to \$226 million, despite challenging weather conditions which traditionally impacts wagering.

Hunter equine identity Fraser admits to drug import plan

Felicity Fraser, well-known in the Upper Hunter horse and polo industry, has admitted to attempting to import more than one tonne of cocaine into the country via hidden shipments of wood from South America. Appearing via video link in Newcastle Local Court on Wednesday, the 42-year-old pleaded guilty to conspiracy to import a commercial quantity

of a border controlled drug, while seven other charges against Fraser were dropped. The court heard between December 2017 and October 2021 Fraser has conspired with her boss, Peter Leslie Ritson, and others, to import the drugs with an estimated street value of more than \$400 million from Ecuador.

NEW ZEALAND

Vidiano to make NZ debut

Vidiano (Pierro) has returned to her homeland after spending time in Australia and will make her New Zealand debut in a handicap over 1600 metres at Hastings on Sunday. Initially in the care of Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman, Vidiano placed in both of her trials in New Zealand before her owners decided to send the filly to Peter Moody in Victoria where she posted a win and three placings from eight starts. The decision was made to bring her home where a smaller, rural environment was selected as her best option. Scutar (O'Reilly), in the same ownership was already in the care of Simon Wilson, and the Hawke's Bay-based trainer was more than happy to welcome the five-year-old mare to his stable. "They [owners] just wanted Scutar to be trained in a farm environment and I was lucky enough to get the horses to train," Wilson said. "They have both settled into the farm environment well." Wilson has been pleased with what he has seen from Vidiano to date but is looking forward to seeing how she performs on raceday this weekend before making any further plans. "I have had her since July and she is a nice horse but is a bit of an unknown and I will know more about her after the weekend," the trainer said. "She works well but needs to bring that to raceday." Vidiano will be joined in her race by stablemate Rip Wheeler (Rip Van Winkle). "He didn't get a lot of luck last start. He was blocked for a run. He has been working well and he likes a better track, so hopefully we don't get too much rain," Wilson said. Rounding out Wilson's trio of runners on Sunday will be Scutar in the Waipukurau Cup (1600m). "Scutar has drawn well [1]. He had his first-up start at Woodville and ran on nicely. It is a nice race for him, I think a mile is his distance. And being a local meeting is a bonus," Wilson

Fresh from a winning double midweek, Daniel Stackhouse will be hoping for further success at Riccarton on Saturday before he returns to Australia. The expatriate Kiwi jockey returned home following the Flemington spring carnival to combine business with pleasure and will have ten rides on the closing day of the New Zealand Cup carnival. "It's been great to be home and get the monkey off the back and bang a couple of winners in and hopefully I can get some more on Saturday," Stackhouse said. The rider was in winning form on Wednesday aboard the John Wheeler-trained Oso Savvy (Savabeel) and the Shane Kennedy and Anna Furlong-prepared Betty Spaghetti (Stratum Star) and will partner her stablemate Blue Solitaire (Almanzor) in the New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). Blue Solitaire was last night rated a \$31 chance in a market dominated by the \$1.40 favourite Legarto (Proisir), but Stackhouse is optimistic of a bold showing from his mount. "The main reason I'm over here is to try and win a Group 1. Her form is okay, but the favourite does look really hard to beat," Stackhouse said. "If we run top three it will be really good. I had a lot of success with Shane before I went to Australia and it was great to ride a winner for him on Wednesday. It's racing and anything can go wrong and something might go in our favour in the Guineas. You've got to be in it to win and she looks reasonably straightforward."

SGP: Zahra and Dee to ride at Gold Cup meeting

Cup meeting on November 19. Zahra has been booked by Ricardo Le Grange to ride Hongkong Great (Lookin At Lucky), while Dee will ride the Donna Logan-trained Super Impact (Real Impact) in the feature Singapore Gold Cup (Listed, 2000m).

SGP: Beasley heading home via Hong Kong

Danny Beasley will call time on his successful spell in Singapore at the end of this season with the veteran hoop planning to continue his career back in Australia, but not before taking the ride on Lim's Kosciuszko (Kermadec) at next month's Hong Kong International Races. Beasley did not re-apply for a licence for next season at Kranji, bringing an end to his 15-year Singapore career at the season-ending meeting on November 26. He intends to return to his hometown of Wagga Wagga with his wife Ash and three children next year so he can be closer to his parents and sister.

SGP: Star Legend bidding to double up

The PSM Racing Stable-owned Star Legend (Exosphere) will attempt to live up to his name and make it two maiden wins in as many weeks for the James Peters stable when he lines up in an open maiden race over 1100 metres at Kranji on Sunday. The gelding's trial form - he won trial number one last Thursday in a time of 1 min 0.7 secs - suggests he could start as one of the more fancied runners and Peters thinks he is a horse to watch. "He has plenty of ability," the trainer said. "You could see that from his trial last week, but he's not 100 per cent wound up for this race, so whatever we see on Sunday, he will improve from that run. Being a four-yearold maiden, this is the last race suitable for him this season so we had to rush his preparation a bit. He's only been in the stable six weeks or so but he should go well on what he has shown us."

JPN: David Egan given twomonth licence

Classic-winning jockey David Egan is looking forward to joining weighing-room colleagues Tom Marquand and Hollie Doyle in Japan this winter after being given a short-term licence to ride in the country. The former UK champion apprentice has endured some ups and downs this year, not least when losing the ride on Mishriff (Make Believe), but he bounced back with a productive autumn highlighted by his first Classic triumph on the Roger Variantrained Eldar Eldarov (Dubawi) in the St Leger (Gr 1, 1m 6.5f) at Doncaster in September. Egan also won the Mill Reef Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) for the same trainer, and owner KHK Racing, on Sakheer (Zoffany) in September and last month landed the Horris Hill Stakes (Gr 3, 7f) aboard the Simon and Ed Crisford-trained Knight (Mehmas) in the same colours. The jockey has ridden 86 winners this year - nine more than his previous best annual tally - and will keep busy in the UK until heading to the far east next month.

Owner-breeder Kirsten Rausing enjoyed more stakes success in France yesterday, following Alpinista's (Frankel) Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) triumph last month, when Allada (2 f ex Algarade by Green Desert) produced a strong staying performance to win the Prix du Grand Camp (Listed, 2400m) at Lyon Parilly. Trained by Tim Donworth, the juvenile filly stayed on strongly in the closing stages to beat Aude (Shamalgan) by one and a quarter lengths with a further length back to Zanndabad (Iffraaj) in third. The sixth foal out of the winning Green Desert (Danzig) mare Algarade, Allada is a half-sister to winner Alinstante (Archipenko) and winner Alba Verde (Verglas). Yesterday's success provided Lanwades Stud stallion Sea The Moon (Sea The Stars) with a 26th individual stakes winner. He will stand the 2023 northern hemisphere breeding season for £25,000 (approx. AU\$44,350).

US: Aussies back in action on Day 3 at Keeneland

Australian interest regained momentum on the third day of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, with Craig Rounsefell's Boomer Bloodstock taking home Cantata (Medaglia D'Oro), catalogued as Hip 679, for US\$300,000 (approx. AU\$468,480), their second purchase

of the sale. Sold in foal to Ashford Stud's Munnings (Speightstown), Cantata is a dualwinning daughter of stakes winner Stoweshoe (Flatter), herself a sister to Distaff Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) winner Taris and half-sister to stakes winner Theatre Star (War Front). Another to make a second appearance at the sale was Newgate Farm as they went to US\$150,000 (approx. AU\$234,240) to acquire Hip 763, Global Brand (War Front), in conjunction with Australian-born Gavin Murphy's SF Bloodstock. A stakes-placed winner in foal to Coolmore stallion Caravaggio (Scat Daddy), Global Brand is a daughter of the Gamely Stakes (Gr 1, 9f) and Rodeo Drive Stakes (Gr 1, 10f) winner Marketing Mix (Medaglia D'Oro), who also finished runner-up in the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (Gr 1, 10f) in 2012. Meanwhile, Sheamus Mills Bloodstock made their maiden purchase of the sale when going to US\$250,000 (approx. AU\$390,400) for Lady Lilly (Nyquist), catalogued as Lot 807. The fouryear-old was placed in the Spinaway Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) as a two-year-old and, being a daughter of the stakes-placed winner Miss Inclined (Pulpit), is a half-sister to stakes winner Hollis (Street Sense).

US: World's best racehorse Flightline to stand at US\$200,000

Lane's End Farm has introduced the world's best racehorse Flightline (Tapit) at an opening fee of US\$200,000 (approx. AU\$312,380) following the superstar's retirement after his latest emphatic triumph in the Breeders' Cup Classic (Gr 1, 10f) last weekend. Bred by Summer Wind Equine and out of the Grade 3-winning Indian Charlie (In Excess) mare Feathered, Flightline cost US\$1 million at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, a seven-figure sum that was easily eclipsed when just a 2.5 per cent share in him sold to Brookdale Farm for US\$4.6 million (approx. AU\$7.18 million) at Keeneland on Monday. Flightline will join a power-packed roster at Lane's End which includes Quality Road (Elusive Quality), who will return to his 2020 fee of US\$200,000 (approx. AU\$312,380), and Candy Ride (Ride The Rails), the sire of second-season sire sensation Gun Runner, who will remain at US\$75,000 (approx. AU\$117,140).

IRE: Coolmore shuttler Saxon Warrior gains rise

A stellar year for No Nay Never (Scat Daddy) will see him jump to the head of affairs on Coolmore's Irish roster at a fee of €175,000 (approx. AU\$272,030), an increase of €50,000 from this year. Recently retired dual Group 1 winner Blackbeard (No Nay Never) will join his sire on the roster, being introduced at a fee of €25,000 (approx. AU\$38,860). Wootton Bassett (Iffraaj), who joined Coolmore from France in 2021, remains at €150,000 (approx. AU\$233,170) for a second consecutive season. There were also fee rises revealed for Churchill (Galileo) to €30,000 (approx. AU\$46,630), from €25,000 in 2022, Gleneagles (Galileo) €17,500 (approx. AU\$27,200) (from €15,000) and Starspangledbanner (Choisir) to €50,000 (approx. AU\$77,720) (from €35,000), while from the more senior ranks, Camelot (Montjeu) dips to €60,000 (approx. AU\$93,270) (from €75,000) along with Australia (Galileo) €25,000 (approx. AU\$38,860) (from €35,000) and Footstepsinthesand (Giant's Causeway) €10,000 (approx. AU\$15,540) (from €12,500).

FR: Mishriff introduced at €20,000 for first season at Sumbe

Three-time Group 1 winner Mishriff (Make Believe) has been introduced at an opening fee of €20,000 (approx. AU\$31,090) as the Sumbe operation revealed its fees for 2023. The

homebred son of Make Believe (Makfi) retired to Sumbe's Haras de Montfort et Preaux with seven wins and prize-money of £11,859,305 (approx. AU\$21.09 million) in a career that saw him win the Prix du Jockey Club (Gr 1, 2100m) at three before landing the Saudi Cup (1800m), Dubai Sheema Classic (Gr 1, 2400m) and International Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 2f) in a stellar campaign at four. Golden Horde, a son of Lethal Force (Dark Angel) who won the Richmond Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) at two and the Commonwealth Cup (Gr 1, 6f) at three, will retain his 2022 fee of €8,000 (approx. AU\$12,440), while Recorder (Galileo), winner of the Acomb Stakes (Gr 3, 7f) for the Queen and William Haggas, has had his fee trimmed to €3,000 (approx. AU\$4,660) from €4.000.

UK: National Stud reveal fees

The National Stud has confirmed their 2023 stud fees, with Little Avondale Stud shuttler Time Test (Dubawi) leading the way at an unchanged £15,000 (approx. AU\$26,620), and the addition of seven-time Group 1 winner Stradivarius (Sea The Stars) at £10,000 (approx. AU\$17,750). "Time Test has backed up his exciting start at stud with a number of high-class performers in his first two crops," head of bloodstock Joe Bradley said. "Crypto Force looks primed to build on his Group 2 Beresford Stakes win with a Classic campaign next season, and Rocchigiani was another 2022 highlight when winning the Group 3 Bonhams Thoroughbred Stakes at Glorious Goodwood, finishing in front of Group 1 Queen Elizabeth II Stakes winner Bayside Boy." Lope Y Fernandez (Lope De Vega), who was very well received by breeders covering a book of 134 mares in his first season, remains unchanged at £8,500 (approx. AU\$15,090).

IRE: Ballylinch Stud roster announced

Off the back of a brilliant Ascot Champions Day double, Ballylinch Stud's New Bay (Dubawi) has had his fee for 2023 doubled to stand for a career-high €75,000 (approx. AU\$116,730). The son of Dubawi (Dubai Millennium), who stood the 2022 breeding season for a fee of €37,500, sired his first elite-level winner when Saffron Beach landed the 2021 Sun Chariot

The second of New Bay's winners on Champions Day came in the form of Queen Elizabeth II Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) victor Bayside Boy, also the winner of the Champagne Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) at two and twice Group 1-placed that year. He has now been retired from the track and will stand alongside his sire at an introductory fee of €15,000 (approx. AU\$23,350). Meanwhile, the roster is again topped by lynchpin Lope De Vega (Shamardal), who remains unchanged at a fee of €125,000 (approx. AU\$194,550). Now 15, he is responsible for four top-level winners this term from 50 black-type performers.

FR: Thunder Moon a new addition to Haras de Bouquetot roster

Al Shaqab Racing yesterday announced fees for its roster in 2023 along with the news that National Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) winner Thunder Moon (Zoffany) will take up stallion duties at Haras de Bouquetot. Stud manager Benoit Jeffroy said: "We're delighted to welcome Thunder Moon at Haras de Bouquetot for 2023. He is a precocious horse of 15.3 hands who has shown plenty of speed winning the National Stakes, like Dubawi, Danehill Dancer and Teofilo did before him. We were looking for a Group 1 winner at two excelling over seven furlongs, not dissimilar to the profiles of recent French successes Wootton Bassett and Siyouni."

UK: Land Force fee unchanged

Land Force's (No Nay Never) fee for 2023 will remain steady at £5,000 (approx. AU\$8,865), Highclere Stud announced yesterday. The six-year-old won three of his nine starts on the track, most notably the Richmond Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) at Glorious Goodwood. Highclere's Jake Warren said: "Land Force's fee will remain at £5,000 1st Oct SLF for the 2023 season. His yearlings have sold extremely well this autumn, averaging £36,008, which is seven times his stud fee. His highest-price lot was 180,000gns and his incredible immediate family have produced two Group 1-winning two-year-old colts this year in Auguste Rodin and Victoria Road."

UK: Belardo to stand at Bearstone Stud for 2023

Dual Group 1 winner Belardo (Lope De Vega) is on the move from Darley's Kildangan Stud and will stand at Bearstone Stud for 2023 at a fee of £6,500 (approx. AU\$11,560), it was announced yesterday. The son of Lope De Vega had been standing in Ireland since his retirement from racing in 2017 and from his first three crops he has sired the winners of more than £2.5 million, including six Group or Graded scorers. Out of the Groupplaced Danehill (Danzig) mare Danaskaya and a half-brother to Scandinavian Group 3 winner Berling (Montjeu), Belardo was bred by Ballylinch Stud and sold to Ted Voute for €100,000 at Arqana's August Yearling Sale in 2013.

UK: Moroneys purchase Group 1 winner Alenquer

Alenquer (Adlerflug), winner of the Tattersalls Gold Cup (Gr 1, 1m 2.5f), has been sold to continue his career in Australia at Mike Moroney's Melbourne stable. Previously trained by William Haggas for Kuwaiti owners Mubarak Alarou and Mussad Almutair, who purchased Alenquer for 80,000 gns as a yearling, he was last seen finishing ninth in October's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Bloodstock agent Paul Moroney, brother of Mike Moroney, labelled Alenguer a "proper horse". Writing on Twitter, he said: "Delighted to announce that in conjunction with [Mike Moroney] we have secured high-class European Group 1-winner Alenguer to race in Australia. He heads south next month to aim for the Sydney autumn carnival." Alenguer is the latest in a line of quality British runners to be bought to race in Australia. Soulcombe (Frankel), who was also trained by Haggas, joined Chris Waller last month and made a winning debut for new connections in the Queen's Cup (Gr 3, 2600m) at Flemington last weekend. Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) second Hoo Ya Mal (Territories) and dual Listed winner Fancy Man (Pride Of Dubai) are other stakes performers to have recently left Britain to race in Australia, while the likes of Waterville (Camelot) and Earl Of Tyrone (Australia) have been purchased out of Ireland.

UK: Arc heroine Alpinista retired as injury rules out Japan Cup bid

Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Alpinista (Frankel) has been retired with immediate effect after sustaining a minor injury in the build-up to her planned swansong in the Japan Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) later this month. Trained by Sir Mark Prescott for owner-breeder Kirsten Rausing, Alpinista scored six times at Group 1 level, with her finest moment coming at Longchamp last month when winning the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe under jockey Luke Morris. "Unfortunately Alpinista has suffered a slight setback and will not now be able to take her chance in the Japan Cup," Prescott said. "It's a great shame as the JRA have been fantastic in making arrangements for the trip and I can't thank them enough. Alpinista was exercised this morning but has now been retired to stud where she will join the great broodmare band of Miss Rausing."

UK: Baaeed crowned Cartier Horse of the Year

Baaeed (Sea The Stars) was the toast of the 32nd Cartier Racing Awards when crowned Horse of the Year and Older Horse of the Year at the Dorchester Hotel in London on Wednesday evening. The retired son of Sea The Stars (Cape Cross) is the first horse owned by Shadwell to receive the prestigious Horse of the Year award following an outstanding season that resulted in four Group 1 wins. Baaeed, who was trained by William Haggas, saw off tough opposition to claim the main accolade, with Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Alpinista, Ascot Gold Cup (Gr 1, 2m 4f) hero Kyprios (Galileo) and prolific sprinter Highfield Princess (Night Of Thunder) also nominated. Baaeed also edged out Alpinista to bag the older horse title, in which his Champion Stakes conqueror Bay Bridge and the versatile Kinross (Kingman) also received nominations. The Cartier Two-Year-Old Filly prize was won by Zoustar's (Northern Meteor) daughter Lezoo, who was last seen winning the Cheveley Park Stakes (Gr 1, 6f). She saw off Commissioning (Kingman), Tahiyra (Siyouni) and The Platinum Queen (Cotai Glory) to claim the award. Other winners included Vadeni (Churchill), Inspiral (Frankel) and Blackbeard.

ia Ora Stud's Shane Wright gained a great deal of satisfaction from the VRC Oaks result last week despite the Scone farm's homebred filly Pavitra (American Pharoah) coming off second best to the Anthony Cummings-trained She's Extreme (Extreme Choice).

"I am pretty happy after the Oaks. We bred the second placegetter and we bought the dam of the winner [Keysbrook for \$825,000 at this year's Chairman's Sale]," Wright reflected.

"When you see your colours getting beaten, if there's one in the race to be beaten by, it was the one who won it, so it was a pretty good day."

Pavitra, a half-sister to Newgate Farm's Group 1-winning sprinter Wild Ruler (Snitzel), has a big future for trainers Richard and Will Freedman, according to Wright.

The three-year-old had her first start in mid-July as a late season juvenile, finishing fifth in a Goulburn maiden won by Kurt Goldman's promising filly Negation (Hellbent), before progressing to wins at Newcastle and Kembla Grange and placings in the Ethereal Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m), the Wakeful Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) and the Oaks at starts six, seven and eight for the preparation.

"We knew our filly Pavitra would stay all day, so the game plan was to put her out in front and try to make it as good a staying test as we could. There was no other speed there with us, so there was only so much Jamie [Kah, jockey] could do, and it was a brilliant ride," Wright said.

"When She's Extreme came at her, she put in a bit of a fight, but we were only in our first prep, we're not the finished article.

"She's Extreme was phenomenal and it was a huge result for Anthony [Cummings] and the whole team at Dorrington Farm [who co-own the filly]."

xpatriate New Zealand trainer Simon Dunderdale, whose thoughts on racing in Kuala Lumpur feature earlier in this edition, was hoping to campaign his best horse, stakes-winning sprinter Awesome Storm who is by little-known sire Phenomenons (Giant's Causeway), in Bahrain this year.

A equine travel ban out of Malaysia, however, has so far skittled Dunderdale's international ambitions.

"About three years ago there was African horse sickness in Malaysia which meant horses aren't allowed to leave Malaysia once they've arrived here," he said.

"Basically polo ponies tested positive to African horse sickness, but they were actually vaccinated before they came, so when they tested them here they still had the antibodies in their blood, the vaccine."

The lifting of the ban on travelling horses is imminent but it hasn't arrived in time for Awesome Storm to race in the Persian Gulf.

"When he came here [from Victoria as a Benalla maiden winner] he was way too good for our racing and we were planning on taking him to Bahrain or Dubai and try him there because he's pretty smart," he said.

"That was the plan as I think he's good enough. I am not saying he'd win Group 1s, but his times were fast enough to warrant having a go overseas.

"There's a nice little carnival there in Bahrain and it would have been spot on with his handicap rating. He has won seven out of eight here and the top few horses in Kuala Lumpur would match up, so hopefully we can do something like that in the future."

As for residing and working in Kuala Lumpur, Dunderdale says the Malaysian capital is a fantastic place to live and, in comparison to other major Asian cities, is relatively cheap.

Staffing at his stable is made up of a lot of foreign workers, but he says KL trainers don't encounter the same shortages as many of his industry counterparts in Australia and New Zealand.

"It has been hard post-Covid, but it is picking up now. We have a lot of foreign workers from Bangladesh and India and places like that. Probably 50 per cent of my staff are from Bangladesh and they're really good," he says.

"The boys can actually do all right if they look after a horse who becomes a good horse. They get bonuses and things like that.

"Staffing is not the issue here that it is in Australia."

ormer New Zealand foreign minister and leader of the New Zealand First party Winston Peters - often seen as a champion of the New Zealand racing industry while in parliament -could be making a comeback to politics, reportedly portraying himself as the country's 'white knight'.

Ousted at the last election in October 2020, Peters had been instrumental in appointing Australian racing figure John Messara to devise a 'rescue plan' for the local racing industry in 2018. Large parts of Messara's report are yet to be enacted, but some changes were implemented, or well on their way, when he failed to retain his seat in parliament.

Now, aged 77, Peters has a chance of returning as part of the New Zealand First party's resurrection at the 2023 general election.

It registered 6.75 per cent support in recent polling, with Peters himself favoured as the preferred prime minister over incumbent Jacinda Ardern and her rival Christopher Luxon.

It's dangerous venturing into politics at any time – and only a few days out from attending the NZB Ready to Run Sale for the first time since 2019 - but from my experience whenever Ardern's name is uttered at or by the Kiwis in the breeding game, the response is rarely kind.

lightline's Breeders' Cup Classic victory at Keeneland on Saturday was one for the ages, as the Aussie contingent effusively told us in the aftermath of the scarcely believable display here.

The unbeaten son of Tapit, who was retired to Lane's End Farm, had a 2.5 per cent share in the four-year-old sell for US\$4.6 million (approx. AU\$7.07 million) at Keeneland on Monday, which values the stallion at AU\$285 million. When unbeaten Triple Crown winner

Justify was sold to Coolmore, the deal reportedly valued him at AU\$100 million.

As Henry Field told us, Flightline almost certainly won't leave Lane's End now that he's there, so shuttling is well and truly out of the question.

Maybe some Australasian breeders may attempt to access Flightline on a southern hemisphere cover at Lane's End.

When this angle was put forward, agent Andrew Williams, who is also US auction house Fasig-Tipton's Australian representative, instead suggested Three Chimneys Farm's Gun Runner (Candy Ride), the sire of 14 stakes winners from just two crops of racing age.

"Gun Runner's probably more suited to southern hemisphere, or closer to it," he said.

As for Williams being at Keeneland for the Breeders' Cup meeting, he reflected: "I was there to see Zenyatta get beaten [in 2010 for the first and only time in 20 starts], and that was the most unbelievable experience, but to see Flightline was even better."

agic Millions released its catalogue for the 2023 Gold Coast Yearling Sale on Tuesday and, as expected, it's impressive on quality and quantity. Inglis will no doubt be releasing its Classic sale offering in the near future, too.

Invariably, when the new sales season is on our doorstep, the likely market conditions – and it's been booming in Australia except for a brief period of uncertainty in the months after the onset of Covid in March 2020 – become a talking point.

Segenhoe Stud's Peter O'Brien, always good for a one-liner or two, is confident that, despite higher interest rates and more pessimism in the wider economy, next year's sales will maintain strong buyer demand.

"You just have to look at the Fasig-Tipton [and Keeneland] sales to see how strong that market is," he said.

"Every year you think it has to level out a bit and probably next year could be that year, but I don't think it'll drop.

"With the 31 yearlings we have going to Magic Millions, it's probably the first draft in my life I can say that I'd happily own any of them.

"There's no tail, they're all specifically selected for the sale and we're going into the sale with a huge amount of confidence."

etr, the News Limited and Matt Tripp-owned start-up corporate bookmaker, certainly made a splash with its sign-up promotions and an expensive marketing campaign, with suggestions it had attracted as many as 300,000 account holders in the couple of weeks since opening.

The 20-1 about Anamoe (max bet \$10) to win the Cox Plate and 100-1 about any Melbourne Cup runner (again \$10 max bet) had people talking – and betting, it seems, including myself.

Alas, my "free" \$1000 fell into the abyss courtesy of Deauville Legend's solid, albeit losing, run, but a few (three) winners out wide for small sums must have had the Betr team seeing red.

No promos, protest payouts or bonus bets on my account when I logged in this week. It's not a surprise, nor is it the first and it's unlikely to be the last time it's happened to me, but they did chop the so-called generosities in record time

Betr? Certainly not – just more of the same in an already crowded market.
