'Dean, your smile made us smile'

Dean Holland after winning the Newmarket Handicap with In Secret

Racing industry mourns death of 'gifted' rider Dean Holland after tragic racing incident at Donald





he racing industry in Victoria and across Australia has been left in shock and sadness after popular rider Dean Holland died from injuries sustained in a fall during the opening race on the card at Donald yesterday.

Holland, 34, was aboard three-year-old gelding Headingley (Caravaggio) when the horse veered left in the home straight of the 1000-metre maiden contest, crashing into the rail and causing Holland to be dislodged from the saddle.

Holland was treated by paramedics on the course, but he was pronounced dead at the scene.

<< Continued from page 2 The incident also resulted in Alana Kelly being brought down from her mount, Time To Rumble (Rich Enuff), with the rider walking away from the event without serious harm.

A joint statement released by Racing Victoria and the Victorian Jockeys' Association at 4.52pm yesterday afternoon confirmed the death of the two-time Group 1-winning rider, who is survived by his wife, Lucy, and four children.

"It is with tremendous sadness that Racing Victoria (RV) and the Victorian Jockeys Association (VJA) confirm the passing of 34-year-old jockey Dean Holland as a result of injuries sustained in a fall at Donald Racecourse today," the statement read.

"Holland was one of two riders dislodged from their horse in the opening race. He was immediately attended to by on-course paramedics, however was unable to be saved due to the nature of his injuries.

"Jockey Alana Kelly, who was the other rider to fall in the incident, was cleared of any serious injuries. Both horses, Headingley and Time To Rumble, were unharmed."

Racing at the west Victoria track was subsequently abandoned, while Racing Victoria has called off the meetings at Flemington and Moe scheduled for today, out of respect to Holland and his family.

Holland, who made his riding debut in December 2005, rode 1,118 winners during his career, headlined by his two Group 1 successes in the 2010 Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2006m) aboard Small Minds (Canny Lad) - on whom he also won his first stakes race 12 days prior in the Adelaide Guineas (Listed, 1600m) - and most recently when partnering champion filly In Secret (I Am Invincible) to win the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) last month.

Among the rider's other notable successes was victory in the Geelong Cup (Gr 3, 2400m) during the 2021 spring carnival aboard Tralee Rose (Tavistock), while he twice landed his hometown Cup in Adelaide, firstly in 2015 when partnering Tanby (Galileo), and again in 2019 with Surprise Baby (Shocking).

RV chief executive, Andrew Jones, said: "On behalf of the Victorian racing industry, I would like to extend our prayers and heartfelt condolences to Dean's partner Lucy, his children, his family, friends and colleagues on the incredibly sad news of his passing.

"It was a tragic accident at Donald today and we are all deeply shocked and saddened that Dean has passed away as a result of injuries sustained in the fall.

"Dean was a gifted lightweight rider who won over 1,000 races and was highly respected by his peers. He showcased his immense talent on the biggest stage last month when winning the Group 1 Newmarket Handicap at Flemington.

"Dean's passing is heartbreaking for all within Victorian racing and the sport nationally. It is a sobering reminder of the immense bravery of our riders."

Matt Hyland, Victorian Jockeys Association chief executive, said: "The VJA and our members are incredibly saddened by the loss of our colleague and friend Dean Holland and extend our heartfelt condolences to his partner Lucy, his four children and his wider family.

"Dean was a much-loved member of the riding group here in Victoria and when he travelled interstate. His fellow riders will all be shattered at the shock news of his passing as we at the VJA are.

"Together with Racing Victoria, the Jockey Assistance Program will be wrapping its arms around the riding group and will be working to support Lucy and the Holland family both now and importantly into the future."

Tributes from industry participants to Holland, who was the son of former jockey Darren Holland, poured in throughout yesterday evening.

Tony and Calvin McEvoy, the trainers of Headingley, and who Holland rode 47 winners for, said in a post to Twitter: "The whole McEvoy Mitchell Racing team are sending our love and thoughts to Dean's family, Lucy, their four kids, Darren and (mother) Belinda. *Continued on page 5>>*

Racing cancelled in Victoria

Race meetings at Flemington and Moe scheduled for today have been cancelled following the death of rider Dean Holland at Donald yesterday. The race meeting at Flemington was due to stage the VRC St Leger (Listed, 2800m) and the ANZAC Day Stakes (Listed, 1400m). A further update as to the rescheduling of the ANZAC Day race meetings will be announced in due course.

Jennilala headlines Australasian Oaks nominations

Last-start Auraria Stakes (Gr 3, 1800m) winner Jennilala (Shalaa) leads 37 nominations for Saturday's Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) at Morphettville. The Ciaron Maher and David Eustace-trained filly won the traditional lead-up race at the same venue on April 15, defeating Arugamama (Churchill) and Let'sbefrankbaby (Frankel), who are also nominated for the race. Western Australian Derby (Gr 2, 2400m) winner She's Fit (Pride Of Dubai) is also among the nominations, along with the Edward Cummings-trained Arts (Xtravagant). A maximum of 16 fillies will contest the Group 1 feature.

Paulele among Victory Stakes nominations

Paulele (Dawn Approach), who is set to stand on Darley's Northwood Park roster this breeding season, is among 11 nominations for Saturday's Victory Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Eagle Farm, as the Queensland winter carnival gets under way. The four-year-old entire, who won the Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at

Ascot in November, is joined by import A Case Of You (Hot Streak) among the nominations for co-trainers Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr. The five-year-old finished fifth on his Australian debut in the William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) last month. Group 1 winners Rothfire (Rothesay) and Private Eye (Al Maher) hold a nomination, along with New Zealand raider Dragon Leap (Pierro).

Moroney trio set for Queensland

Mike Moroney will send Banker's Choice (Mongolian Khan), Roch 'N' Horse (Per Incanto) and Milford (Savabeel) north for the upcoming Queensland winter carnival. Ballarat Cup (Listed, 2000m) winner Banker's Choice has been earmarked for three runs in Brisbane, while Roch 'N' Horse, the winner of last year's Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) and Champions Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m), will likely target the Doomben 10,000 (Gr 1, 1200m). "[Bankers Choice] will go to the (AD) Hollindale (Stakes) into the Doomben Cup and then possibly into the Q22 race as well. That would be his three main races I would think," Moroney told Racing.com. The Victoria-based trainer also has intentions to send Milford to the Q22 (Gr 2, 2200m). The five-year-old was due to contest the Les Carlyon Handicap (1700m) at Flemington today, but the race has now been postponed.

McEwen Stakes for Giga Kick

Group 1-winning gelding Giga Kick (Scissor Kick) is set to kick off his spring campaign at Moonee Valley in the McEwen Stakes (Gr 2, 1000m) in a preparation that will be aimed at winning his second Everest (1200m). The three-year-old was last seen winning the All Aged Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Randwick on April 15, after a narrow second placing to the world's highest-rated sprinter I Wish I Win (Savabeel) in the TJ Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m). Giga Kick remains in work for trainer Clayton Douglas who will run his star sprinter one more time this campaign in the Doomben 10,000 (Gr 1, 1200m) next month.

Prebble to ride Cannonball

Champion rider Brett Prebble will ride James Harron's colt Cannonball (Capitalist) in the King's Stand Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) at Royal Ascot in June. Trained by Peter and Paul Snowden, Cannonball was last seen finishing third in The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) and boasts two stakes victories next to his name. Cannonball will join Coolangatta (Written Tycoon) who is also set to contest the King's Stand Stakes, while fellow Australian gallopers Artorius (Flying Artie) and The Astrologist (Zoustar) are set to run in the Platinum Jubilee Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on the final race-day of the carnival.

Spain suspended

Zac Spain has been suspended for eight meetings after pleading guilty to careless riding aboard Darra Linden (Puissance De Lune) at Sale on Sunday. The jockey rode a trio of winners this weekend, including I'mlovin'ya (Capitalist) in the Redleva Stakes (Listed, 1100m). Spain will be sidelined from April 27 until May 4, meaning he will miss the Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) at Morphettville this week.

ATC's slot for The Everest up for grabs

The Australian Turf Club's Everest slot is up for grabs this year, after the three-year-deal with Everest-winning owner Bon Ho has ceased. The club has shown interest in locking in champion sprinter Nature Strip (Nicconi), a past winner of the race himself, who has contested the rich prize in all of its last four runnings. Trainer Chris Waller has confirmed the plan to bring the gelding back for another Spring Carnival assault and an attempt to run in a record-breaking fifth Everest.

Racing's Night of Champions date finalised

The NSW Racehorse Owners Association will hold their annual Night of Champions on Thursday, August 31, in the Royal Randwick ballroom. The awards evening will reveal the winners of ten categories, including the NSW Horse of the Year. This year, the gala dinner is supporting the KARI Foundation, a non-profit organisation dedicated to supporting and empowering Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities to access resources,

support and opportunities to help them each their full potential. The foundation provides a range of services and programs that are designed to address the unique needs and challenges faced by Indigenous communities. The KARI Foundation has also worked with the racing industry to place numerous young Aboriginal people into employment in training stables, and is always looking for partnership opportunities that will benefit the community. Tickets will be available in July and are priced at \$295 per person.

Mapperley Stud release 2023 roster

apperley Stud has released the fee for their resident stallions Contributer (High Chaparral) and Armory (Galileo) - along with Profondo (Deep Impact), who they own in partnership with Windsor Park Stud.

On the back of his seventh stakes winner, She's A Con in the Warstep Stakes (Listed, 2000m), Contributer will stand for \$18,000 (plus GST) this season, a \$2,000 drop on his 2022 service fee of \$20,000 (plus GST).

"Contributer continues to impress with another strong year of results on the racetrack. If you look at his statistics, on his current trajectory, he's performing better or at least on par with the elite sons of High Chaparral across the key performance measures. They are pretty significant sires he's being compared to, the likes of So You Think, Toronado, and Dundeel," Mapperley Stud principal Simms Davison said.

"If you take this into account, his fee of \$18,000 is enormous value for breeders. We think he will be the value stallion in New Zealand this year, considering the excellent job he's done so far."

Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) runner-up Armory will stand for \$10,000 (plus GST), a fee unchanged from his first season at stud, where he covered 127 mares.

"Breeders really got behind him in his first year which is extremely rewarding. He's an excellent physical type and breeders gravitate to that as we all want to breed strong, goodlooking athletes for the racetrack." Davison said.

"We are now eagerly anticipating his first foals in August, it's always an exciting time for the stud and we have full confidence in him producing some ripping types."

Profondo will stand his first season at stud at Windsor Park Stud for a fee of \$17,500 (plus GST), but Davison says the response from breeders has been extraordinary and that his book has already closed.

"We have had an overwhelming response from breeders since announcing he was coming to New Zealand, due to the extreme demand for his services he now has a closed book." Davison said.

Impressive trial winner to debut



Just A Floozie

Regally bred filly Just A Floozie (I Am Invincible) will make her eagerly anticipated debut in today's Avondale Classic (1200m). Trained by Peter and Dawn Williams, the juvenile has won two of her three trial outings, the latest over 800 metres at Avondale, in which she won by four and a half lengths. Just A Floozie is the second foal out of Thorndon Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Thee Auld Floozie (Mastercraftsman), with Peter Williams believing she has been blessed with plenty of her dam's ability. "She can sit in behind them or lead, she's pretty adaptable from what we've seen at the trials so far," he said. "She's just a lovely type of filly and has been pretty professional so we'll wait and see what happens, but she seems to be a pretty smart type. This is her third prep and she's pretty straightforward, she's done everything very well. She looks an exciting filly, but we've had a fair bit of rain, so we'll have to wait and see how the track comes up. Soft ground will be fine and Avondale is a good track." Just A Floozie was bred by James Chapman's Jamieson Park, who remain in the ownership group after she failed to meet her \$500,000 reserve at New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sale at Karaka.

HK: Blinkers on for Kiwi Aegon in Champions Mile

Aegon (Sacred Falls) will race in blinkers for the first time when the Andrew Forsman-trained five-year-old takes his chance in Sunday's Champions Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) at Sha Tin.

"Aegon is certainly going into a different environment on a long 'prep' and does seem at a bit of a disadvantage, but he is pretty well travelled and laidback and it looks like he has settled in quite well but it's only early days," the trainer said yesterday. "He is pretty straightforward and it will be a small field and you just hope by putting the blinkers on it switches him on and he gets him to travel at that important part of the race. He tends to get back a little bit and that's probably why we opted to go to Hong Kong rather than a big field in the Doncaster [Handicap]. With a smaller field the logic is that if he can draw well, he won't be too far off them even if he is a little bit slowly away. Hopefully, he can be positive and take a position that he hasn't probably been able to do in his last couple of starts."

HK: Lucky Sweynesse chasing Speed Series bonus

Lucky Sweynesse (Sweynesse) will attempt to join elite company with victory in Sunday's Chairman's Sprint Prize (Gr 1, 1200m) at Sha Tin. Triumphant in the first two legs of Hong Kong's three-race Speed Series, the Manfred Man-trained four-year-old has swiftly become the city's premier sprinter and success this weekend under Zac Purton will see him net a HK\$5 million (approx. AU\$953,820) bonus, in addition to the HK\$11.4 million (approx. AU\$2.17 million) winner's cheque. "It'd be nice and I'm sure the owners would be happy if it happened," Purton said. "He's going well, he ticks over quite nicely – he just does his job in the mornings. It looks like it is a suitable race for him and hopefully he can draw well and more importantly get out of the gates cleanly. He's a bit frustrating out of the gates. He got it wrong last time, so he's due to get it right this time."

UK: Leading Derby hope Epictetus lines up at Epsom

Last season's Vertim Futurity Trophy (Gr 1, 1m) runner-up Epictetus (Kingman) will put his Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) credentials to the test when he heads to that track for today's Blue Riband Trial (Listed, 1m 2f). Trained in partnership by John Gosden and his son Thady, Epictetus, who is as short as 16-1 for the Classic on June 3, looks certain to go off warm order when he tackles five rivals this afternoon.



Onward and upward

hey're nice foals and if they can run it will be all on. He probably represents the best value of any stallion in the country. He can only go one way and that is upwards."

Those were the comments from Waikato Stud's Mark Chittick in May 2021, when the first foals by Ardrossan (Redoute's Choice) were at the weaning stage.

At the same time, Chittick added: "He fits a similar profile to Centaine, who had 34 foals his first year [Ardrossan had 39] and had an amazing first crop of 12 stakes winners."

Chittick's latter comment is some time from being realised, but his former comment is already true as the stallion is off to a more than promising start.

From nine runners, Ardrossan can boast two stakes winners, the first being Waikato Stud's own Codigo, winner of the Wellesley Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Trentham, a couple of weeks before the 2023 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale. Codigo has had just the two starts and remains unbeaten and his stakes result was timely for the seven Ardrossan Book 1 lots offered and sold. Their top price was \$260,000 and two further lots fetched \$130,000 and \$190,000.

Of the 12 lots in Book 2, ten sold and the top two made \$150,000 and \$135,000. Considering that Ardossan's fee in 2020 was a paltry \$3,000, breeders made huge gains.

On the other hand, Loch Katrina was purchased at the 2022 Book 2 sale for not much money, in fact realising just \$6,000. That's the difference when stakes results begin to take place.

Ardrossan's initial fee (2019) began at \$8,000 (all fees plus GST), but due to the Covid pandemic and the great uncertainty prevailing throughout 2020 and 2021, Waikato Stud went low, hence Chittick's "best value" line.

For 2022, the fee was increased, to \$6,000, but that, too, backs Chittick's comment that there is only one way and that is upwards.

The nine runners of his first crop also include a third winner and two placegetters, so his fee has been increased to \$10,000 for 2023. The upside remains and in this writer's opinion, he still represents value.

The stallion's second stakes winner, Loch Katrine, was tough in Saturday's Champagne Stakes (Listed, 1600m). She had to be. The two-year-olds were faced with a slog through a Heavy 10 track.

Twice placed prior to her breakthrough, she was beaten by a head on debut, coincidentally at Pukekohe also on a Heavy 10 surface, last month. At her second start she ran third on top of the ground at Ruakaka.

In the Champagne Stakes she outstayed them. She was a handy third early, before drifting to share sixth (two out) at the end of the back straight. From the 800 metres, she went forward (wide) and from the 600 was widest, but at the top of the straight was almost level with the leader. Michael McNab urged her to a narrow lead inside the 300 metres, fought off a solid challenge at the 200 metres, then stayed on best for a tough win.

"She got through the ground okay, but she's not very big and is pretty good on a better track, so I made a point of trying to keep her in fresh ground," said McNab. "I kept her rolling and she was just so tough the last bit."

In another coincidence, Loch Katrine's dam, five-race winner Cong'er (Zenno Rob Roy) scored her most important win, the Listed Karaka Classic at Pukekohe, over the same 1600 metres, also on a heavy track, back in 2012.

Since being retired to stud, Cong'er has had three foals to the races for two winners. Cong'er ranks as a half-sister to Trentham Group 3 winner Bahira (Volksraad) and their dam, Conifer Bay (Virginia Privateer), was a Group 1 winner of the Championship Stakes (2100m) at Ellerslie and ran second to Dundeel's (High Chaparral) grandam, Staring (Fiesta Star), in the 1992 New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m).

Conifer Bay is from a half-sister to the good stayer, Group 2 winner Northfleet (Kazakstaan), winner of nine races and who ran second in the Wellington Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) and third in the Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m).

Almanzors please Cambridge Stud

Pukekohe's staying test for the three-yearolds, the Championship Stakes (Gr 3, 2100m) resulted in another maiden winner, Cheval D'Or (Almanzor). Although the only non-winner in the field of ten, due to her recent form she was installed as the favourite and that support proved fully justified when she took command over the final 100 metres in a strong win.

Her five lead up races included a solid last-start third in the Manawatu Classic (Gr 3, 2000m) and in the start before that, a game fourth in the Sunline Vase (Gr 3, 2100m). Her first three races saw her run twice third and once second so the filly is honest and consistent.

In the Championship Stakes, she was midfield with a lap to run but was pushed back to third-last starting the back straight, holding there (wide) to the end of the back straight. Jockey Michael McNab sent her forward from the 800 metres and inside the 600 metres was widest, but gaining on the leaders. Into the straight she was third, challenged and grabbed the lead at the 200 metres then asserted her authority over the final 100 for the win.

McNab was impressed with the filly: "When Tony [Pike] gave me the colours, I asked him what he thought and he said he thought she would love the wet track. He wasn't wrong, as the whole way she just travelled beautifully."

Cheval D'Or became the eighth individual stakes winner for Almanzor (Wootton Bassett), his third in Australasia and second this season, the other being Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) winner, Manzoice.

Maintaining the "onward and upward theme", it is easy to forget that Almanzor has just two crops to the races. It seems as if he has been around a lot longer but that could be due to his impact at the sales with his initial crop. It is only 14 months since his Dynastic impressively won the Karaka 2YO Million (RL, 1200m), then was narrowly defeated by the very good filly, Licketysplit (Turn Me Loose), in the Sistema Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m).

Cambridge Stud CEO, Henry Plumptre, had several illuminating comments for Kiwi Chronicles when we contacted him after Cheval D'Or's nice win: "When Dynastic won the Karaka Million, it was against the run of play for a big leggy colt who looked like a Classic horse as a yearling, but performed like a precocious two-year-old to win the Million."

"The remainder of his first-crop two-yearolds were relatively quiet, but we received very positive feedback from a number of trainers in New Zealand and Australia that his progeny, while not necessarily precocious, were going to make lovely three-year-olds," said Plumptre. "The fact that the buying bench stepped up again gave us confidence that both Australian and New Zealand trainers liked his stock."

"Almanzor's record this season is, perhaps, frustrating but overall, hugely impressive from a horse that was always destined to become a sire of middle-distance Classic horses, if he was anything at all."

The son of Wootton Bassett (Iffraaj) has been represented by a flurry of black-type performers as three-year-olds. Apart from Manzoice, Almanzor's stock have added four Australasian Group 1 Classic placings this season.

Virtuous Circle ran second in the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m); Andalus ran second in the New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m); Mehzebeen ran second in the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) and Blue Solitaire ran third in the New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m).

Further Group placed performers are Holymanz, Marvelouz, Safura and Devildom. Frustrating, maybe, but they can run and when tried over the longer distances, are way above average.

We should not be surprised that the Almanzors have shown their ability at three and over some ground. Although he scored at two, the Listed Grand Criterium de Bordeaux was over 1600 metres and his three Group 1 victories the following season were at 2100 metres and ten furlongs (2000 metres).

Plumptre concurred, wrapping up his comments with: "It is interesting that his best form at three was in the latter stages of the season – in the two Champion Stakes at Leopardstown and Ascot, beating the older horses and a total of 11 Group winners. We are excited about the future as we know there is an abundance of good types developing in stables across Australia and New Zealand and we are delighted that so many owners have had the benefit and excitement of owning a stakes horse by him."

High expectations

Cheval D'Or's trainer, Tony Pike, took a fancy to the first crop of Almanzor, outlaying \$645,000 for three lots. In conjunction with The Oaks Stud, Cheval D'or accounted for \$420,000 of that total, the equal second top-priced lot by the stallion. The other \$420,000 lot was for Andalus (see above).

Nine Book 1 lots that year made \$300,000 or more, so, much was expected, including Cheval D'Or who has quite a family to back up her price.

Her dam, Keepa Cheval (Keeper) has had seven to the races for seven winners. They include Cheval D'Or's half-brother the triple Group 1-winning sprinter, The Bostonian (Jimmy Choux). Her half-sister, Vitesse (Makfi), is the dam of Kovalica (Ocean Park), a Group 3 winner in Brisbane last season.

Keepa Cheval's half-sister is the mighty Champion Sprinter-Miler and ten-times Group 1 winner, King Mufhasa (Pentire) as well as Belle Joie (Mellifont), dam of Sacred Satono (Satono Aladdin), a Group 3 winner this season.

There was always going to be residual value in purchasing Cheval D'Or, given her close relatives. Now that she is a Group 3 winner herself, with plenty of potential, The Oaks Stud have a very valuable future broodmare.

Her immediate future depends on how she pulls up after the win. "We've been over in Brisbane a few times when conditions haven't been ideal so it's nice to know you can cop a track like that," said Pike. "She has form on good ground, so is very versatile and as long as she pulls up well there is no reason why we won't go. She has been a little unlucky not to win a race before today and as a slow-maturing filly she is now starting to put things together. It is six weeks until the Queensland Oaks, so we might consider running her in The Roses [Gr.2, 2000m] first."

Quietly good

The third stakes race on Saturday's Pukekohe card resulted in a very solid win by White Noise (El Roca) who is putting together a nice record. The Easter Handicap (Gr 3, 1600m) was his career sixth win and third stakes win in 20 starts.

The four-year-old was given a gun ride by Michael McNab and proved too good and too strong. He was third early (two out) and held his position from the 1200 metres to the 800-metre mark, where he moved up to second. Rounding into the straight he levelled up, took the lead at the top of the straight and dared his opponents to run him down. They couldn't and he had the race well under control from the 200 metres and was increasing his lead at the line.

McNab was pretty confident at the halfway mark, "Once I started tracking up coming to the bend it was pretty easy from there."

Twice a stakes winner last season at three, including the Wellington Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m), White Noise was tried in Sydney at the back end of his three-year-old preparation but is probably not really a stayer, showing nothing in the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m).

Back home at four last spring, he won and ran second then was given another two-race campaign, this time in Victoria. After a fair third in the Sale Cup (Listed, 1600m) he showed little at Listed level at Flemington and returned home.

Saturday's return to form was his fourth start back and judging from the ease of this latest success, let's hope he is back on track. The talent is there.

Winning trainer Andrew Forsman summed up White Noise's return to form: "We asked a fair bit of him in the spring and we brought him home and gave him another prep, which probably wasn't the right thing to do. We backed off him and he has come back in good order."

White Noise is the second of two winners from his dam, White Nymph (Sir Percy), whose half-sister, Queen Takes King (Charm Spirit), recorded stakes-placings in provincial Western Australia. His third dam, the Italian Group 3 winner, Spring (Sadler's Wells), is a half-sister to the successful sire and dual Group 1 winner Pentire (Be My Guest).

Never say die

On a day of testing conditions, toughness was on display all the way up the Riccarton straight for the running of the Warstep Stakes (Listed, 2000m).

Two fillies, She's A Con (Contributer) and Luella Christina (Snitzel), were in a race of their own from the 300 metres and provided a thrilling finish. Luella Christina led at the 300. She's A Con led narrowly from the 200 metres to the just short of the 100 metres, but was headed for a stride or two by Luella Christina. Undaunted, the former fought back hard to land her maiden stakes win and second career win in seven starts, the first two well clear of the rest.

Co-trainer Kelvin Tyler had a measure of confidence heading into the race. "I knew she would be tough enough. I also knew the 2000 metres wouldn't bother her, as she was wide and did it tough over the mile last time and got the win."

She's A Con marks the seventh individual stakes winner for Contributer (High Chaparral), but more importantly his fifth this season alone. He is, indeed, a contributor and She's A Con's earnings pushed the stallion's current season New Zealand earnings beyond \$1 million and up to 14th on the sire list.

His overall winners/runners ratio stands at 71 per cent (71 from 109 runners). His stakes winners/runners ratio is 6.4 per cent and stakes performers/runners ratio is 13.7 per cent. His New Zealand stats are better still and such growing results are making Contributer a desirable stallion.

She's A Con's has three Group 1 winners close up in her family. Her dam is a half-sister to the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner, Sleek Chassis (Flying Spur), while her granddam is a half-sister to Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) winner, Marble Halls (Nassipour) and to Ocean Dream (Redoute's Choice), the dam of 2018 Caulfield's The Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner, Amphitrite (Sebring).

Her third dam ranks as a three-quarter sister to the prolific winner, Powley (Noble Bijou), whose 17 wins and six seconds in 28 starts included the New Zealand 1,000 Guineas.

Australian mares prove their worth once more

hile Liberty Island (Duramente), the Oka Sho (Gr 1, 1600m) winner out of Australian-bred Group 1 winner Yankee Rose (All American), is becoming a star amid the three-year-old ranks in Japan this season, a southern hemisphere mare is once again proving their worth in the Far East, when Carpentaria (Lord Kanaloa) won an 1800-metre contest at Tokyo on Sunday.

A daughter of four-time Group 1 winner and Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) runner-up Mosheen (Fastnet Rock), Carpentaria took her record to three wins from five starts with a head victory under Damian Lane for trainer Tetsuya Kimura

A private purchase for Northern Farm, Mosheen has produced three winners from six runners in Japan, including her second foal Primo Scene (Deep Impact), a Grade 3 winner

and Grade 1 runner-up.

With five fillies from Mosheen's first six foals, the immediate family of the dual Guineas and Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) winner is being nurtured by Northern Farm, with Primo Scene last year producing a colt by Epiphaneia (Symboli Kris S).

Whatever the fee paid for Mosheen, it is

likely to have been a very profitable venture for Northern Farm. Just two of Mosheen's progeny have sold at sale, both last year: A weanling colt by Epiphaneia, the sire of three Grade 1 winners, for JPY330,000,000 (approx. AU\$3,676,258) and a yearling colt by Maurice (Screen Hero) for a sale-topping JPY400,000,000 (approx. AU\$4,456,115). A tidy return for the Yoshida family.

SINGAPORE

Super Salute a superstar for I Am Invincible

arraman Park flagbearer I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) has a new star performer in Singapore with his son Super Salute recording a sixth consecutive win when taking Sunday's EW Barker Trophy (Listed, 1400m) at Kranji.

The four-year-old earned his trainer Jason Lim a first local Group race in Singapore, as he completed the sextet with victory over Golden Monkey (Star Turn).

Named Construct when racing in Australia, the son of I Am Invincible finished second in the Breeders' Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) and seventh in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) as a two-year-old, before returning at three to place third in the Up And Coming Stakes (Gr 3, 1300m).

Placed on Inglis Digital by his owners, a Newgate Farm-led syndicate, Lim purchased the horse for \$110,000. He has since won six races from seven starts in Singapore.

I Am Invincible, who has 28 winners from 32 runners in Singapore, was also represented by a winner in the final race on the card, as Invincible Tycoon recorded back-to-back victories when winning the Class 4 Stakes over 1200 metres for Lim's Stable and trainer Steven Burridge.

The four-year-old was a \$30,000 buy from the Inglis Digital platform for Nathan Doyle Racing and The Osher Group in March last year.

Iron Will (4 g ex Tristavel by Don Tristram) became the fifth individual winner in Hong Kong for his Rich Hill Stud sire Proisir (Choisir) when winning the Magazine Gap Handicap (1650m) at Sha Tin on Sunday. Trained by Danny Shum, Iron Will won by a neck ahead of Fast Buck (Al Maher). Iron Will was a \$28,000 buy from the Ainsley Downs draft at the 2020

New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale. The horse trialled twice in New Zealand before his export to Hong Kong, where he has scored at his ninth start. Iron Will is the fifth named foal out of Tristavel, herself a half-sister to Group 1 winner Russian Pearl (Soviet Star). Proisir, who has had 11 runners in Hong Kong, will stand for a fee of \$70,000 (plus GST) in 2023.

Second for Time For War

War Weapon (5 g ex Sunbrella by Peintre Celebre) won Sunday's Mount Butter Handicap (Class 4, 1600m) at Sha Tin to become the second individual winner for his sire Time For War (Snitzel) in Hong Kong. The Pierre Ngtrained five-year-old was ridden to victory by Zac Purton, defeating Darci Joy (Darci Brahma) by two and a quarter lengths. War Weapon was a \$10,000 buy for Steven Oliver from the draft of Waverley Park Lodge at the Magic Millions Gold Coast National Yearling Sale. He is one of seven winners from as many runners out of Sunbrella (Peintre Celebre). Time For War, who has had three runners in Hong Kong, died in 2016.

Five for Capitalist

Newgate Farm stallion Capitalist (Written Tycoon) earned his fifth individual winner in Hong Kong from just eight runners when Blue Marlin (4 g ex Granada by Dolphin Street) won the Pottinger Peak Handicap (Class 4, 1400m)

at Sha Tin on Sunday. The Douglas Whyte-trained four-year-old won by three-quarters of a length, ahead of Regent Glory (All American). Blue Marlin was a \$150,000 buy for Michael Hickmott from the Newgate draft at the 2020 Inglis Easter yearling sale. He is one of four winners from six runners out of the once-raced Grenada (Dolphin Street).

Third for Fast Company


Gallant Hero (5 g ex Bett's Gift by Teofilo) earned his first Hong Kong win at start 13 to become the third winner in the jurisdiction for his sire Fast Company (Danehill Dancer), when winning the Tsim Sha Tsui Handicap (Class 5, 1800m) at Happy Valley on Wednesday. Trained by David Hall, Gallant Hero won by two lengths, ahead of Owners' Star (Farhh). The Irish-bred gelding was a &52,000 weanling, before being sold for &160,000 as a yearling by the Hong Kong Jockey Club, and subsequently sold for HK\$1.7 million (approx. AU\$323,820). He is one of two named foals out of the unraced Teofilo (Galileo) mare Bett's Gift.

First for Flying Artie

Blue Gum Farm's new stallion recruit Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) was handed his inaugural winner in Hong Kong, when Sunshine Legendary (4 g ex Exceleine by Exceed And Excel) won the Jordan Handicap (Class 5, 1200m) at Happy Valley on Wednesday. Sunshine Legendary won by a head, defeating Dragon Kingdom (Holy Roman Emperor). The Frankie Lor-trained four-year-old was a \$65,000 Magic Million weanling buy for Group 1 Bloodstock and Two Bays Farm from the Cornerstone Stud draft, before making \$160,000 when purchased by Astute Bloodstock at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale. Sunshine Legendary trialed once at Ballarat before his export to Hong Kong. Flying Artie, who has had three runners in Hong Kong, will stand for a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST) in 2023.

First for Lucky Street

Darling View Stud stallion Lucky Street (Oratorio) was another to sire his first winner in Hong Kong this week, and from his very first runner, when Magniac (3 g ex Top Show by Stratum) won the Ho Man Tin Handicap (Class 3, 1200m) at Happy Valley on Wednesday. The Jamie Richards-trained three-year-old won by two lengths, ahead of Ace One (Shamus Award). Magniac was a \$65,000 buy for Trevor Andrews from the Western Breeders' Alliance draft at the 2021 Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale. The gelding won three races from six starts as a two-year-old in Western Australia when named Final Series. He is one of three winners from four to race out of three-time winner Top Show (Stratum).

New winners

Blue Point - Darley shuttler Blue Point (Shamardal) enjoyed a memorable week with three new scorers taking his tally to four winners from his first seven runners. Valour And Swagger (2 c ex Music Chart by Exchange Rate) ran away with a novice contest over six furlongs at Windsor as he defeated the oddson favourite Dapperling (Dandy Man) by six and a half lengths. A 45,000gns foal, Valour And Swagger was purchased for £80,000 by Oliver St Lawrence at the Goffs Doncaster Premier Yearling Sale. He is the third winner from as many to race out of the stakes-placed Exchange Rate (Danzig) mare Music Chart. Blue Storm (2 c ex Riskit Fora Biskit by Kodiac) provided Blue Point with a third individual winner when running out a comfortable scorer in a fivefurlong novice event at Newmarket. A £75,000 purchase at last year's Goffs UK Premier Yearling Sale, Blue Storm is the sixth foal out of the Listed-winning mare Riskit Fora Biskit (Kodiac), making him a half-brother to the useful winners Asjad (Iffraaj) and Silver Surfer (Caravaggio). The explosive start to Blue Point's stallion career continued when Keren (2 c ex Keresona by Oasis Dream) landed a newcomers contest over 1100 metres at Tarbes in France. Keren is out of the Listed-winning Oasis Dream (Green Desert) mare Keresona, who herself is a half-sister to the Group 3 winner Keratiya (Iron Mask). Blue Point, who shuttled to Northwood Park for a fee of AU\$44,000, is housed at Kildangan Stud where he stands for a fee of €35,000 (approx. AU\$57,130).

Calyx - The Amo Racing-owned Persian Dreamer (2 f ex Surprisingly by Galileo) produced a perfect debut performance to



easily score in a five-furlong fillies' maiden at Newmarket, providing Coolmore's first-season sire Calyx (Kingman) with a second individual winner. Trained by Dominic Ffrench Davis, the filly quickened impressively in the final furlong to put three and a quarter lengths between her and favourite Dorothy Lawrence (Soldier's Call). A €145,000 purchase as a yearling, Persian Dreamer is a half-sister to Group-placed winner Queen Olly (No Nay Never) and useful scorer Schooner Ridge (Siyouni) being the fourth foal out of the Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare Surprisingly, herself a sister to Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) runner-up and Group 3 winner Tiger Moth (Galileo) and Group-placed winner Butterscotch (Galileo). Calyx, who has now had six starters, stands for a fee of €10,000 (approx. AU\$16,310).

Encryption - Cifrado (2 c ex Madame Fly by Excites) gave Eureka Stud's Encryption (Lonhro) his second winner when impressively landing an Ipswich maiden. Bred by Black Soil Bloodstock, the colt is out of Madame Fly (Excites) making him a half-brother to Listed winner Miami Fleiss (Spirit Of Boom). Trained by Rex Lipp, Cifrado was purchased at the 2022 Magic Millions Gold Coast yearling sale for \$320,000 by owner Cliff Little.

Jungle Cat - Telemon Thoroughbreds' Jungle Cat (Iffraaj) produced his first southern hemisphere winner when his daughter Puss Boots (2 f ex Minkus by Jet Spur) recorded a strong victory in a maiden handicap over 950 metres at Cairns. A \$13,000 buy from last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast March Yearling Sale, Puss Boots is raced by Hedley Racing. Jungle Cat has had just three southern hemispherebred runners to date on the back of serving 57 mares in his first season at stud for a fee of \$13,200.

US Navy Flag stood at The Oaks Stud for a fee of \$15,000 (plus GST) in 2022.

Ardrossan - Waikato Stud stallion Ardrossan (Redoute's Choice) earned his second individual stakes winner when Loch Katrine (2 f ex Cong'er by Zenno Rob Roy) won the Champagne Stakes (Listed, 1600m) at Pukekohe. A \$6,000 buy for Wilko Bloodstock from the SG Stud draft at the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale, Loch Katrine is the second winner from three to race out of Listed winner Cong'er (Zenno Rob Roy). Ardrossan, who has had nine starters, stood for a fee of \$6,000 (plus GST) in 2022.

Australia - Canberra Legend (3 c ex Rocana by Fastnet Rock) provided Coolmore Stud stallion Australia (Galileo) with a 33rd individual stakes winner, and took his unbeaten

record to two, when landing the Feilden Stakes (Listed, 1m 1f) at Newmarket. A 350,000gns purchase as a yearling, Canberra Legend is a half-brother to Group 3 winner Youth Spirit (Camelot) and useful scorer Tarbaan (Tamayuz) being the third foal out of the unraced Fastnet Rock (Danehill) mare Rocana, herself a halfsister to Group 2 scorer Blaine (Avonbridge). Australia stands for a fee of €25,000 (approx. AU\$40,750).
